


Emiliana Arango (COL #84) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #2)

First meeting

HOLOGIC

WTA TOUR

Arango:

- Making her US Open main-draw debut, having previously fallen in 2023 and 2024 qualifying
- This is her 3rd Grand Slam main draw, having contested Roland Garros (2r) and Wimbledon (1r) also this season
- Currently 0-4 vs. Top 10 players in career
- Career-best win by opponent ranking came over No.26 Potapova at 2023 Guadalajara
- Her best tour-level result on hard court is a runner-up finish at Merida in 2025 (I. Navarro in final)

Swiatek:

- 2022 US Open champion (d. Jabeur in final)
- She is a six-time Grand Slam singles champion; her other five Slam titles coming at Roland Garros (2020, 2022-2024) and most recently 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in final)
- Bidding to become the first woman to win Wimbledon and US Open in the same calendar year since Serena Williams in 2012
- Was runner-up in the US Open Mixed Doubles event held last week (w/Ruud; I. Errani/Vavassori in final)
- Enters US Open having won her 24th career WTA title at Cincinnati earlier this month the last two US Open champions also won Cincinnati prior to coming to New York (Gauff in 2023 and Sabalenka in 2024)
- A loss to No.84 Arango would be her worst Grand Slam defeat by opponent ranking (that is currently a 1r loss to No.81 Golubic at 2019 Wimbledon)
- The 2019 Wimbledon loss to Golubic is also Swiatek's only 1r loss in her 26 previous Grand Slam main-draw appearances (25-1 in Grand Slam 1r matches, 96.1%)
- Can possibly reclaim the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking this fortnight if Aryna Sabalenka fails to reach the quarterfinals, Swiatek (or Coco Gauff) could potentially move to No.1 by winning the title

Ajla Tomljanovic (AUS #79) vs. [3] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Gauff leads 1-0

Tomljanovic:

- Joint-best result across the Grand Slams came here with QF run in 2022 (also made back-to-back Wimbledon QFs in 2021 and 2022)
- During her 2022 US Open run, Tomljanovic defeated Serena Williams in 3r, which was the 23-time Grand Slam singles champion's final professional match
- Owns a 23-17 record in Slam Ir matches (8-3 in US Open Ir matches); fell Ir in the most recent Grand Slam event at 2025 Wimbledon (I. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Has notched 3 career wins over Top 5 players; her most recent Top 5 win was over No.4 Paula Badosa at 2022 Cincinnati (0-7 vs. Top 5 players since then)

Gauff:

- Making her 7th US Open appearance; she won her first Grand Slam title here in 2023 (d. Sabalenka in final)
- With her 2023 US Open victory at age 19, Gauff became the first American teenager to win the women's singles title at the US Open since Serena Williams in 1999
- Picked up her second Grand Slam singles title this summer at 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in final)
- Owns a 20-4 record in Grand Slam 1r matches; she lost her 1r match at the most recent major, 2025 Wimbledon (I. Yastremska)
- Gauff has won her last 20 Grand Slam matches against players ranked outside the Top 50; her last such loss was to No.128 Kenin in the 1r of 2023 Wimbledon
- Can possibly attain the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking this fortnight if Aryna Sabalenka fails to reach the quarterfinals, Gauff (or Iga Swiatek) could potentially move to No.1 by winning the title

[8] Amanda Anisimova (USA #9) vs. Kimberly Birrell (AUS #83)

First meeting

Anisimova:

- Making 6th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2020 (I. Sakkari)
- Career-best Grand Slam result came at the most recent Slam, when she reached her first Grand Slam final at 2025 Wimbledon (I. Swiatek in F)
- This is her first time seeded among the Top 8 at a Grand Slam event
- Made her Top 10 debut on July 14, following the Wimbledon final; this time last year was ranked No.50
- Two of her three singles titles have come on hard court (2022 Melbourne Summer Set 2 and 2025 Doha)
- Has won 10 Grand Slam main-draw matches so far in 2025, already equal to her highest such tally in a single calendar year (level with 2022)

Birrell:

- Making her 3rd main-draw appearance at US Open and seeking her first main-draw victory at the event; she fell
 1r in 2023 (as lucky loser, I. Brady) and 2024 (as qualifier, I. Vekic)
- Career-best Grand Slam result is a 3r run at her home major, the Australian Open, in 2019 (I. Kerber)
- Owns 2 wins in career over Top 10 players, defeating No.10 Daria Kasatkina at 2019 Brisbane and No.8 Emma Navarro at 2025 Brisbane
- Record in 1r matches at Grand Slams is 2-9 (0-3 in 2025)
- Career-best tour-level result on hard court is finishing runner-up at 2024 Osaka (I. Lamens in final)

Laura Siegemund (GER #52) vs. [20] Diana Shnaider (#17)

Siegemund leads 2-0

Siegemund:

- Appearing in her 9th US Open main draw; her tournament-best result is 3r in 2016 (I. V. Williams)
- This is her 30th Grand Slam main draw, and she has reached Slam quarterfinals twice: at Wimbledon this year
 (I. Sabalenka) and 2020 Roland Garros (I. Kvitova)
- Is 3-3 against Top 20 players so far this season, with her most recent Top 20 victory coming at Wimbledon over No.6 Madison Keys in the 3r
- Both of her previous wins over Shnaider came in qualifying rounds; this is their first main-draw meeting
- One of three players from Germany to feature in the main draw along with Tatjana Maria and Eva Lys

Shnaider:

- Made her US Open main-draw debut last year and reached 4r (I. eventual finalist Pegula)
- This is her 10th Grand Slam main-draw appearance, with her 2024 US Open 4r result her best across Slams
- Owns a 7-2 record in Grand Slam Ir matches, with only losses in 2024 at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Enters US Open on the back of winning WTA 500 Monterrey for her fifth career title (d. Alexandrova in F); she is now 5-1 in Tour level finals, losing only her first at 2023 Ningbo to No.1 seed Jabeur
- Now owns three hard-court WTA singles titles: Monterrey 2025, Hong Kong 2024 and Hua Hin 2024

Greet Minnen (BEL #106) vs. [23] Naomi Osaka (JPN #24)

Osaka leads 1-0

Minnen:

- Career-best Grand Slam results have come here in New York, with 3r appearances in 2021 and 2023
- Owns a 6-13 record in Grand Slam 1r matches (3-2 in US Open 1r matches)
- Has posted 10 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently over No.38 Anastasia Potapova at 2024 Beijing (has gone 0-5 vs. Top 50 players since then)
- Bidding for her first main-draw hard-court win of the summer (I. 1r in Cincinnati and Cleveland)
- Belgian women have won the US Open singles title on 5 occasions: 3 times by Kim Clijsters (2005, 2009, 2010) and twice by Justine Henin (2003, 2007)

Osaka:

- Two-time US Open champion, claiming the title here in New York in 2018 (d. S. Williams in final) and 2020 (d. Azarenka in final)
- Her triumph here in 2018 made her the first Japanese player to win a Grand Slam singles title
- Has claimed four Grand Slam singles titles in total, also winning the Australian Open twice, in 2019 and 2021
- Her 2019 Australian Open victory saw her ascend to the World No.1 ranking for the first time; she held the top
 ranking for a total of 25 weeks during her career
- She is 7-1 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (in tour-level matches); that one loss was to then-No.294 Bencic at Australian Open (via ret.)
- All of her 7 Hologic WTA Tour-level singles titles have come on hard court, most recently the 2021 Australian Open (she also won a WTA 125-level title on clay this year at Saint-Malo)

Ashlyn Krueger (USA #38) vs. [26] Sofia Kenin (USA #27)

Tied 1-1

Krueger:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, where her career-best result is reaching 3r last year (I. Samsonova)
- Owns a career record of 3-7 in Grand Slam 1r matches (1-3 in US Open 1r matches)
- Has notched 17 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.44 Kessler at Strasbourg 2025 (she is 0-6 vs. Top 50 players since then)
- Her one WTA singles title came on hard court at 2023 Osaka (d. Zhu in final); she also made another hard-court final at 2025 Abu Dhabi (I. Bencic)

Kenin:

- Making her 10th appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament result is 4r in 2020 (I. Mertens)
- Contesting her 30th Grand Slam main draw overall; she has won 1 Grand Slam title at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F), and has reached 1 additional Grand Slam final at 2020 Roland Garros (I. Swiatek in F)
- Owns a career record of 19-10 in Grand Slam 1r matches (6-3 in US Open 1r matches)
- Four of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently 2020 Lyon
- Posted her career-high ranking of No.4 for the first time in March of 2020

Katie Boulter (GBR #48) vs. [27] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #28)

Boulter leads 1-0

Boulter:

- Making 4th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her tournament-best result is 3r in 2023 (I. Stearns)
- She has reached Grand Slam 3r on three occasions (also 2022 and 2023 Wimbledon)
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.9 Paula Badosa at 2025 Wimbledon; Boulter is 3-8 vs. Top 50 players in 2025
- Record in 1r matches at Grand Slams stands at 12-5 (2-1 at US Open)
- Defeated today's opponent Kostyuk in the 2024 San Diego final to claim her one hard-court WTA singles title (her 2 additional WTA singles titles have come on grass at Nottingham)

Kostyuk:

- Making 6th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her tournament-best results are 3r in 2020 (I. eventual champion Osaka) and 2024 (I. Navarro)
- Career-best result across all Grand Slams is QF run at 2024 Australian Open (I. Gauff)
- Owns 49 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.41 Tatjana Maria at Cincinnati 2025
- Record in 1r matches at Grand Slams stands at 14-8 (3-2 at US Open)
- Her one WTA singles title has come on hard court, at 2023 Austin
- Reached career-high ranking of No.16 in June of last year

[Q] Victoria Jimenez Kasintseva (AND #130) vs. Maya Joint (AUS #43)

Tied 1-1

Jimenez Kasintseva:

- Came through qualifying to make her Grand Slam main-draw debut
- Aiming to become the first player from Andorra to win a Grand Slam main-draw match in the Open Era
- Has an 0-3 record against Top 50 opponents in tour-level matches
- Career-best win by opponent ranking is defeating No.57 Zhu Lin at 2024 Madrid
- Her best tour-level result on hard court is a QF run at 2022 Seoul
- Won the 2020 Junior Australian Open singles title at age 14

Joint:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open; she made her Grand Slam main-draw debut here last year as a qualifier and reached the 2r (d. Siegemund, I. Keys)
- 0-3 in Grand Slam 1r matches this year
- Won her first two WTA singles titles this year, on clay at Rabat (d. Cristian in final) and on grass at Eastbourne (d. Eala in final)
- Career-best tour-level result on hard court is SF run at 2025 Hobart
- Broke into Top 50 for the first time in her career on June 30; peaked at No.37 in July
- Has won 21 tour-level matches so far in 2025 by contrast, only won 1 tour-level main-draw match in 2024 (which was her 2024 US Open 1r victory)

Hailey Baptiste (USA #47) vs. Katerina Siniakova (CZE #76)

First meeting

Baptiste:

- Making her 3rd main-draw appearance at the US Open and seeking her first main-draw win at the event; she lost 1r in 2020 (I. Mladenovic) and 2021 (I. Zhang Shuai)
- Contesting her 10th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best result across all Grand Slams is R16 run at Roland Garros this year (I. Keys)
- Her career-best tour-level result on hard court is QF run at 2025 Auckland
- Posted a new career-high ranking of No.47 this week; this time last year was ranked No.102

Siniakova:

- Making her 11th main-draw appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament result is 3r in 2018 (I. Tsurenko)
- Contesting her 43rd consecutive Grand Slam singles main draw, tied (w/Putintseva) for the longest active streak; overall, Siniakova is making her 44th Grand Slam main draw appearance in singles
- Career-best singles result across all Grand Slams is R16 run at 2019 Roland Garros (I. Keys)
- Her most recent Top 50 win came over No.6 Zheng Qinwen in the 1r of 2025 Wimbledon
- 3 of her 5 WTA singles titles have come on hard court, at 2017 Shenzhen, 2022 Portoroz and 2023 Nanchang
- Siniakova won the 2022 US Open women's doubles title w/Krejcikova, completing that team's Career Grand Slam in doubles

Danielle Collins (USA #61) vs. Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #50)

Collins leads 1-0

Collins:


- Making her 10th main-draw appearance at US Open; her career-best tournament result is reaching R16 in 2022 (I. Sabalenka)
- Contesting the 32nd Grand Slam main draw of her career; her career-best Grand Slam result is finishing runner-up at the 2022 Australian Open (I. World No.1 Barty)
- Holds a 22-9 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches; her most recent 1r loss at a Slam was here last year (I. fellow American Dolehide)
- 2 of her 4 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: 2021 San Jose and 2024 Miami
- Reached career-high ranking of World No.7 for the first time in July 2022

Cristian:

- Making 3rd main-draw appearance at US Open, and is seeking her first main-draw win at the event (lost 1r in 2022 and 2024)
- Contesting her 12th Grand Slam main draw of career; her career-best Grand Slam showings are 3r at this year's Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Is currently ranked No.50; she made her Top 50 debut this June, peaking at career-high of No.49
- Career-best tour-level result on hard court is finishing runner-up at 2021 Linz (I. Riske-Amritraj)

- Making her seventh main-draw appearance at US Open, where she is a former champion, lifting the title in 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Other key result here is making QF in 2024
- Title here in 2022 is one of six Grand Slam crowns, the other five coming at Roland-Garros (2020, 2022-2024) and Wimbledon (2025)
- Bidding to be first player since Serena Williams in 2012 to win Wimbledon and US Open in the same calendar year
- Was R-Up w/Ruud in US Open Mixed Doubles event held last week (l. Errani/Vavassori in F)
- Enters 2025 US Open following 24th career title at Cincinnati - the last two US Open champions also won Cincinnati prior to coming to New York, Gauff in 2023 and Sabalenka in 2024
- Overall, 2025 US Open is her 27th consecutive Grand Slam main draw, and she has a 100-20 record at Grand Slam events
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 25-1; her one 1r Slam loss came at 2019 Wimbledon (l. Golubic)
- Faces No.84 Emiliana Arango in 1r today; a loss would be Swiatek's worst Grand Slam loss by opponent ranking (currently the loss to No.81 Golubic at 2019 Wimbledon)
- Only other loss at Slam level to a player outside the Top 50 came to No.76 Svitolina in 2023 Wimbledon QF
- 13 of her 24 WTA singles titles have come on hard court, including Cincinnati earlier this month
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.1. She has spent 125 weeks of her career ranked World No.1
- Has won 49 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, trailing only Aryna Sabalenka

- Today's winner will face Suzan Lamens or Valerie Glozman in 2r
