MATCH NOTES - DAY 5 - SATURDAY, MARCH 22

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. [Q] Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #102) Sabalenka:

- Making her 7th appearance at Miami, where her best results have been two QF runs in 2021 (I. Barty) and 2023 (I. Cirstea)
- Following a 1r bye, she defeated Tomova in 58min and by only dropping three games (6-3 6-0)
- Sabalenka has won her last 16 matches against qualifiers, having last lost against Vekic at San Diego in 2022
- Since 1985, the WTA World No.1 is undefeated against qualifiers and lucky losers at Miami and Indian Wells
- Since the start of the 2024 season, Sabalenka holds a 26-1 win record against players outside the Top 50 (l. Anisimova at Toronto 2024)

Ruse:

- Making her 2nd appearance at Miami, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2022 (I. Rybakina)
- As a qualifier, has beaten P. Kuderemtova and seed No.29 Frech in the main draw
- Will face a World No.1 for the second time in her career, having lost to Swiatek in Rome 2022 (6-3 6-0)
- Could become the fifth qualifier to defeat a World No.1 at a WTA 1000 event, following Chang at Tokyo in 2009, Kontaveit at Rome in 2017, Jabeur at Beijing in 2018 and Kalinskaya at Dubai in 2024
- Playing to reach her maiden WTA 1000 4r, could become the first qualifier to reach the 4r at Miami since Gracheva in 2023

[3] Coco Gauff (USA #3) vs. [28] Maria Sakkari (GRE #51)

Gauff:

- Making 6th appearance at Miami, where her best result was 4r in 2024 (I. Garcia) and 2022 (I. Swiatek)
- Following a 1r bye, has defeated Kennin without a loss of a game (6-0 6-0) and in 47 minutes
- Maria Sakkari is the second opponent against whom Gauff will play 10+ WTA main draw matches in her career, after Iga Swiatek (14)
- Is 1 of 3 Americans in the Top 5 on the PIF WTA Rankings; there have been three Americans in the Top 5 since Feb. 24, 2025; prior to that the last time three Americans were ranked in the Top 5 was November 2003
- Owns a 4-5 career record against players from Greece, with record in 2025 standing at 1-0 (d. Sakkari at Indian Wells)
- Has lost two of her last three meetings against players ranked outside the Top 50 (I. Kessler at Dubai and Bencic at Indian Wells) after having won the previous 36 matches as such

Sakkari:

- Making her 8th appearance at Miami, where her best result was reaching semifinals in 2021 (I. Andreescu)
- Following a 1r bye, has defeated Lucia Bronzetti following a three-set and 2:48h battle on Thursday
- Has lost 11 of her last 12 meetings against Top 10 opponents, her last win coming in against Gauff at Indian Wells in 2024
- Is looking to win consecutive matches for the first time since the 2024 Paris Olympics, and for the fists time on hard court since Miami Open in 2024

[9] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #9) vs. [Q] Taylor Townsend (USA #90) *Qinwen Zheng:*

• Making her 4th appearance at Miami, where her best result has been reaching the 4r in 2023 (I. Potapova)

- Following a Ir bye, defeated American Davis in her previous round to now make her third consecutive 3r appearance at Miami
- Making her 24th WTA 1000 appearance, highlighted by a runner up finish at Wuhan in 2024 (I. Sabalenka)
- Owns a 15-7 career record against players from the United States, with a 1-1 record in 2025 (d. Davis previous round and I. Stearns at Dubai)
- Has won nine of her last 10 matches against players ranked 90 or below on the PIF WTA Rankings (I. No.97 Siegemund at Australian Open in 2025)

Townsend:

- Making her 5th appearance at Miami, where her best results were making 3r in 2024 (I. Rybakina) and in 2017 (I. Kuznetsova)
- As a qualifier, has defeated fellow American Li and seed No.19 Putintseva in the main draw
- Holds a 2-13 career record against Top 10 players, with the wins coming in against Pegula at Rome in 2023 and Halep at US Open in 2019
- Holds a 1-0 record against today's opponent, having defeated Zheng in the qualifying rounds at 2019 Miami
- Is also playing in the doubles draw, where along with Siniakova the pair are No.1 seeds; The doubles pair are also ranked No.1 on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals leaderboard having lifted the Australian Open and Dubai titles this year
- Has previously reached the doubles final at Miami in 2023 (along w/ Fernandez)

[31] Ons Jabeur (TUN #30) vs. [6] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #6)

Jabeur:

- Making her 6th appearance at Miami, where her best results have been 4r runs in 2021 (I. Sorribes Tormo) and 2022 (I. Collins)
- Following a 1r bye, has defeated Siniakova so far and with a win today is looking to equal her previous best career results at Miami
- Has already won four WTA 1000 matches in 2025, equalling such wins for the full 2024 season
- Owns 18 wins against Top 10 players, most recent win coming in against Qinwen Zheng in Doha 2025
- With seven tiebreaks played this season, she is the 5th player with most tiebreaks played, lead by Tauson (11), Navarro (9), Badosa and Shnaider (8 each)

Paolini:

- Making her 4th appearance at Miami, where her best result has been a 3r run in 2024 (I. Navarro)
- In her other appearances fell in the 1r in 2022 (I. Alexandrova) and in 2023 (I. Bjorklund)
- Following a 1r bye, has beaten Sramkova so far this week
- Has lost her five last meetings against Top 30 players, last win coming in against Rybakina at the WTA Finals Riyadh
- While the pair will face each other on hard court for the first time, Paolini has won the most recent encounter against Jabeur on clay (Stuttgart in 2024)

First meeting


- Is making her first main draw appearance at Miami, having contested qualifying on two occasions in 2023-24
- As a qualifier, has defeated Minnen and seed No.21 Vekic in the main draw to set a 3r encounter against the defending champion and seed No.14 Collins
- Holds a 3-7 win record against Top 20 players (d. No. 19 Vekic in the previous round, No.8 Sakkari at US Open in 2023 and No.17 Alexandrova at Linz in 2023)
- Is one of the four qualifiers to make the 3r, along with Ruse, Townsend and L. Fruhvirtova

Collins:

- Making her 7th appearance at Miami, where she returns as the defending champion
- Following a 1r bye, has beaten Cirstea to make her fourth consecutive 3r appearance here in Miami
- Owns 4-5 wins against players from Switzerland
- Has lost two of the last 15 matches against players ranked 160 or lower on the PIF WTA Rankings (I. No.198 Ruse at Hamburg in 2021 and via ret. I. No.175 Vickery at Guadalajara in 2023)
- Owns a 33-8 career record against qualifiers, with the 2025 record standing at 3-0 (d. Baptiste at Indian Wells, Aiava and Snigur at Australian Open)

- Best result by a qualifier at Miami was the Semi-Finalist run by Danielle Collins in 2018
- Is currently ranked No.102; this time last year was ranked No.170

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suarez Navarro in F) and

- Highlight of 2024 season was reaching first career Grand Slam third round at US Open earning second Top 10 win of career by beating No.8 Barbora Krejcikova in the second round; also reached quarterfinals at Rouen and semifinals at WTA 125 Paris and WTA 125 Hamburg
- 2023 highlight was reaching third WTA singles final of career, on home soil at Cluj-Napoca (l. Korpatsch)
- In 2022, reached 2r on nine occasions, including Australian Open (l. Kudermetova) and US Open (l. Gauff)
- During 2021 season, captured maiden WTA title at Hamburg (d. Petkovic in F) and finished R-Up at Palermo (l. Collins) - entered both tournaments as a qualifier
- Made Top 100 debut at No.99 on September 20, 2021
- Ended 2020 with her deepest ITF Circuit run of the season, at \$100k Dubai-UAE. Also reached two QFs at this level and fell in final round of qualifying at both Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Advanced to maiden WTA QF at 2019 Nottingham (as qualifier, l. Garcia)
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. A.Radwanska in 3s)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2016 Bucharest and scored first Tour-level win of career at 2017 Bucharest (d. Shinikova, l. Suarez Navarro)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2015 Bucharest
- Owner of six singles and 10 doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Played first professional events of career in Romania on ITF circuit in 2012

Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings

- Also in 2018, was R-Up at Lugano (l. Mertens) and Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki), made SF at Cincinnati, reached five QFs and produced a career-best Grand Slam run to R16 at US Open
- Entered Top 50 on April 16, 2018, after Lugano run, and Top 20 on August 27 of the same year, following New Haven title
- Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first Tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifting WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoeft)
- Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko)
- Member of Belarus Billie Jean King Cup team that lost to USA in 2017 final - scored first Top-20 win of career with defeat of No.13 Stephens during final in Minsk
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat
- Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, bringing back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012

- Coached by Anton Dubrov
- Previously coached by Dmitry Tursunov and Didi Kindlmann
- Started playing tennis when she was 6 by an accident when her father Sergey drove by the tennis courts and decided to give it a try
- Has a sweet tooth and considers something sweet as a perfect present; loves her grandmother's cooking, and looks forward to her pancakes when she is away from home
- Has a tiger tattoo on her left arm, which earned her the nickname "The Tiger"
- She spends her time off with family, catching up with friends, or reading; her favorite book is "The Count of Monte Cristo"




