Varvara Gracheva (USA #65) vs. Alycia Parks (USA #59)

First meeting

Gracheva:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Miami, with a best result of 4r in 2023 (as qualifier I. Kvitova)
- Looking for her fourth main draw match win of 2025 after progressing to 2r at Austin, Australian Open and Indian Wells (I. eventual champion M.Andreeva)
- Owns a 2-2 record against USA players so far in 2025 (d. McNally at Australian Open and Stearns at Austin; l. Stearns at Cluj-Napoca and Dolehide at Austin)
- Best career result on hard court is runner-up which she has reached once: Austin in 2023 (l. Kostyuk)

Parks:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Miami and looking for first win today after falling in 1r in 2023 (l. Mertens)
- Owns a 1-2 career record against players from France, and this is her first such meeting of the 2025 season
- Her sole career title came at 2023 Lyon, where she defeated French player Caroline Garcia in the final
- Is currently ranked at No.59 on the PIF WTA Rankings; reached her career high of No.40 in August 2023

Naomi Osaka (JPN #61) vs. [Q] Yuliia Starodubtseva (UKR #108)

First meeting

Osaka:

- Making 8th Miami appearance, her best result was reaching the final in 2022 (l. Swiatek in F); also made quarterfinal here in 2021 (l. Sakkari)
- Her runner-up finish in 2022 equaled the best result by Japan at Miami also achieved by Kimiko Date in 1995 (l. Steffi Graf in F)
- Has an overall match record of 14-7 at Miami and is undefeated in opening round matches
- Is a seven-time hard court champion, most recently 2021 Australian Open

Starodubtseva:

- Making debut appearance at Miami
- Facing a player from Japan for the first time at Tour level
- Owns 8 career wins over Top 100 players with her best win by ranking against No.14 Anna Kalinskaya at Beijing 2024
- Is looking for her first main draw match win of 2025; her sole win of the season came in qualifying at Merida
- Best result by Ukraine at Miami was semifinal by Elina Svitolina in 2021
- Best result at Miami by a qualifier was semifinal by Danielle Collins in 2018

Kvitova leads 2-1

Kvitova:

- Making her 14th appearance at Miami, her most recent and best result was winning the title in 2023 (d. Rybakina in final)
- Returned to the courts in February after 17 months maternity leave, playing her first tournaments at Austin (l. Burrage in 1r) and Indian Wells (l. Gracheva in 1r)
- Won her only previous hard court meeting against Kenin which was here in Miami in 2018
- Owns 20 hard court titles with the 2023 Miami trophy her most recent
- Winner today will face No.3 seed Coco Gauff in the second round

Kenin:

- Making sixth main draw appearance at Miami, previously making 3r on three occasions 2023 (l. Andreescu), 2021 (l. Jabeur) and 2018 (l. Kvitova)
- Competing in her 41st WTA 1000 event having reached the semifinals three times – 2019 Toronto, 2019 Cincinnati and 2023 Guadalajara
- Won her most recent meeting against Kvitova at the 2020 Roland Garros semifinal
- Owns 0-1 record against wild cards this year, losing to No.118 Maya Joint at Hobart; also her most recent loss to a player ranked outside the Top 100

Renata Zarazua (MEX #71) vs. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #40)

Krueger leads 1-0

Zarazua:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Miami, previously reaching 2r as a qualifier in 2021 (l. Kerber)
- Owns two wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.30 Caroline Garcia at US Open 2024
- Is 1-1 against players from United States of America so far in 2025 (d. Townsend at Australian Open; l. Baptiste at Singapore)
- Best career result on hard court is SF run at Acapulco in 2020 (l. eventual R-Up Fernandez)
- Only player from Mexico in the main draw
- Winner today will face 2024 & 2023 Miami runner-up Rybakina

Krueger:

- Making 4th appearance at Miami and looking for her first win today, previous falling in the first round in 2024, 2023 and 2022
- Won her only previous meeting against Zarazua in qualifying at 2022 US Open
- Recently reached the biggest final of her career at 2025 Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic in F)
- Owns one hard court title at Osaka in 2023 (d. Zhu in F)
- Is playing at a career high ranking of No.40
- A player from the USA has won the Miami title 15 times with the most recent champion being Danielle Collins in 2024

