


DAY 4 – WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 27

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Polina Kudermetova (#67)

Sabalenka leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Returning this year as defending champion, having defeated Pegula in last year's final
- Was also R-Up here in 2023 (I. Gauff) and made the SF in 2021 and 2022
- Has successfully defending titles twice in her career Wuhan in 2018-19 and Australian Open from 2023-24
- Serena Williams from 2012-14 was the last player to defend the US Open title
- Overall this is her 30th Grand Slam main draw appearance has won the Australian Open twice (2023-24), finished R-Up at Roland Garros (2025, I. Gauff) and has made the Wimbledon SFs three times
- Owns a 20-4 record in Slam 2r matches (5-2 at US Open), and has reached at least the QF stage of last 11 Grand Slams contested
- Defeated P.Kudermetova in their only previous meeting in the 2025 season opening Brisbane final
- Is closing in on 100 Grand Slam main draw wins, entering 2025 US Open with a 95-26 record

Kudermetova:

- Making her US Open main draw debut after falling in the first round of qualifying last year
- Contesting her 5th Grand Slam main draw; this is the first time she has reached the 2r of a Slam
- Progressed to the second round following the retirement of Nuria Parrizas Diaz at 2-2 in the first set
- Second time facing a World No.1 after losing to Sabalenka in the 2025 Brisbane final
- Owns one Top 10 win in career, over No.9 Daria Kasatkina at Brisbane 2025

[4] Jessica Pegula (USA #4) vs. Anna Blinkova (#80)

Pegula leads 4-1

Pegula:

- Posted best result across the Slams last year here with run to final, losing to Sabalenka
- Prior to this had reached six Slam QFs across all the Majors but never further
- Overall this is her 27th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and owns a 19-7 record in Slam 1r matches
- Defeated Sherif so far this week to extend her Ir win streak at US Open to six straight, dating back to 2020
- Has over 50 Grand Slam match wins to her name (53-26 record)
- Owns the joint-most singles title this season, with three, at Austin, Charleston and Bad Homburg (same as Sabalenka)
- A win today would be her 13th straight win against an opponent ranked outside the Top 50 at US Open (last loss was against No.64 Alize Cornet in 2019)

Blinkova:

- Making 8th main draw appearance at US Open, where she has advanced to the 2r for the first time
- Defeated Yuliia Starodubtseva in 1r; her first win in straight sets at a Grand Slam since 1r at Australian Open 2024
- Owns four wins in her career over Top 10 players, most recently No.5 Pegula at Indian Wells 2024
- Looking to advance to her fifth 3r at a Grand Slam and first since Australian Open 2024

Anastasia Potapova (#53) vs. [5] Mirra Andreeva (#5)

Tied 1-1

Potapova:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open; her best result is reaching 3r in 2024 (I. Muchova)
- Making 23rd Grand Slam appearance; her best result is 4r at Roland Garros 2024 (I. eventual champion
- Owns a career record of 5-7 in 2r Grand Slam matches, and 1-1 in 2r at US Open
- Owns 7-22 career record against Top 10 players, her most recent win was against No.8 Qinwen Zheng at Madrid
- Two of her 3 career titles have come on hard court: Cluj-Napoca 2025 (d. Bronzetti in F) and Linz 2023 (d. Martic in F)

Andreeva:

- Making 3rd appearance at US Open, where her best result is 2r twice: 2024 (I. Krueger) & 2023 (I. eventual champion Gauff)
- Making 11th Grand Slam appearance; her best result was SF run at 2024 Roland Garros (I. Paolini)
- With a win today, she would reach the 3r at US Open for the first time
- Owns 14-1 record in 2025 against players outside Top 50, with only loss against No.361 Boisson at Roland Garros
- Has won two WTA 1000 titles in 2025; holds the records of the youngest player to win a title at WTA 1000 level

Iva Jovic (USA #73) vs. [7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8)

Paolini leads 1-0

Jovic:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Alexandrova)
- With a win today would be through to her first 3r at Grand Slams
- Looking for her first Top 10 win, having failed both of her previous attempts (I. No.7 Rybakina at Australian Open & No.6 Paolini at Indian Wells, both this year)
- Career best win by ranking is defeating No.23 Noskova at Cincinnati 2025
- One of the eight teenagers in this year's field, currently ranked at career high of No.73 (just achieved on Aug 25)

