[5] Mirra Andreeva (CZE #5) vs. Alycia Parks (USA #56)

First meeting

Andreeva:

- Making 3rd appearance at US Open, where her best result is 2r twice: 2024 (l. Krueger) & 2023 (l. eventual champion Gauff)
- Making 11th Grand Slam appearance; her best result was SF run at 2024 Roland Garros (l. Paolini)
- Owns a career record of 9-1 in Grand Slam 1r matches, and 2-0 in 1r at US Open, her only 1r defeat came at Wimbledon 2024 (l. Fruhvirtova)
- Owns 13-1 record in 2025 vs. players outside Top 50, with only loss vs. No.361 Boisson at Roland Garros
- Has won two WTA 1000 titles in 2025; holds the records as youngest to win a title at the WTA 1000 level

Parks:

- Enters the US Open after most recently reaching the semifinals in Monterrey (including R16 win over No.11 Emma Navarro); as a result her ranking jumped from No.71 to 56; her career-best ranking in No.40
- Also during this year's North American summer hard court swing, fell in 1r at Cincinnati (l. Krejčíková) and 1r at Montreal (l. McNally)
- Making 3rd appearance at US Open, she is bidding to reach 2r for the first time after falling in 1r twice: 2023 (l. Kasatkina) & 2021 (l. Danilovic)
- Making 9th Grand Slam appearance; owns 3-5 record in Grand Slam 1r matches, and 0-2 in 1r at US Open
- Owns 2 career-wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.5 Caroline Garcia at Lyon 2023

[6] Madison Keys (USA #6) vs. Renata Zarazua (MEX #82)

Keys leads 1-0

Keys:

- Making 14th main-draw appearance at US Open, where she was runner-up in 2017 (I. Stephens in final) and reached 2 additional SFs (2018, 2023)
- Contesting her 49th Grand Slam main draw of career; she won her first Grand Slam title earlier this year at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in final)
- Holds 43-5 record in Grand Slam 1r matches; her last 1r loss at a Grand Slam event was to Sloane Stephens at 2021 US Open (rematch of 2017 US Open final)
- Has won 37 tour-level matches so far in 2025, tied for 4th-most on Tour
- 5 of 10 career WTA singles titles have come on hardcourt, incl. Australian Open and Adelaide this year

Zarazua:

- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at US Open; she reached 2r last year (d. Garcia, I. Wozniacki)
- Contesting the 9th Grand Slam main draw of her career; she is 4-4 in Grand Slam 1r matches, and has never advanced beyond the 2r of a Slam
- Zarazua is 0-6 against Top 10 players in her career, most recently losing to No.10 Rybakina at Cincinnati earlier this month
- Aiming to become the first Mexican woman to defeat a Top 10 seed at a Grand Slam since Angelica Gavaldon d. Jana Novotna at 1995 Australian Open

[9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #10) vs. [WC] Juileta Pareja (USA #335)

First meeting

Rybakina:

- Making 7th main-draw appearance at US Open; career-best US Open results are 3r showings in 2021 and 2023 (this is the only Slam where she has yet to make the QF)
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; she has won 1 Grand Slam title (2022 Wimbledon) and reached 1 other Grand Slam final (2023 Australian Open)
- Has won her last 11 matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 200 (last loss to a player ranked below No.200 was to No.430 Maria Lourdes Carle at 2021 Billie Jean King Cup)
- In this summer's North American hard-court swing, has lost in the SF of all 3 of her events, each time to the eventual champion (I. Fernandez in Washington; I. Mboko in Montreal; and I. Swiatek in Cincinnati)
- Holds 21-3 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches; last Grand Slam 1r loss was to Burel at 2022 US Open
- Leads the Tour in aces served (359)

Pareja:

- The youngest player in the women's draw at 16-year-old, is making her Grand Slam main-draw debut at this year's US Open; reached final round of qualifying here last year
- Contesting her first tour-level match since her WTA main-draw debut in April at Bogota (SF as a qualifier)
- With her Bogota run, Pareja became the youngest player to reach a tour-level semifinal since 15-year-old Coco Gauff won Linz title in 2019
- This will be Pareja's first career meeting vs. a player ranked inside the Top 90
- At 2025 Junior Wimbledon, finished runner-up in both singles and doubles

