MATCH NOTES - DAY 6 – FRIDAY, MAY 30

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Olga Danilovic

Sabalenka lead 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Has now reached at least the 3r at last 16 Slams contested, dating back to 2021 Australian Open
- Has held PIF WTA World No.1 ranking since October 21, 2024; during Roland-Garros, will mark her 40th and 41st total weeks at No.1 (pushing to 33 consecutive); will hold on to No.1 ranking after tournament
- Has reached six singles finals this year – the most entering Roland Garros since 2013 (Serena Williams)
- Has won 3 titles this year – Brisbane, Miami, Madrid

Danilovic:

- Can match best Paris and Slam result by winning through to the R16 today
- Made R16 here in 2024 (as qualifier, I. Vondrousova) and also at the Australian Open in 2025 (I. Badosa)
- First time facing the reigning WTA World No.1 player. Highest ranked player faced prior was the World No.6 on two occasions – defeating Pegula this year at Australian Open and falling to Vondrousova here last year

[4] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #4) vs. [LL] Yuliia Starodubtseva (UKR #81)

First meeting

Paolini:

- Reached her first Grand Slam final here last year, falling to Swiatek in the title match
- Was first Italian woman to reach a singles Slam final since Pennetta (won) and Vinci (runner-up) played an all-Italian final at the 2015 US Open
- Followed up R-Up finish here last year by also making the Wimbledon final, falling to Krejčíková
- Contesting Roland Garros at her career-high ranking of No.4, posted following historic Rome title earlier this month
- Won WTA 1000 title at Rome, first Italian woman to win the title at Italian Open in 40 years

Starodubtseva:

- Through to 3r at a Slam for the first time, bettering 2r at 2024 Wimbledon
- Looking to earn her first career Top 10 win in first third round at a Slam today
- Best career result on clay is R16 run at Madrid in 2025 (I. M. Andreieva)

[5] Iga Swiatek (POL #5) vs. Jaquelin Cristian (ROU #60)

First meeting

Swiatek:

- Following 1r and 2r wins, is on a 23-match winning streak at tournament, following her title 3-peat (2022-24)
- Looking to become the first woman to win four successive Roland Garros titles in the Open Era; Seles and Henin both won three in a row
- Has won 10 WTA clay-court titles; this is first year since 2020 that she hasn't won a title heading into the French Open

Cristian:

- Through to the 3r of a Slam for the second time, having also made this stage at 2025 Australian Open (l. Lys)
- Entered Roland-Garros in strong form having reached first clay court final last week at Rabat (l. Joint)
- Owns one win in career over a Top 10 player, defeating No.10 Barbora Krejcikova at 2024 Beijing

[Q] Victoria Mboko (CAN #120) v. [8] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #8)

First meeting

Mboko:

- Making main draw debut appearance at Roland Garros and across all majors
- One of four Canadian players in history to make 3r at Roland Garros at 18 years old or younger: Leylah Fernandez in 2020, Helen Kelesi in 1987-1988, Carling Bassett-Seguso in 1984-86
- First time playing a Top 10 opponent; previous and highest-ranked opponent faced was No.11 Badosa at Miami 2025
- Career best win by ranking was defeating No. 54 Osorio at Miami 2025

Zheng:

- Making fourth appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching R16 on debut in 2022 (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Best result at Grand Slams was R-Up at Australian Open 2024 (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 is 3-0 in 2025 (34-7 overall)
- Record against qualifiers in 2025 is 2-0 (15-4 overall)

[12] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11) vs. [21] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #21)

Rybakina leads 3-2

Rybakina:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best results were QFs in 2021 (l. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- At other majors, won 2022 Wimbledon title (d. Jabeur in F); also reached 2023 Australian Open final (l. Sabalenka)
- Won the three most recent meetings against Ostapenko, including their only previous meeting on clay at 2023 Rome in the semifinal
- On a six match winning streak after claiming the ninth title of her career at Strasbourg last week
- Four of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2019 Bucharest, 2023 Rome, 2024 Stuttgart, 2025 Strasbourg

Ostapenko:

- Making 10th appearance at Roland Garros, lifting the title in 2017 (d. Halep in F)
- One of the three former Roland Garros champions in main draw (along with Swiatek and Krejcikova), Ostapenko also reached SF at Wimbledon 2018 (l. eventual champion Kerber)
- Besides Roland Garros 2017, also owns a second title on clay at Stuttgart 2025
- Her most recent victory over a Top 20 player was over No.1 Sabalenka in the final at Stuttgart in April

[13] Elina Svitolina (UKR #14) vs. Bernarda Pera (USA #83)

Svitolina leads 1-0

Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching QF in 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023
- Making 45th career Grand Slam main draw appearance
- Has 31 wins at Roland Garros, the most wins of any event in her career
- Has won her last 11 matches against players against opponents ranked 50+ last losing to Blinkova at Linz 2025 (BJK Cup)
- Has registered 14 wins on clay this season, the most of any player (with 25 wins this season overall)
- Owns 7 career titles on clay: Rouen in 2025; Strasbourg in 2023; Strasbourg in 2020; Rome in 2018; Rome, Istanbul in 2017; Marrakech in 2015

Pera:

- Making her 8th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where she reached the R16 in 2023 (l. Jabeur)
- This marks her 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- Best result across all Slams is reaching R16 here at Roland Garros in 2023
- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.19 Donna Vekic at Roland Garros 2025
- Is 3-6 in Grand Slam events against Top 20 opponents
- Owns 2 career titles on clay court: Hamburg, Budapest in 2022

