## [7] Mirra Andreeva (#7) vs. Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #63)

### M.Andreeva:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 4r in 2023
- Making her 10th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- In the last 10 years, is the third player to make 10 Grand Slam main draw appearances before turning 19 (along with Coco Gauff and Ana Konjuh)
- Best career result on grass is a QF appearance at Bad Homburg in 2025
- Only Aryna Sabalenka (43), Iga Swiatek (36) and Jessica Pegula (35) have won more WTA level main draw matches than Mirra Andreeva (33) in 2025
- In 2025, Andreeva is 11-1 vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (the one loss was to Boisson in Roland Garros QF)

### Bronzetti:

- Making 15th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- This is her 4th Wimbledon main draw appearance and first time advancing to the second round
- Contesting her 15th career Grand Slam main draw; with a win today, would equal her career-best Grand Slam result having previously reached the R32 at 2023 US Open
- Lost previous nine career meetings against Top 10 opponents; the highest ranked player she has defeated so far is No.12 Barbora Krejcikova (US Open 2023)
- With her win over Jil Teichmann in the opening round, snapped a 5-match losing streak

## [8] Iga Swiatek (POL #4) vs. Caty McNally (USA #208)

## Swiatek leads 1-0

### Swiatek:

- Playing in 26th main draw of a Slam
- Reached first final of the season last week at Bad Homburg, her first final since 2024 Roland Garros; as a result climbed from No.8 to No.4 in this week's PIF WTA Rankings
- Owns 12-5 record at Wimbledon, her fewest wins at any Slam
- Previously held the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking for 125 weeks
- Holds 22-2 record in Grand Slam 2r matches; Swiatek has not lost before 3r of a Grand Slam since the 2019 US Open
- Has won last 12 meetings against opponents outside Top 200; last loss came against No.338 Ana Konjuh at 2021 Miami; including ITF level events has won 25 of last 26 vs. opponents outside Top 200, a stretch that dates back to 2018
- This is third time facing an opponent outside the Top 200 at a Slam (3-0 all straight-set wins), including a 2022 Wimbledon win over No.252 Jana Fett
- With a win would become third player this century to reach the third round for 22 consecutive Slams joining Amelie Mauresmo and Serena Williams

#### McNally:

- Currently ranked No.208; gained direct entry to main draw with a special ranking of No.71
- In March 2024 underwent elbow surgery; returned to play in November 2024; returned to Grand Slam play in main draw at 2025 Australian Open
- A two-time Grand Slam doubles finalist finishing as runner-up at US Open in 2021 (w/Gauff) and 2022 (w/Townsend)
- Reached a career-high ranking of No.54 in 2023
- Playing in 9th Grand Slam main draw with best result being a R32 finish at 2020 US Open
- Win over Burrage in opening round was first career main draw win at Wimbledon; lost in first round in 2019 and 2023

### Veronika Kudermetova (#46) vs. [10] Emma Navarro (USA #10)

### Kudermetova leads 1-0

#### Kudermetova:

- Making 25th Grand Slam main draw appearance; Best result across all Grand Slams is QF run at Roland Garros 2022
- This is fifth Wimbledon appearance; with a win today would be first time advancing to R32; previously best result was R64 (also 2019, 2023)
- Posted a 6-4 record vs. Top 10 opponents in 2023, but has lost last 7 meetings vs. Top 10 opponents
- Owns 2 career Top 10 wins on grass both vs Sabalenka in Berlin
- Also ranked No.11 in doubles

#### Navarro:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching QF stage in 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- One of four Americans seeded among Top 10 seeds along with Coco Gauff (#2), Jessica Pegula (#3) and Madison Keys (#6), the first time since 2004 that there are four Americans among the Top 10 seeds (in 2004: Serena Williams, Venus Williams, Lindsay Davenport and Jennifer Capriati).
- Has been involved in 15 three-set matches in 2025 only Madison Keys (12), Jessica Pegula, Ashlyn Krueger, and Hailey Baptiste (9 each) have won more than Navarro in 2025 (8)

### Maria Sakkari (GRE #77) vs. [11] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11)

#### Sakkari:

- Making 38th Grand Slam main draw appearance (9th at Wimbledon)
- Best result at Wimbledon has been reaching R32 four times (2017, 2019, 2022, 2024)
- Is 1-8 vs. Top 20 opponents this year
- On grass, is 1-9 record vs. Top 20 opponents with only win coming against No.12 Daria Kasatkina (2022 Berlin, QF)
- Win over Anna Blinkova in first round was first win at a Slam since 2024 Wimbledon when reached R32
- Former WTA World No.3 is a two-time Grand Slam semifinalist 2021 Roland Garros and 2021 US Open

#### Rybakina:

- Entering Wimbledon, leads the Tour in aces served (235)
- Making 5th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was winning the tournament in 2022 (d. Jabeur in final)
- Has also reached SF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Krejcikova) and QF in 2023 (I. eventual R-Up Jabeur)
- In the last 5 years (since 2021), only Iga Swiatek (19) has reached more women's singles Grand Slam second-rounds than Elena Rybakina (18)
- At no other WTA level event has Rybakina registered more wins in her career than at Wimbledon (19)
- Only grass court title came at Wimbledon 2022

### [16] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) vs. Irina-Camelia Begu (ROU #115)

### Kasatkina leads 8-1

#### Kasatkina:

- Making 38th Grand Slam appearance (8th at Wimbledon)
- A Wimbledon quarterfinalist in 2018 (I. eventual Champion Angelique Kerber)
- Has more wins against Begu (8) than any other opponent
- Best result across all Slams is SF run at Roland Garros in 2022 (I. eventual Champion Iga Swiatek)
- Defeated Emiliana Arango in opening round to earn first grass court match win of 2025 season; fell 1r at Queens, Berlin and Eastbourne
- Began representing Australia in March 2025

#### Begu:

- Making 52nd Grand Slam appearance (13th at Wimbledon)
- Best results at Wimbledon has been R32 (2015, 2021, 2022)
- Seeking first Top 20 win since 2023 Madrid (d. No.18 Samsonova)
- Owns 1-5 record vs. Top 20 opponents on grass with lone win against No.8 Belinda Bencic (2016 Birmingham)
- Overall owns 18 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.18 Liudmila Samsonova at Madrid 2023

### [17] Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #16) vs. Caroline Dolehide (USA #67)

### Krejcikova leads 1-0

#### Krejcikova:

- Making fifth Wimbledon main draw appearance, where her best result was becoming Champion in 2024 (d. Jasmine Paolini in Final)
- The women's reigning champion has lost in the opening round only twice in Wimbledon in the Open Era: Steffi Graf in 1994 and Marketa Vondrousova in 2024
- Seeking her 14th win at Wimbledon, it will be the most wins she has at a single Grand Slam event (has 13 wins at Australian Open)

#### Dolehide:

- Making 15th Grand Slam main draw appearance (4th at Wimbledon)
- Win over Arantxa Rus in opening round was first main draw win at Wimbledon
- Bidding to reach R32 for the first time
- Owns 3-18 record vs. Top 20 opponents (0-4 in 2025)
- Seeking first Top 20 win on grass (previously 0-2)

## [23] Clara Tauson (DEN #22) vs. Anna Kalinskaya (#39)

### Kalinskaya leads 1-0

#### Tauson:

- Making 4th appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (I. Collins)
- Has a match record of 11-16 against Top 50 players so far this season with her most recent victory over No.25 Frech at Bad Homburg
- Best result across all Slams is R16 run at Roland Garros 2024 (I. Jabeur)
- Career-best tour-level result on grass is QF run at Nottingham in 2025 (I. Linette)
- Only player from Denmark in this year's main draw
- Is second on WTA Tour for most aces served this year (223)

#### Kalinskaya

- Best Wimbledon showing was last year with R16 (I. Rybakina)
- Her best Grand Slam result was achieved at 2024 Australian Open where she reached QF (I. Q.Zheng)
- Has faced a player from Denmark only once before, defeating Tauson at 2024 Roland Garros in 2r
- This is only her first grass court main draw this season after falling in qualifying at Bad Homburg (I. Seidel)

## Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #62) vs. [28] Sofia Kenin (USA #28)

#### Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous and best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (I. eventual Champion Krejcikova)
- Owns 5 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.9 Emma Navarro at Roland Garros 2025
- Best result by Spanish woman at Wimbledon was Champion run by Garbiñe Muguruza (2017), Conchita Martínez (1994)

#### Kenin:

- A two-time Grand Slam finalist, making 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance (6th at Wimbledon)
- With a win would equal her best Wimbledon result (previously R32 finish in 2023)
- Best result at a Grand Slam is Champion run at Australian Open 2020 (d. Muguruza in F)
- Also made Runner-Up run at Roland Garros in 2020 (I. Swiatek in F)
- Career-best result on grass is Champion run at Mallorca in 2019 (d. Bencic in F)

### Suzan Lamens (NED #69) vs. [18] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#19)

### Lamens:

- Making Wimbledon main draw debut and this is her third Grand Slam main draw appearance overall
- Seeking first career Top 20 win today (previously 0-4); this is also first career Top 20 match on grass

### Alexandrova:

- Making 33rd Grand Slam main draw appearance
- This is 7th Wimbledon main draw appearance with R16 run in 2023 standing as her best result; this is her fourth time through to R64 at Wimbledon (also 2r in 2016, 2021)
- Since the start of 2019, has won 35 matches on grass; only Ons Jabeur (41) has won more in that span
- Entered Wimbledon fourth on WTA this season for most aces served (181)
- A two-time grass-court title winner both at 's-Hertogenbosch (2022, 2023)

### Starodubtseva leads 1-0

#### Starodubsteva:

- Making 7th Grand Slam main draw appearance (2nd at Wimbledon)
- Also reached R64 at 2024 Wimbledon
- With a win today would equal best Grand Slam result 2025 Roland Garros (R32)
- Owns 2-6 record vs. Top 20 opponents with wins over No.14 Anna Kalinskaya (2024 Beijing) and No.20 Samsonova (2025 Madrid)

#### Samsonova:

- Making 21st Grand Slam main draw appearance, including fourth at Wimbledon
- Best result at a Slam has been R16 finish four times including 2021 Wimbledon
- Is 13-7 in round of 128 matches at the Slams (2-1 at Wimbledon)

- Faces No.7 Mirra Andreeva in 2r today; Bronzetti has 0-9 career record vs. Top 10 players (0-2 in 2025)
- Career-best tour-level result on grass is a runner-up finish at 2023 Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova)
- One of 3 players from Italy in the main draw, and they all won their 1r matches (also No.4 seed Paolini and Cocciaretto)
- Best result by an Italian woman at Wimbledon in the Open Era was Jasmine Paolini's final last year
- Is currently ranked No.63; this time last year was ranked No.81. Reached career-high of No.46 in April of 2024
- Was 0-2 on grass this year coming into Wimbledon; fell 1r in Nottingham (l. Ruzic) and Eastbourne (l. eventual finalist Eala)

## **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Reached first two WTA finals of career in 2024 winning the title at Iasi and finishing runner-up at Ningbo
- Made first Grand Slam semifinal at 2024 Roland Garros beating World No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals
- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16. Also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women s doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell 1r on WTA main-draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)

- In 2024 reached semifinals at Guangzhou and Monastir, won WTA 125 Contrexeville and posted a career high ranking of No.46 in April. Was also a part of the Italian Billie Jean King Cup Finals winning team
- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career at Rabat (d. Stephens in SF and Grabher in F); R-Up at Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova after receiving SF walkover from Swiatek); quarterfinalist at Guangzhou, Ningbo and Monastir; achieved best Grand Slam result of career to date in reaching 3r at US Open (l. Zheng Qinwen).
- At start of 2023 season, helped Italy advance to finals of United Cup against United States (l. Keys)
- Made first career singles final appearance at 2022 Palermo (l. Begu in F)
- In 2022, also made SF at Rabat (l. Trevisan), R16 at Miami (as LL, l. Saville) and 2r at 2022 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Barty), on Grand Slam main-draw debut
- In 2021, posted 49-23 record (across all levels), reaching five ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 in Bellinzona, Switzerland
- Reached back-to-back WTA QFs in summer of 2021, first at Lausanne (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Zidansek) and then Palermo (l. Ruse). Also made QF at Portoroz (as qualifier, l. Putintseva)
- First contested Grand Slam qualifying at 2021 US Open, falling at first hurdle
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Rome
- Owns five singles and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Won maiden ITF Circuit title at W10 Sion, Switzerland in 2016
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2013