[WC] Venus Williams (USA #602) vs. [11] Karolina Muchova (CZE #13) Muchova leads 1-0

Williams:

- Making 25th appearance at US Open, where she won the tournament in 2000 (d. Davenport in F) and 2001 (d. S. Williams in F)
- Owns 7 singles titles in total at Grand Slams, with all the other five coming at Wimbledon (2000-01, 2005, 2007-08)
- Is playing her 3rd event of 2025 season since Miami 2024, after Washington DC and Cincinnati
- Last time she played a Top 20 opponent was at Cincinnati 2023, where she defeated No.16 Veronika Kudermetova
- Was the lowest ranked player (No.1504) to play main draw at US Open in 2022; Is currently ranked No.597

Muchova:

- Won only previous meeting at 2020 US Open
- Making 8th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching SF in 2024 (l. Pegula) and 2023 (l. eventual champion Gauff)
- Best result at Grand Slams is R-Up at Roland Garros 2023 (l. Swiatek in F); also reached SF at Australian Open 2021 (l. Brady)
- Record in 1r matches at Grand Slams stands at 15-9 (5-2 at US Open)=
- Her career sole singles title has come on hard court at Seoul 2019 (d. Linette in F)
- Is currently ranked No.12; this time last year was ranked No.52

Anna Bondar (HUN #97) vs. [12] Elina Svitolina (UKR #15)

Svitolina leads 2-0

Bondar:

- Making 3rd appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching 2r in 2024 (l. Kalinskaya)
- Owns a career record of 3-8 in 1r Grand Slam matches, and 1-1 in 1r at US Open
- Owns 2-8 career record vs. Top 20 players, most recently defeated No.16 Alexandrova at Hamburg 2025
- Best career result on hard court is QF run twice: Cluj-Napoca 2022 (l. Potapova) & Lyon 2022 (l. Cirstea)
- So far during this year's North American summer hard court swing, fell in 1r at Monterrey (l. Maria) & 1r at Cincinnati (l. Tomljanovic)

Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was SF run in 2019 (l. S. Williams)
- Making 47th Grand Slam appearance; her best result is SF three times: Wimbledon 2023 (l. Vondrousova); US Open 2019 (l. S. Williams); Wimbledon 2019 (l. Halep)
- Owns a career record of 40-6 in 1r Grand Slam matches (9-2 in 1r at US Open), hasn't lost a Grand Slam 1r match since Wimbledon 2018 (l. Tatjana Maria)
- Owns 18-2 record in 2025 against players outside Top 50
- Owns 3-0 career record against players from Hungary, 2-0 in 2025 with both wins against today's opponent Bondar at Wimbledon and Roland Garros

[15] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) vs. Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #70)

First meeting

Kasatkina:

- Making 11th appearance at US Open, where her best result is 4r twice in 2023 (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka) and 2017 (l. Kanepi)
- contesting her 39th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performance was SF run at Roland Garros 2022 (l. Swiatek)
- Owns a career record of 29-9 in 1r Grand Slam matches, and 6-4 in 1r at US Open
- Six of her 8 career singles titles have come on hard court, most recently Ningbo 2024 (d. M. Andreeva in F)
- Began representing Australia earlier this year; she is one of seven Australians in the draw

Ruse:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open; her best result is reaching 3r in 2024 (l. Badosa)
- Owns a career record of 5-8 in Grand Slam 1r matches, 2-2 in 1r at US Open
- Owns 2-18 career record vs. Top 20 players, most recent win was over No.8 Krejckikova at US Open 2024
- So far during this year's North American summer hard court swing, fell in 1r at Cleveland (l. Baptiste), 1r at Cincinnati (l. qualifier Ito) and 1r at Montreal (l. Raducanu)

Barbora Krejckikova (CZE #62) vs. [22] Victoria Mboko (CAN #23)

