### [WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #85) vs. [9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #12)

Rybakina leads 1-0

#### Mboko:

- Making main-draw debut at this tournament
- Has reached the first tour-level SF of her career, in just her 3rd career WTA 1000 main-draw appearance
- Her fourth-round victory over World No.2 Coco Gauff was her first career Top 10 win in 3 attempts
- 18-year-old Mboko is the youngest woman to reach this tournament's SF since Belinda Bencic's title run in 2015
- She is the 8th player to reach a WTA 1000 at 18 years old or younger
- Through 5 matches, has served 37 aces, the most at the tournament since 2022 (Karolina Pliskova, 43)
- Mboko is the first Canadian semifinalist at the Canadian Open after Bianca Andreescu in 2019
- She could become the fourth Canadian finalist at the tournament after Faye Urban (1968 and 1969), Vicky Berner (1969) and Bianca Andreescu (2019)
- Mboko (18 years) is the fourth-youngest semi-finalist at the Canadian Open since 2000, older only than Belinda Bencic (2015), Ana Ivanovic (2006) and Serena Williams (2000) - they all reached the final
- Has equaled the best result achieved by her coach, Nathalie Tauziat at the Canadian Open (semi-final in 1990, lost to Steffi Graf)

### Rybakina:

- Making 4th appearance at this tournament; her previous and career-best tournament showing is the 2023 SF
- So far, Rybakina is 6-1 during this year's North American summer hard-court swing (also made Washington SF, I. eventual champion Fernandez in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Is playing in 10th WTA 1000 semifinal. Since 2023 when she reached her first WTA 1000 semifinal, only Iga Swiatek (15) has reached more WTA 1000 semifinals, while Aryna Sabalenka has also reached 10 in that time frame
- Contesting her 38th career WTA 1000 main draw; has won 2 WTA 1000 titles (2023 Indian Wells and 2023 Rome)
- 4 of 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2020 Hobart, 2023 Indian Wells, 2024 Brisbane and 2024 Abu Dhabi)
- Leads the Tour in Aces served (302) this year, including 26 aces this week
- Has a chance to return to the Top 10 this week; could secure return with a win today; also could return to Top 10 with her SF run if Tauson does not win the title

# [16] Clara Tauson (DEN #19) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #49)

#### Tauson leads 1-0

### Tauson:

- Tauson has won the only previous career meeting against Naomi Osaka, in Auckland's final this year via retirement
- Has advanced to the semifinal without dropping a set
- Making 2nd semifinal appearance at WTA 1000 having previously finishing as R-Up at 2025 Dubai (I. M. Andreeva)
- Would become the fourth player to reach multiple WTA 1000 finals in 2025, after Sabalenka, M. Andreeva and Gauff
- Through to seventh career WTA level SF all the previous six have been on hard court
- Through to 4th WTA level semifinal of the year (Auckland, Linz, Dubai and Montréal): already more than in her entire career prior to this season (three in total)
- Has won 32 WTA-level main draw matches in 2025, more than in the previous three entire calendar years combined (2022, 2023 and 2024)
- Tauson is the second Danish player to reach the semifinals at the Canadian Open in the Open Era after Caroline Wozniacki (Won in 2010, SF in 2012 and R-Up in 2017)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.19 (achieved on July 14, 2025); by reaching the SF is projected to move to No.15 after the tournament; she could move to No.13 if she reaches the final and could possibly make her Top 10 debut if she wins the title (also dependent on Rybakina's results)

### Osaka:

- Through to this tournament's semifinals for the first time in her career
- Making sixth career semifinal appearance at a WTA 1000 event, having previously finished as semifinalist at 2018
   Beijing, as a runner-up at 2020 Cincinnati (NYC) and 2022 Miami, and title runs at 2018 Indian Wells and 2018 Beijing
- Owns 80-41 record at WTA 1000 events
- There have been three unseeded finalists at a WTA 1000 tournament in 2025 Amanda Anisimova (Won, 2025 Doha), Jelena Ostapenko (R-Up, 2025 Doha) and Clara Tauson (R-Up, 2025 Dubai); Osaka and/or Mboko could join the list
- Is the third Japanese player to reach the semifinals at the tournament, equaling semifinal runs at the Canadian Open in the Open Era by Kazuko Sawamatsu in 1974 and Kimiko Date Krumm in 1994
- Has won five-straight matches for the first time reaching the Miami final in 2022 (I. Swiatek)
- Has won 21 WTA main draw matches in 2025: she only had more in 2018 and 2019 (40 each) in a calendar year
- Seeking 43rd career win over a Top 20 player today; she has already beaten two Top 20 players during this event (Samsonova in 2r and Svitolina in QF)

# **SUMMARY OF PERFORMANCE BYE & SPECIAL EXEMPT SPOT**

Looking ahead to Cincinnati, if Naomi Osaka advances to the final in Montreal, Osaka will receive a performance bye at Cincinnati in the opening round.

As Victoria Mboko was a direct entry into the Cincinnati qualifying draw, she will receive "Special Exempt Spot" into the main draw at Cincinnati.

A "Special Exempt Spot" is a singles Main Draw spot reserved for a singles player who is unable to compete in the Qualifying of a WTA Tournament in which she has been accepted as a direct acceptance by the Qualifying Sign-In Deadline because she is still competing in the singles main draw of a Tournament in the week before the Special Exempt Tournament.

In addition, if Mboko advances to the final, she will eligible to receive a performance bye in the opening round of Cincinnati.

If it is deemed that the performance bye are not needed they will be replaced by either the next player to move in off of the main draw alternate list or by a lucky loser, depended on the timing.

A performance bye would be awarded in addition to the Top 32 seeds at the tournament, yielding 33 or possibly 34 byes at Cincinnati.

## **ABOUT THE UPCOMING PIF WTA RANKINGS**

With a Thursday final in Montreal, the PIF WTA Rankings will updated at the conclusion of the tournament's championship matches. At that time, any ranking points earned at 2024 Washington DC and 2024 Toronto will drop off the Rankings with 2025 Montreal points being added. These will be the rankings for August 11, for historical and record purposes.

Further, the August 11 Rankings will update on Sunday evening at the conclusion of the ITF events allowing for points to be applied to the respective players' Ranking points.

The PIF WTA Rankings will next be updated on Monday, August 18 at the conclusion of the Cincinnati final at which point the 2024 Cincinnati points will drop off with 2025 Cincinnati points being added, accordingly. These rankings will serve as the basis for US Open seeding.

- Played only at ITF level in 2024 earning a further title at W35 Darmstadt (Germany) and broke into the Top 300 for the first time In 2023 secured her second ITF career title at W60 Saskatoon
   In 2022 played qualifying at WTA 1000 Toronto and main draw at WTA 250 Granby in her first WTA Tour level appearances
   Claimed her first ITF title in 2022 at W25 Saskatoon (Canada)
   Played first ITF tournament at W15 Prokuplje (Serbia) in 2021 at the age of 14
- Won three titles from five finals in 2024, tasting success at Brisbane, Abu Dhabi and Stuttgart and finishing R-Up at Doha and Miami. Qualified for her second WTA Finals and defeated WTA World No.1 Sabalenka in the group stage
- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023
   Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top 10 debut following tournament (January 30,
   2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title
   at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at

- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
- First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
- Won back-to-back Slam matches for the first time during 3r showing at 2020 Australian Open (l. Barty)
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22, 2019)

Returned to play in 2024 following maternity leave and reached the QF at Doha and 's-Hertogenbosch, as well as R16 at Rome and Beijing

Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023
