[29] Anna Kalinskaya (#29) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #2)

Tied 1-1

Kalinskaya:

- Making 7th appearance at US Open
- Has beaten Clervie Ngounoue and Yulia Putintseva to reach 3r, equaling her best previous result at US Open in 2024 (3r, I. Haddad Maia)
- Best result at all Grand Slams is QF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Q.Zheng)
- Her win over today's opponent Swiatek at Dubai 2024 was her sole career win against world No.1
- Owns a career record of 5-6 against Top 5 opponents - she lost via retirement in the only previous such meeting at a Major (l. Rybakina at Wimbledon 2024 via retirement)
- Best career result on hard court is runner-up at Washington DC 2025 and Dubai 2024

Swiatek:

- 2022 US Open champion (d. Jabeur in final)
- She is a six-time Grand Slam singles champion; her other five Slam titles coming at Roland Garros (2020, 2022-2024) and most recently 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in final)
- One of the two players to reach 3r at the US Open in each of the last six years (since 2020) along with Pegula
- Becomes the first player to claim 30+ hard court wins for four consecutive seasons (2022-2025) since Elina Svitolina (2016-2019)
- Is the player with the most wins at Grand Slams in 2025 (19, tied with Aryna Sabalenka prior to 3r here)
- Since the start of Wimbledon, Swiatek is the player with the most Tour level match wins (16)
- Record against opponents outside Top 20 stands at 36-4 in 2025, with the most recent loss to No.35 Collins at Rome

[28] Magdalena Frech (POL #33) vs. [3] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Gauff leads 2-0

Frech:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open, where her best previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 (l. Muchova)
- Bidding to reach 4r at a Grand Slam for the second time in her career, after last year's Australian Open (l. today's opponent Gauff)
- Owns two wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Mirra Andrejeva at Berlin 2025
- Could claim maiden Top 10 win of her career at a Grand Slam, currently holding a 0-4 record
- Two Polish players (Frech, Swiatek) could reach the women's singles 4r at the US Open for the first time in the Open Era

Gauff:

- Making 7th US Open appearance; she won her first Grand Slam title here in 2023 (d. Sabalenka in final)
- Overall, this is her 25th Grand Slam main draw appearance, and she owns one further Slam title, winning 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Since 2000, only Maria Sharapova (85) has claimed more match wins at Grand Slams than Coco Gauff (73) while aged 21 or under
- Since 2023, holds 30-1 record at Grand Slams against opponents ranked outside the Top 20 with her sole loss coming to Dayana Yastremska at Wimbledon 2025 (1r)
- In the Open Era, only one player from USA has reached more fourth round Grand Slam matches before turning 22 than Gauff (15) – Venus Williams (17)
- With her 2023 US Open victory at age 19, Gauff became the first American teenager to win the women's singles title at the US Open since Serena Williams in 1999

[8] Amanda Anisimova (USA #9) vs. Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #50)

First meeting

Anisimova:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at US Open; she has equaled her tournament-best result (also reached 3r in 2020, l. Sakkari)
- Best result across all Grand Slams is a trip to the final earlier this summer at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Swiatek in F)
- Holds an 8-2 record in Grand Slam 3r matches; a win today would give her R16 performances at all four Grand Slam events in her career
- Has won her last 10 Grand Slam matches against opponents ranked outside the Top 20
- Her 2r victory over Maya Joint was her 40th career Grand Slam main draw win
- First time being seeded among Top 8 at a Grand Slam event
- Made her Top 10 debut on July 14, following the Wimbledon final; this time last year was ranked No.50

Cristian:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at US Open and earned her first main draw wins in New York this week (l. 1r in 2022 and 2024)
- Had never made a Grand Slam 3r before this year, but has done it 3 times in 2025 and is now a win away from her first career Grand Slam R16
- She is 1-9 against Top 10 players, with her one Top 10 win coming over No.10 Barbora Krejickova at 2024 Beijing
- Could become the third woman since 2000 to defeat 3 American opponents en route to the US Open R16, after Serena Williams (2014) and Ons Jabeur (2022)
- Made her Top 50 debut this June, peaking at career-high of No.49

[21] Linda Noskova (CZE #32) vs. [11] Karolina Muchova (CZE #13)

First meeting

Noskova:

- This is her 13th Grand Slam main draw and her best result came at 2024 Australian Open with QF (l. Yastremski)
- Her best Slam result of the season so far was 4r at Wimbledon (l. eventual R-Up Anisimova)
- Has beaten Dalma Galfi and Eva Lys to reach her first 3r at US Open
- Owns 14 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.7 Mirra Andrejeva at Bad Homburg 2025
- Owns one singles title on hard court at Monterrey 2024

Muchova:

- Making 8th appearance at US Open, where she advanced to SF the past two years - l. Gauff in 2023 and Pegula in 2024
- Best result at Grand Slams has been runner-up finish at Roland Garros in 2023 (l. Swiatek)
- Has beaten Venus Williams and Sorana Cirstea to reach 3r; owns 64 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.20 Belinda Bencic at Montreal 2025
- Owns one singles title on hard court at Seoul 2019
- Is currently ranked No.13; this time last year was ranked No.52 and was unseeded when she made her 2024 run to the semifinals