First meeting

Krejckikova

- Two-time Grand Slam champion winning at 2021 Roland Garros and 2024 Wimbledon
- Best US Open result came on main draw debut in 2021 with run to QF
- Overall this is her 22nd Grand Slam main draw appearance
- Lifted the doubles title here w/Siniakova in 2022
- Owns a 16-5 record in Slam 1r matches, one such loss coming here in New York in 2023 and four such losses at Roland-Garros

Mboko

- Began 2025 season ranked outside the Top 300 but breakout season has seen her enter 2025 US Open as the No.22 seed and at a career-high ranking of No.23
- Overall this is just her third Grand Slam main draw appearance, following 2025 Roland-Garros (as qualifier, made 3r) and 2025 Wimbledon (as LL, l. Baptiste in 2r)
- Coming off fairytale title run in Montreal, defeating four Grand Slam champions to win her home tournament; at 18 years old, became second youngest to defeat 4 Grand Slam Champions at a tournament in the Open Era; only Serena Williams was younger when she did so at the 1999 US Open at 17 years old
- Last player to win the WTA 1000 Canadian event and then the US Open was Andreescu (Toronto)

[19] Elise Mertens (BEL #21) vs. [WC] Alyssa Ahn (USA #714)

First meeting

Mertens:

- Making 10th US Open appearance; previous best result was reaching back-to-back QFs in 2020 and 2019
- Contesting her 35th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performance is SF at Australian Open 2018 (l. Wozniacki)
- Won the US Open Women's Doubles title in 2019 with Sabalenka (d. Barty/Azarenka in F)
- Owns a career record of 29-5 in 1r Grand Slam matches, and 6-3 at US Open
- Owns 6-1 record in 2025 against players outside Top 100 with only loss against wildcard Lois Boisson at Roland Garros
- Former WTA World No.1, holding the top spot for 39 weeks; in doubles has won a Grand Slam title at 3 of the 4 Slams (exception: Roland Garros where best finish is 2019 SF); also won 2022 WTA Finals in doubles

Ahn:

- 18-year-old is making her Grand Slam debut at this year's US Open
- Contesting her first ever tour-level match in today's 1r
- This will be Ahn's second career meeting against a Top 100 player, after loss to No.70 Claire Liu at San Diego 2023 qualifying
- Is currently at a career-high ranking of No.714; this time last year was ranked No.1022
- Completed the 16s and 18s sweep of the USTA Billie Jean King Girls' National Championships in San Diego, having also won the 16-and-under title in 2022
- Committed to play tennis at Stanford in 2025-26 where she will be teamed up with Valerie Glozman, who is also in the main draw

Maria Sakkari (GRE #64) vs. Tatjana Maria (GER #42)

Tied 2-2

Sakkari:

- Sakkari and Maria's most recent meeting was in the 1r of the 2022 US Open, which Sakkari won (in 2022, they met at 3 of the 4 Grand Slam events, with Sakkari winning 2 of 3 meetings)
- Making her 11th appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament showing is reaching the 2021 SF (l. eventual champion Raducanu)
- Contesting the 39th Grand Slam main draw of her career; her best Grand Slam results are SFs at 2021 Roland Garros and 2021 US Open
- 1 of her 2 career WTA singles titles has come on hard court, 2023 Guadalajara

Maria:

- Making 12th main-draw appearance at US Open; she has advanced to the 2r of this event on 4 occasions (including last year), but has yet to reach 3r
- Contesting her 48th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best Grand Slam showing is a run to the 2022 Wimbledon SF (l. Jabeur)
- Reached new career-high ranking of No.36 this July, shortly after winning her highest-level title at WTA 500 Queen's Club at age 37 -- with that victory, she became the oldest singles champion on the Hologic WTA Tour since 38-year-old Serena Williams won 2020 Auckland

Taylor Townsend (USA #139) vs. Antonia Ruzic (CRO #69)

First meeting

Townsend:

- Making 10th main-draw appearance at US Open; her career-best US Open result is making R16 in 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu), which is also her best Grand Slam singles result
- Holds a 12-18 record in Grand Slam 1r matches (0-3 this year)
- During this year's North American summer hard-court swing, reached Washington QF as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Fernandez), then made Cincinnati 3r (l. Bouzas Maneiro)
- Currently ranked World No.1 in the PIF WTA Doubles Rankings; she reached the top spot of the doubles rankings for the first time on July 28

