2025 WIMBLEDON

This is the 138th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 131st staging of the Wimbledon women's singles championship and the 57th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (24-1 in 1r, 96.0%):** Swiatek has been defeated in the 1r only once in 25 Grand Slam main draw appearances, here at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)
- **Madison Keys (42-5 in 1r, 89.4 %):** Has won 12-straight Slam opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). She owns a perfect 10-0 record here in opening matches at Wimbledon
- **Coco Gauff (20-3 in 1r, 87.0%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin)
- **Elena Rybakina (20-3 in 1r, 87.0%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel)
- **Elina Svitolina (39-6 in 1r, 86.7%):** Svitolina has won 35 of her last 36 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- **Zheng Qinwen (12-2 in 1r, 85.7%):** Zheng's two first round losses both came here at Wimbledon, in 2023 (I. Siniakova) and 2024 (I. Sun)
- **Elise Mertens (28-5 in 1r, 84.9%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu). Fell 1r at most recent Slam at 2025 Roland-Garros (I. Boisson)
- **Emma Raducanu (10-2, 83.3%):** Both of Raducanu's first round losses came at the US Open; she is 3-0 at Wimbledon in the opening round.
- **Aryna Sabalenka (23-5, 82.1%) :** Has not lost in 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open
- **Victoria Azarenka (55-12 in 1r, 82.1%):** Four of her 12 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & WIMBLEDON

In 2024, New Zealand's Lulu Sun became the seventh qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when Alexandra Stevenson advanced to SF. At the 2021 US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

This will be the 57th Women's Singles edition of the tournament in Wimbledon in the Open Era.

Martina Navratilova in Wimbledon is the player with the most Women's Singles titles in a single Grand Slam in the Open Era (nine).

Four players in the Open Era have won the Women's Singles at Wimbledon on five or more occasions: Martina Navratilova (nine), Steffi Graf, Serena Williams (seven each) and Venus Williams (five).

Petra Kvitova is the only current player with multiple titles at the Championships in Women's Singles (two, in 2011 and 2014).

Martina Navratilova has appeared in (134) and won (120) the most Women's Singles matches at Wimbledon of any player in the Open Era - she has the most wins (120) of any female or male player at a single Grand Slam event in that span.

Martina Navratilova has appeared in the most Women's Singles finals at Wimbledon in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 9-3 from her 12 appearances: she is one of three over that span to appear in 10+ Women's Singles finals at the event, along with Serena Williams (11) and Chris Evert (10).

With a win-loss record of 74-7 at the event, Steffi Graf (91.4%) holds the highest winning percentage in the Women's Singles in Wimbledon in the Open Era among players with 3+ main draw appearances - Elena

Only Venus Williams (24), Martina Navratilova (23) and Serena Williams (21) have appeared in 20+ Women's Singles main draws in Wimbledon in the Open Era.

Six players in the Open Era have won the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon without dropping a set: Chris Evert (1981), Lindsay Davenport (1999), Venus Williams (2008), Marion Bartoli (2013) and the two to achieve the feat multiple times, Serena Williams (2002 and 2010) and Martina Navratilova (1983, 1984, 1986 and 1990).

Having achieved the feat in Wimbledon, Martina Navratilova is the only player in the Open Era to win a single Women's Singles Grand Slam event without dropping a set on four separate occasions (1983, 1984, 1986 and 1990).

At 16 years and 279 days, Martina Hingis (1997) is the youngest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles at Wimbledon - she is one of two players in the Open Era to win the event before turning 18, along with Maria Sharapova (2004).

At 34 years and 287 days, Serena Williams (2016) is the oldest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles at Wimbledon: Serena Williams (2012, 2015 and 2016) and Martina Navratilova (1987 and 1990) are the only two players over that span to win the event multiple times after turning 30.

Marketa Vondrousova in 2023 became the only unseeded player to win the Women's Singles title in Wimbledon in the Open Era.

Marketa Vondrousova in 2023 (at No.42) became the lowest-ranked winner of the Women's Singles title in Wimbledon since the WTA Rankings were published in 1975 - she is one of the three players ranked outside the Top 30 to win the event over that span, along with Venus Williams in 2007 (No.31) and Barbora Krejčíková in 2024 (No.32).

Martina Navratilova holds the longest winning streak in the Women's Singles in Wimbledon in the Open Era, with 47 straight wins between 1982 and 1988: this is the longest winning streak of any female or male player at a single Grand Slam event over that span.

Ann Jones in 1969 and Virginia Wade in 1977 are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Women's Singles final in Wimbledon in the Open Era, with both going on to win the event in respective years.

Dropping 25 games, Martina Navratilova in 1983 has conceded the fewest games en route to winning the Women's Singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era.

Barbora Krejčíková in 2024 conceded the most games en route winning the Women's Singles title in Wimbledon in the Open Era (76).

The Women's Singles reigning champion has lost in the opening round only twice in Wimbledon in the Open Era: Steffi Graf in 1994 and Marketa Vondrousova in 2024.

Coco Gauff could become the third youngest player to win Women's Singles Grand Slam titles on all three surfaces during in Open Era, older than only Serena Williams and Steffi Graf.

Since 1985, Aryna Sabalenka could become the fifth World No.1 to reach the final at the Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon during a single season after Martina Navratilova (1987), Steffi Graf (1988 and 1989), Monica Seles (1992) and Serena Williams (2015 and 2016).

Since 2000, Aryna Sabalenka could become the third player to reach the Women's Singles final at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in a single season after Justine Henin (2006) and Serena Williams (2015 and 2016).
