MATCH NOTES - DAY 8 - SUNDAY, JUNE 1

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. [16] Amanda Anisimova (USA #16)

Anisimova leads 5-2

Sabalenka:

- Has now reached at least the 4r at last 9 Slams contested, dating back to 2022 Australian Open
- Has reached a 15th career R16 at Grand Slam events, with this her third at Roland Garros after 2023 and 2024
- Has held PIF WTA World No.1 ranking since October 21, 2024; during Roland-Garros, will mark her 40th and 41st total weeks at No.1 (pushing to 33 consecutive); will hold on to No.1 ranking after tournament
- Leads the Tour in match wins so far this season with 37 (next most is Pegula with 31)
- Has claimed more match wins in straight sets in 2025 (32) than any player has managed overall Tour level wins so far this season
- Has reached six singles finals this year the most entering Roland Garros since 2013 (Serena Williams)
- Has won 3 titles this year Brisbane, Miami, Madrid

Anisimova:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland-Garros, where her best result was reaching SF in 2019 (I. No.8 Barty), which is also her best result across all majors
- This is her 8th career meeting against Sabalenka she has faced no other player on more occasions and also holds the most career wins over Sabalenka with five (also has five wins over Kasatkina)
- Record against Sabalenka on clay is 3-1
- Best result on clay in 2025 was SF run at Charleston (I. Kenin)
- Record in 4r matches at Grand Slams is 2-4 (1-1 at RG)
- Best career result on clay is Champion run at Bogota 2019 (d. Sharma in F)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.16 (first achieved on Mar 31); this time last year was ranked No.231

[4] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #4) vs. [13] Elina Svitolina (UKR #14)

Svitolina leads 1-0

Paolini:

- Currently on a career-best 9-match Tour level winning streak
- Contesting her 22nd Grand Slam main draw appearance and is seeking a spot in her third career Slam QF
- Reached her first Grand Slam final here last year, falling to Swiatek in the title match
- Was first Italian woman to reach a Slam final since Pennetta (won) and Vinci (runner-up) played an all-Italian final at the 2015 US Open
- Followed up R-Up finish here last year by also making the Wimbledon final, falling to Krejcikova
- Contesting Roland Garros at her career-high ranking of No.4, which she returned to last month after becoming the first Italian woman to win the Italian Open title in 40 years

Svitolina:

- Making 12th main-draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best results are reaching QF in 2015, 2017, 2020 and 2023
- Seeking a spot in her 13th career Grand Slam QF, and 5th at Roland Garros
- Has 32 wins at Roland Garros, the most wins of any event in her career
- Has registered 15 WTA main-draw wins on clay this season, the most of any player (with 26 wins this season overall)
- Owns 40 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula at 2025 Indian Wells
- Has beaten Top 4 players at Grand Slam events on 2 occasions: d. No.1 lga Swiatek at 2023 Wimbledon and No.4 Paolini at 2025 Australian Open

[12] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11) vs. [5] Iga Swiatek (POL #5)

Rybakina:

- Is the only player to have multiple clay court WTA level main draw wins against Swiatek; she won both of their two previous meetings on clay at 2023 Rome and 2024 Stuttgart
- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best results were QFs in 2021 (I. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- At other majors, won 2022 Wimbledon title (d. Jabeur in F); also reached 2023 Australian Open final (l. Sabalenka)
- On a seven-match winning streak after claiming the ninth title of her career at Strasbourg last week
- Four of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2019 Bucharest, 2023 Rome, 2024 Stuttgart, 2025 Strasbourg

Swiatek:

- Is on a 24-match winning streak at the tournament, following her title 3-peat (2022-24)
- Swiatek (38-2) has become the player with the most main draw wins at the French Open in the Open Era after their first 40 matches, equaling Chris Evert
- Looking to become the first woman to win four successive Roland Garros titles in the Open Era; Seles and Henin both won three in a row
- Has won 10 WTA clay-court titles; this is first year since 2020 that she hasn't won a title heading into Roland Garros

Samsonova leads 3-2

Samsonova:

- Making sixth appearance at Roland Garros surpassing her previous best result of 3r in 2024 (I. Cocciaretto)
- With a win today would reach her best result across all Slams (made 4r at 2022 & 2024 US Open and 2021 Wimbledon)
- Enters Roland Garros off the back of posting a new career best on clay with R-Up at Strasbourg (I. Rybakina in
- final)
- Won the most recent meeting against Zheng at 2023 Montreal
- Owns nine career wins over Top 10 players, most recently over No.10 Badosa at 2025 Strasbourg

Zheng:

- Making fourth appearance at Roland Garros, where she has equaled her best previous result with R16 on her debut in 2022 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Best result at Grand Slams was R-Up at Australian Open 2024 (I. Sabalenka in F)
- Owns 23 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently over No.1 Sabalenka at 2025 Rome
- Best result by a player from China is Li Na's run to the title in 2011

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan.
 Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suarez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings

- In 2024 made first WTA 1000 final of career at Toronto, finishing R-Up to Pegula (defeated No.3 Sabalenka en route). Also enjoyed run to R16 at Australian Open, her third time reaching that stage in Melbourne
- Played a small number of tournaments in 2023 before taking a break away from the sport after Madrid in April
- Lifted second career title at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (d. Sasnovich in F) in January 2022
- In 2022, also made SF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and five further QFs, including at Wimbledon (l. Halep)
- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish. Best results were QF runs at Parma and Bad Homburg
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha; during Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