Ruzic:

- Making her Grand Slam main-draw debut at this tournament; she is 1 of 8 women making their Grand Slam main-draw debuts this week
- One of 2 players from Croatia in this fortnight's main draw (along with former Top 20 player Donna Vekic)
- Last week, made her first career WTA 500-level QF at Monterrey
- Is currently ranked No.89; this time last year was ranked No.173. She made her Top 100 debut on June 9, peaking at No.84 earlier this month

Lola Jeanjean (FRA #93) vs. [Q] Priscilla Hon (AUS #126)

First meeting

Jeanjean:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at US Open; on her previous appearance in 2022 she fell in 1r (l. Gauff)
- On her Grand Slam debut at 2022 Roland Garros, defeated World No.8 Karolina Pliskova in 2r as a wildcard
- Owns a career record of 3-5 in 1r Grand Slam matches
- Owns 1-1 career record against players from Australia, losing to Kasatkina at Roland Garros 2025 and defeating Birrell at Roland Garros 2023

Hon:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at US Open; bidding to reach 2r for the first time in her career after 1r exits in 2024 (l. eventual champion Sabelanka) & 2019 (l. Gasparyan)
- Contesting her 9th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performances are 2r at 2020 Australian Open (l. Kerber) & 2019 Roland Garros (l. Keys)
- Owns a career record of 2-6 in 1r Grand Slam matches
- Owns 4 career-wins over Top 100 players, most recently defeated No.17 Kvitova at Adelaide 2022

First meeting

Kvitova:

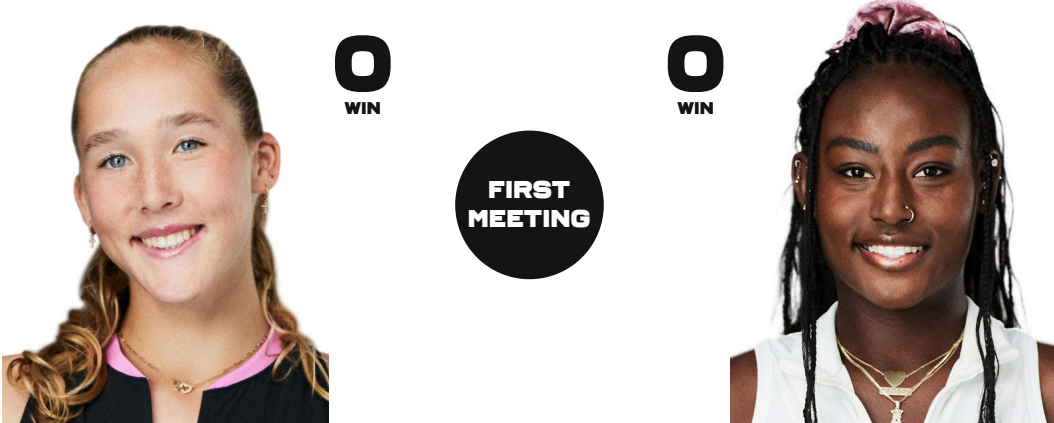
- Plans to retire from professional tennis following this tournament
- Making 17th main-draw appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament results are QFs in 2015 (l. eventual champion Pennetta) and 2017 (l. V. Williams)
- Contesting her 62nd career Grand Slam main draw; she has won 2 Grand Slam titles at 2011 Wimbledon (d. Sharapova) and 2014 Wimbledon (d. Bouchard)
- Kvitova has won her last 12 first-round matches at US Open (between 2012 and 2023); the last time she fell 1r at US Open was 2011 (l. Dulgheru)
- After 2023 Beijing, took 17 months of maternity leave, giving birth to Petr in July 2024. Returned to action at Austin this February

