## MATCH NOTES - DAY 4 - WEDNESDAY, MAY 28

## [1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Jil Teichmann (SUI #97)

### Sabalenka:

- Has held PIF WTA World No.1 ranking since October 21, 2024; during Roland Garros, will mark her 40th and 41st total weeks at No.1 (pushing to 33 consecutive); will hold on to No.1 ranking after tournament

- Won only previous meeting at 2022 Doha in R16 in straight-sets 6-2 6-1

- Has reached six singles finals this year - the most entering Roland Garros since 2013 (Serena Williams)

- Has won 3 titles this year - Brisbane, Miami, Madrid

#### Teichmann:

- Advanced to R16 at 2022 Roland Garors, her best Grand Slam result to date (making 17th Slam appearance); also stands as the only other time she has advanced past the second round at a Slam

- Playing world No.1 for the 3rd time in career, having failed both of her previous two meetings against such opponents, I. Barty at Cincinnati 2021 (in F) and I. Swiatek at Bad Homburg 2023

- Defeated Lucrezia Stefanini in 1r - her first win on clay of the 2025 season

## [4] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #4) vs. Ajla Tomaljanovic (AUS #71)

Paolini:

- Reached her first Grand Slam final here last year, falling to Swiatek in the title match

- Was first Italian woman to reach a singles Slam final since Pennetta (won) and Vinci (runner-up) played an all-Italian final at the 2015 US Open

- Followed up R-Up finish here last year by also making the Wimbledon final, falling to Kreicikova
- Contesting Roland Garros at her career-high ranking of No.4, posted following historic Rome title earlier this month

- Won WTA 1000 title at Rome, first Italian woman to win the title at Italian Open in 40 years

### Tomljanovic:

- Making 10th main-draw appearance at Roland Garros; her career-best tournament result is reaching R16 in her 2014 main-draw debut

- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Paula Badosa at 2022 Cincinnati (since then, she has gone 0-7 vs. Top 10 players)

- Defeated fellow Australian Maya Joint in Monday's 1r, reversing a loss to Joint (via retirement) in last week's Rabat SF

- Has reached 3 Grand Slam QFs (2021 Wimbledon, 2022 Wimbledon and 2022 US Open)

#### Emma Raducanu (GBR #41) vs. [5] Iga Swiatek (POL #5)

#### Raducanu:

- Playing Roland Garros for just the second time (I. 2r in 2022)
- Contesting 12th Grand Slam main draw of career; in her 2nd Grand Slam main draw appearance, she won the 2021 US Open title, becoming the first qualifier to win a Grand Slam singles title in the Open Era
- Owns 3 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.10 Emma Navarro at 2025 Miami
- Defeated No.17 Daria Kasatkina at last week at Strasbourg, her first career Top 20 win on clay
- Most recent British woman to win the Roland Garros singles title is Sue Barker in 1976

#### Swiatek:

- Has won previous four meetings, all in straight-sets, including at 2025 Australian Open (R32)
- After first-round win (d. Sramkova), is on a 22-match winning streak at tournament, following her title 3-peat (2022-24)
   Looking to become the first woman to win four successive Roland Garros titles in the Open Era; Seles and Henin both won three in a row

- Has won 10 WTA clay-court titles; this is first year since 2020 that she hasn't won a title heading into the French Open

- Holds a 21-2 record in Grand Slam 2r matches; she has not lost before the 3r of a Grand Slam since 2019

### [8] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7) v. Emiliana Arango (COL #85)

#### Zheng:

- Making fourth appearance at Roland Garros; previous best result was R16 on debut in 2022 (I. eventual champ Swiatek)
- Best result at Grand Slams was R-Up at Australian Open 2024 (I. Sabalenka in F)
- Defeated Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova in 1r, raising her record in 1r matches at Grand Slams to 12-2
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 is 5-1 in 2025, with sole loss to No. 97 Siegemund at Australian Open 2025
- Owns three singles titles on clay at Paris Olympic 2024 (same venue), Palermo in 2023-2024

#### Arango:

- Making Grand Slam main-draw debut appearance at Roland Garros, having played qualifying from 2022-2024
- Defeated Alexandra Eala in 1r to score her first Grand Slam win
- Has failed her previous three meetings against Top 10 opponents
- Career best win by ranking was defeating No.26 Potapova at Guadalajara 2023
- Best career result on clay is QF run at Bogota 2018
- Last time a Colombian woman reached R32 at Roland Garros was 2017 Mariana Duque-Marino (R32)

