MATCH NOTES – DAY 5 – FRIDAY, JULY 4

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Emma Raducanu (GBR #40)

Sabalenka leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Making sixth appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous best results have been SF runs in 2021 (l. Ka. Pliskova) and 2023 (l. Jabeur)
- Record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 15-4 (2-0 at Wimbledon)
- Record against players outside Top 20 this year is 29-4
- Has never lost to a British player on Tour (8-0 record)
- Is currently ranked No.1; is playing Wimbledon as No.1 seed for the first time in her career and 3rd consecutive Grand Slam as seed No.1
- Will remain No.1 after Wimbledon, regardless of results this fortnight

Raducanu:

- Against Sabalenka is looking to defeat a second Grand Slam champion in a row, having beaten 2023 Wimbledon champion Vondrousova in 2r
- Bidding to reach R16 here at Wimbledon for a third time, after tournament debut in 2021 (l. Tomljanovic) and 2024 (l. Sun)
- Record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 3-1 (2-0 at Wimbledon)
- Two of her three career Top 10 wins have been on grass: No.5 Pegula at 2024 Eastbourne and No.9 Sakkari at 2024 Wimbledon. More recently, d. No.10 Navarro at 2025 Miami
- Career best Grand Slam showing is her run to the 2021 US Open title; she became the first qualifier to win a Grand Slam singles title in the Open Era
- Looking for her first career win over the World No.1; she is currently 0-3 after falling to Swiatek on each of those occasions - in QF at 2022 Stuttgart, R16 at 2024 Indian Wells and QF at 2024 Stuttgart

Laura Siegemund (GER #104) vs. [6] Madison Keys (USA #8)

Tied 1-1

Siegemund:

- Second-oldest woman in the singles starting field at Wimbledon this year, after her countrywoman Tatjana Maria (also 37, made 1r exit)
- Fell in Grand Slam qualifying no fewer than 10 times before making her main draw debut here at Wimbledon in 2015
- Has reached Wimbledon 3r for the first time in her career
- Best singles result on grass in career to date was QF at Bad Homburg in 2021 (l. Siniakova)
- Two-time doubles quarterfinalist here at Wimbledon (2023-24)

Keys:

- From her ten previous Wimbledon appearances, has a record in 3r matches of 5-3
- Defeated Siegemund in their most recent meeting in the first round of 2016 Wimbledon
- Looking to become the first woman to win the Australian Open and Wimbledon in the same year since Serena Williams in 2015
- Before heading to Wimbledon, lost to the eventual champions on grass at both Queen's (Maria, SF) and Berlin (Vondrousova, 1r)
- Winner of three grass court titles, having won at Eastbourne twice (captured first WTA title of career in 2014 and also 2023) and Birmingham once (2016)

Dalma Galfi (HUN #110) vs. [13] Amanda Anisimova (USA #12)

First meeting

Galfi:

- In her 4th main draw, has equalled her previous best result with 3r in 2023 (l. Alexandrova)
- Her 2r win over No.20 Haddad Maia was the first Top 20 win of her career with a record now standing at 1-3
- Her two match wins here this week are her first main draw Tour level match wins of the season; on the WTA 125 series she claimed back-to-back titles at Vic and Oeiras on clay in April
- Only player from Hungary to reach the 3r here this year after Bondar fell to Svitolina in 1r

Anisimova:

- Making her 4th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching the quarterfinal in 2022 (l. Halep)
- Posted her best Slam result at 2019 Roland Garros (l. Barty)
- Achieved her career best result on grass recently reaching the final at Queen's (l. Maria in final)
- Won her maiden WTA 1000 title this season at Doha (d. Ostapenko)
- Has the potential to make her Top 10 debut after Wimbledon depending on the results of a number of other players (Navarro, Svitolina, Rybakina)

[24] Elise Mertens (BEL #23) vs. [14] Elina Svitolina (UKR #13)

Svitolina leads 5-3

Mertens:

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 4r in 2022 (l. Jabeur) and 2019 (l. Strycova)
- Best result across Slams is semifinal at 2018 Australian Open (l. Wozniacki)
- Owns 25 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.19 Ekaterina Alexandrova at 's-Hertogenbosch in 2025
- Owns one grass court title: 's-Hertogenbosch in 2023