Parry:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open; she reached the 2r for the first time last year
- Contesting the 20th Grand Slam main draw of her career; she has reached Grand Slam 3r four times, including at the most recent Slam, 2025 Wimbledon (as a qualifier)
- Playing her first tour-level hard-court match since the 2025 Australian Open 1r (l. Vekic)
- Career-best tour-level results on hard court are SFs at 2022 Granby and 2024 Osaka
- Best US Open result by a Frenchwoman in the Open Era is Mary Pierce's run to the 2005 final (l. Clijsters)

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)

- Finished 2021 in fine form, winning 18 of last 20 matches, highlighted by two WTA 125K Series finals, winning title in Montevideo, Uruguay and finishing R-Up at Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Overall, compiled 50-23 win-loss record last year, lifting three ITF Circuit titles and rising nearly 200 places in the rankings during second half of campaign. Also fell 1r at Roland Garros (as WC, l. Sasnovich) and Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Niemeier)
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2020, at W15 tournament in Antalya, Turkey
- Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Lapko, l. Mertens)
- First contested WTA qualifying at 2018 Roland Garros
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event in Le Havre in 2017
- After Beijing 2023 took 17 months maternity leave giving birth to Petr in July 2024. Returned to the courts at Austin 2025
- In 2023, won 30th and 31st titles at Miami (d. Rybakina in F) and Berlin (d. Vekic in F) and reached QF at Adelaide 2, Indian Wells and Ningbo
- Won title at 2022 Eastbourne (d. Ostapenko in F) and finished R-Up later that summer at Cincinnati (l. Garcia)
- Best result in 2021 was title run at Doha (d. Muguruza in F). Also made SFs at Bad Homburg and Ostrava, and QFs at Stuttgart, Madrid and Cincinnati
- Reached one final in 2020 at Doha (l. Sabalenka)
- Reached title match at 2019 Australian Open for third career Grand Slam final appearance -result moved her to World No.2, matching her career high ranking. Had she beaten Naomi Osaka in the final, would have claimed World No.1 ranking
- Also in 2019, won title at Sydney and Stuttgart and qualified for WTA Finals in Shenzhen for seventh time (went 0-3 in group play)
- Won a WTA-leading five titles in 2018, at St. Petersburg (d. Mladenovic in F), Doha (d. Muguruza in F), Prague (d. Buzarnescu in F), Madrid (d. Bertens in F) and Birmingham (d. Rybakina in F); qualified for WTA Finals going 0-3 in group play
- Titles in 2018 came on all three surfaces - first player to win a title on three different surfaces in a season since S.Williams in 2015
- Began 2017 season in May at Roland Garros (2r, l. Mattek-Sands) after a knife attack in her home in Czech Republic on December 20, 2016; required extensive surgery to left hand. Won title at 2017 Birmingham only a month later
- Contested Rio Olympics in August 2016, winning the singles bronze medal (l. Puig in SF, d. Keys in bronze medal play-off); also won titles at Wuhan and WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai
- Won three titles in 2015 at Sydney, Madrid and New Haven
- Runner-up at 2015 WTA Finals in Singapore (l. A.Radwanska in 3s). Former champion at the season finale, which she won on her event debut in 2011 (d. Azarenka in F)
- Earned second Grand Slam title at 2014 Wimbledon (d. Bouchard in F); also won title at New Haven and Wuhan and qualified for WTA Finals going 1-2 in group play
- Won two titles in 2012 at Montreal and New Haven and qualified for WTA Finals going 0-1 in group play; also won two titles in 2013 at Dubai

and Tokyo then reached SF at WTA Finals after going 2-1 in group play

- Won first career title at 2009 Hobart (d. Benesova in F) and reached final at Linz (l. Wickmayer)
- Earned first WTA main draw win at 2008 Paris [Indoor] defeating No.30 Anabel Medina Garrigues and reached first QFs at Budapest and Zurich propelling her into Top 50 for the first time ending year at No.44
- Earned first Top 10 win of career over No.8 Venus Williams while ranked No.143 at 2008 February
- Made WTA debut at 2007 Prague qualifying and main draw debut at 2007 Stockholm; also played US Open qualifying that year Member of Czech Republic's Billie Jean King Cup winning team in 2011-12, 2014-16 and 2018
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Czech Republic in 2006; owns seven ITF titles
