Dayana Yastremska (UKR #42) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #2)

Yastremska:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 4r in 2019
- Best career result on grass is a Runner-Up finish at Nottingham in 2025
- Owns 3 Top 5 wins all coming on hardcourts No.2 Karolina Pliskova (2019 Wuhan), No.5 Sofia Keinin (2020 Doha) and No.3 Barbora Krejcikova (2022 Dubai)
- Highest ranked opponent she has defeated on grass has been No.16 Jelena Ostapenko (2022 Birmingham)
- Owns 10-11 record in opening rounds of Grand Slams, including a 2-1 record at Wimbledon

Gauff:

- Owns 20-3 in 1r (87.0%) with her only first-round defeats at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin)
- Finished the clay-court swing with a Tour-leading 18 match wins while finishing as runner-up at Madrid and Rome and capturing the title at Roland Garros
- Gauff won the previous three meetings in the series (all on clay)
- The reigning Roland Garros champion has lost in the first round at Wimbledon twice in the Open Era 2005 (Justine Henin, I. to Daniilidou) and 2010 (Francesca Schiavone, I. to Dushevina)
- Wimbledon is the only Slam that Gauff is yet to reach the quarterfinal stage; her previous best result has been three R16 finishes (2019, 2021, 2024)
- In position to stay at No.2 after Wimbledon; only a run by Pegula to the final would bump Gauff out of the No.2 spot; with a win today, Pegula could only overtake Gauff with a title

[3] Jessica Pegula (USA #3) vs. Elisabetta Cocciaretto (ITA #116)

Pegula:

- Won only previous meeting at 2023 Wimbledon (R32)
- Has won 17-straight first round matches at the Grand Slams, a streak that started at 2021 Australian Open
- Lost her main draw debut at Wimbledon in 2019 (I. Buzarnenscu), but has won her last four opening round matches at Wimbledon
- Has reached five singles finals this year (including most recently at Bad Homburg); only Aryna Sabalenka (7) has reached more
- Since 2021, has reached the QF at each Grand Slam at least once; during that time, only Aryna Sabalenka (12) and Iga Swiatek (10) have reached more Grand Slam quarterfinals than Pegula (7)

Cocciaretto:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2023 (I. No.4 Jessica Pegula)
- Has won only one of previous eight match-ups vs. Top 10 ranked opponents, with her lone win coming at 2023 Roland Garros (d. Kvitova)
- The former WTA World N.29 is seeking first career Top 5 win (previously 0-5)
- Is 7-7 in Grand Slam opening rounds, including a 2-0 mark at Wimbledon

[7] Mirra Andreeva (#7) vs. Mayar Sherif (EGY #86)

First meeting

First meeting

M.Andreeva:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 4r in 2023
- Making her 10th Grand Slam main draw appearance, is 8-1 in R128 with only loss coming at 2024 Wimbledon (I. to B.Fruhvirtova)
- In the last 10 years, is the third player to make 10 Grand Slam main draw appearances before turning 19 (along with Coco Gauff and Ana Konjuh)
- Best career result on grass is a QF appearance at Bad Homburg in 2025

Sherif:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 1r in 2024 and 2023
- Owns 4-12 record in opening round at Slams, including 0-2 at Wimbledon
- Is the only player form Egypt to have appeared in the main draw at Wimbledon in the Open Era
- Has won 75 matches (all on clay) at WTA 125 events, the most since the level was introduced; next most is 56 wins (Anna Karolina Schmiedlova)
- Has 2 career Top 10 wins both on clay def. No.7 Maria Sakkari (2022 Parma) and No.5 Caroline Garcia (2023 Madrid)
- First time facing a Top 20 ranked opponent on grass

[8] Iga Swiatek (POL #4) vs. Polina Kudermetova (CZE #64)

Swiatek:

- Playing in 26th main draw of a Slam, has only lost in opening round only once 2019 Wimbledon (I.to Golubic); owns 24-1 record in R128
- Reached first final of the season last week at Bad Homburg, her first final since 2024 Roland Garros; as a result climbed from No.8 to No.4 in this week's PIF WTA Rankings
- Has won 61 consecutive opening matches at WTA events (including United Cup and WTA Finals), with her last opening loss coming to Maria Sakkari at the WTA Finals 2021 it is the longest such a streak of any player since 2000.
- Owns 11-5 record at Wimbledon, her fewest wins at any Slam

P.Kudermetova:

- Making Wimbledon main draw debut after falling in opening round of qualifying last year
- P.Kudermetova lost in the First Round on each of their first three Grand Slam main draw appearances (AO 2023 vs Olivia Gadecki, AO 2025 vs Magdalena Frech and RG 2025 vs Jelena Ostapenko)
- Notched first two career Top 20 wins of career this year with wins over No.9 Daria Kasatkina (Brisbane) and No.19 Ekaterina Alexandrova (Indian Wells)

[WC] Petra Kvitova (CZE #572) vs. [10] Emma Navarro (USA #10)

First meeting

Kvitova:

- Two-time Wimbledon champion (2021, 2014), making 16th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; among active players equals Alize Cornet and Victoria Azarenka
- Sixth player in the Open Era to appear at Wimbledon as a wildcard after having turned 35 after Wendy Turnbull, Martina Navratilova, Kimiko Date Krumm, Venus Williams and Angelique Kerber
- Among active players, has the most main draw match wins (38) and most matches played (51) at Wimbledon
- Among current players, only Victoria Azarenka (228) has played more Grand Slam matches than Petra Kvitova (185)
- Seeking first Top 10 win since 2023 Berlin when def. No.4 Caroline Garcia in QF

Navarro:

- Making third Wimbledon main draw appearance
- One of four Americans seeded among Top 10 seeds along with Coco Gauff (#2), Jessica Pegula (#3) and Madison Keys (#6), the first time since 2004 that there are four Americans among the Top 10 seeds (in 2004: Serena Williams, Venus Williams, Lindsay Davenport and Jennifer Capriati).
- Making 11th appearance at a Grand Slam, she has a 6-4 record in opening matches at Grand Slams

Elina Avanesyan (ARM #49) vs. [11] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11)

Avanesyan:

- Making 2nd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Samsonova)
- Best result across all Slams is R16 run at Roland Garros in 2024 and 2023
- Has lost last four Grand Slam meetings against seeded players last time she defeated such an opponent was 2024 Roland Garros (Qinwen Zheng in 3r)
- Career-best Tour-level result on grass is QF run at Berlin in 2023 (I. eventual R-Up Vekic)

Rybakina:

- Entering Wimbledon leads the Tour in aces served (235)
- Making 5th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was winning the tournament in 2022 (d. Jabeur in Final);
- Has also reached SF in 2024 (I. eventual Champion Krejcikova) and QF in 2023 (I. eventual R-Up Jabeur)
- In the last five years (since 2021), only Iga Swiatek (18) has reached more Women's Single's Grand Slam second rounds than Rybakina (17, level with Pegula)
- At no other WTA level event has Rybakina registered more wins in her career than at Wimbledon (19)
- Only grass court title came at Wimbledon 2022

[17] Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #16) vs. Alexandra Eala (PHI #56)

Krejcikova:

- Making fifth Wimbledon main draw appearance, where her best result was becoming Champion in 2024 (d. Jasmine Paolini in Final)
- The women's reigning champion has lost in the opening round only twice in Wimbledon in the Open Era: Steffi Graf in 1994 and Marketa Vondrousova in 2024
- Seeking her 14th win at Wimbledon, it will be the most wins she has at a single Grand Slam event (has 13 wins at Australian Open)

Rybakina leads 1-0

Eala:

.

