- With both finalists posting 3-0 records in round robin play, the runner-up will receive \$2,695,000 while the champion will earn \$5,235,000
- With her earnings from WTA Finals, Sabalenka will set a new WTA Tour record for most prize money earnings in a single-season; previously the record was owned by Serena Williams (2013, \$12,385,572)
- Nine times has a player posted a 3-0 record in round robin play and gone on to win the title
- This will be the 10th consecutive staging of the WTA Finals that produces a first-time champion dating back to 2015
- The No.6 seed has won the title four of the last seven editions of the WTA Finals – Caroline Wozniacki in 2017; Elina Svitolina in 2018; Garbine Muguruza in 2021 and Caroline Garcia in 2022; overall the No.6 seed has won the WTA Finals five times (also Maria Sharapova in 2004).
- Since the event’s inauguration in 1972, this will be the third final at the WTA Finals between the #1 and #6 seeds, with the top seed winning on both occasions – 2003 (Kim Clijsters) and 2007 (Justine Henin).
- This will be the first final at the WTA Finals to be a rematch of a Grand Slam final since Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova in 2012.
- Aryna Sabalenka (nine) has reached the most WTA level finals in 2025 – Sabalenka is just the second player in the decade to reach nine WTA-level finals in a year after Iga Swiatek in 2022.
- Sabalenka will finish as year-end No.1 for the second consecutive year; she is the seventh player to hold the No.1 Ranking for an entire calendar year joining Stefanie Graf, Serena Williams, Martina Navratilova, Ashleigh Barty, Chris Evert and Monica Seles.
- Rybakina will finish at No.6 as runner-up or No.5 if she wins the title

***Sabalenka:***

- Making her 5th consecutive appearance at the WTA Finals, and is the No.1 seed at the event for the fourth time (seeded No.1 in 2021, 2023-2025)
- Finished round robin play as the Stefanie Graf Group winner with a 3-0 record (d. Paolini, Pegula and defending champion Gauff); her undefeated round robin record marked the 28th time a player has gone 3-0 in that portion of the WTA Finals (Rybakina had made it 27 times the previous day)
- In the semifinals, beat No.4 Amanda Anisimova in three sets to reach the 40th WTA singles final of her career; with the win, Sabalenka owns a Tour-leading 63 match wins, surpassing Iga Swiatek (62)
- Has equaled career-best result at the WTA Finals, when she finished as runner-up in 2022 (l. Garcia in final); also reached the SF in 2023 and 2024
- Seeking her 22nd career WTA singles title
- Winner of a tour-leading four WTA singles titles this season, including her fourth career Grand Slam title at the US Open, as well as WTA 1000 Miami, WTA 1000 Madrid and WTA 500 Brisbane
- Has notched 63 tour-level wins in 2025, surpassing Iga Swiatek (62) for the most tour-level wins this year
- Her opening victory this week over Paolini was her 500th career match at Tour-level events
- Owns 55 career Top 10 wins, including all four of her wins this week; Sabalenka is 15-4 vs. the Top 10 this year
- Boasts a 39-6 record on hard courts in 2025
- 18 of her 21 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently the 2025 US Open (all four of her Grand Slam titles have been on hard court)
- Has already secured the PIF WTA Rankings Year-End World No.1 Ranking for the second straight year
- Sabalenka is the first player to reach the final of the WTA Finals and three or more Grand Slam finals in a calendar year since Angelique Kerber in 2016
- Sabalenka is only the fifth player to reach the semifinals at all four Grand Slam events and the WTA Finals in the same calendar year two or more times (2023, 2025); she joins Chris Evert (1974, 1984), Martina Navratilova (1984, 1985), Stefanie Graf (1988, 1989, 1990, 1993) and Justine Henin (2003, 2006)
- Aryna Sabalenka could become the first WTA #1 to win the WTA Finals since Ashleigh Barty in 2019

## ***Rybakina:***

- Making her 3rd consecutive WTA Finals appearance
- Emerged as the Serena Williams Group winner and advanced beyond the round robin stage for the first time; in each of the last two years, she went 1-2 in round robin
- Went undefeated 3-0 in round robin play (d. Anisimova, Swiatek and Alexandrova), marking the 27th time a player has gone 3-0 in that portion of the WTA Finals (the next day, Sabalenka matched that feat)
- In the semifinals, she came back from a set down to defeat No.5 Jessica Pegula and reach the 22nd WTA singles final of her career
- Seeking her 11th career WTA singles title
- Picked up two WTA singles titles this year, at WTA 500 events in Strasbourg and Ningbo; trying to win three titles in a calendar year for the second year in a row
- Currently on a 10-match winning streak: Ningbo title, Tokyo SF (ended with walkover, which does not count as a loss) and Riyadh final. Her longest tour-level winning streak is 13 straight from Dubai through Miami in 2023
- Her most recent loss was to today's opponent Sabalenka in the 2025 Wuhan QF
- Has posted 55 Tour-level match wins in 2025, the third-highest total on Tour this year (trailing only Sabalenka and Swiatek)
- Has notched 30 Top 10 wins in her career, including all four of her wins here this week
- Has gone 4-6 vs. Top 5 players this year, with three of those four wins coming this week over No.2 Swiatek, No.4 Anisimova and No.5 Pegula
- Owns a 7-6 career record against players ranked World No.1 at the time of their meeting; her most recent win over a reigning No.1 came over Sabalenka in the 2025 Cincinnati QF
- Following her win over No.2 Swiatek earlier this week, has now defeated a player ranked in the Top 2 on 11 occasions since her Tour debut in 2016; among active players, only Venus Williams has more Top 2 wins (28)
- First player from Kazakhstan to make it to the semifinals and beyond of the WTA Finals
- Five of her 10 career WTA titles have come on hard court, including Ningbo this year
- This will be Elena Rybakina's third final in 2025, after going on to claim respective tournament victories in Strasbourg and Ningbo.
- Currently ranked No.6; this time last year was ranked No.5; reached career-high ranking of No.3 in June 2023
- This year's Tour leader in total aces (503); she fired 15 aces in her semifinal win over Pegula; since 2008 when the WTA began recording match stats, Rybakina's 15 aces were the second most at a WTA Finals match between only Elina Svitolina (16 aces in 2019 SF)
- Since the WTA Rankings were first published in 1975, Rybakina could become just the second player to defeat the World No.1 in back-to-back editions of the WTA Finals after Tracy Austin, who defeated Evert and Navratilova (1979-80)
- Since the start of the 2020 season, Elena Rybakina (250) is one of just three players to claim 250+ match wins at WTA level, along with Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka.
- Since 2003, Elena Rybakina could become the fourth player to defeat the WTA #1 to secure tournament victory at the WTA Finals after Justine Henin (2006), Kim Clijsters (2010) and Dominika Cibulkova (2016).

