### **QUARTERFINAL QUICK HITS**

- The Top 2 seeds Aryna Sabalenka and Coco Gauff have advanced to the QF; the last time the Top 2 seeds advanced to the final at Roland Garros was 2013 No.1 seed Serena Williams def. No.2 seed Maria Sharapova.
- Sabalenka and Zheng square off in today's quarterfinal in a rematch of the 2025 Rome QF who by Zheng their first and only meeting on clay.
- Iga Swiatek continues her quest to become the first woman to win four successive Roland Garros titles in the Open Era; Seles and Henin both won three in a row
- Elina Svitolina (30y, 269d) and Madison Keys (30y, 111d) are the oldest players remaining in the draw. The last time two players 30+ years old reached the QF at Roland Garros was 2020

### Sabalenka leads 6-1

#### Sabalenka:

- Is the first player to reach the quarterfinals at 10 consecutive Slams since Serena Williams (also 10, US Open 2014 to Australian Open 2017)
- Is looking to reach her seventh WTA level semi-final in 2025: in the last 15 years (since 2010), only Iga Swiatek (eight) would have more by the end of the French Open
- Sabalenka served a season-high 11 aces in her R16 win over Amanda Anisimova
- Sabalenka has won a Tour-leading 38 matches this year
- Has held PIF WTA World No.1 ranking since October 21, 2024; during Roland-Garros, will mark her 40th and 41st total weeks at No.1 (pushing to 33 consecutive); will hold on to No.1 ranking after tournament
- Has reached six singles finals this year the most entering Roland Garros since 2013 (Serena Williams)
- Has won 3 titles this year Brisbane, Miami, Madrid

### Zheng:

- Making fourth appearance at Roland Garros, advancing to QF for the first time; previous best result with R16 on her debut in 2022 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Best result at Grand Slams was R-Up at Australian Open 2024 (I. Sabalenka in F)
- Owns 24 career wins over Top 20 players, including a win over No.1 Sabalenka at 2025 Rome
- Best result by a player from China is Li Na's run to the title in 2011
- Only Na Li (10) has reached more Women's Singles Grand Slam quarter-finals than Qinwen Zheng (four) in the Open Era among Chinese players
- Zheng can be the first player to defeat the WTA World No. 1 for 3+ consecutive clay court matches (Swiatek at the Olympics 2024 and Sabalenka in Rome) since Justine Henin (four in a row S. Williams in Charleston and Roland Garros 2003, Davenport in Charleston 2005 and Mauresmo in Berlin 2006)

### [5] Iga Swiatek (POL #5) vs. [13] Elina Svitolina (UKR #14)

#### Swiatek leads 3-1

#### Swiatek:

- Is on a 25-match winning streak at the tournament, following her title 3-peat (2022-24)
- Swiatek is the fifth player in the Open Era to win 25+ consecutive Singles matches at Roland Garros after Rafael Nadal, Chris Evert, Bjorn Borg and Monica Seles
- Swiatek (39-2) has become the player with the most main draw wins at the French Open in the Open Era after their first 40 matches, equaling Chris Evert
- Looking to become the first woman to win four successive Roland Garros titles in the Open Era; Seles and Henin both won three in a row
- Has won 10 WTA clay-court titles; this is first year since 2020 that is yet to win a title heading into Roland Garros

#### Svitolina:

- Making 12th main-draw appearance at Roland Garros, having also reached the QF in 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023
- Seeking a spot in her 13th career Grand Slam QF, and 5th at Roland Garros
- Has 32 wins at Roland Garros, the most wins of any event in her career
- Has registered 16 WTA main-draw wins on clay this season, the most of any player (with 27 wins this season overall) Since 2015, when she made her first at Roland Garros, only Serena Williams (16) has reached more Women's Singles Grand Slam quarterfinals than Elina Svitolina (13)

- Making her 8th appearance at RolandGarros, with best results coming with SF run in2023 (l.Muchova) and QF appearance in 2024(l.Andreeva)
- Is a three-time Grand Slam winner, lifting thetitle at 2023-24 Australian Open and 2024 US Open
- Faces No.7 Qinwen Zheng in QF today; leads the head-to-head 6-1 (recently fell to Zheng at 2025 Rome)
- Overall this is here 28th Grand Slam main drawappearance, and has also made the SFs atWimbledon (in 2021 and 2023)
- Has beaten Kamilla Rakhimova, Jil Teichmann, Olga Danilovic, and Amanda Anisimova so far this week
- Three-time clay court champion, winning Madridin 2021, 2023 and 2025
- Has already reached 12 Singles Grand Slam quarterfinals: since 2021, when she made her first in Wimbledon, only Novak Djokovic has more (14)
- No.1 seed has won the title here on 22occasions, most recently Swiatek last year
- Spending her 40th and 41st weeks as the PIF WTA World No.1 this fortnight
- During last year's European clay swing reachedQF at Roland Garros, Runner-Up atRome, Runner-Up at Madrid, QF at Stuttgart
- Has won 38 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins
- Is currently ranked No.1; this time last year was ranked No.2

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan.
   Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suarez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings

- Enjoyed best season of career in 2024, reaching her first Grand Slam final at the Australian Open, winning titles at Tokyo and Palermo, contesting the title match at her home tournament in Wuhan and closing out the season at her first WTA Finals, losing to Gauff in the final
  - An outstanding 2024 also saw her make her Top 10 and Top 5 debuts in the PIF WTA Rankings and the gold medal placed around her neck at the 2024 Paris Olympics
- Earned 2023 WTA Most Improved Player of year ending the season at No.15 and inside the Top 20 for the first time
- Won maiden WTA titles in 2023 at Palermo (d. Paolini in F) and Zhengzhou (d. Krejcikova in F); also reached final at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (l. Haddad Maia), SF at Abu Dhabi and first career Grand Slam QF at US Open (l. Sabalenka)

- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F)
- Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020
   Australian Open (streak broke by skipping 2020
   US Open). Is a two-time semifinalist at Grand
   Slam level, at 2019 Wimbledon (l. eventual
   champion Halep) and 2019 US Open (l.
   S.Williams). Became the first woman from
   Ukraine to reach a major SF; on the men's,
   Medvedev made that stage at Roland Garros in
   1993 (SF) and 1999 (R-Up)
- Highlight of 2019 was reaching the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th and most prestigious career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)
- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009

- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a threepeat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals
- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome.
   Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media.
   Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit

- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska) Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova)
- Other 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2020
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)

- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Kung in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016
