2025 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. This year marks the 58th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 104 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings (week of April 7, 2025). In addition, there are 16 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (23-1 in 1r, 95.8%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 24 Grand Slam main draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). Swiatek is 6-0 in first round matches at Roland-Garros
- **Madison Keys (41-5 in 1r, 89.1 %):** Has won eleven-straight Slam opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). Keys is 10-2 here at Roland-Garros in opening matches
- **Elise Mertens (28-4 in 1r, 87.5%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu)
- **Mirra Andrejeva (7-1 in 1r, 87.5%):** Since making her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2023 Roland Garros, Andrejeva is 7-1 in the opening rounds of a Slam, with her only loss coming at 2024 Wimbledon
- **Elena Svitolina (38-6 in 1r, 86.4%):** Svitolina has won 34 of her last 35 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria). Svitolina is 11-0 in opening round at Roland Garros.
- **Coco Gauff (19-3 in 1r, 86.4%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin)
- **Elena Rybakina (19-3 in 1r, 86.4%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel)
- **Olga Danilovic (6-1 in 1r, 85.7%):** Danilovic made her first six Grand Slam main draw appearances via qualifying – five times as a qualifier and once as a lucky loser. Her first direct entry was 2025 Australian Open. Her only loss in the opening round at a Slam was at 2024 Wimbledon as a lucky loser.
- **Zheng Qinwen (11-2 in 1r, 84.6%):** Zheng's two first round loss came Wimbledon in 2023 (I. Siniakova) and 2024 (I. Sun)
- **Naomi Osaka (23-5, 82.1%):** Two of her five 1r Slam exits have come here at Roland-Garros, in 2017 and 2022
- **Victoria Azarenka (54-12 in 1r, 81.8%):** Four of her 12 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances. Has won five of last six opening round matches at Roland Garros.
- **Aryna Sabalenka (22-5, 81.5%) :** Has not lost 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open. Since has won 17-straight opening round matches

Eight players received main draw wildcards. These include six Frenchwomen – **Lois Boisson**, **Elsa Jacquemot**, **Leolia Jeanjean**, **Chloe Paquet**, **Diane Parry** and **Tiantsoa Sarah Rakotomanga Rajaonah** – along with Australia's **Destinee Aiava** and the USA's **Iva Jovic**. In the Open Era, the best result by a wildcard at a Grand Slam was achieved by **Kim Clijsters**, who won the 2009 US Open title.

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & ROLAND GARROS

Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era by winning the 2021 US Open. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by **Nadia Podoroska** at 2020 Roland Garros, **Alexandra Stevenson** at 1999 Wimbledon and **Christine Dorey** at the 1978 Australian Open. A qualifier has reached the quarterfinal stage at Roland Garros 11 times, most recently **Nadia Podoroska** and **Martina Trevisan** in 2020:

In the Open Era, a 30-something has won a Grand Slam title 25 times, a feat accomplished by 10 different women: **Serena Williams** (10), **Margaret Court** (3), **Martina Navratilova** (3), **Chris Evert** (2), **Billie Jean King** (2), **Ann Jones** (1), **Angelique Kerber** (1), **Li Na** (1), **Flavia Pennetta** (1) and **Virginia Wade** (1). - Longest match (time): 4 hours, 7 minutes – V.Buisson (FRA) d. N. Van Lottum (FRA) 67 75 62, 1r, 1995
- Longest match (games): 56 games – K Melville (AUS) d. P.Teeguarden (USA) 97 46 1614, 1r, 1972. Since the introduction of the tiebreak in 1973, the record is 46 games, which has happened twice
- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 21 times (most recently, **Iga Swiatek** in 2020)
- Five players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); **Henin** (2005) and **Barbora Krejčíková** (2021)
- Only six players have won the Roland-Garros women's singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls' singles title (**Halep**, **Durr**, **Jausovec**, **Mandlikova**, **Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls' singles winners in this year's main draw are: **Cornet** (2007), **Halep** (2008), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Svitolina** (2010), **Jabeur** (2011), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Badosa** (2015), **Masarova** (2016), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019), **Jacquemot** (2020), **Noskova** (2021)
- Chris Evert has won the most women's singles titles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, winning the event on seven times. Evert is one of two players to have won the event five or more times in that span, along with Steffi Graf (6).
- Chris Evert and Steffi Graf have reached in the most women's singles finals at Roland Garros in the Open Era, appearing in nine finals each over that span.
- Six players in the Open Era have won the women's singles at Roland Garros without dropping a set - Evonne Goolagong (1971), Billie Jean King (1972), Chris Evert (1974), Steffi Graf (1988), Justine Henin (2006-07) and Iga Swiatek (2020).
- Margaret Court holds the best winning percentage in the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, at 95.2% - min. 10 matches. Among active players, Iga Swiatek (94.6%) holds the highest winning percentage.
- Steffi Graf has appeared in and won the most women's singles matches at Roland Garros in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 84-10 at the event. Graf is the only player to have won 75+ matches at the event over that span.
- At 16y 189d, Monica Seles (1990) is the youngest winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Only Martina Hingis (16y 117d – Australian Open 1997) is a younger women's singles Grand Slam winner over that span.
- Only two players in the Open Era have won multiple women's singles titles at Roland Garros before the age of 20 – Steffi Graf (1987-88) and Monica Seles (1990, 1991 and 1992)

- Since 2000, only two players have won the women's singles title at Roland Garros as teenagers – Jelena Ostapenko (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2020).
- At 33y 283d, Serena Williams is the oldest winner of the women's singles title at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Williams (2013, 2015) is one of two players in the Open Era to win multiple women's singles titles at the event after turning 30, along with Chris Evert (1985–86).
- A qualifier has never reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Nadia Podoroska (2020) has gone the furthest of any qualifier at the event in that span, losing to eventual winner Iga Swiatek in the semi-final.
- Since WTA rankings were first published in 1975, Iga Swiatek (#54, 2020) is the lowest-ranked winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros, and is the only player ranked outside the WTA Top 50 to win the event.
- A wildcard has not reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Mary Pierce (2002) has gone the furthest of any wildcard at the event, losing to eventual winner Serena Williams in the quarter-final.
- In 2024, Iga Swiatek became the third player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at Roland-Garros for three consecutive years, after Monica Seles (1990–92) and Justine Henin (2005–07). She was also the first to win a single Grand Slam event for three straight years since Serena Williams (US Open 2012–14).
- Last year, Iga Swiatek claimed a fourth women's singles title at Roland Garros from six appearances in the main draw at the event. In the Open Era, only Margaret Court (3/4, 75%) holds a better title win rate from main draws entered at the event.
- In the Open Era, the top seed in the women's singles at Roland Garros has lost in the opening round only once, with Angelique Kerber falling to Ekaterina Makarova in 2017.
- Since the WTA-1000 format's introduction in 2009, Iga Swiatek could become only the second player to claim tournament victory at Madrid Open, Italian Open and Roland Garros in a calendar year after Serena Williams (2013).
- Madison Keys could become the first player to claim the Women's Singles titles at the Australian Open and Roland Garros in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2015.
- Either Elena Rybakina or Marketa Vondrousova could become the sixth player since 2000 to win both Wimbledon and Roland Garros along with Barbora Krejickova, Ashleigh Barty, Garbine Muguruza, Maria Sharapova and Serena Williams.

- Last year, **Iga Swiatek** won her fourth Roland Garros title – becoming the eighth woman to win three or more Roland Garros titles
- In 2021, **Barbora Krejčíková** won her first Grand Slam in singles on her fifth main draw appearance at the majors, and she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Having saved a match point en route, she also became the first Czech woman to win Roland Garros since Hana Mandlíková in 1981
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Slam singles title
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 12 times, with the No.2 seed winning seven times (most recently 1995)
- Thirty-four of the Roland Garros women's titles have been won by one of the Top 2 seeds; the top seed has won the title 22 times, and the No.2 seed has won the title 12 times
- The Roland Garros final has been decided in three sets on 23 occasions, most recently in 2023