Svitolina:

- Making 11th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best results were reaching SF in 2019 (l. Halep) and 2023 (l. Vondrousova), which is also her best run at all majors, along with SF run at US Open 2019 (l. S. Williams)
- Is playing her second event on grass of 2025 season, having reached 2r at Bad Homburg (l. Haddad Maia)
- Defeated Mertens in their only previous meetings on grass: 1r at 2025 Bad Homburg and 2r at 2023 Wimbledon
- Her Wimbledon SFs are her best career grass court results, also Ukraine's best result at Wimbledon
- Has won 30 matches so far in 2025 including winning the title at Rouen
- A win today would see her advance to her 6th consecutive 4r at a Grand Slam, dating back to 2023 Wimbledon

Kamilla Rakhimova (#80) vs. [30] Linda Noskova (CZE #27)

First meeting

Rakhimova:

- Has reached 3r for the first time at Wimbledon in her second main draw appearance after reaching 1r as a qualifier in 2023 (l. Bucsa)
- Her QF run at Eastbourne last week is her career best result on grass
- Achieved her first win against a Top 10 opponent by defeating No.4 Jasmine Paolini in the previous round at Wimbledon 2025
- Looking to reach the R16 for the first time in her career at a Grand Slam

Noskova:

- In her third Wimbledon main draw appearance has reached 3r for the first time (2r in 2024; 1r in 2023)
- Has a 9-2 match record against players ranked outside the Top 50 so far this season with only losses to No.69 Lamens at Roeun and No.51 Krueger at Abu Dhabi
- The Wimbledon title has gone to a player from Czech Republic five times (Barbora Krejickova in 2024, Marketa Vondrousova in 2023, Petra Kvitova in 2014 & 2011, Jana Novotna in 1998)
- Recently achieved her career best result on grass with semifinal at 2025 Bad Homburg (l. Pegula)

Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#50) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #53)

Osaka leads 2-1

Pavlyuchenkova:

- Making 16th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching the QF in 2016 (l. Serena Williams)
- Including Wimbledon 2025 has the second most Grand Slam main draw appearances among players in the draw with 65 (most is Azarenka with 68)
- Her best result across Slams is R-Up which she reached at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Krejčíková)
- Recently reached her best career result on grass with SF at Eastbourne 2025 (l. eventual champion Joint)
- Reached a career high ranking of No.11 in November 2021

Osaka:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; a win today would achieve her best result, previously making 3r in 2017 (l. eventual finalist V. Williams) and 2018 (l. eventual champion Kerber)
- Four time Grand Slam singles champion, all at hard court majors: 2018 and 2020 US Opens; and 2019 and 2021 Australian Opens (4-0 in Grand Slam finals)
- Defeated Pavlyuchenkova in their two most recent meetings in 1r at 2021 Australian Open and the final at 2019 Osaka
- Career best result on grass is reaching 2018 Nottingham SF (l. eventual champion Barty)
- This is her third grass tournament of the season after Berlin (l. Samsonova in 1r) and Bad Homburg (l. Navarro in 2r)

[Q] Diane Parry (FRA #118) vs. Sonay Kartal (GBR #51)

First meeting

Parry:

- Upset No.12 seed Shnaider in 2r, for her second career win over a Top 20 opponent – also defeated No.2 Krejčíková at 2022 Roland Garros
- Has reached 3r at three of the four Slams – also Australian Open and Roland Garros – but is yet to go further
- Reached first grass court semifinal last year at Nottingham, falling to Karolína Plíšková
- Former World No.1 junior who reached SF of Wimbledon girls' event in 2019

Kartal:

- Through to 3r at Wimbledon for the second year in a row – bidding to reach R16 at a major for the first time
- Record on grass this swing is 4-3, including 2r efforts at Queen's and Nottingham
- Defeated No.21 Ostapenko in 1r to post the fifth Top 50 win of her career; her best win by ranking was over No.16 Kasatkina at 2025 Queen's
- Is currently ranked No.51 close to her career high of No.49 achieved on June 23, 2025; this time last year was ranked No.298
- A win today would set up a meeting with either Osaka or Pavlyuchenkova