CAREER MILESTONES

- Began the year at a career high ranking of No.39 and a strong opening result at Auckland with quarterfinal (l. Gauff). Posted her best Grand Slam result to date with R16 at Roland Garros (l. M.Andreeva) and reached semifinals at WTA 125s Paris (l. Shnaider) and Hong Kong (l. Tauson)
- Stand out results of 2023 were achieving runner-up at Austin and two quarterfinals, firstly on clay at Strasbourg (l. Svitolina) and then on grass at Bad Homburg (l. Bronzetti). Also advanced to R16 at both Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Rybakina) and Miami (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitova). Top ranking of the season of No. 40 was achieved on August 7, 2023.
- Best results of 2022 were runs to QF at Chennai (l. eventual champion Fruhvirtova) and 3r at Roland Garros (l. Mertens). Also reached 2r on four occasions
- Second Top 100 season in 2021 finishing the year at No.79, in a season highlighted by making her WTA SF debut at Chicago 250 and posting a career-best 14 main draw match wins
- Highlight of 2020 campaign was 3r showing at US Open (l. Martic); in 2r recovered from 6-1 5-1 down, saving 4MP to upset No.44 Mladenovic
- Ended 2019 at No.105, nearly 300 places up from her 2018 finish after a campaign in which she posted a 70-26 win-loss record, lifting five titles on the ITF Circuit, including at \$60K Valencia and \$60K Saint-Malo
- Recorded first WTA victory during 2r run at 2019 Washington DC (as qualifier, d. Blinkova, l. Hsieh)
- Fell 1r on WTA debut (main draw and qualifying) at 2019 Lausanne (as qualifier, l. X.Han), while made Grand Slam qualifying debut at US Open later that summer
- During 2018 season, won second ITF Circuit title of career at \$15k/Antalya-TUR and reached three other QFs at this level
- On ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Egypt in 2016
- Contested Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open as a junior, with best result a 3r run at 2016 Wimbledon
- Highlight of 2024 season was posting best Grand Slam result courtesy of run to 3r at Australian Open (l. Gauff). Also won two WTA 125 titles, at Warsaw and Gaiba
- Won first singles title in 2023 at Lyon (d. Garcia). In doubles won Cincinnati (w/Townsend) and achieved R-Up at Birmingham (w/Hunter).
- Contested three WTA main draws in 2022, highlighted by maiden QF at this level at Ostrava (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Krejčíková)
- In 2022, also made 2r at Berlin (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Jabeur) and finished the campaign with a 10-match winning streak that brought WTA 125K Series titles at Andorra and Angers
- Closed out 2021 with R-Up finish at W25 event in Daytona Beach-FL, USA
- In 2021, also made 2r at Lausanne and fell 1r at US Open (as WC, l. Danilovic) and Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Rus); struck 129mph serve during 1r defeat at US Open, matching V.Williams' record for the fastest serve in the tournament's history Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2021 Charleston [250] (as qualifier, l. Jabeur)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Charleston [250] (l. Vikhlyantseva in final round)
- Owns one ITF Circuit singles title from six finals, triumphing at \$25k Orlando-FL in November 2020 (also won doubles title)
- Made ITF Circuit debut at a \$15k event in Orlando-FL, USA in March 2017

- Currently based mainly in France, at the ETC Academy in Cannes, where she trains alongside several touring pros, including Daniil Medvedev
- Introduced to tennis by her mother Natalia Kazakova, who was her coach until the age of 14
- Studied at the meteor sports center in Zhukovsky, before moving to Germany to train with Nina Bratchikova
- Favorite hobby is drawing, and her favorite artist is Vincent Van Gogh - particularly 'self-portrait with a severed ear'
- She owns two dogs - a Yorkshire Terrier and a Parson Russell - named Tutsi and Enya, and a parrot called Boy
- Also likes to listen to alternative rock music, particularly the band Skillet
