- Tournament's 28th edition, having made debut appearance on the Hologic WTA Tour in 1996. Past singles winners include Liudmila Samsonova (2024), Ekaterina Alexandrova (2023, 2022) and Alison Riske (2019)
- This year's field is led by No.1 Ekaterina Alexandrova. Making her sixth appearance at 's-Hertogenbosch, Alexandrova is looking for her third Libéma Open crown after capturing the title in 2023 (d. Veronika Kudermetova in F) and 2022 (d. Aryna Sabalenka in F)
- The No.2 seed is defending champion Liudmila Samsonova. Coming off a Runner-Up finish at Strasbourg (l. Elena Rybakina in F), she is making her fourth tournament appearance and is seeking to add a third Tour-level title on grass

- Elise Mertens of Belgium is the No.3 seed. Seeking her first Tour-level champion run on grass, Mertens next singles title will be the 10th of her career on Tour
- Poland's Magda Linette rounds out the Top 4 seeds. With three singles title in her Tour career (two on hard court, one on clay), Linette is looking to capture her first on grass in her second appearance at 's-Hertogenbosch
- 2024 Runner-Up Bianca Andreescu will be making her third main draw appearance here, as a wildcard
- Home favorite Suzan Lamens is making her third main draw appearance at 's-Hertogenbosch after capturing her first Tour-level win on grass in the 1r during last year's edition (d. Bernarda Pera)
- In doubles, Netherlands' Bibiane Schoofs returns to defend her crown after taking last year's Libéma Open title with Ingrid Neel. This year she will be teaming up with Czech Republic's Anastasia Detiuc in their first tournament as a pair on grass.