[16] Amanda Anisimova (USA #16) v. [22] Clara Tauson (DEN #22)

First meeting

Anisimova:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland-Garros, where her best result was reaching SF in 2019 (l. No.8 Barty), which is also her best result across all majors
- Best result on clay in 2025 was SF run at Charleston (l. Kenin)
- Record in 3r matches at Grand Slams is 6-2 (2-1 at RG)
- Best career result on clay is Champion run at Bogota 2019 (d. Sharma in F)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.16 (first achieved on Mar 31); this time last year was ranked No.231

Tauson:

- Making 5th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was reaching 4r in 2024 (l. Jabeur), which is also her best result across all majors
- First time being seeded at a Grand Slam - No.22 seed
- Best career result on clay is QF run at Charleston 250 in 2021
- Is currently ranked No.22 (close to her peak rank No.21 in March 2025); this time last year was ranked No.72

Dayana Yastremska (UKR #48) vs. [19] Liudmila Samsonova (#18)

First meeting

Yastremska:

- Has equalled her best Roland Garros result by reaching 3r today; also made 3r last year (l. Gauff)
- Career best result at a Grand Slams was SF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Zheng)
- Posted her first Top 20 win of the season in previous round over No.12 Diana Shnaider
- Career best win by ranking was defeating world No.2 Ka. Pliskova at Wuhan 2019
- Owns one singles title on clay at Strasbourg 2019

Samsonova:

- Making sixth appearance at Roland Garros and has equalled her best previous result with 3r in 2024 (l. Cocciaretto)
- Enters Roland Garros off the back of posting a new career best on clay with R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Rybakina in final)
- Her second meeting with a player from Ukraine this season after falling to Starodubtseva at Madrid
- Is 9-6 against Top 50 players in so far in 2025

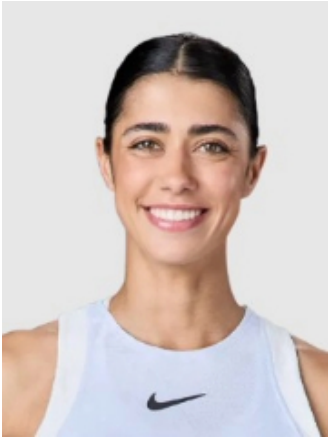

- Has made additional Slam finals at 2023 US Open (l. Gauff) and 2025 Australian Open (l. Keys)
- Overall this is her 28th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and has also made the SFs at Wimbledon (in 2021 and 2023)
- Has now reached at least the 3r at last 16 Slams contested, dating back to 2021 Australian Open
- Also owns two doubles titles at the Slams, winning 2019 US Open and 2021 Australian Open both w/ Mertens
- Has beaten Kamilla Rakhimova and Jil Teichmann so far this week dropping only 5 games across those two matches
- Faces No.34 Olga Danilovic in 3r today - has only lost once to an opponent outside the Top 30 this year, falling to No.38 Tauson in Dubai
- Owns 2-0 career record against players from Serbia, defeating Danilovic at 2018 Madrid and Jorovic at 2019 Dubai
- Three-time clay court champion, winning Madrid in 2021, 2023 and 2025
- Is currently ranked No.1; this time last year was ranked No.2
- No.1 seed has won the title here on 22 occasions, most recently Swiatek last year
- Spending her 40th and 41st weeks as the PIF WTA World No.1 this fortnight
- During last year's EUROPEAN CLAY swing reached QF at ROLAND GARROS, RUP at ROME, RUP at MADRID, QF at STUTTGART
- Has won 36 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins

- Faces No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in 3r today; the first time facing the reigning WTA World No.1 player. Highest ranked player faced prior was the World No.6 on two occasions - defeating Pegula this year at Australian Open and falling to Vondrousova here last year
- Overall owns 3 wins in career over Top 10 players, in addition to Pegula, also No.10 Collins at 2024 Roland-Garros and No.10 Goerges at 2018 Moscow River Cup
- Owns one clay court title, at Moscow River Cup in 2018
- Only player from Serbia to reach 3r
- Best result by Serbian woman at ROLAND GARROS was title run by Ana Ivanovic in 2008
- Is currently ranked No.34, one spot off career-high ranking of No.33; this time last year was ranked No.125
- During last year's EUROPEAN CLAY swing reached SF at IASI 250, 1r at BUDAPEST, 4r at ROLAND GARROS, 2r at MADRID

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejčíková/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitová in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejčíková/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suarez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings

- Enjoyed best season of career in 2024, reaching her first Grand Slam R16 at Roland Garros (as a qualifier) and winning her second career Hologic WTA Tour title (first on hard court) at Guangzhou. Achieved a new career-high ranking of No.51 in December



- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a three-peat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals

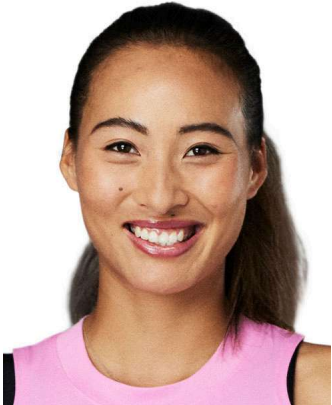

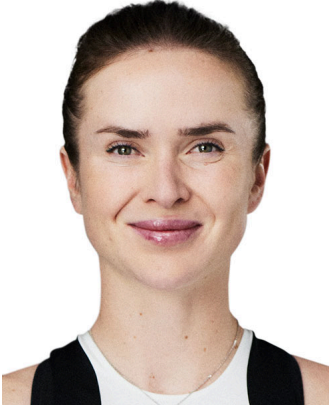
