Suzan Lamens (NED #66) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #2)

First meeting

Lamens:

- Making her US Open main draw debut, having previously fallen in 2022 and 2024 qualifying
- Playing in fourth Grand Slam main draw, having contested at all the Grand Slam main draws for the first time in this season
- Facing a Top 10 opponent for the 2nd time in her career after losing to Elena Rybakina at Indian Wells 2025
- Career best win by opponent ranking came over No.21 Haddad Maia at 2025 Montreal
- Owns 1 WTA title which came on hard court at Osaka 2024
- The last player from Netherlands to defeat a Top 5 opponent at a Grand Slam was Kiki Bertens, who defeated Kerber at Roland Garros 2016; no player has achieved this feat at the US Open in the last 40 years

Swiatek:

- 2022 US Open champion (d. Jabeur in final)
- She is a six-time Grand Slam singles champion; her other five Slam titles coming at Roland Garros (2020, 2022-2024) and most recently 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in final)
- Bidding to become the first woman to win Wimbledon and US Open in the same calendar year since Serena Williams in 2012
- Was runner-up in the US Open Mixed Doubles event held last week (w/Ruud; l. Errani/Vavassori in final)
- Enters US Open having won her 24th career WTA title at Cincinnati earlier this month - the last two US Open champions also won Cincinnati prior to coming to New York (Gauff in 2023 and Sabalenka in 2024)
- In Grand Slam 2r matches stands at 23-2 (5-1 at US Open); last lost in the 2r at a Slam at US Open 2019
- Can possibly reclaim the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking this fortnight - if Aryna Sabalenka fails to reach the quarterfinals, Swiatek (or Coco Gauff) could potentially move to No.1 by winning the title

Donna Vekic (CRO #49) vs. [3] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Tied 1-1

Vekic:

- Making her 11th appearance at US Open, where her best result was QF run in 2019 (l. Bencic), this was her first career Grand Slam QF and she has appeared in 2 more since
- Contesting her 48th Grand Slam appearance; best result is reaching the SF at Wimbledon 2024 (l. Paolini)
- Record in Grand Slam 2r matches stands at 14-13 (4-1 at US Open)
- Vekic has lost her past five matches against Grand Slam champions, with her last win coming against today's opponent Gauff en route to the silver medal at last year's Olympics
- Bidding to register her 2nd career Top 10 win at a Grand Slam, after defeating Sloane Stephens at Wimbledon 2018
- 3 of her 4 career titles have come on hard court: Monterrey 2023, Courmayeur 2021 and Kuala Lumpur 2014

Gauff:

- Making 7th US Open appearance; she won her first Grand Slam title here in 2023 (d. Sabalenka in final)
- With her 2023 US Open victory at age 19, Gauff became the first American teenager to win the women's singles title at the US Open since Serena Williams in 1999
- Picked up her second Grand Slam singles title this summer at 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in final)
- Owns a 17-3 record in Grand Slam 2r matches; last lost in the 2r at a Slam at US Open 2021 (l. Stephens)
- Since the 2023 US Open, Gauff is 29-1 at Grand Slam events vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 20, with her only loss coming to No.42 Yastremska in Wimbledon 1r this year
- Can possibly attain the PIF WTA World No.1 Ranking this fortnight - if Aryna Sabalenka fails to reach the quarterfinals, Gauff (or Iga Swiatek) could potentially move to No.1 by winning the title

[8] Amanda Anisimova (USA #9) vs. Maya Joint (AUS #43)

First meeting

Anisimova:

- Making 6th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2020 (l. Sakkari)
- Career-best Grand Slam result came at the most recent Slam, when she reached her first Grand Slam final at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Swiatek in F)
- This is her first time seeded among the Top 8 at a Grand Slam event
- Made her Top 10 debut on July 14, following the Wimbledon final; this time last year was ranked No.50
- Two of her three singles titles have come on hard court (2022 Melbourne Summer Set 2 and 2025 Doha)
- Bidding to win her 40th career Grand Slam match, with 31 of her previous 39 coming in straight sets

Joint:

- Making 2nd appearance at US Open; she made her Grand Slam main draw debut here last year as a qualifier and reached the 2r (d. Siegemund, l. Keys)
- Bidding to reach the 3r at a Grand Slam event for the first time, to become the youngest player from Australia to achieve this feat since Samantha Stosur (Australian Open 2003)
- Looking to register her first career Top 10 win on her third attempt, after losses this year to No.10 Navarro in Madrid and No.6 Pegula at Australian Open
- Won first two WTA singles titles this year, on clay at Rabat (d. Cristian in F) and grass at Eastbourne (d. Eala in F)
- Career-best tour-level result on hard court is SF run at 2025 Hobart
- Broke into Top 50 for the first time in her career on June 30; peaked at No.37 in July
- Has won 22 tour-level matches so far in 2025 - by contrast, only won 1 tour-level main-draw match in 2024 (which was her 2024 US Open 1r victory)

[11] Karolina Muchova (CZE #13) vs. Sorana Cirstea (ROU #71)