Paolini:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching 4r in 2024 (I. Muchova)
- Is two-time Grand Slam finalist at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Krejcikova) and Roland Garros 2024 (I. Swiatek)
- Including her Ir defeat of Aiava, has won 7 out of her last 8 matches (only loss to Swiatek in final at Cincinnati)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 in 2025 is 18-5, with the most recent loss to No. 110 Ito at Montreal
- Record in 2r matches at Grand Slams is 6-5 (1-1 at US Open)
- Owns two singles titles on hard court at Dubai 2024 and Portoroz 2021
- Best result by Italy at US Open was by Flavia Pennetta who won the title in 2015

[9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #10) vs. [Q] Tereza Valentova (CZE #96)

First meeting

Rybakina:

- Making 7th main draw appearance at US Open; her best results are 3r showings in 2021 and 2023 (this is the only Grand Slam event where she has yet to make the QF)
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; she has won one Grand Slam title (2022 Wimbledon, d. Jabeur in final) and reached one other Grand Slam final (2023 Australian Open, I. Sabalenka)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 at Grand Slams is 6-0 in 2025 (43-7 overall), with the most recent loss at a Grand Slam to No. 143 Ponchet at US Open 2024
- Four of her 9 career titles have come on hard court (2020 Hobart, 2023 Indian Wells, 2024 Brisbane and 2024 Abu Dhabi)

Valentova:

- Making her US Open main draw debut
- In 2023 reached the US Open girl's singles final (I. Katherine Hui in F)
- Reached her first Grand Slam main draw this year as a qualifier at Roland Garros (I. Gauff in 2r)
- Second time playing a Top 10 opponent (I. No.2 Gauff at Roland Garros 2025)
- Is currently ranked No.96 (close to career best No.92 in July 2025); this time last year was ranked No.276
- Defeated Lucia Bronzetti in 1r to score her first US Open main draw win
- Achieved a career best result at Prague last month by reaching the semifinal (I. Bouzkova)

[10] Emma Navarro (USA #11) vs. [WC] Caty McNally (USA #101)

Tied 1-1

Navarro:

- Making 4th appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching SF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka), her best result across all majors
- Also reached another two QFs at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Paolini) and Australian Open 2025 (I. Swiatek)
- Appearing in her eighth career 2r at a Grand Slam; a win today would mark her seventh straight 2r win
- Won only previous Tour-level meeting against McNally at Indian Wells 2023 (also faced her at ITF Macon 2020)
- Owns a 4-1 career record against players from USA at Grand Slams
- Both of her two career singles titles have come on hard court at Merida 2025 and Hobart 2024
- Is currently ranked No.11 (peak rank at No.8); this time last year was ranked No.12

McNally:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at US Open, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2020
- Defeated No. 87 Jil Teichmann in 1r; first time defeating a Top 100 opponent at a Grand Slam since winning against No. 29 Ekaterina Alexandrova US Open 2020
- Seeking first career win over a Top 20 player (currently 0-7)
- Looking to win a career-best sixth Tour-level hard court match this season; also won five such matches in 2023

Ann Li (USA #58) vs. [16] Belinda Bencic (SUI #19)

First meeting

Li:

- Through to the US Open 2r for the second time, after making 3r in her debut here in 2020
- Her 3r run here is her joint-best result across the Slams, also making this stage at 2021 Australian Open
- Enters 2025 US Open off the back of reaching the fifth final of her career at Cleveland last week (falling to Cirstea)
- Owns one hard court title, Tenerife in 2021
- One of 25 American women to begin the 2025 US Open main draw
- Defeated Rebecca Sramkova so far this week marking her 10th Grand Slam main draw win (10-14 record across the Majors)

Bencic:

- Joint-best result across the Slams came at US Open with semifinal run in 2019 (losing to eventual champion Andreescu)
- Has also made the semifinals at 2025 Wimbledon, again falling to eventual champion Iga Swiatek
- Overall this is her 36th Grand Slam main draw, and has reached the R16 at Australian Open three times and the 3r at Roland-Garros twice
- Has beaten Zhang Shuai so far this week to snap back-to-back losses, at Montreal (in the 3r, lost to Muchova) and opening match at Cincinnati (falling to Kudermetova)
- Owns nine singles title, all seven coming on hard court, most recently 2025 Abu Dhabi
- Best result by a Swiss woman at US Open was by Martina Hingis who won the title in 1997
- Is currently ranked No.19; this time last year was ranked No.280 as she made her way back from maternity leave

Lulu Sun (NZL #164) vs. [19] Elise Mertens (BEL #21)

First meeting

Sun:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open, after falling in 1r 2024 (I. Bronzetti)
- Through to 2r of a Grand Slam for the second time in her career after quarterfinal run Wimbledon 2024
- Facing a player from Belgium for the first time in her career at Tour level
- Owns six career wins over Top 50 players, most recently No.16 Daria Kasatkina at Eastbourne 2025
- Best career result on hard court was R-Up at Monterrey 2024 (I. Noskova in F)

Mertens:

- Making 10th US Open appearance with previous best results of back-to-back QFs in 2020 and 2019
- Contesting her 35th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performance is SF at Australian
- Open 2018 (I. Wozniacki)
- Including her 1r victory over No.714 Alyssa Ahn, has a 7-1 record in 2025 against players ranked outside the Top 100 with only loss against wildcard Lois Boisson at Roland Garros

Elsa Jacquemot (FRA #91) vs. [31] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #30)

First meeting

Jacquemot:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at US Open; on her previous appearance in 2023, lost in 1r against Lesia Tsurenko
- Making 9th Grand Slam appearance; her best result is 3r at Roland Garros 2025 (I. wildcard Boisson)
- Owns a career record of 1-2 in Grand Slam 2r matches, this is the first time she has reached the 2r at US Open
- Defeated No.44 Marie Bouzkova in the previous round to register her second Top 50 win of her career after win over No.29 Linette at Wimbledon 2025
- Her best career result on hard court came just before the US Open, with a QF run in Cleveland (I. eventual finalist Ann Li)

Fernandez:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where she reached her first Grand Slam final in 2021 (finished runner-up to Raducanu in all-teenage final)
- Bidding to reach her first 3r at US Open since her run to the final in 2021
- Contesting her 22nd career Grand Slam main draw; she is 5-9 in Grand Slam 2r matches
- Owns 13-6 record this year vs. players ranked outside Top 50, most recently defeated No.117 Marino in the previous round here
- During this year's North American summer hard court swing, won first career WTA 500 title at Washington DC (d. Kalinskaya in final)

[32] McCartney Kessler (USA #41) vs. Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #60) Vondrousova leads 1-0

Kessler:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at US Open; fell in 1r on her previous appearance in 2024 (I. Kostyuk)
- Owns 0-1 career record in Grand Slam 2r matches, bidding to reach her first career Grand Slam 3r
- Defeated No.36 Magda Linette in the 1r to register her 16th win over a Top 50 player in 2025
- Owns 11-9 record in 2025 against players outside the Top 50
- Both of her two career titles have come on hard court: Hobart 2025 (d. Mertens in F) and Cleveland 2024 (d. Haddad Maia in F)

Vondrousova:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open; her best result was QF run in 2023 (I. Keys)
- Making 28th Grand Slam main draw appearance; her best result is winning Wimbledon 2023 (d. Jabeur in F); also finished runner-up at Roland Garros 2019 (l. Barty in F)
- Owns 10-8 career record in Grand Slam 2r matches (2-2 at US Open)
- Owns 16-8 career record against players from United States of America (2-1 in 2025), most recent was win over today's opponent Kessler in Wimbledon 1r
- Holds 3 tour-level titles, one on hard court: Biel 2017 (as a qualifier, d. Kontaveit in F)

Emma Raducanu (GBR #36) vs. [Q] Janice Tjen (INA #149)

First meeting

Raducanu:

