DOUBLES FINAL NOTES - JANUARY 26

[1] KATERINA SINIAKOVA (CZE #1) / TAYLOR TOWNSEND (USA #5) VS

[3] HSIEH SU-WEI (TPE #6) / [3] JELENA OSTAPENKO (LAT #8)

SINIAKOVA / TOWNSEND:

- This is the third Grand Slam Siniakova / Townsend have teamed up; in addition to winning the 2024 Wimbledon title, the duo also reached the SF at 2024 US Open
- Currently the PIF WTA World No.1 in doubles, Siniakova will hold on to the top spot after the tournament; the week of Jan 27 will be her 136th week atop the WTA Doubles Rankings. She currently sits at No.5 on the all-time list for weeks at No.1; next on the list is Lisa Raymond (137 weeks)
- Siniakova has won a total of 28 titles throughout her career with 10 different partners, including 17 with Barbora Krejcikova; nine of her titles came at Grand Slams
- Siniakova has reached the SF or better at five-straight Grand Slams SF at 2024 Australian Open, Won at 2024 Roland Garros, Won at 2024 Wimbledon and SF at 2024 US Open
- In addition to winning the Career Grand Slam, Siniakova has also won Olympic gold medals in doubles (2021) and mixed doubles (2024), while also winning the title at 2021 WTA Finals and helping her countrymates win the Billie Jean king Cup in 2018
- This is Siniakova's 11th Grand Slam doubles appearance at the Australian Open; this is also her fourth time reaching the event's final in doubles won in 2022, 2023 and finished as runner-up in 2021
- This is Townsend's 7th Australian Open doubles appearance; her previous best finish was the R16 (2019, 2024)
- Playing in her 28th Grand Slam doubles draw, Townsend finished as runner-up twice 2022 US Open (w/Caty McNally) and 2023 Roland Garros (w/Leylah Fernandez); she also won 2024 Wimbledon (w/Siniakova)

HSIEH / OSTAPENKO:


- Hsieh seeks an eighth Grand Slam doubles title with a fifth different partner, while Ostapenko bids for her second in a row after teaming with Lyudmyla Kichenok to win the US Open last summer
- Hsieh is competing in her 67th Grand Slam in doubles
- In eight Grand Slam doubles final appearances, Hsieh has won seven times with four different partners Peng Shuai (2), Barbora Strycova (2), Elise Mertens (2) and Wang Xinyu (1)
- Hsieh has won titles at the Australian Open (2024), Roland Garros (2023, 2014) and Wimbledon (2023, 2021, 2019, 2013)
- Ostapenko is making her 34th Grand Slam doubles appearance; this is her third Grand Slam doubles final having finished as runner-up at 2024 Australian Open and winning at 2024 US Open (both w/Lyudmyla Kichenok)
- This is Ostapenko's 10th doubles draw appearance at the Australian Open






