[7] Mirra Andreeva (#7) vs. Hailey Baptiste (USA #55)

First meeting

M.Andreeva:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 4r in 2023
- Making her 10th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- Best career result on grass is a QF appearance at Bad Homburg in 2025
- Only Aryna Sabalenka (44), Iga Swiatek (37) and Jessica Pegula (35) have won more WTA level main draw matches than Mirra Andreeva (34) in 2025
- Andreeva has already equaled her most wins in a season having also won 34 in 2024
- In 2025, Andreeva is 12-1 vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (the one loss was to Boisson in Roland Garros QF)
- Bidding to become the youngest player to reach the Fourth Round at each of the first three Slams of the season since Nicole Vaidisova in 2006

Baptiste:

- Making Wimbledon main draw debut and 9th overall Grand Slam appearance
- This is her second time through to the R32 having also advanced to R16 at 2025 Roland Garros
- Fell in qualifying in two grass-court tournaments prior to Wimbledon Nottingham and Eastbourne
- Owns 1-4 record vs Top 10 opponents with lone win coming against No.10 Barbora Krejcikova at 2024 Wuhan
- Only Aryna Sabalenka (14) and Clara Tauson (10) have won more tie breaks than Hailey Baptiste so far in 2025 (nine, level with Elena Rybakina)
- Has won 18 WTA level main draw matches in 2025 (including BJK Cup): as many as she managed combining her first six seasons since debuting on Tour (18 between 2019 and 2024)

[8] Iga Swiatek (POL #4) vs. Danielle Collins (USA #54)

Swiatek:

- Playing in 26th main draw of a Slam
- Reached first final of the season last week at Bad Homburg, her first final since 2024 Roland Garros; as a result climbed from No.8 to No.4 in this week's PIF WTA Rankings
- 1 of 2 players to reach R32 in Wimbledon in all the last five editions of the tournament (along with Elena Rybakina)
- Third player this century to reach R32 for 22 consecutive Slams joining Amelie Mauresmo and Serena Williams
- Bidding to reach R16 for 19th time in career

Collins:

- Making 31st Grand Slam main draw appearance
- This is her 7th Wimbledon main draw appearance with best results coming at 2019 (R32) and 2024 (R16)
- Owns six Top 5 wins across career including one earlier this year defeating No.2 Swiatek at 2025 Rome
- Throughout career has never recorded two Top 5 wins in the same season
- Has won only 2 of previous 14 Grand Slam meetings against Top 10 opponents, defeating Angelique Kerber at the Australian Open 2019 and Iga Swiatek in Melbourne 2022 this will be her first career such meeting in Wimbledon
- Collins has spent 2 hours on court through the first two rounds the fewest of those through to R32

Krejcikova:

- The 2024 Wimbledon champion is making fifth Wimbledon main draw appearance
- Has 15 wins at Wimbledon, the most wins she has at a single Grand Slam event
- Has 15 career Top 10 wins, including 2 on grass-courts defeating No.4 Elena Rybakina (SF) and No.7 Jasmine Paolini (F)
- As she is defending 2,000 ranking points, would drop outside the Top 70 (to approximately No.75 depending on other results)
- The Women's Singles defending champion only lost two times in the Open Era in the Round of 32: Venus Williams in 2006 and Petra Kvitova in 2015, both against Jelena Jankovic

Navarro:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching QF stage in 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- Overall making 11th Grand Slam appearance
- Navarro has made at least the R32 in 5 of the last 6 Slams (only exception being 2025 Roland Garros)
- In the last two years, only Iga Swiatek and Elina Svitolina (seven each) have made more Women's Singles Grand Slam Third Rounds than Emma Navarro (six)

[23] Clara Tauson (DEN #22) vs. [11] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #11)

Tauson:

- Making 4th appearance at Wimbledon, where previous three results were first round losses
- Best result across all Slams is R16 run at Roland Garros 2024 (I. Jabeur)
- Career-best tour-level result on grass is QF run at Nottingham in 2025 (I. Linette)
- Only player from Denmark in this year's main draw
- Entering Wimbledon ranked second on WTA Tour for most aces served this year (223)
- Has served the most aces at Wimbledon 2025 in Women's Singles (24, at least 10 more than any other player)
- Seeking first career Top 20 win on grass (previously 0-3); overall owns 6 Top 20 wins in career with 3 coming in 2025
- Could equal the best result achieved in the Open Era by a player from Denmark in Women's Singles in Wimbledon, made by Caroline Wozniacki six times.

Rybakina:

- Entering Wimbledon, leads the Tour in aces served (235)
- Making 5th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was winning the tournament in 2022 (d. Jabeur in final)
- Has also reached SF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Krejcikova) and QF in 2023 (I. eventual R-Up Jabeur)
- Owns 21-3 record at Wimbledon; at 87.5% owns 4th highest match win percentage in the Open Era
- Along with Swiatek, is 1 of 2 players able to reach R32 in Wimbledon at last five editions of the tournament
- Could become the only player to advance to R16 in Wimbledon in all the last five seasons (since 2021)
- Only grass court title came at Wimbledon 2022

[16] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) vs. [19] Liudmila Samsonova (#19)

Samsonova leads 1-0

Kasatkina:

- Making 38th Grand Slam appearance (8th at Wimbledon)
- A Wimbledon quarterfinalist in 2018 (I. eventual Champion Angelique Kerber)
- Best result across all Slams is SF run at Roland Garros in 2022 (I. eventual Champion Iga Swiatek)
- Entered Wimbledon without a grass-court main draw win this year; fell 1r at Queens, Berlin and Eastbourne
- Began representing Australia in March 2025

Samsonova:

- Making 21st Grand Slam main draw appearance, including fourth at Wimbledon
- Best result at a Slam has been R16 finish four times including 2021 Wimbledon

Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #88) vs. [18] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#17)

Sonmez:

- This week, Sonmez became the first Turkish player to reach 3r of a Grand Slam event in the Open Era (since 1968)
- Contesting 4th Grand Slam main draw of her career (first time in Wimbledon main draw); was 0-3 in Grand Slam maindraw matches prior to this week
- Has 0-3 record vs. Top 20 players (career-best win by ranking is over No.24 Frech at 2024 Tokyo)

Alexandrova:

- Making 33rd Grand Slam main draw appearance, and has twice reached Grand Slam R16 (2023 Wimbledon and 2025 Roland Garros)
- Since the start of 2019, has won 36 matches on grass; only Ons Jabeur (41) has won more in that span
- A two-time grass-court title winner both at 's-Hertogenbosch (2022, 2023)
- Alexandrova is 6-0 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 75

Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #62) vs. Dayana Yastremska (UKR #42)

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous and best result was reaching 3r in 2024 (I. eventual Champion Krejcikova)
- Owns 5 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.9 Emma Navarro at Roland Garros 2025
- Best result by Spanish woman at Wimbledon was Champion run by Garbiñe Muguruza (2017), Conchita Martínez (1994)
- With a win today would be in position to make Top 50 debut after Wimbledon

Yastremska:

- Making 22nd Grand Slam main draw appearance with best result standing as SF at 2024 Australian Open
- Making 4th Wimbledon appearance; has now reached R32 (or better) in 3 of her 4 Wimbledon appearances also 2024 (R32) and 2019 (R16)

Elisabetta Cocciaretto (ITA #116) vs. Belinda Bencic (SUI #35)

Bencic leads 1-0

Cocciaetto:

- Making her 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous best result was reaching the r32 in 2023 (I. Pegula)
- Achieved her second Top 10 win over No.3 Jessica Pegula at Wimbledon 2025 in the first round
- Faces No.35 Belinda Bencic in 3r today; looking for her 17th win in career over a Top 50 player
- Best result by Italy at Wimbledon was the Runner-Up run by Jasmine Paolini in 2024
- Bidding to be the 9th Italian woman to reach the R16 at Wimbledon this century

Bencic:

- Making her 9th appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous best results have been the r16 in 2023, 2018, and 2015
- Faces No.116 Elisabetta Cocciaretto in 3r today; leads the head-to-head 1-0 (this is their first meeting on grass)
- Best career result on grass is Champion which she has reached once: Eastbourne in 2015
- 1 of 9 moms in draw at Wimbledon this year
- With a win would be through to the R16 for the 11th time at a Slam; would be the 13th active player to reach R16 11 times

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached first two WTA finals of career in 2024 winning the title at Iasi and finishing runner-up at Ningbo
- Made first Grand Slam semifinal at 2024 Roland Garros beating World No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals
- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16. Also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women s doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell 1r on WTA main-draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)

- In 2024 made Tour level R16 at Bogota, Seoul and Wuhan as well as reaching 2r at Roland Garros. Also made semifinal at WTA 125 Puerto Vallarta and broke into the Top 100 for the first time, achieving a career high ranking of No.80 in October.
- Won back-to-back main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia); also in 2023 fell 2r at Charleston and Washington DC, 1r at Miami and QF at WTA 125K Midland
- 2022 season including, 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet); also fell 1r at Indian Wells, Miami and Roland Garros and QF at WTA 125K Montevideo
- In 2021, came through qualifying to reach 2r at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Kenin), also reached 2r at Chicago [500] (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur). Fell 1r on three occasions including US Open Won doubles title at 2021 Charleston [250] w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- Played one main draw in 2020 at US Open in Grand Slam main draw debut falling to Kristina Mladenovic in 1r; also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as WC d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at US Open and on ITF Circuit won \$25k titles at Tucon, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017