- Making 4th appearance at US Open, where she won the tournament on debut appearance in 2021 (as qualifier, d. Fernandez in F)
- Contesting her 14th Grand Slam appearance, outside US Open her best result at Grand Slams is R16 at Wimbledon 2024 (I. Sun) & 2021 (I. Tomljanovic)
- Is through to her first US Open 2r since winning the title in 2021
- Has won 25 Tour level main draw matches so far in 2025 her highest career tally in a single entire season
- Owns a 5-6 record in Grand Slam 2r matches
- Owns 4-1 record in 2025 against players outside Top 100, has won the last 4 consecutively
- Her SF run in Washington DC last month was her first Tour-level semifinal since winning the US Open title in 2021

Tjen:

- Making Grand Slam main draw debut after coming through qualifying at her first Tour-level qualifying event
- Defeated No.26 Veronika Kudermetova in the previous round to record her first ever Tour-level match win on her Tour-level debut
- First time a player from Indonesia has won a main draw match at US Open since Angelique Widjaja in 2002 (d. Anna Kournikova)
- Could become the first player from Indonesia to reach a Grand Slam 3r since Yayuk Basuki at Wimbledon 2000
- Players from Indonesia hold a 2-46 record in the Open Era against former Grand Slam champions only Yayuk Basuki has defeated such an opponent (Fed Cup 1995 vs. Gabriela Sabatini and Sydney 1997 vs. Mary Pierce)
- Has won 100 out of 113 matches at ITF level since turning professional in May 2024
- Best result by a qualifier at US Open is title run by today's opponent Emma Raducanu in 2021

Victoria Azarenka (#132) vs. Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#45)

Azarenka leads 7-2

Azarenka:

- Making 18th appearance at US Open; she is three-time finalist in 2012-13 (I. S. Williams in F both times) and 2020 (I. Osaka in F)
- Owns two Grand Slam titles at Australian Open in 2012 (d. Sharapova) and 2013 (d. Li Na)
- Has defeated a Top 50 opponent only once so far this season against Veronika Kudermetova in qualifying at Bad Homburg; with a record of 1-9
- Record in 2r matches at US Open is 14-2, with the only losses in 2023 & 2010
- Owns 20 singles titles on hard court, most recently Cincinnati (NYC) in 2020

Pavlyuchenkova:

- Making 16th main draw appearance posting her best result in 2011 with quarterfinal (I. S.Williams)
- Her best Slam result was reaching the final at 2021 Roland Garros (I. Krejcikova)
- Owns nine career hard court titles, most recently Hong Kong and Monterrey in 2017
- This is her first meeting against a player ranked outside the Top 100 so far this season
- Has progressed beyond the 2r at US Open on six occasions, most recently 2024 when she made 3r (I. Swiatek)

Cristina Bucsa (ESP #95) vs. Alexandra Eala (PHI #75)

Eala leads 1-0

Bucsa:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open
- Defeated Claire Liu in the opening round to equal her previous best result at US Open in 2022 (2r, I. Collins)
- Best result across all majors is 3r at Wimbledon 2025 (I. Sierra) and Australian Open 2023 (I. Swiatek)
- With a win would be through to her first 3r at US Open
- Best career result on hard court is quarterfinal at Abu Dhabi 2024

Eala:

- Making US Open main draw debut; won the US Open Junior Singles title here in 2022 (d. Havlickova in F)
- This is her 3rd Grand Slam main draw appearance; fell in 1r at Roland Garros 2025 (l. Arango) and 1r at Wimbledon 2025 (l. defending champion Krejcikova)
- Defeated No.14 seed Clara Tauson in 1r to reach 2r at a Grand Slam for the first time
- First time facing Bucas at Tour level, after defeating her on the ITF circuit in 2021
- This is the first time a female player from the Philippines has competed in the US Open singles main draw

- Last loss to a player outside the Top 50 at Slam level came to No.115 Kanepi at 2022 Australian Open
- Last time the No.1 seed lost in 2r at US Open was Karolina Pliskova in 2020 (l. Garcia)
- 17 of her 20 career titles came on hard court, including 2 this year: Miami (d. Pegula in F) & Brisbane (d. P. Kudermetova in F)
- Is currently ranked No.1; this time last year was ranked No.2
- During this year's North American summer hard court swing, reached QF at Cincinnati (l. Rybakina)
- Has won 51 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins
