PIF WTA WORLD NO.1

For the first time in her career, **Aryna Sabalenka** enters a Grand Slam tournament as the PIF WTA World No.1. Sabalenka first attained the ranking on September 11, 2023 and returned to the top spot last year on October 21.

Following the 2025 Australian Open, the No.1 ranking will belong to either Sabalenka, Iga Swiatek or Coco Gauff:

- **Sabalenka** will need to reach QF to have a chance at retaining the No.1 ranking, although that could change as Swiatek progresses through the tournament. If Swiatek reaches the third round, then Sabalenka would need to reach the SF. If Swiatek reaches the SF then Sabalenka would need to reach the final. Should Swiatek and Sabalenka meet in the final, then the winner would leave Australia with the PIF WTA World No.1 ranking
- **Swiatek**, as she reached the third round last year in Melbourne, is defending only 130 points at the Australian Open, compared to Sabalenka's 2000 championship points. She could secure the No.1 ranking in the early stages of the tournament with early exits by Gauff and Sabalenka
- The only way **Gauff** could move to No.1 would be by winning the title and Sabalenka losing in the QF or earlier and Swiatek not advancing to the third round

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST ROUND SUCCESS

- **Iga Swiatek (22-1 in 1r, 95.65%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 23 Grand Slam main draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). Swiatek is 6-0 in first round matches at the Australian Open
- **Madison Keys (40-5 in 1r, 88.89%):** Has won ten-straight Slam opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). Keys is 9-1 here at Australian Open in opening matches
- **Caroline Wozniacki (48-7 in 1r, 87.27%):** The former World No.1 is 13-1 in first round matches at the Australian Open, with her only loss in Melbourne coming in 2016. She has won her last seven R128 matches across all Slams with her last loss coming at 2019 Roland Garros
- **Elise Mertens (27-4 in 1r, 87.1%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu)
- **Elina Svitolina (37-6 in 1r, 86.05%):** Svitolina has won 33 of her last 34 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- **Coco Gauff (18-3 in 1r, 85.71%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin)
- **Elena Rybakina (18-3 in 1r, 85%.71):** Two of Rybakina’s first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel)
- **Victoria Azarenka (54-11 in 1r, 83.08%):** Four of her 11 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances
- **Zheng Qinwen (10-2 in 1r, 83.3%):** Zheng’s two first round loss came Wimbledon in 2023 (I. Siniakova) and 2024 (I. Sun)
- **Worth Noting:** Naomi Osaka 22-5 (81.48%), Aryna Sabalenka 21-5 (80.77%),
