MATCH NOTES - DAY 3 – TUESDAY, MAY 27

[2] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. Olivia Gadecki (AUS #91)

First meeting

Gauff:

- For the first time since 2010, two Americans are among the Top 3 seeds at Roland Garros (as Pegula is No.3 seed)
- Strong clay-court results during European clay-court swing reaching the QF at Stuttgart (WTA 500) and back-to-back WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome
- Making 23rd Grand Slam main draw appearance and 6th at Roland Garros including a runner-up finish in 2022 and SF run in 2024
- Owns 5-0 record in first round matches at Roland Garros, the only Slam she is yet to lose in the opening round
- Has won 11 matches (11-3) on clay in 2025, ranked No.2 on tour for clay match wins, along with Sabalenka (11-2), only second to Svitolina (12-2)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 is 9-2 in 2025 season,

Gadecki:

- Making main draw debut at Roland Garros having played qualifying from 2021-24
- Facing WTA World No.2 today, the highest ranked opponent she has ever faced (previously No.4 Rybakina at 2024 Brisbane)
- Playing in sixth career main draw at a Slam; has once advanced out of first round (2r at 2023 Australian Open)
- Playing her 4th tournament on clay of 2025 season (Rome, Madrid, Charleston), having all failed in qualifying but played 1r at Rome as Lucky Loser (l. Dolehide)

Anca Todoni (ROU #88) vs. [3] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

First meeting

Todoni:

- Making tournament debut at Roland Garros
- Has won three WTA 125 and five ITF Circuitry singles titles on clay
- This is Todoni's third career match-up against a Top 5 ranked opponent – previously 0-2 (l. No.2 Gauff at 2024 Wimbledon and No.5 Q.Zheng at 2025 Australian Open)
- Seeking first win over a Top 100 opponent in a main draw match-up
- This time last year was ranked No.179

Pegula:

- Won first Tour-level clay-court title at Charleston (green clay) in April but has posted 3-4 record on red clay since
- Making sixth main draw appearance at Roland Garros with best result being QF in 2022; did not play at 2024 Roland Garros due to injury
- Finalist in doubles in 2022, partnering with Coco Gauff
- Owns 18-6 record in opening round matches at the Slams, winning 16-straight R128 matches; her last opening round loss at a Slam came at 2020 Roland Garros
- The oldest player to earn a Top 3 seed since 2016 (Serena Williams)

[6] Mirra Andreeva (#6) vs. Cristina Bucsa (ESP #98)

First meeting

Andreeva:

- The youngest Top 6 seed at Roland Garros since 2007 (Nicola Pietrangeli)
- Has won 7 of 8 opening round matches with only loss coming at 2024 Wimbledon (I. Fruhvirtova)
- Since 1990 only two players have reached back-to-back semifinals at Roland Garros before turning 19: Moica Seles and Martina Hingis
- Only Aryna Sabalenka and Jessica Pegula have won more matches than Andreeva this year (27, tied with Iga Swiatek)

Bucsa:

- Lost in straight-sets in each of her previous seven meetings against Top 10 ranked opponents (0-6)
- Playing in main draw at a Slam for the 14th time and 4th time at Roland Garros
- With a win today, would equal her best result at Roland Garros (2r, 2024); her best result at a Slam has been a R32 finish at 2023 Australian Open

[14] Karolina Muchova (CZE #13) vs. Alycia Parks (USA #52)

First meeting

Muchova:

- Former finalist here at Roland Garros, finishing R-Up in 2023 (d. No.2 Sabalenka in SF, I. Swiatek in F)
- Overall this is her 23rd Grand Slam main draw appearance, and has reached at least the QF at every major, making the SF at Australian Open (2021), the QF at Wimbledon (2019, 2021) and back-to-back SFs at the US Open in 2023 and 2024
- Withdrew from 2024 Roland Garros with wrist injury
- Faces No.52 Alycia Parks in 1r today - in first event contested since Miami

Parks:

- Making her 2nd appearance at Roland Garros, falling 1r in 2024 (I. Vondrousova)
- Overall this is her 7th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and best result across the Majors is making 3r at 2024 Australian Open
- Owns a 2-4 record in Slam 1r matches, having also made 2r at US Open in 2023
- Owns 5 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently overcoming No.13 Diana Shnaider at Doha 2025

[24] Elise Mertens (BEL #22) vs. [WC] Lois Boisson (FRA #361)

First Meeting

Mertens:

- Has reached R16 at all four Slams including three times at Roland Garros (2018, 2022, 2023)
- Former WTA World No.1 in doubles for 39 weeks; also reached career-high ranking of No.12 in singles
- Last time faced an opponent ranked outside Top 300 was 2023 Roland Garros (I. Pavlyuchenkova in R16)

Boisson:

- Making Grand Slam main draw debut at 22 years old
- Previously, only Grand Slam appearances came in qualifying at Roland Garros (2021, 2022, 2023)

[25] Magdalena Frech (POL #26) vs. Ons Jabeur (TUN #36)

Jabeur leads 2-0

Frech:

- Has reached the 2r here twice, in 2018 and 2023
- Overall this is her 16th Grand Slam main draw appearance, with best return coming at 2024 Australian Open where she made R16
- Owns 16 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently overcoming No.16 Beatriz Haddad Maia at Doha 2025
- One of three Polish women in PIF WTA Top 100 – all inside the Top 50 – also No.5 Iga Swiatek and No.32 Magda Linette

Jabeur:

- Has reached the quarterfinal here in Paris twice, in 2023 and 2024
- Is a three-time Slam R-Up, reaching the title match at 2022 Wimbledon (I. Rybakina), 2022 US Open (I. Swiatek) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Vondrousova)
- In the last five years (since 2021) only Iga Swiatek, Aryna Sabalenka and Coco Gauff have won more matches on clay than Jabeur (49)

[30] Anna Kalinskaya (#28) vs. Marie Bouzkova (CZE #47)

Bouzkova leads 2-1

Kalinskaya:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at Roland Garros having reached the second round once (2024)
- Overall this is 18th Grand Slam appearance (main draw)
- Former WTA World No.11 reached the QF at 2024 Australian Open, her best result at a Slam
- This is fourth Slam as a seed – also at 2024 Roland Garros, 2024 Wimbledon and 2024 US Open

Bouzkova:

- Won the first two meetings – 2020 Cincinnati (NYC) and 2022 Guadalajara – but lost most recent meeting at 2024 Wimbledon
- Making 7th main draw appearance at Roland Garros with best result coming last year reaching R32
- Wimbledon is the only Slam Bouzkova has reached the second week – R16 in 2023 and QF in 2022
- Best career result on clay is runner-up at Bogota 2024 (I. Osorio in Final)

Varvara Gracheva (FRA #72) vs. [31] Sofia Kenin (USA #30)

Gracheva:

- Currently the top-ranked Frenchwoman on PIF WTA Rankings; next highest ranked is No.93 Diane Parry
- Began representing France after obtaining French passport in June 2023, having lived in the country for five years
- Coming off SF run at WTA 125 Paris event (I. eventual champion Boulter)
- Has won last four opening round matches at Roland Garros
- Advanced to R16 here last year (I. M.Andreeva)
- Most recent win over a Top 50 opponent was No.43 Stearns in Austin earlier this year
- Is 4-11 in main draws against former Grand Slam champions

Kenin:

- Has won 13 matches at Roland Garros, her highest tally at a tournament
- Making 28th Grand Slam main draw appearance and 6th at Roland Garros
- Former Roland Garros finalist, falling to Swiatek in 2020 title bout
- Reached second clay court final of career at Charleston in April (I. Pegula)
- Has not lost to a player ranked outside Top 50 since Hobart at start of season (No.118 Joint)

[Q] Tereza Valentova (CZE #172) vs. [WC] Chloe Paquet (FRA #119)

First Meeting

Valentova:

- Making Grand Slam debut appearance at Roland Garros, as a qualifier
- Won the Girl's Singles title at Roland Garros 2024 (d. Samson in F)
- Owns career record 8-1 against French opponents at ITF level
- Today mark's career debut at WTA level main draw
- 1 of 7 teenagers in the main draw

Paquet:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous and best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (l. Vondrousova) - her best result at a Slam
- Holds 2-9 record in Grand Slam opening rounds, only winning at Roland Garros (2024, 2017)
- French wildcards have lost last four meetings against qualifiers/lucky losers in Women's Singles - last French wildcard to defeat Q/LL at Roland Garros was Razzano in 2015
- Best career result on clay is SF run which she has reached 2 times: Iasi 250 in 2024; Strasbourg in 2019
- Bidding to win first Tour-level match of 2025

