## WTA FINALS – A BRIEF HISTORY

- This is the 54th staging of the event (which began in 1972). This year marks the second time that the WTA Finals are hosted in Saudi Arabia. Riyadh is the 14th different city to host the year-end event.
- The singles event features eight players and begins as a round robin event, with four players in each group. Over the first six days of competition, each player meets the other three players in her group, with the top two in each pool moving on to the semifinals. Each of the group winners meets the runner-up in the other group in the semifinals. The winners of each semifinal meet in the championship match.
- The current round robin format was re-introduced in 2003 for the first time since 1982.
- Seven players have won the title at the WTA Finals in their tournament debut – Chris Evert (1972, first edition), Evonne Goolagong (1974), Serena Williams (2001), Maria Sharapova (2004), Petra Kvitova (2011), Dominika Cibulkova (2016) and Ashleigh Barty (2019).
- Other players who reached the final on their debut include Tracy Austin (1979 R-Up), Andrea Jaeger (1981 R-Up), Lindsay Davenport (1994 R-Up), Martina Hingis (1996 R-Up), Simona Halep (2014 R-Up), Sloane Stephens (2018 R-Up), Anett Kontaveit (2021 R-Up) and Qinwen Zheng (2025).
- The longest Finals win streak was compiled by Navratilova, who won 21 straight matches in winning five titles between 1983 and 1986 and reaching the quarterfinals in 1987. The next longest win streak in tournament history is S.Williams, who won 16 in a row (2009, 2012, 2013 and 2014)
- Between 1984 and 1998, a best-of-five sets final was used to decide the Finals final; three finals went the distance: 1990 - Seles vs. Gabriela Sabatini (the first woman's match in 89 years to extend to five sets since the 1901 Philadelphia Finals); 1995 – Steffi Graf vs. Anke Huber; 1996 - Graf vs. Hingis. Six finals went to four sets (1986 - March, 1987, 1989, 1991, 1993 and 1998)
- On 10 occasions has a Finals winner has not dropped a set en route to the title; Evert achieved the feat three times (1972-73, 1975) and Navratilova (1984-85) and S.Williams (2001, 2012) did it twice; Sabatini did not drop a set in 1988, while Clijsters did the same in 2002 and Swiatek is the most recent, in 2023
- There have been 27 different winners in 53 stagings; of those 26 winners, 19 have reached No.1 in the WTA Rankings with the only exceptions were Sylvia Hanika (1982), Gabriela Sabatini (1988, 1994), Jana Novotna (1997), Petra Kvitova (2011), Agnieszka Radwanska (2015), Dominika Cibulkova (2016), Elina Svitolina (2018), Caroline Garcia (2022) and Coco Gauff (2025).
- The top seed has won the title 23 times, most recently Ashleigh Barty in 2019

## DOUBLES QUALIFIERS

**Sara Errani & Jasmine Paolini:** Errani and Paolini have enjoyed another outstanding season on the Hologic WTA Tour, highlighted by winning three WTA 1000 titles – Doha, Rome and Beijing – in addition to winning their first Grand Slam doubles title at Roland-Garros. The pair posted an incredible 14-match win streak where they triumphed in Rome and Paris before falling in the final in Berlin. The duo is in contention for the WTA Year-End Doubles No.1 Ranking.

**Katerina Siniakova & Taylor Townsend:** Townsend and former WTA Finals doubles champion Siniakova are set to make their second consecutive appearance as a pair after making their WTA Finals debut last year when they went on to reach the title match. This will mark Siniakova's seventh consecutive appearance at the WTA Finals, winning the title in 2021. The Czech-American duo started the season by winning the Australian Open and also triumphing in Dubai (WTA 1000). They finished as runners-up at the US Open and posted strong semifinal showings at Indian Wells, Miami and Wimbledon. Both Townsend and Siniakova have held the PIF WTA World No.1 in doubles this year and Siniakova is in contention to finish the year atop the PIF WTA Doubles Rankings.

**Gabriela Dabrowski & Erin Routliffe:** Dabrowski and Routliffe have qualified for the WTA Finals for the third year in a row together. Last season the duo made history as the first players from Canada and New Zealand respectively to win the WTA Finals doubles title. They will be looking to be the first team since Timea Babos and Kristina Mladenovic from 2018-2019 to successfully defend the WTA Finals crown. Dabrowski and Routliffe have won three titles this season - Cincinnati (WTA 1000), Stuttgart (WTA 500) and the US Open, which marked their second Grand Slam title together.