[13] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#12) vs. Laura Siegemund (GER #52)

Alexandrova leads 2-1

Alexandrova:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at US Open; her career best tournament result is 3r, which she has now reached for three straight years in New York
- Aiming to make her third straight Grand Slam R16, having reached that round at 2025 Roland Garros and Wimbledon
- Holds a 19-5 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- Three of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, and she also reached a hard court final last week at WTA 500 Monterrey (l. Shnaider in final)
- Entered the US Open at a new career-high singles ranking of No.12, as well as in 10th place in the PIF Race to the WTA Finals

Siegemund:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at US Open; she has equaled her career-best tournament result of 3r, which she reached in 2016 (l. V. Williams)
- Her career-best Grand Slam showings are QF finishes at 2020 Roland Garros (l. Kvitova) and 2025 Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.17 Diana Shnaider in this week's opening round
- Has defeated Top 20 players at 3 of the 4 Grand Slams this year (along with US Open 1r win over Shnaider, also d. No.5 Q.Zheng at Australian Open and No.8 Keys at Wimbledon)
- Attempting to post multiple Top 20 wins at the same event for the first time since she beat four Top 20 players in a row to win the 2017 Stuttgart title

[15] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #18) vs. [23] Naomi Osaka (JPN #24)

Osaka leads 2-0

Kasatkina:

- Making 11th appearance at US Open, where her best result is 4r twice in 2023 (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka) and 2017 (l. Kanepi)
- Contesting her 39th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam performance was SF run at Roland Garros 2022 (l. Swiatek)
- At Grand Slam tournaments so far this year, reached 4r at Australian Open (l. Navarro), 4r at Roland Garros (l. M. Andrejeva), and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Samsonova)
- Two players representing Australia (Kasatkina, Hon) could reach the 4r at US Open for the first time since 1979 (Evelyn Goolagong, Kerry Reid, and Dianne Fromholtz)
- Holds a 3-10 record against Grand Slam champions, with her last win coming against Sofia Kenin at the US Open (2r) in 2023

Osaka:

- Making 9th appearance at US Open, where she is a two-time champion (2018, d. S. Williams in F and 2020, d. Azarenka in F)
- A four-time Grand Slam champion, 2025 US Open marks 26th main draw appearance at a Grand Slam
- Looking to reach her first Grand Slam fourth round since 2021 Australian Open, when she won the title
- Among players still in the draw, only Swiatek (6) has claimed more Grand Slam titles than Osaka (4)
- Entering the 3r only Sabalenka (78), Tauson (70), Keys (68) and Rybakina (66) have served more aces than Osaka (61) in Grand Slam events this season

[18] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #22) vs. Maria Sakkari (GRE #64)

Haddad Maia leads 4-0

Haddad Maia:

- Making 5th main-draw appearance at US Open, where her previous best result was reaching QF in 2024 (l. Muchova), which was also Brazil's best result at US Open
- Making 22nd Grand Slam appearance; best result across all majors is SF run at 2023 Roland Garros
- Record in 3r matches at Grand Slams is 3-3 (1-0 at US Open)
- Owns 2 career singles titles on hard-court at Seoul in 2024 and Zhuhai in 2023
- Is undefeated against Sakkari with her most recent victory in 4r at 2024 Madrid on clay
- Is currently ranked No.22 (peak rank at No.10 in June 2023); this time last year was ranked No.21

Sakkari:

- Making 11th appearance at US Open; her career best tournament showing was making the 2021 SF (l. eventual champion Raducanu)
- Contesting the 39th Grand Slam main draw of her career; her best Grand Slam results are SFs at 2021 Roland Garros and 2021 US Open
- Record in 3r matches at Grand Slams is 5-11; looking for her first R16 at Grand Slams since Australian Open 2022
- Owns one singles title on hard court at Guadalajara 2023

Diane Parry (FRA #107) vs. [27] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #28)

Kostyuk leads 2-0

Parry:

- Making 5th appearance at US Open; she reached the 2r for the first time last year (d. Wang Xiyu, I. Wang Yafan)
- Contesting the 20th Grand Slam main draw of her career; she has now reached five Grand Slam 3rs, including at the most recent Slam, 2025 Wimbledon (as a qualifier)
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.15 Diana Shnaider at Wimbledon 2025
- Career-best Tour-level results on hard court are SFs at 2022 Granby and 2024 Osaka
- Only player from France to reach 3r

Kostyuk:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at US Open, where her best results were reaching 3r in 2024 (l. Navarro) and 2020 (l. eventual champion Osaka)
- Best result across all Grand Slams is QF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Gauff)
- Her sole career singles title was earned on hard court at Austin 2023
- Lost in the first round at the previous two Grand Slams to players ranked outside the Top 100 (l. No.188 Bejlek at Roland Garros; l. No.171 Erjavic at Wimbledon)
- During this year's North American summer hard-court swing, made Montreal QF, Cincinnati 3r and Washington DC 1r



- Faces No.29 Anna Kalinskaya in 3r today; record against opponents outside Top 20 stands at 36-4 in 2025, with the most recent loss to No. 35 Collins at Rome
- 13 of her 24 WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently Cincinnati 2025
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.1. She has spent 125 weeks of her career ranked World No.1