Muchova leads 5-1

Muchova:

- Has advanced to semifinals at US Open the past two years – defeating today's opponent, Cirstea, in the quarterfinals in 2023
- Went 3-2 on North American hardcourts heading to New York, reaching R16 at Montreal and R32 at Cincinnati
- Record in Grand Slam 2r matches stands at 11-4 (5-0 at US Open)
- 18 of her 45 Grand Slam main draw match wins have been secured in New York – her most successful Slam
- One of five Czech women to advance to 2r this week at Flushing Meadows
- This time last year was ranked No.52, before her run to the semis at the US Open (l. Pegula)

Cirstea:

- Achieved best US Open result two years ago advancing to QF – falling to Muchova, her opponent today
- Underwent foot surgery after Wimbledon 2024 (plantar fasciitis); missed rest of last season, including US Open
- Coming off third career WTA singles title won at the Cleveland WTA 250 last week – her first title since 2021
- Prior to Cleveland, enjoyed a strong run to R16 at Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- One of two Romanians through to 2r, alongside Jaqueline Cristian, who defeated Danielle Collins in 1r
- Record in US Open 2r matches stands at 4-8 (19-20 at all Slams)

[15] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) vs. Kamilla Rakhimova (#65)

First meeting

Kasatkina:

- Making 11th appearance at US Open, where her best result is 4r twice in 2023 (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka) and 2017 (l. Kanepi)
- Contesting her 39th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performance was SF run at Roland Garros 2022 (l. Swiatek)
- Owns a career record of 19-10 in Grand Slam 2r matches, and 4-2 in 2r at US Open
- Six of her 8 career singles titles have come on hard court, most recently Ningbo 2024 (d. M. Andrejeva in F)
- Began representing Australia earlier this year; she is one of seven Australians in the draw

Rakhimova:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, her best result is reaching the 3r in 2021 (l. Krejčíková)
- Through to the 2r of US Open for the second time in her career, she has fallen in 1r on her last 3 appearances
- Defeated former Top 5 player Caroline Garcia in the previous round, in Garcia's final career match before retirement
- Owns 2 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently defeated No.5 Jasmine Paolini at Wimbledon 2025
- Best career result on hard court is QF run three times, most recently Jiujiang 2024 (l. Bouzková)

[18] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #22) vs. Viktorija Golubic (SUI #72)

Golubic leads 4-1

Haddad Maia:

- Making 5th main-draw appearance at US Open; returns after reaching the QF in 2024 (l. Muchova)
- Making 22nd Grand Slam appearance; best result across all majors is SF run at 2023 Roland Garros
- Owns 2 career singles titles on hard-court at Seoul in 2024 and Zhuhai in 2023
- During this year's North American summer hard-court swing made 2r showings at Montreal, Cincinnati, and Monterrey

Golubic:

- Making 8th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2024 (l. Badosa)
- Best result across all Slams is QF run at 2021 Wimbledon
- Defeated Lois Boisson so far this week to reach 2r at US Open for the first time in her career
- Owns 30 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.46 Lois Boisson here this week
- Owns 1 career singles title on hard-court at Jiujiang in 2024

[21] Linda Noskova (CZE #32) vs. Eva Lys (GER #59)

Noskova leads 3-0

Noskova:

- In her fourth US Open main draw, has equaled her best previous result with 2r in 2023 (I. Jabeur)
- Playing in her 13th Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam result is 2024 Australian Open QF (I. Yastremska)
- Is undefeated against players from Germany with a record of 6-0, including two Tour level victories over today's opponent Lys
- 1 of 5 women from Czech Republic to reach 2r, along with Muchova, Krejckova, Vondrousova and Valentova
- Her sole career title came on hard court at 2024 Monterrey

Lys:

- This is her third US Open main draw, with a best previous result of 2r in 2023 (I. Bronzetti)
- Her best Slam result came this year at the Australian Open with 4r (I. Swiatek)
- Is 4-10 against Top 50 players so far in 2025, most recently defeating No.42 Maya Joint at Cleveland in the week prior to US Open; also her best season result at Cleveland with QF (I. Zakharova)
- Hit a career high ranking last month of No.55
- One of two German players to reach 2r along with Siegemund

Hailey Baptiste (USA #47) vs. [23] Naomi Osaka (JPN #24)

Osaka leads 2-0

Baptiste:

- Making her 3rd main-draw appearance at the US Open
- Through to 2r at US Open for first time, building on breakthrough results at this year's Roland Garros (R16) and Wimbledon (3r)
- Playing 10th Grand Slam main draw of career, having fallen in qualifying here at Flushing Meadows in each of the past three years
- Currently the ninth-ranked US woman, having cracked the Top 50 this year – this time last year was No.102
- Both previous matches against Osaka have been on hardcourts, at Auckland and Miami this year, and both went the distance
- Went 2-4 on hardcourts this summer, posting wins over Osuigwe at Montreal and Ruse at Cleveland

Osaka:

- Two-time US Open champion, claiming the title here in New York in 2018 (d. S. Williams in final) and 2020 (d. Azarenka in final)
- Her triumph here in 2018 made her the first Japanese player to win a Grand Slam singles title
- Has claimed four Grand Slam singles titles in total, also winning the Australian Open twice, in 2019 and 2021
- Her 2019 Australian Open victory saw her ascend to the World No.1 ranking for the first time; she held the top ranking for a total of 25 weeks during her career
- All of her 7 Hologic WTA Tour-level singles titles have come on hard court, most recently the 2021 Australian Open (she also won a WTA 125-level title on clay this year at Saint-Malo)
- One of 4 women who have been ranked No.1 through to the second round, along with Sabalenka, Swiatek and Azarenka
- One of 4 mothers through to the second round at the US Open
- Record in Grand Slam 2r matches stands at 19-5 (6-1 at US Open)

Ashlyn Krueger (USA #38) vs. Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #50)

First meeting

Krueger:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, where her career-best result is reaching 3r last year (l. Samsonova)
- Making 11th Grand Slam main-draw appearance; best Slam result is 3r at US Open 2024 (l. Samsonova)
- Has notched 18 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.26 seed Sofia Kenin in the previous round
- Her one WTA singles title came on hard court at 2023 Osaka (d. Zhu in final); she also made another hard-court final at 2025 Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic)

Cristian:

- Making 3rd main-draw appearance at US Open; through to R64 for first time after losing in 1r in 2022 and 2024
- Contesting her 12th Grand Slam main draw of career; her career-best Grand Slam showings are 3r at this year's Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Owns 15 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.23 Linda Noskova at Montreal 2025
- Is currently ranked No.50; she made her Top 50 debut this June, peaking at career-high of No.49
- Career-best tour-level result on hard court is finishing runner-up at 2021 Linz (l. Riske-Amritraj)

Renata Zarazua (MEX #82) vs. Diane Parry (FRA #107)

Zarazua leads 2-0

Zarazua:

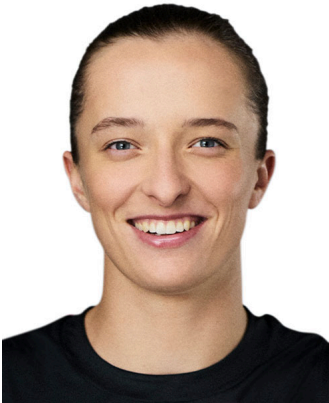
- Making 2nd main-draw appearance at US Open, and is into 2r for the second straight year
- In 1r, upset No.6 seed Madison Keys for her first career Top 10 win in 7 attempts
- With her 1r win, she became the first Mexican woman to defeat a Top 10 seed at a Grand Slam since Angelica Gavaldon d. Jana Novotna at 1995 Australian Open
- Seeking her first-ever trip to a Grand Slam 3r (0-4 in Grand Slam 2r matches)
- Aiming to match best US Open result by a Mexican woman in Open Era - Gavaldon made US Open 3r in 1995

Parry:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open; she has reached a tournament-best 2r for the second straight year
- In 1r, defeated Petra Kvitova in the 2-time Wimbledon champion's final professional match
- 1r victory over Kvitova was her first hard-court tour-level win of the year
- Contesting her 20th career Grand Slam main draw; she has reached a Slam 3r on 4 occasions, including at the most recent Slam, 2025 Wimbledon (as a qualifier)
- One of 2 women from France to reach this week's 2r (also Elsa Jacquemot)

- Making her seventh main draw appearance at US Open, where she is a former champion, lifting the title in 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Other key result here is making QF in 2024
- Title here in 2022 is one of six Grand Slam crowns, the other five coming at Roland Garros (2020, 2022-2024) and Wimbledon (2025)
- Bidding to be first player since Serena Williams in 2012 to win Wimbledon and US Open in the same calendar year
- Was R-Up w/Ruud in US Open Mixed Doubles event held last week (l. Errani/Vavassori in F)
- Won her 24th career title at Cincinnati earlier this month - the last two US Open champions also won Cincinnati prior to coming to New York, Gauff in 2023 and Sabalenka in 2024
- 2025 US Open is her 27th consecutive Grand Slam main draw, she has a 101-20 record at Grand Slam events
- Record in Grand Slam 2r matches stands at 23-2 (5-1 at US Open); she last lost in the 2r at a Slam at US Open 2019
- Since 2020, no player has reached the 3r in Grand Slams more often than Swiatek (22)
- Faces No.66 Suzan Lamens in 2r today; owns 17-1 record in 2025 against players ranked outside Top 50, her only loss coming against Alexandra Eala at Miami 2025; only other loss at Slam level to a player outside the Top 50 came to No.76 Svitolina in 2023 Wimbledon QF
- 13 of her 24 WTA singles titles have come on hard court
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.1. She has spent 125 weeks of her career ranked World No.1
- Has won 50 matches so far in 2025; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Sabalenka
- Swiatek and Sabalenka (18 each) own the most wins in Grand Slam events during the 2025 season

- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a three-peat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)