**Veronika Kudermetova & Elise Mertens:** The experienced duo, who went unbeaten to win the WTA Finals in 2022, has qualified for the second time as a team; overall this will be Mertens' seventh consecutive time contesting the event. The duo's season has been highlighted by winning the title at Wimbledon and finishing as runner-up at two WTA 1000 events – Madrid and Rome. They also were semifinalists at 's-Hertogenbosch and the US Open.

**Mirra Andreeva & Diana Shnaider:** Andreeva and Shnaider will be making their WTA Finals debut. The young duo won the first doubles titles of their careers in 2025, triumphing at Brisbane (WTA 500) and Miami (WTA 1000). The pair also finished as runner-up at Queens and enjoyed semifinal runs at Doha and Rome (both WTA 1000), Charleston (WTA 500) as well as two Grand Slams, the Australian Open and then at Roland Garros.

**Hsieh Su-Wei & Jelena Ostapenko:** Hsieh and Ostapenko will be making their debut as a team at the WTA Finals, with both having plenty of experience at the event with other partners. Overall this will be Hsieh's sixth appearance, winning the title in 2013 and also finishing as runner-up three times, while this will be Ostapenko's third appearance in doubles with her best result being a semifinal run in 2022. Ostapenko also qualified for the WTA Finals in singles in 2017, competing in the group stage. The team secured their place in Riyadh as three-time finalists in 2025 finishing as runner-up at the Australian Open, Dubai (WTA 1000) and Wimbledon.

**Timea Babos & Luisa Stefani:** Competing together at the WTA Finals for the first time as a team, however, Babos brings the experience as a three-time WTA Finals doubles champion (from 2017-19). Babos and Stefani have reached five finals this season to earn their place in Riyadh, winning titles at Linz (WTA 500), Strasbourg (WTA 500) Sao Paulo (WTA 250) and Tokyo (WTA 500). They finished as runners-up at the Ningbo (WTA 500) and also enjoyed a semifinal run at Bad Homburg.

**Asia Muhammad & Demi Schuurs:** Competing together at the WTA Finals for the first time as a team, Schuurs is through to her sixth qualification, reaching the semifinals in 2019, 2021 and 2022, while Muhammad is making her first appearance. The duo of Muhammad and Schuurs have won two titles, at the WTA 1000 BNP Paribas Open (Indian Wells) and a historic triumph at the WTA 500 HSBC Championships as women's tennis returned to London's Queen's Club for the first time in over 50 years.

## ABOUT THE ROUND ROBIN FORMAT

- In 2003 the current round robin format feeding into a four-player single-elimination draw returned to the WTA Finals for the first time since 1982. The Top 2 finishers in each group will advance to the semifinals where the top player in each group, will play against the other group's runner-up
- There have been 26 instances where a player has posted a perfect 3-0 record in round robin play, most recently 2023 champion Iga Swiatek and 2023 runner-up Jessica Pegula
- On nine occasions has a player posted a 3-0 record and gone on to win the title, most recently in 2023 (Swiatek).
- Meanwhile nine times has a player posted a 3-0 round robin record and failed to reach the final, most recently 2022

## ROUND ROBIN TIE-BREAKING METHODS

Since 2003, a semifinalist has been decided by the round-robin tie-break method nine times (2003, 2004, 2009, 2011, 2013, twice in 2015, 2016 and 2021). The final standings of each group shall be determined by the following:

- 1) Greatest number of wins
- 2) Greatest number of matches played; or
- 3) Head-to-head results if only two (2) players are tied, or if three (3) players are tied then:
  - a. If three (3) players each have the same number of wins, a player having played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the match-up of the two remaining tied players; or
  - b. Highest percentage of sets won; or
  - c. Highest percentage of games won

If the above tie-breaking methods produce one (1) superior player (1st place) or one inferior player (3rd place), and the two (2) remaining players are tied, the tie between those two (2) players shall be broken by head-to-head record.

## YEAR-END WTA RANKINGS

The Year-End WTA Rankings will be published at the conclusion of the WTA Finals. The ranking points on offer at the finals are 200 points per round robin win, 400 points for a semifinal win and 500 points for a final win.

Aryna Sabalenka has secured the year-end No.1 ranking for the second consecutive year. Iga Swiatek will finish at No.2.

The WTA Doubles Year-End No.1 will belong to either Katerina Siniakova or Sara Errani and Jasmine Paolini as co-No.1.

Current WTA World Doubles No.1 Siniakova has held the No.1 ranking for 167 (week of Oct 27) and 168 weeks (week of Nov 3) trailing only Martina Navratilova (237 weeks) and Liezel Huber (199 weeks).

If Siniakova / Townsend win two round robin matches, then Siniakova would secure the year-end No.1 doubles rankings.

Errani and Paolini could climb to co-No.1 after the WTA Finals, but would need to win the WTA Finals title with an undefeated record in round robin play.