## Dayana Yastremska (UKR #48) v. [11] Diana Shnaider (#12)

#### Yastremska:

- Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (I. Gauff)
- Career best result at a Grand Slams was SF run at Australian Open 2024 (I. Zheng)
- Looking to her first Top 20 win since defeating No.7 Marketa Vondrousova at Australian Open 2024
- Career best win by ranking was defeating world No.2 Ka. Pliskova at Wuhan 2019
- Owns one singles title on clay at Strasbourg 2019

### Shnaider:

- Making her main draw 3rd appearance at Roland Garros, making 2r in 2023 and falling 1r in 2023

- 2025 Roland-Garros is 8th Grand Slam main draw appearance, with best return coming with R16 run at 2024 US Open (I. eventual R-Up Pegula)

- With a win today would be through to her first 3r at Roland Garros
- Owns one singles title on clay at Budapest 2024
- Is currently ranked No.12 (career high at No.11)

## [12] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11) vs. [WC] Iva Jovic (USA #129)

### Rybakina:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best results were QFs in 2021 (I. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Paolini)

- At other majors, won 2022 Wimbledon title (d. Jabeur in F); also reached 2023 Australian Open final (l. Sabalenka)
- On a 5-match winning streak after claiming last week's Strasbourg title, snapping a year-long title drought
- 4 of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2019 Bucharest, 2023 Rome, 2024 Stuttgart and 2025 Strasbourg

### Jovic:

- 17-year-old wild card is making her Roland Garros debut this year

- Contesting just her 3rd Grand Slam main draw, and has won her 1r match on all 3 occasions (also 2r finishes at 2024 US Open and 2025 Australian Open)

- Seeking her first Top 20 win in 3rd attempt (I. Rybakina at 2025 Australian Open; I. Paolini at 2025 Indian Wells)

- Best career WTA Tour-level result on clay is R16 at 2025 Bogota; also won ITF W100 Challenger clay-court title at Charlottesville, VA, USA this April

## Anna Bondar (HUN #82) vs. [13] Elina Svitolina (UKR #14)

#### Bondar:

- Making 3rd appearance at Roland Garros, has reached the 2r for the first time
- Defeated Laura Siegemund in the 1r so far this week
- Owns one win in career over a Top 20 player (d. No.14 Karolina Pliskova at Rome 2023)

- Only player from Hungary to reach 2r; the last time a Hungarian woman reached R32 at Roland Garros was 2009 –

- Agnes Szavay (R16) and Melinda Czink (R32)
- Owns one career Top 20 win defeating No.14 Karolina Pliskova at 2023 Rome

#### Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching QF in 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023
- Defeated Zeynep Sonmez in the 1r so far this week
- Has a match record of 13-2 on clay so far this season

- Owns seven Tour-level clay court titles: Rouen 2025, Strasbourg 2023, Strasbourg 2020, Rome 2018; Rome 2017, Istanbul 2017, Marrakech 2015

- Former WTA World No.3

### [16] Amanda Anisimova (USA #16) vs. Viktorija Golubic (SUI #78)

#### Anisimova:

- Making 21st Grand Slam appearance

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where best result was reaching SF in 2019 (I. No.8 Ashleigh Barty)
- Holds a 1-0 record against Golubic, winning their lone meeting at Chicago 2021
- This time last year was ranked No.231

#### Golubic

- Making 31st career Grand Slam appearance

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Roland Garros; with a win today would reach the R32 for the first time at Roland Garros; thus far, her best result here has been reaching the 2r in 2024 and 2016

- Defeated Petra Kvitova in the opening round
- Owns seven wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.17 Veronika Kudermetova at Australian Open 2024

- Best career result on clay is champion at Gstaad 2016

## Bernada Pera (USA #83) vs. [18] Donna Vekic (CRO #19)

#### Pera:

- Making her 13th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland-Garros this fortnight, with best result coming with R16 run in 2019

- Additionally won the Olympic Silver Medal here at Roland-Garros in 2024 when it staged the Olympics that year

- Bidding to win back-to-back matches for fourth time this season, after Australian Open R16, Indian Wells R16 and Madrid R16 (Roland-Garros is 12th tournament of 2025)

#### Vekic:

- Making her 13th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland-Garros this fortnight, with best result coming with R16 run in 2019

- Additionally won the Olympic Silver Medal here at Roland-Garros in 2024 when it staged the Olympics that year

- Bidding to win back-to-back matches for fourth time this season, after Australian Open R16, Indian Wells R16 and

Madrid R16 (Roland-Garros is 12th tournament of 2025)



- Three-time Slam winner, lifting the title at 2023-24 Australian Open and 2024 US Open. Has made additional Slam finals at 2023 US Open (l. Gauff) and 2025 Australian Open (l. Keys)
- Going into Roland Garros with a 11-2 record on clay in 2025 - won at Madrid (d. Gauff in F), finished R-Up at Stuttgart (l. Ostapenko) and reached QF at Rome (l. Zheng)
- Has beaten Kamilla Rakhimova in opening match, raising record in 1r at Roland Garros to 6-1
- Faces No.98 Jil Teichmann in 2r today, having won all of her previous 9 meetings against opponents outside Top 50 in 2025 season
- Record in 2r matches at Roland Garros stands at 5-1, with the only loss to Anisimova in 2019
- Overall record in 2r matches at Slams is 18-4 having won all the past 16 second round, with the latest loss at US Open 2020 (l. Azarenka)
- Owns 5-2 career record against players from Switzerland, (0-0 in 2025), having played and defeated today's opponent Teichmann once at Doha 2022
- Owns three clay titles, all coming at Madrid, in 2021, 2023 and 2025
- Is currently ranked No.1; this time last year was ranked No.2
- Top Seed at a major for second time in career, after 2025 Australian Open. Top seed has won the Roland-Garros title on 22 occassions, most recently Swiatek in 2024
- During last year's European clay swing reached QF at Roland Garros, R-Up at Rome, R-Up at Madrid, QF at Stuttgart
- Has won 35 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins

## **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career





## **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best winby-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top-50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- Owns three singles titles on ITF Circuit
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarter finals of Wimbledon and US Open in 2018

- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a threepeat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals
- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak joint-longest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit



- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021, following title run at W60 ITF Circuit event in Santiago, Chile
- Ended 2021 in fine form, winning 27 matches after US Open, lifting titles at WTA 125K Series event at Buenos Aries and two ITF Circuit tournaments
- In 2020, reached two QF on ITF Circuit and made 2r at WTA 125K Series event at Prague
- Suffered 1r defeat on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Budapest (l. Cirstea). Also that year, fell 1r at Bucharest (as qualifier, l. Tig) and in qualifying on three occasions

- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skai. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)



# **CAREER MILESTONES**

- In 2024 posted her best Tour results on the Asian swing with quarterfinals at Guangzhou and Hong Kong. Also reached the final at WTA 125 Gaiba
- Highlights of 2023 included a QF appearance at Hobart and posting her strongest Grand Slam result to date at Roland Garros with R16
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2022, claiming first two WTA singles titles at Budapest (d. Krunic in F) and Hamburg (d. Kontaveit in F)
- Followed back-to-back titles in Budapest and Hamburg last summer with R-Up finish at WTA 125K Series event in Concord, stretching winning streak to 16 matches and resulting in Top-50 debut (August 15, 2022)
- Last season also reached SFs at Cleveland (l. eventual champion Samsonova)
- In 2021 advanced to 2r but never further on 10 occasions, including at Australian Open
- In doubles, broke into Top 50 for the first time at the end of 2021, thanks in part to SF run at Roland Garros w/Linette
- Reached 2r five times in 2020, including at US Open and Roland Garros
- Scored her second career Top-20 victory in 2019 against No.16 Q.Wang at Prague
- Reached a then-career-high ranking of No.63 on July 29, 2019 after back-to-back SF runs at Lausanne (l. Ferro) and Jurmala (l. Kawa)
- Captured her ninth ITF Circuit singles title in 2019 at \$100K ITF/Trnava 3-SVK (d. Blinkova in F)
- Reached first Tour-level QF of career at 2018 Charleston (l. eventual R-Up and No.14 Keys in 3s)
- Nominated for WTA's Breakthrough Player of the Month in April 2018 following Charleston run, which was eventually won by Bogdan (fan vote)
- As lucky loser, scored career first main draw win at the 2018 Australian Open (d. Blinkova 1r), first Top 100 win and Top 10 win (over No.10 Konta 2r) at the Australian Open (l. Strycova in 3r). Became first lucky loser to reach 3r of Australian Open since 1997 (Kleinova)
- Rose nearly 200 ranking places in 2017, ending season at No.127 after posting 54-20 record (all levels)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Guangzhou (l. Cornet) and contested qualifying at US Open, Wuhan, Linz and Moscow. That year, also made 1r exit at WTA 125K Series event at Limoges (l. Alexandrova)
- In 2015 won first titles on ITF Circuit at \$10k ITF/Alkmaar-NED, \$10k ITF/Breda-NED and \$10k