[WC] Elsa Jacquemont (FRA #138) vs. Maria Sakkari (GRE #90)

First meeting

Jacquemont:

- Playing in 7th career Grand Slam main draw; best result at a Slam thus far has been R64 finish at 2022 Roland Garros
- French Open junior Champion in 2020
- Competing just two places shy of her career-high ranking of No.137
- Looking for her first main draw, Tour-level match win of the season but has enjoyed success at the WTA 125 and ITF levels
- One of nine Frenchwomen in the starting field at 2025 Roland Garros

Sakkari:

- Playing in 14th main draw in of the season, the highest tally on Tour; her best result thus far has been a QF finish at Linz
- Making 37th career main draw appearance at a Grand Slam; this is her 9th main draw appearance at Roland Garros
- Has twice reached SF at a Slam including at 2021 Roland Garros; also reached SF at 2021 US Open
- Ranking dipped to No.92 on May 19 (currently No.90), her lowest ranking since the week of August 28, 2017
- Reunited with longtime coach Tom Hill in April this year, after 14 months apart
- Former World No.3, looking to advance past 1r here in Paris for the first time since 2022
- Last loss to a player ranked outside Top 100 was to No.135 Raducanu at Wimbledon last year

- Career best result at Grand Slams was 2r run at Australian Open 2023 (l. Kostyuk)
- Faces No.2 Coco Gauff in 1r today; owns 1 win in career over Top 10 players, having defeated No.4 Sofia Kenin at Melbourne 250 in 2021 - also her best career win by ranking
- Owns 3-6 career record against players from United States of America (0-2 in 2025), playing today's opponent Gauff for the first time
- Her sole win at Grand Slams was winning opening match at Australian Open 2023 (d. P. Kudermetova)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakthrough performance of 2024 came at WTA 500 Guadalajara where she achieved runner-up as a qualifier (l. Frech in F). The result pushed her ranking into the Top 100 for the first time, peaking at No.83 on Oct 7, 2024.
- Broke into Top 200 for first time at beginning of 2023, reaching first Grand Slam at Australian Open (l. Kostyuk in 2r). Also made US Open main draw (as qualifier, l. Andreeva in 1r) and climbed to No. 127 by end of 2023.
- Strongest Tour level result of 2022 came at s Hertogenbosch on grass where she reached 1r as a qualifier (l. Kalinina).
- Played first full year of tournaments in 2021 winning ITF titles at \$15K Antalya and \$25K Vigo. Also made WTA debut at Gippsland Trophy before defeating No.1 seed Sofia Kenin to reach R16 at Phillip Island Trophy.

Made ITF debut in 2016 at Brisbane \$25K at age of 14.

- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l.

eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)