**KUDERMETOVA/MERTENS LEADS 1-0**

Kudermetova/Mertens d. Babos/Stefani 6-4, 6-2 in 2025 Rome R32

***Babos/Stefani:***

- Babos/Stefani defeated defending champions Dabrowski/Routliffe to clinch second place in the Liezel Huber Group with a 2-1 record and advance to the semifinals (also d. Andreeva/Shnaider; I. Siniakova/Townsend)
- In the semifinals, they ousted Martina Navratilova Group winners Hsieh/Ostapenko in straight sets
- Babos dominated the WTA Finals between 2017 and 2019, winning three straight titles (w/Hlavackova in 2017, and w/Mladenovic in 2018 and 2019) – this is her first qualification since her 2019 title
- Overall, this is Babos’s sixth appearance at the WTA Finals, having also qualified in 2015 (w/Mladenovic) and 2016 (w/Shvedova)
- By contrast, Stefani is making her WTA Finals debut this year
- Stefani is the first Brazilian to make a final at the WTA Finals in either singles or doubles
- This year, Babos and Stefani teamed up for the very first time in their careers at WTA 500 Linz – and promptly won the title
- Overall, they won four team titles in 2025, additionally triumphing at WTA 500 Strasbourg, WTA 500 Tokyo and WTA 250 Sao Paulo (Stefani’s birthplace)
- Also were runners-up at WTA 500 Ningbo, during the week where they sealed qualification for the WTA Finals
- The duo ended the Grand Slam season strongly with quarterfinal finishes at both Wimbledon (l. defending champions Siniakova/Townsend) and the US Open (l. eventual champions Dabrowski/Routliffe)
- Stefani also reached the mixed doubles final this year at Wimbledon (w/Salisbury, I. Siniakova/Verbeek)
- Babos is a former WTA Doubles World No.1. She reached that peak for the first time on July 16, 2018, and spent a total of 13 weeks at the top ranking
- Babos is also a 4-time Grand Slam champion in women’s doubles, winning all of those titles with Kristina Mladenovic (2018 and 2020 Australian Open; 2019 and 2020 Roland Garros)
- Stefani has won one Grand Slam title, claiming the 2023 Australian Open mixed doubles title with her compatriot Rafael Matos

### ***Kudermetova/Mertens:***

- Kudermetova and Mertens finished second in the Martina Navratilova Group with a record of 2-1 (defeated Muhammad/Schuurs and Errani/Paolini; lost to Hsieh/Ostapenko)
- In the semifinals, they defeated Liezel Huber Group winners Siniakova/Townsend in a match-tiebreak, having saved match point in the second-set tiebreak
- Kudermetova and Mertens won the WTA Finals title together in 2022
- This is Kudermetova's third appearance at the WTA Finals. Along with the title in 2022, she also made SF last year with Chan Hao-ching (l. Siniakova/Townsend)
- Mertens is appearing at the WTA Finals for the seventh consecutive edition; she has qualified for this event with five different partners overall
- This is Mertens' third trip to the doubles final at the WTA Finals. Along with the 2022 title, Mertens was also the 2021 WTA Finals runner-up (w/Hsieh, l. Krejčíková/Siniakova)
- Additionally at the WTA Finals, Mertens made the semifinals in 2023 (w/Hunter, l. Siegemund/Zvonareva), the 2018 opening round (w/Schuurs), and group stage finishes in 2019 (w/Sabalenka) and 2024 (w/Hsieh)
- During 2021 and 2022, Kudermetova and Mertens won three titles as a pair (2021 Istanbul, 2022 Dubai and 2022 WTA Finals) and reached three other finals (2022 Doha, 2022 Miami and 2022 's-Hertogenbosch)
- After a hiatus of over two years (since their 2022 WTA Finals title), Mertens and Kudermetova re-teamed in April of 2025
- In their first two events as a duo this year, they reached WTA 1000 finals at both Madrid and Rome
- In their fifth tournament back together, they captured the Wimbledon title – Kudermetova's first career Grand Slam doubles title, and Mertens' fifth
- At this year's other Grand Slam events, the pair made Roland Garros QF and US Open SF
- Mertens reached the WTA Doubles World No.1 ranking for the first time on May 10, 2021. She has spent a total of 39 weeks ranked Doubles World No.1
