- This will be the 57th edition of the Women's Singles at the Canadian Open in the Open Era, with the inaugural edition of the event held in 1892.
- Chris Evert and Monica Seles have won the equal-most Women's Singles titles at the Canadian Open in the Open Era, with both winning the event on four occasions – Seles won the event on four consecutive occasions meanwhile (1994-98).
- Chris Evert and Monica Seles have appeared in the equal-most Women's Singles finals at the Canadian Open in the Open Era, with six finals each.
- Arantxa Sanchez Vicario (42) has appeared in the most Women's Singles matches at the Canadian Open in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 32-10 at the event.
- Serena Williams (35) has claimed the most Women's Singles match wins of any player in the Open Era at the Canadian Open, while Victoria Azarenka (23) has the most among currently active players.

- Monica Seles (91.2%, 31-3) holds the best winning percentage in the Women's Singles at the Canadian Open in the Open Era, with reigning champion Jessica Pegula (89.5%, 17-2) next-best – minimum 10 matches.
- Since the introduction of the Tier format in 1990, only three players have won the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open on back-to-back occasions – Monica Seles (1995-98), Martina Hingis (1999-00) and Jessica Pegula (2023-24).
- Since 1990, Monica Seles (eight) has claimed the most WTA top 10 wins at the Canadian Open, while Belinda Bencic (six) has the most among active players.
- Jessica Pegula could become the second player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open on three consecutive occasions, after Monica Seles.
- At 15 years 129 days, Jennifer Capriati (1991) is the youngest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles at the Canadian Open – Capriati is one of six teenagers since 1990 to win the event along with Martina Hingis, Serena Williams, Ana Ivanovic, Belinda Bencic and Bianca Andreescu.
- At 32 years 307 days, Martina Navratilova (1989) is the oldest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open, and the last player aged 30+ to defeat a WTA top 10 opponent in the final.
- Since 1990, three players aged 30+ have won the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open – Serena Williams (2013), Simona Halep (2022) and Jessica Pegula (2024).
- Since the WTA-1000 format's introduction in 2009, Serena Williams (2013) is the only player to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open without conceding a set.
- Monica Seles (1995) has conceded the fewest games en route to the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open since 1990, dropping just 14 games – Seles also conceded only two games in the semi-final and final combined that year.
- Belinda Bencic (2015) has conceded the most games en route to the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open since 1990, conceding 66 games all up.
- Since the Tier format's introduction in 1990, three players have won the Women's Singles final at the Canadian Open via retirement – Martina Hingis (2000), Belinda Bencic (2015) and Bianca Andreescu (2019).
- In the Open Era, Faye Urban (1969) and Bianca Andreescu (2019) are the only two Canadian players to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open.
- Since the introduction of the Tier format in 1990, Bianca Andreescu (1990) remains the only Canadian to reach the Women's Singles final at the Canadian Open.
- Monica Seles (1995) is the only player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open as a wildcard – since 1990, Seles is one of four players to achieve the feat at a Tier 1/WTA-1000 event, along with Steffi Graf (Berlin 1996), Maria Sharapova (Cincinnati 2011) and Bianca Andreescu (Indian Wells 2011).
- Since 1990, Serena Williams (#80) is the lowest-ranked player to win the Women's Singles title at the Canadian Open – Williams is one of two players ranked outside the WTA top 50 to win the event in that span, along with Camila Giorgi (#71) in 2021.
- Claiming tournament victory in Toronto in 2011, Serena Williams (#80) remains the lowest-ranked player to win a WTA-1000 event since the format's inception in 2009.
- Last season, Jessica Pegula became only the fourth player in the Open Era to reach the Women's Singles final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in a season after Rosemary Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013).
- Iga Swiatek (80.9%, 114-27) only trails Serena Williams (84.1%, 148-26) for winning percentage at WTA-1000 events, since the format's introduction in 2009 – minimum 10 matches.

- Currently holding a career win-loss record of 36-13, Mirra Andreeva's opening match will be her 50th at WTA-1000 events – among teenagers since 1990, only Serena Williams (40) and Venus Williams (39) can have claimed more wins from their first 50 Tier 1/WTA-1000 matches.
- Since 2009, Jessica Pegula could become just the third player to win three consecutive editions of a WTA-1000 event, along with Serena Williams (Miami) and Aryna Sabalenka (Wuhan).
- Aryna Sabalenka (21) has claimed the most WTA-1000 match wins of any player so far in 2025, with Mirra Andreeva (20) claiming the next-most.
- Since the start of the 2020 season, Iga Swiatek (111) and Aryna Sabalenka (101) are the only two players with 100+ WTA-1000 match wins, with Jessica Pegula (87) claiming the third-most over that span