- Including all levels and qualifying draws, seeking her first win over an opponent from Czech Republic (previously 0-6)
- Making second Grand Slam main draw appearance after having lost in the First Round at Roland Garros this year
- Is first player from Philippines to appear in main draw at Wimbledon in the Open Era
- As a qualifier last week in Eastbourne reached the main draw and went to reach the final falling in a championship tiebreak set 4-6, 6-1, 7-6(10); became the first player from Philippines to win a grass court WTA level main draw match in the Open Era
- After defeating No.5 Madison Keys (R32) and No.2 Iga Swiatek (QF) in Miami earlier this year, added another Top 20 win at Eastbourne, defeating No.20 Jelena Ostapenko en route to final
- Playing this week on a career-high ranking of No.56

Maya Joint (AUS #41) vs. [19] Liudmila Samsonova (#19)

First meeting

Joint:

- 1 of 6 teenagers in the main draw at Wimbledon
- Playing this week on a career-high ranking of No.41, after winning her second title of the 2025 season at Eastbourne (WTA 250); also won a WTA 250 title at Rabat
- Has won 13 of last 16 matches (includes loss in first round of qualifying at Nottingham), a stretch that included two title runs at Eastbourne and Rabat
- This is 6th career meeting vs. Top 20 opponent; owns one career Top 20 win, defeating No.20 Donna Vekic (2025 Merida)
- Making Wimbledon main draw debut (fell in qualifying in 2024); playing in fourth career main draw at a Slam

Samsonova:

- Making 21st Grand Slam main draw appearance, including fourth at Wimbledon
- Best result at a Slam has been R16 finish four times including 2021 Wimbledon
- Is 13-7 in round of 128 matches at the Slams (2-1 at Wimbledon)

[WC] Heather Watson (GBR #143) vs. [23] Clara Tauson (DEN #22)

Tauson leads 1-0

Watson:

- Making 15th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2022 (I. Niemeier); this was her best result across all Slams
- Holds a 6-8 match record in first round matches at Wimbledon
- Career-best tour-level result on grass is SF run which she has reached on four occasions: Nottingham in 2023; Birmingham in 2021; Eastbourne in 2017 and 2014
- 1 of 10 British women in this year's Wimbledon main draw, the most at the tournament since 1992
- A wildcard is yet to reach the Women's Single's Final at Wimbledon in the Open Era

Tauson:

- Making 4th appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (I. Collins)
- Best result across all Slams is R16 run at Roland Garros 2024 (l. Jabeur)
- Career-best tour-level result on grass is QF run at Nottingham in 2025 (I. Linette)
- Only player from Denmark in this year's main draw
- Currently second on Tour for most aces served (223) during the 2025 season

[28] Sofia Kenin (USA #28) vs. [Q] Taylor Townsend (USA #99)

Kenin:

- This is their 6th meeting and a rematch of their 2023 Wimbledon qualifying match, won by Kenin
- Making 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance (6th at Wimbledon)
- Best Wimbledon result has been a R32 finish in 2023
- 2020 Australian Open champion

Townsend:

- Making 30th Grand Slam main draw appearance (5th at Wimbledon)
- Best result at Wimbledon has been a second round finish (twice 2018, 2019)
- Best result at a Slam has been a R16 finish at 2019 US Open
- Currently ranked No.2 in the WTA Doubles Rankings
- Won 2024 Wimbledon doubles title with Katerina Siniakova
- 1 of 9 moms in the main draw

Caty McNally (USA #208) vs. [WC] Jodie Burrage (GBR #154)

McNally:

- Currently ranked No.208; gained direct entry to main draw with a special ranking of No.71
- In March 2024 underwent elbow surgery; returned to play in November 2024; returned to play in main draw at 2025 Australian OpenA two-time Grand Slam doubles finalist finishing as runner-up at US Open in 2021 (w/Gauff) and 2022 (w/Townsend)
- Reached a career-high ranking of No.54 in 2023
- Playing in 9th Grand Slam main draw with best result being a R32 finish at 2020 US Open
- Seeking her first career main draw win at Wimbledon after falling in first round in 2019 and 2023

Burrage:

- 1 of 10 British women in this year's Wimbledon main draw, the most at the tournament since 1992
- Making 8th Grand Slam main draw appearance having reached the R64 three times, including her last main draw appearance at Wimbledon in 2023
- Defeated McNally in only previous main draw encounter in the R128 at 2023 Wimbledon (Burrage's only win to date at Wimbledon)
