

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Rebeka Masarova (SUI #109)

Sabalenka leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Returning this year as defending champion, having defeated Pegula in last year's final
- Was also R-Up here in 2023 (I. Gauff) and made the SF in 2021 and 2022
- Has successfully defending titles twice in her career Wuhan in 2018-19 and Australian Open from 2023-24
- Serena Williams from 2012-14 was the last player to defend the US Open title
- Won the doubles title here at Flushing Meadows in 2019 (w/Mertens)
- Overall this is her 30th Grand Slam main draw appearance has won the Australian Open twice (2023-24),
 finished R-Up at Roland Garros (2025, I. Gauff) and has made the Wimbledon SFs three times
- Has reached at least the QF stage of last 11 Grand Slams contested
- Is closing in on 100 Grand Slam main draw wins, entering 2025 US Open with a 94-26 record

Masarova:

- Had fallen in qualifying at all the Slams this year before gaining direct entry to 2025 US Open.
- Has reached 2r here twice, in both 2021 and 2023
- Faces PIF WTA World No.1 Sabalenka in 1r today; second time facing the reigning World No.1, also losing to Sabalenka at 2025 Berlin
- Owns one Top 10 win in career, over No.8 Maria Sakkari at here at US Open in 2023

[4] Jessica Pegula (USA #4) vs. Mayar Sherif (EGY #104)

First meeting

Pegula:

- Posted best result across the Slams last year here with run to final, losing to Sabalenka
- Prior to this had reached six Slam QFs across all the Majors but never further
- Overall this is her 27th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and owns a 19-7 record in Slam 1r matches
- Has lost her last three consecutive matches against opposition outside the Top 100, starting at Roland Garros (No.361 Boisson), Wimbledon (No.116 Cocciaretto) and No.386 Sevastova (Montreal)
- Has over 50 Grand Slam match wins to her name (52-26 record)
- Owns the joint-most singles title this season, with three, at Austin, Charleston and Bad Homburg (same as Sabalenka)

Sherif:

- Making her 5th appearance at US Open and bidding for first main draw win today, having lost opening matches from 2021-24
- Made history with 1r win at 2021 Australian Open, becoming first Egyptian woman to win a match at a Grand Slam tournament
- Match today is her first in almost a month, since reaching 2r on clay at Palermo in mid-July
- Looking for her second Tour level main draw match win of the season after 1r at Miami

[Q] Destanee Aiava (AUS #168) vs. Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8)

First meeting

Aiava:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (as qualifier, I. Rybakina)
- Best result across all majors is 2r at Australian Open 2025 (l. Collins)
- As qualifier, has beaten Beilek, Mikulskyte, Seidel to reach main draw
- Looking to first Top 10 win since defeating No.10 Aryna Sabalenka at 's-Hertogenbosch 2019
- Is currently ranked No.168 (peak rank at No.147 in 2017)

Paolini:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching 4r in 2024 (I. Muchova)
- Is two-time Grand Slam finalist at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Krejcikova) and Roland Garros 2024 (I. Swiatek)
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 6-1 in 2025, with the only loss to No. 110 Ito at Montreal 2025
- Owns two singles titles on hard court at Dubai 2024 and Portoroz 2021
- Best result by Italy at US Open was by Flavia Pennetta who won the title in 2015

[10] Emma Navarro (USA #11) vs. Yafan Wang (CHN #202)

First meeting

Navarro:

- Making 4th appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching SF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka), her best result across all majors
- Also reached another two QFs at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Paolini) and Australian Open 2025 (I. Swiatek)
- Both of her two career singles titles have come on hard court at Merida 2025 and Hobart 2024
- Nine women from United States of America have won US Open, most recently by Coco Gauff in 2023
- Is currently ranked No.11 (peak rank at No.8); this time last year was ranked No.12

Wang:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching 4r in 2024 (I. Badosa), which is also her best result across all Grand Slams
- Owns 5 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.9 Maria Sakkari and No.20 Victoria Azarenka at US Open 2024 (en route to R16)
- Record in 1r matches at US Open stands at 4-1 (10-8 overall), with the only loss to Wozniacki in 2019
- Her sole career singles champion has come on hard court at Acapulco in 2019

Alexandra Eala (PHI #70) vs. [14] Clara Tauson (DEN #15)

First meeting

Eala:

- Making US Open main draw debut
- This is the first time a female player from the Philippines has competed in the US Open singles main draw
- Eala will become the third player (male or female) from the Philippines to appear at the US Open singles main draw after Cecil Mamiit (1996, 1997, 1999 and 2000) and Eric Taino (2001 and 2002).
- Making 3rd Grand Slam main draw appearance; fell in 1r at Roland Garros 2025 (I. Arango) and 1r at Wimbledon 2025 (I. defending champion Krejcikova)
- Won the US Open Junior Singles title in 2022 (d. Havlickova in F)
- Owns 3 career-wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.20 Jelena Ostapenko at Eastbourne 2025

Tauson:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result is 2r which she has reached three times: 2024 (I. Shnaider); 2023 (I. Stearns); 2021 (I. No.1 seed Barty)
- Making 17th Grand Slam appearance; best result is 4r at 2025 Wimbledon (I. eventual champion Swiatek) and 2024 Roland Garros (I. Jabeur)
- Owns 18-1 record in 2025 against players outside Top 50, with only loss coming against No.72 Yastremska at Linz
- All 3 of her career-titles have come on hard court: Auckland 2025 (d. Osaka in F); Luxembourg 2021 (d. Ostapenko in F); Lyon 2021 (d. Golubic in F)
- So far during this year's North American summer hard court swing reached 2r at Cincinnati (I. V. Kudermetova),
 SF at Montreal (I. Osaka), QF at Washington DC (I. Kalinskaya)

[Q] Zhang Shuai (CHN #114) vs. [16] Belinda Bencic (SUI #18)

Zhang leads 1-0

Zhang:

- Making 12th main draw appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament showing was reaching R16 in 2022
 (I. Gauff)
- Contesting her 49th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performances are QFs at 2016
 Australian Open and 2019 Wimbledon
- Began her career 0-14 in Grand Slam 1r matches before her run to 2016 Australian Open QF as a qualifier (d. No.2 Halep in 1r of that event for her first career Grand Slam main draw win)
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.8 Emma Navarro at 2024 Beijing

Bencic:

- Making 9th appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament showing is reaching the 2019 SF (I. eventual champion Andreescu), and she also reached QF in 2014 and 2021
- Contesting her 36th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best Grand Slam performances are SFs at 2019
 US Open and 2025 Wimbledon
- 7 of her 9 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently 2025 Abu Dhabi
- After giving birth to daughter Bella last year, returned to action in October 2024; she has raised her ranking from No.421 at the start of 2025 to its current position of No.18

[Q] Rebecca Marino (CAN #119) vs. [31] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #33)

Marino leads 1-0

Marino:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament performance was reaching 3r in 2022 (I. Zhang Shuai)
- Contesting her 20th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam showings are two runs to 3r (2011 Roland Garros and 2022 US Open)
- Prevailed in three 3-set qualifying matches to reach this fortnight's main draw
- Holds a 6-13 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches; seeking her 1st Grand Slam main draw win since 2022 US
 Open

• Fernandez:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where she reached her first Grand Slam final in 2021 (finished runner-up to Raducanu in all-teenage final)
- Contesting her 22nd career Grand Slam main draw; she is 14-7 in Grand Slam 1r matches
- During this year's North American summer hard court swing, won her 1st career WTA 500-level title at Washington (d. Kalinskaya in final)
- All of her 4 WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2021 Monterrey, 2022 Monterrey, 2023 Hong Kong and 2025 Washington)

[32] McCartney Kessler (USA #34) vs. Magda Linette (POL #36)

Kessler leads 1-0

Kessler:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at US Open; fell in 1r on her previous appearance in 2024 (I. Kostyuk)
- Bidding to reach the 2r of a Grand Slam for the second time in her career; has lost her last five Grand Slam Ir matches consecutively
- Owns 1-0 career record against players from Poland, defeating today's opponent Linette at Brisbane 2025
- Owns 18 career-wins over Top 50 players, most recently No.5 Mirra Andreeva at Montreal 2025
- Her two career-titles have come on hard court: Hobart 2025 (d. Mertens in F) and Cleveland 2024 (d. Haddad Maia in F)

Linette:

- Making 11th appearance at US Open, her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2020 (I. Kontaveit)
- Making 41st Grand Slam appearance; her best result is SF run at Australian Open 2023 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Owns 15-25 career record in 1r Grand Slam matches, bidding for her first Grand Slam match win of 2025
- Owns 11-12 record in 2025 against Top 50 players, most recent was loss to Veronika Kudermetova in Cincinnati
- Best result by a player from Poland at US Open was Iga Swiatek who lifted the title in 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)

Emma Raducanu (GBR #35) vs. [Q] Ena Shibahara (JPN #130)

Raducanu leads 1-0

Raducanu:

- Making 4th appearance at US Open, where she won the tournament on debut appearance in 2021 (as qualifier, d. Fernandez in F)
- Outside the US Open her best result at Grand Slams is R16 run at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Sun)
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 23-9 (3-1 in 2025)
- Record in 1r matches at Grand Slams is 11-2 (1-2 at US Open)
- Is currently ranked No.35; this time last year was ranked No.72

Shibahara:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Swiatek), which is her best result across all majors
- Hasn't reached main draw at other Slams outside US Open
- As qualifier, has beaten Day, Pridankina and Gracheva to make main draw
- Has failed all her previous six attempts against Top 50 opponents
- Best career result on hard court is QF run at Austin 2025

Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #56) vs. [Q] Tereza Valentova (CZE #94)

First meeting

Bronzetti:

- This is her 4th US Open main draw posting her best result in 2023 with 3r (I. Q.Zheng); also her best Grand Slam result
- Has a record of 5-10 in 1r Grand Slam matches
- Looking for her first match win against a qualifier so far this season with a record of 0-6
- One of three players from Italy in the main draw along with Paolini and Cocciaretto

Valentova:

- Making her US Open main draw debut
- In 2023 reached the US Open girl's singles final (I. Katherine Hui in F)
- Reached her first Grand Slam main draw this year as a qualifier at Roland Garros (I. Gauff in 2r)
- Achieved a career best result at Prague last month by reaching the semifinal (I. Bouzkova)
- One of 8 players from Czech Republic to feature in the main draw
- Facing a player from Italy for the first time at Tour level

Lulu Sun (NZL #102) vs. Camila Osorio (COL #94)

First meeting

Sun:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open, after falling in 1r 2024 (I. Bronzetti)
- Bidding to reach 2r of a Grand Slam for the second time in career, since QF run at Wimbledon 2024
- At Grand Slam tournaments so far this year, fell in 1r at Australian Open (I. Kovinic), 1r at Roland Garros (I. qualifier Mboko), and 1r at Wimbledon (I. Bouzkova)
- Owns 15-28 career record against players inside Top 100
- Best career result on hard court was R-Up at Monterrey 2024 (I. Noskova in F)

Osorio:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching 2r twice: 2022 (I. Riske Amritraj) & 2021 (I. Jabeur)
- Owns a career record of 9-9 in 1r Grand Slam matches; 2-2 in 1r at US Open
- Owns 7-2 record in 2025 against players outside Top 100
- Best career result on hard court was R-Up twice: Monterrey 2022 (I. Fernandez in F) & Tenerife 2021 (I. Li in F)
- One of 2 players from Colombia in this year's main draw alongside Emiliana Arango

Victoria Azarenka (#133) vs. [Q] Hina Inoue (USA #218)

First meeting

Azarenka:

- Making 18th appearance at US Open, where she is three-time finalist in 2012-13 (I. S. Williams in F both times) and 2020 (I. Osaka in F)
- Owns two Grand Slam titles at Australian Open in 2012 (d. Sharapova) and 2013 (d. Li Na)
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 at US Open stands at 9-0
- Record in 1r matches at US Open is 19-1, with the only loss to Sabalenka in 2019
- Owns 20 singles titles on hard court, most recently Cincinnati (NYC) in 2020

Inoue:

- Making main draw debut at US Open
- First time playing main draw across all majors, having played qualifying at Wimbledon 2025 and Roland Garros 2025
- As qualifier, has beaten Davis, Waltert and Stefanini to make main draw
- Including qualifying matches, her career best win by ranking so far is defeating No. 127 Waltert here in qualifying at US Open 2025
- Previously has only played Tour-level main draw events once at Hong Kong 250 in 2024 (as qualifier, I. Xiyu Wang in 1r)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Best results in 2024 were reaching SF at Brisbane (l. Sabalenka), Miami (l. Rybakina) and Berlin (l. Kalinskaya). Made 4r at Australian Open (l. Yastremska). In addition, reached QF another four times at Doha (l. eventual champion Swiatek), Rome (l. Collins), Charleston (l. Pegula) and Washington DC (l. Sabalenka).
- Opened 2023, with QF at Adelaide 1 (l. Noskova) before reaching semifinal at Australian Open (l. Rybakina). Made 4r at Wimbledon (l. Svitolina) and 2r at US Open before earning a QF finish at Guadalajara (l. Garcia)
- Standout result in 2022 was SF in last tournament of her season, at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Pegula). Also reached QFs at Washington DC and Adelaide, while made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Best result in 2021 came in final event when she finished R-Up at Indian Wells (l. Badosa on third set tie-break). Also made SFs at Doha and Bad Homburg