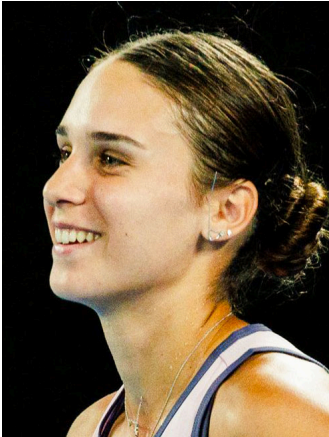

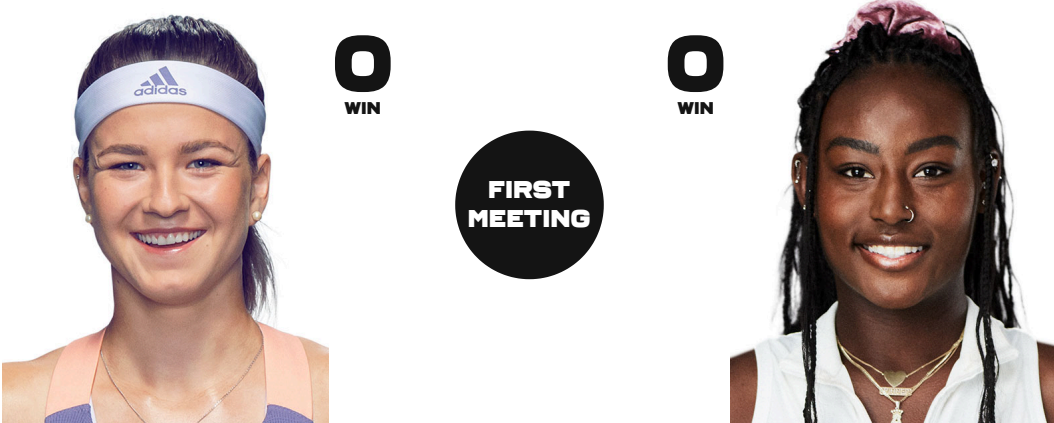

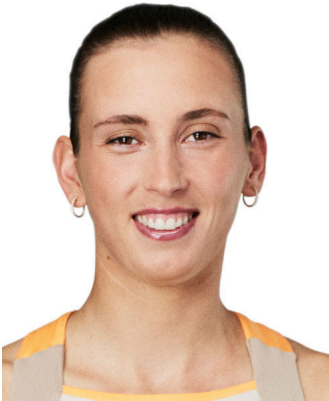

CAREER MILESTONES

- Achieved best result of 2024 at Tokyo with runner-up (l. Zheng in final). In doubles claimed her third and fourth career titles at Abu Dhabi and Miami w/Bethanie Mattek-Sands.
- Strongest result of 2023 was runner-up at San Diego (l. Krejčíková). Also reached SF at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto) and Guadalajara (l. Dolehide). As a qualifier, posted her best Wimbledon result with 3r (l. Svitolina). Moved 202 positions up the ranking from her 2022 year-end position (from No. 235 to No.33).
- Best results of 2022 were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
- Reached R16 at US Open and was one of only two players (also Kvitová) to reach second week of all three Slams in 2020
- Lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F) becoming the first player in 2020 to win a second title
- Won maiden major at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008. Defeated No.1 Barty and home favorite in SF for third career win over a reigning World No.1
- Australian Open run helped her break into the Top 10 for the first time at No.7 on February 3, 2020
- Won 2019 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year award after winning three WTA titles at Hobart (d. Schmiedlova in F), Mallorca (d. Bencic in F) and Guangzhou (d. Stosur in F)
- Finished 2019 at No.14 as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38-tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Toronto (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys), subsequently leading to Top 20 debut at No.20 on August 19, 2019

- Began the year at a career high ranking of No.39 and a strong opening result at Auckland with quarterfinal (l. Gauff). Posted her best Grand Slam result to date with R16 at Roland Garros (l. M.Andreeva) and reached semifinals at WTA 125s Paris (l. Shnaider) and Hong Kong (l. Tauson)
- Stand out results of 2023 were achieving runner-up at Austin and two quarterfinals, firstly on clay at Strasbourg (l. Svitolina) and then on grass at Bad Homburg (l. Bronzetti). Also advanced to R16 at both Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Rybakina) and Miami (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitová). Top ranking of the season of No. 40 was achieved on August 7, 2023.
- Best results of 2022 were runs to QF at Chennai (l. eventual champion Fruhvirtová) and 3r at Roland Garros (l. Mertens). Also reached 2r on four occasions
- Second Top 100 season in 2021 finishing the year at No.79, in a season highlighted by making her WTA SF debut at Chicago 250 and posting a career-best 14 main draw match wins
- Highlight of 2020 campaign was 3r showing at US Open (l. Martić); in 2r recovered from 6-1 5-1 down, saving 4MP to upset No.44 Mladenovic
- Ended 2019 at No.105, nearly 300 places up from her 2018 finish after a campaign in which she posted a 70-26 win-loss record, lifting five titles on the ITF Circuit, including at \$60K Valencia and \$60K Saint-Malo
- Recorded first WTA victory during 2r run at 2019 Washington DC (as qualifier, d. Blinkova, l. Hsieh)
- Fell 1r on WTA debut (main draw and qualifying) at 2019 Lausanne (as qualifier, l. X.Han), while made Grand Slam qualifying debut at US Open later that summer
- During 2018 season, won second ITF Circuit title of career at \$15k/Antalya-TUR and reached three other QFs at this level
- On ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Egypt in 2016
- Contested Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open as a junior, with best result a 3r run at 2016 Wimbledon

- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati) to become first player since October 2001 to defeat World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (after McHale)
- Advanced to R16 at 2019 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams, l. eventual champion Barty) - became first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF
- Also won maiden doubles titles in 2019 at Auckland (w/Bouchard) and Beijing (w/Mattek-Sands)
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team from 2018-20
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Marino in 1r)
- Owns four ITF singles titles and two doubles titles
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China
