MATCH NOTES - DAY 1 - SUNDAY, MAY 25

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Kamilla Rakhimova (#75)

Sabalenka leads 2-0

Sabalenka:

- Best results here in Paris were her SF run in 2023 (I. Muchova) and QF appearance in 2024 (I. Andreeva)
- Has only lost 1r here once, on debut in 2018 (I. Bertens)
- Three-time Slam winner, lifting the title at 2023-24 Australian Open and 2024 US Open; has made additional Slam finals at 2023 US Open and 2025 Australian Open
- Owns a 22-5 record in Slam 1r matches, last loss coming at 2020 Australian Open

Rakhimova:

- Her 3r run here in 2023 (I. today's opponent Sabalenka) is her joint-best result across the Slams, also making this stage at 2021 US Open
- This is her 13th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and owns a 4-8 record in Slam 1r matches
- Faces PIF WTA World No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in 1r today; second time facing the reigning No.1, falling to Swiatek at 2023 US Open in two tight sets losing 6-4 7-6(6)
- Best win of career rankings-wise came over No.19 Azarenka at 2024 Guadalajara

[4] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #4) vs. Yue Yuan (CHN #89)

Paolini leads 2-0

Paolini:

- Reached her debut Grand Slam final here last year, falling to Swiatek in the title match
- Was first Italian to reach a singles Slam final since Pennetta at US Open in 2015, and first to reach the final here in Paris since Errani in 2014
- Followed up R-Up finish here last year by also making the Wimbledon final, falling to Krejcikova
- Contesting Roland Garros at a career high of No.4, posted following historic Rome title earlier this month

Yuan:

- Making her 10th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and has progressed beyond the 1r once, at 2022 US Open where she reached 3r as a qualifier
- Overall is 1-8 in Slam 1r matches
- Faces No.4 Jasmine Paolini in 1r today; owns 1 win in career over a Top 10 player, coming against No.8 Zheng at Indian Wells last season

Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#51) vs. [8] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #8) Pavlyuchenkova leads 1-0

Pavlyuchenkova:

- Roland Garros singles finalist in 2021 (l. Krejcikova)
- Among active players, only two players have played more matches here in Paris 45 (Azarenka has played 46 and Stephens, 48)
- Former junior finalist here in 2006 (I. A.Radwanska)
- Like Zheng, her opponent today, is an Olympic gold medalist, having won the mixed doubles w/Rublev at Tokyo in 2021

Zheng:

- Triumphed on the clay of Roland Garros last year when she won Olympic gold medal in singles (d. Vekic in F)
- Coming of SF effort at Rome, where she defeated No.1 Sabalenka before falling to Gauff
- In addition to Paris Olympics, has won two clay court titles, back-to-back at Palermo WTA 250 (2023-24)
- Former Australian Open finalist (2024 Australian Open) looking to emulate countrywoman Li Na who became the first Chinese player to win a Grand Slam singles title here in 2011

[11] Diana Shnaider (#11) vs. [Q] Anastasiia Sobolieva (UKR #230)

Shnaider leads 1-0

This is their first Tour level encounter after Shnaider won at ITF level in Antalya in 2011

Shnaider:

- Making 3rd Roland Garros appearance, making 2r in 2023 and falling 1r in 2023
- Best return across the Slams is R16 run at 2024 US Open (I. eventual R-Up Pegula)
- Contesting Roland Garros at a career-high of No.11
- Faces No.230 Anastasiya Soboleva in 1r today last loss to a player Soboleva's rank or lower was almost two
 years ago, at 2023 Budapest (I. No.246 Timofeeva)

Sobolieva:

- Making debut Grand Slam main draw appearance here at 2025 Roland Garros
- Won through three rounds of qualifying to reach main draw, defeating Great Britain's Dart and Jones, along with France's Belgrava
- Had contested Slam qualifying twice before, at 2024 Wimbledon and US Open
- 2025 Roland Garros is third Tour level main draw outing, after 2023 Cluj-Napoca and 2024 Prague (both lost Ir as qualifier)

Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #76) vs. [13] Elina Svitolina (UKR #13)

First meeting

Sonmez:

- Making her second Roland Garros appearance after reaching 1r as a qualifier last year (I. Navarro)
- This is her third Grand Slam appearance and looking for her first main draw win today
- This is her third career meeting against a Top 10 player and looking for her first win today
- Only player from Turkey to feature in the main draw

Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result quarterfinals in 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023
- Has a match record of 38-6 in Grand Slam Ir (86.4%): has won 34 of her last 35 opening round matches at Slams dating back to 2015Australian Open with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- Is 11-0 in opening rounds at Roland Garros
- Recently claimed clay court title at Rouen (d. Danilovic in F), made SF at Madrid (I. Sabalenka) and QF at Rome (I. Stearns)
- Has a match record of 12-2 on clay so far this season

[Q] Nina Stojanovic (SRB #170) vs. [16] Amanda Anisimova (USA #16)

First meeting

Stojanovic:

- Making her third Roland Garros appearance and looking for her first main draw win today after playing 1r in 2020 and 2021
- Has reached the main draw at a Slam for the first time since 2021 US Open
- Looking for her first career win over a Top 20 player
- One of two players from Serbia in the main draw along with Danilovic

Anisimova:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, with a best result of SF in 2019 (I. Barty)
- Her 2019 Roland Garros SF was her best result across all Slams with her only other final 8 appearance at Wimbledon in 2022
- In the run up to Roland Garros this year, reached SF at Charleston (I. Kenin) and played WTA 125 Paris making QF (I. Paquet via retirement)
- Last time a player from USA won Roland Garros was Serena Williams in 2015

[18] Donna Vekic (CRO #18) vs. Anna Blinkova (#65)

Blinkova leads 1-0

Vekic:

- Making her 13th appearance here in Paris, with best result coming with R16 run in 2019
- Additionally won the Olympic Silver Medal at Roland Garros in 2024 when it staged the Olympics that year
- Overall this is her 46th Grand Slam main draw appearance, with best return across the Slams coming with SF run at 2024 Wimbledon

Blinkova:

- Making her 6th appearance at Roland Garros, where she has reached the 3r twice, in 2019 and 2023
- Overall this is her 26th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and has also reached the 3r at Wimbledon in 2023 and Australian Open in 2024
- Owns 8 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently defeating No.13 Diana Shnaider at Miami this season
- Has reached one WTA final on clay, finishing Runner-Up at Strasbourg in 2023

[26] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #26) vs. [Q] Sara Bejlek (CZE #193)

First meeting

Kostyuk:

- Making sixth appearance at Roland Garros, where her best previous result was reaching 4r in 2021 (I. Swiatek)
- Arrives in Paris with clay so far in 2025: advanced to QF at Madrid and R16 at Rome falling to Sabalenka on both occasions
- Best career result on clay is runner-up finish at 2024 Stuttgart (I. Rybakina)
- One of five players from Ukraine in the starting field this fortnight; Svitolina's four QF runs are the best by a Ukrainian woman here

Bejlek:

- Advanced to the main draw with qualifying wins over Barthel, Shibahara and Starodubtseva
- Best career result on clay so far is reaching R16 at 2024 Madrid
- Looking for her third career win over a Top 50 opponent today against Kostyuk
- Continues to play on the ITF Circuit and the WTA 125 level, when not on the main Tour

Petra Kvitova (CZE #608) vs. Viktorija Golubic (SUI #82)

Kvitova leads 1-0

Kvitova:

- Making 15th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was SF run in 2012 (I. eventual champion Sharapova) and 2020 (I. Kenin)
- Best results at Grand Slams are title runs at Wimbledon 2011 (d. Sharapova in F) and 2014 (d. Bouchard in F); also made final at Australian Open in 2019 (l. Osaka in F)
- Record in 1r matches at Roland Garros stands at 12-2, with the only two losses coming against Ferguson in 2010 and Cocciaretto in 2023
- Is playing her 6th tournament and first Grand Slam since she returned to play from maternity leave (Austin, Indian Wells, Miami, Madrid, Rome), having won one match at Rome (d. Begu)
- Five out of her 31 singles titles have come on clay at Stuttgart 2019, Madrid 2018, 2015 and 2011, Prague in 2018

Golubic:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Potapova) and 2016 (I. Safarova)
- Career best result at Grand Slams was QF run at Wimbledon 2021 (I. Ka. Pliskova)
- Looking to her first win on clay (2nd overall) of 2025 season
- Record in 1r at Grand Slams stands at 8-11 (2-5 at Roland Garros)
- Owns one singles title on clay at Gstaad 2016 (d. Bertens in F)

[Q] Leyre Romero Gormaz (ESP #150) vs. [WC] Tiantsoa Rakotomanga Rajaonah (FRA #238) First meeting

Romero Gormaz:

- Making main draw debut at Roland Garros, also her debut appearance across all majors
- Is playing her first main draw tournament on clay of 2025 season, having played qualifying at Madrid and Rome;
 also finished R-Up at Antalya 125 #1 (I. Todoni)
- As qualifier, has beaten Astakhova, Sharma and Klimovicova to make main draw
- Career best win by ranking was defeating No. 74 Dodin in qualifying at Madrid 2024; looking to her first main draw win of 2025 season today
- Has only played one main draw match at Tour level event on clay at lasi 2024 (I. Avanesyan in 1r)

Rakotomanga Rajaonah:

- Making main draw debut appearance at Roland Garros also her debut across all majors
- One of the seven teenagers in this year's field
- Before entering Roland Garros, has played just one Tour level event at Rouen 2025 (as qualifier, made QF)
- Faces No.150 Leyre Romero Gormaz in 1r today; career best win was defeating No.58 Bronzetti at Rouen 2025
- Is currently ranked at her career-best No.238 (just achieved on May 19); this time last year was ranked No.552

- Has won 34 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan.
 Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
