MATCH NOTES - DAY 2 - WEDNESDAY, MARCH 19

[WC] Sayaka Ishii (JPN #188) vs. Emma Raducanu (GBR #60) *Ishii:*

First meeting

- Making Miami main draw debut after playing qualifying in 2024
- Her one career Top 100 win came in qualifying at Tokyo 2024 against No.53 Clara Tauson
- Best result by a wild card at Miami was semifinal by Victoria Azarenka in 2018 and Justine Henin in 2010
- This is the fourth Tour level main draw match of her career and first in 2025; previous Tour main draw appearances came at 2024 Tokyo (quarterfinal) and 2024 Cleveland (R32)

Raducanu:

- Making third appearance at Miami and looking for her first match win today after falling in her opening match in 2023 (I. Andreescu in 1r) and in 2022 (I. Siniakova in 2r after 1r bye as No.11 seed)
- Prior to Miami, was defeated by a player from Japan (Uchijima) in her 1r Indian Wells match
- Owns one hard court title at 2021 US Open, when she became first qualifier to lift a major title
- Making 16th appearance at a WTA 1000 with best result being three R16 finishes
- Has won 7 of last 9 matches vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 100
- Winner of today's match will face No.8 seed Emma Navarro

Anhelina Kalinina (UKR #55) vs. Victoria Azarenka (#32) *Kalinina:*

Azarenka leads 2-0

- Making 4th appearance at Miami, where her previous best result is 4r on two occasions, in 2024 (I. Putintseva) and 2022 (I. Pegula)
- Her best result at a WTA 1000 event was R-Up at Rome 2023 (I. Rybakina)
- Owns 2-4 record vs. Top 50 opponents in 2025; best career win by ranking was defeating No.2 Sabalenka in R32 at Miami 2024
- Best career result on hard court is SF run at Brisbane 2025 and Austin 2024

Azarenka:

- Making 16th appearance at Miami, she is a three-time champion; 2009 (d. S. Williams), 2011 (d. Sharapova) and 2016 (d. Kuznetsova)
- Also reached the semifinals in 2024 (I. Rybakina) and 2018 (I. eventual champion Stephens)
- Has won 10 singles titles at WTA 1000 events
- Owns 207 match wins at WTA 1000 events, the most since the level was introduced in 2009
- One of the four previous champions in this year's field, along with Danielle Collins (2024), Petra Kvitova (2023), Iga Swiatek (2022)
- Ranked No.5 in history for match wins at Miami (43), following Serena Williams (76), Venus Williams (67), Steffi Graf (59), Gabriela Sabatini (45); has never failed at an opening match at Miami
- With 45 match wins at Miami, has won more matches at only US Open (48) and Australian Open (50)
- 20 of 21 career singles titles have on hard court, most recently Cincinnati (NYC) in 2020

McCartney Kessler (USA #48) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #50) Kessler:

Bouzkova leads 1-0

- 1 of 10 Americans ranked in Top 50; reached a career-high ranking of No.47 earlier this year (Jan 13, 2025)
- Making sixth WTA 1000 appearance with best result being R16 run at 2025 Dubai
- Enters Miami with 13 main draw match wins in 2025, after winning eight in 2024 season
- Has reached three Tour-level finals since August 2024, winning titles at 2024 Cleveland and 2025 Hobart while finishing as runner-up at 2025 Austin; also won an ITF singles title in that stretch

Bouzkova:

- Making 31st appearance at WTA 1000 having previously reached the SF twice 2019 Toronto and 2022 Guadalajara
- Making fifth main draw appearance at Miami, with best result came at 2023 (I. Sabalenka)

Katie Boulter (GBR #35) vs. Peyton Stearns (USA #43)

Stearns leads 2-0

- **Boulter:**
- Making 4th appearance at Miami, where her previous and best result was reaching 4r in 2024 (I. Azarenka)
- Her 4r run at 2024 Miami was also her best WTA 1000 result, along with 4r at Toronto 2024 (I. Sabalenka)
- Looking for her first win against Top 50 opponents in 2025, having failed her two previous meetings so far this season against No.2 Swiatek at United Cup and No.7 Rybakina at Indian Wells
- Owns one hard court title at San Diego 2024
- Johanna Konta posted the best Miami result by a player from the United Kingdom by winning the title in 2017

Stearns:

- Making 2nd appearance at Miami, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Azarenka)
- Her best result at a WTA 1000 event was quarterfinal at Toronto 2024 (I. eventual champion Pegula)
- Best result on hard court is quarterfinal three times: Cleveland and Toronto in 2024; Austin in 2023
- United States of America has won Miami 15 times, most recently by Danielle Collins in 2024

Dayana Yastremska (UKR #42) vs. Belinda Bencic (SUI #45)

Bencic leads 3-1

- Yastremska:
- Making 3rd appearance at Miami, where her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (I. Sakkari)
- Best result at WTA-1000 events was QF run at Wuhan 2019 (I. Kvitova) and Dubai 2022 (I. Vondrousova)
- Owns five wins over Top 50 players (5-6 in 2025), most recently No.32 Ons Jabeur at Indian Wells 2025
- Owns two singles titles on hard court Hua Hin in 2019; Hong Kong in 2018

Bencic:

- Making 8th appearance at Miami, where her previous best result was reaching SF in 2022 (I. Osaka)
- Best result at WTA-1000 events was title run at Toronto 2015 (d. Halep) and Dubai 2019 (d. Kvitova)
- Is unbeaten against opponents ranked No.40 or higher in 2025 (8-0)
- Owns 7 singles titles on hard court, most recently Abu Dhabi 2025
- Has won 15 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.6 on tour for match wins (tied with Pegula)
- Since return to Tour has seen ranking climb from No.1213 (Nov 4, 2024) to her current No.45 ranking

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2024 produced a breakthrough performance at WTA 500 Tokyo to reach QF as a qualifier; also made main draw at WTA 250 Cleveland.
 Made the Top 200 for the first time in November
- · In 2023 made second ITF final at W25 Redding
- Began on ITF circuit in 2022 reaching first final at W15 Monastir; also played qualifying at Tokyo as a wild card
- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best winby-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top-50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- Owns three singles titles on ITF Circuit
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarter finals of Wimbledon and US Open in 2018