(LL) Solana Sierra (ARG #101) vs. Cristina Bucsa (ESP #102)

First meeting

Sierra:

- Making her main draw debut at Wimbledon after playing qualifying in 2024; entered the main draw as lucky loser following the withdrawal of Greet Minnen
- Playing her first main draw Tour level event here at Wimbledon
- Her 2r win over No.43 Katie Boulter was her second best career win by ranking (also defeated No.32 Navarro at 2023 WTA 125 Florianopolis)
- Best result by an Argentinian player at Wimbledon was the Runner-Up run by Gabriela Sabatini in 1991
- Last time a player from Argentina reached 3r at Wimbledon was 2009 (Gisela Dulko)
- Her Wimbledon result will push her ranking into the Top 100 for the first time in her career

Bucsa:

- Making her 3rd appearance at Wimbledon and equals her best previous results with 2r in 2024 (I. Bouzas Maneiro) and 2023 (I. Pegula)
- Best result across Slams is 3r which she reached at 2023 Australian Open (I. Swiatek)
- Her best career result on grass is R16 which she has reached once at 2025 Nottingham
- Best result by Spain at Wimbledon were title runs by Garbiñe Muguruza in 2017 and Conchita Martínez in 1994
- Excluding qualifying matches, has a 2-3 record against players ranked outside the Top 100 so far this year (9-8 including qualifying)

- Owns three titles at Grand Slams, winning Australian Open in 2023 and 2024 and the US Open in 2024 - also a three-time finalist (2023 US Open, 2025 Australia Open and 2025 Roland Garros. Has reached more Slam finals than any other player in the field, ahead of Azarenka and Swiatek (five each)
- Top seed at Wimbledon for first time in career - and her third successive Grand Slam as No.1 seed
- Missed Wimbledon last year due to a shoulder injury
- Prior to this year's Wimbledon, reached SF at Berlin (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Defeated Canada's Carson Branstine and Marie Bouzkova of Czech Republic, both in straight sets, so far this week
- Record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 15-4 (2-0 at Wimbledon)
- Faces No.40 Emma Raducanu in 3r today; owns 211 wins in career over Top 50 players, including win over No.48 Bouzkova
- Record against players outside Top 20 this year is 29-4, ahead of today's meeting with Raducanu
- Owns 8-0 career record against British players
- Has reached two grass court finals in her career: 2018 Eastbourne and 2022 's-Hertogenbosch
- This time last year was ranked No.3 - will remain No.1 after Wimbledon, regardless of results this fortnight
- Winner of today's match faces Mertens or Svitolina in R16

- Heads into today's bout against No.1 Sabalenka with three career wins over Top 10 opponents, most recently defeating No.10 Navarro at 2025 Miami. Other wins were on grass last year, over No.5 Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Sakkari here at Wimbledon
- Record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 3-1 (2-0 at Wimbledon)
- One of two players from United Kingdom to reach 3r, along with Kartal
- Ahead of Wimbledon this year, reached QF at Queen's (l. Zheng) and 2r at Eastbourne (l. eventual champion Joint)
- Is currently ranked No.40; this time last year was ranked No.135
- During last year's grass swing reached SF at Nottingham, QF at Eastbourne and R16 at Wimbledon
- Has won 18 matches so far in 2025
- Has been involved in 10 three-set matches in 2025 (5-5 record)
- Has reached one career semifinal on grass, at Nottingham in 2024 (l. Boulter)
- Ann Haydon-Jones (1969) and Virginia Wade (1977) are the two British winners of the Wimbledon ladies' singles in the Open Era

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career

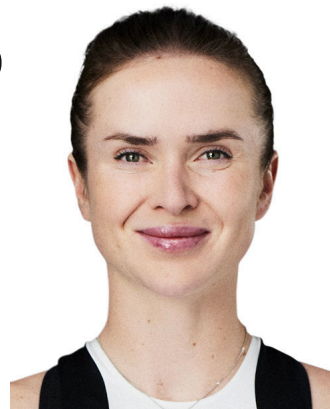