- In 2024, achieved best Grand Slam result reaching SF at Wimbledon (l. Paolini). Won Silver Medal at Paris Olympics (l. Zheng in F), the first Olympic medal in women's singles for Croatia. Finished runner-up at Bad Homburg (l. Shnaider in F), reached SF at Linz (l. Alexandrova). Reached her career best ranking at No.18 on Oct 7, 2024.
- In 2023, posted best Australian Open result with QF (l. eventual champion Sabalenka), equalling best Grand Slam result (QF finish at 2019 US Open). Claimed fourth career title at Monterrey (d. Garcia) and runner-up at Berlin (l. Kvitova). Results brought ranking back into Top 20 for first time since 2019 and qualification for Zhuhai Elite Trophy.
- 2022's highlight was R-Up finish at San Diego (as qualifier, l. Swiatek). Elsewhere, made QF at Birmingham and Tallinn
- Lifted third WTA title of her career at Courmayeur in October 2021 (d. Tauson in F)
- Underwent knee surgery at start of 2021, but experienced some setbacks since her return to Tour last summer, tearing plantar fascia and suffering from knee and foot injuries in spring 2022
- Contested the first match of the WTA Tour's resumption following the hiatus, defeating Rus in the 1r at 2020 Palermo
- Ended 2019 ranked No.19 for career-best yearend finish (up from No.34 in 2018), having cracked the Top 20 for the first time on October 21, 2019
- Produced career best Grand Slam result at 2019 US Open, where she reached QF (l. Bencic)
- Also in 2019, finished R-Up at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); en route to final, posted best win of career by ranking - and third over a Top 5 opponent - with defeat of No.2 Kvitova in QF, bettering victories over No.4 Stephens at 2018 Wimbledon and No.4 Garcia at 2018 Tokyo [PPO]
- Also made final at Nottingham (l. Garcia in third set tie-break) and ended 2019 by qualifying for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (fell RR)
- Ended 2018 at then-career-high ranking of No.34, after registering 31 tour-level wins. Campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Washington, DC (l. Kuznetsova after holding 4mp) - her first finals appearance since winning 2017 Nottingham - and made SF showings at Nottingham and Tokyo [PPO], and reached Grand Slam R16 for first time at Wimbledon (l. Goerges)

ITF/Rotterdam-NED. Also fell in qualifying at Quebec City. Improved ranking from No.646 to No.361

- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2014 Quebec City
- On ITF Circuit has won nine titles in singles and eight in doubles
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in 2011 at \$10k ITF/Landisville, PA-USA
- Enjoyed a resurgent year in 2017, breaking the Top 50 on July 24 and finishing campaign ranked No.54. Grass court season saw her lift a second WTA singles title of career, at Nottingham (d. No.8 Konta in final) - prior to this run had not posted back-to-back main draw wins since September 2015 (R-Up at Tashkent)
- Posted just four tour-level wins across 2016, but closed the campaign by reaching two ITF finals, winning her fifth and most recent title at this level at \$100k ITF/Sharm El Sheikh-EGY
- Highlights in 2015 included reaching final at Tashkent (l. Hibino) and QF at Baku
- Ranked No.95, lifted maiden WTA singles title at 2014 Kuala Lumpur (d. No.10 Cibulkova in final); aged 17 y 10 m, became youngest player to win a WTA singles title since 2006 Bangkok (Vania King)
- Reached first WTA career final at 2012 Tashkent (l. Begu) on her WTA main draw debut, and in doing so became youngest WTA finalist since 15year-old Paszek won Portoroz in 2005
- Broke into Top 100 (at No.93) on January 28, 2013 Has won five ITF Circuit singles and one doubles title
- Member of Croatian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2019
