[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Cristina Bucsa (ESP #95)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Returning this year as defending champion, having defeated Pegula in last year's final
- Was also R-Up here in 2023 (I. Gauff) and made the SF in 2021 and 2022
- Seeking to become the first player to win consecutive US Open women's singles titles since Serena Williams from 2012-2014
- Overall, this is her 30th Grand Slam main-draw appearance – she has also won the Australian Open twice (2023-24), finished R-Up at Roland Garros (2025, I. Gauff) and has made the Wimbledon SFs three times
- Through to R16 for 17th time in career, including six at the US Open (2018, 2021-25)
- Is closing in on 100 Grand Slam main-draw wins – now up to 97-26 at majors after her two victories this week
- Has reached at least the QF stage of the last 11 Grand Slam events she has contested
- With a win today, would secure stay atop the WTA Rankings regardless of any other results

Bucsa:

- Playing in 16th Grand Slam main draw (5th at the US Open)
- Entered the US Open with a 1-4 record in main draw at the tournament
- Through to R16 for first time in career at a Slam
- For the third time, will face a No.1 ranked opponent, having previously lost to Iga Swiatek twice in 2023 – Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Seeking first career Top 10 win (previously 0-8); highest ranked opponent she has defeated is No.14 (d. Belinda Bencic at 2023 Cincinnati)
- With a win would advance to her first QF of the 2025 season and first since April 2024 (Bogota, QF)
- Other Spanish women to reach the R16 at the US Open this century (since 2000): Paula Badosa, Garbine Muguruza, Carla Suarez Navarro and Magui Serna
- Would be the fifth Spanish woman in the Open Era to reach the US Open quarterfinals along with Paula Badosa, Carla Suarez Navarro, Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario and Conchita Martinez

[9] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #10) vs. Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #60)

Tied 1-1

- Today's R16 match features one of the Tour's best servers in Rybakina – 1st in service points won, service games won and aces served – against one of the best return games on Tour as Vondrousova entered the US Open ranked 6th best in Return Points Won and 7th best in Return Games Won

Rybakina:

- Making 7th main-draw appearance at US Open; through to the R16 for the first time; previous best results have been R32 finishes in 2021 and 2023 (this is the only Grand Slam where she has yet to make the QF)
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; she has won one Grand Slam title (2022 Wimbledon, d. Jabeur in final) and reached one other Grand Slam final (2023 Australian Open, l. Sabalenka)
- Bidding to reach 7th Grand Slam QF and first at the US Open
- In this summer's North American hard-court swing, advanced to the SF of all 3 prior events, each time losing to the eventual champion (l. Fernandez in Washington; l. Mboko in Montreal; and l. Swiatek in Cincinnati)
- Has posted 42 tour-level match-wins this year, 3rd-most on tour (trailing only No.1 Sabalenka and No.2 Swiatek)

Vondrousova:

- Making 6th appearance at US Open, where her best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. Keys)
- Bidding to reach her fifth Grand Slam QF overall
- Contesting her 28th Grand Slam main draw of career; has won 1 Grand Slam title (2023 Wimbledon, d. Jabeur in final) and reached 1 other Grand Slam final (2019 Roland Garros, l. Barty)
- Through to the 4r of a Grand Slam for the first time since her QF finish at Roland Garros 2024
- R32 win over Paolini was her 15th career win against a Top 10 player and first at a Slam since 2023 Wimbledon final against No.6 Ons Jabeur
- With a win, it would be the second time this year Vondrousova has defeated two Top 10 opponents at a tournament – also at 2025 Berlin defeating No.1 Sabalenka (SF) and No.6 Keys (R32)
- Vondrousova has defeated two Top 10 opponents at a Slam one time in her career – 2023 Wimbledon, defeating No.4 Jessica Pegula (QF) and No.6 Ons Jabeur (F)
- Through three matches in New York, has hit a tournament leading 25 double faults; entering the US Open Vondrousova was averaging 5.45 double faults per match (compared to 8.33 in 3 matches so far at US Open)

[4] Jessica Pegula (USA #4) vs. Ann Li (USA #58)

Tied 1-1

Pegula:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at US Open, where her best result was reaching final in 2024 (l. Sabalenka)
- Overall, this is her 27th Grand Slam main draw appearance; prior to R-Up run here last year, had reached QFs across all the Slams but never further
- Through to R16 at a Grand Slam for the 10th time; she is 7-2 in Grand Slam R16 matches (2-1 in US Open R16 matches)
- A win today would be her 15th straight victory against an opponent ranked outside the Top 50 at US Open (last loss was against Alize Cornet in 2019)
- Has reached the QF at a Grand Slam seven times, including twice at the US Open – 2022 (QF) and 2024 (R-Up); her 2024 run to the final at the US Open was her first Slam advancing past the QF round
- Owns the joint-most singles titles this season (3) at Austin, Charleston, and Bad Homburg (same amount of titles in 2025 as Sabalenka)

Li:

- Making her Grand Slam R16 debut in her 15th main draw appearance; this is her 5th appearance in the US Open main draw
- Has one career win over a Top 10 opponent, defeating No.7 Anett Kontaveit at 2022 Miami (1-8 vs. Top 10)
- Her 2nd victory over No.16 seed Bencic was the 4th Top 20 win of her career
- Her 1 WTA singles title has come on hard court, at 2021 Tenerife; she has also reached 4 additional WTA finals, all on hard court, including last week in Cleveland (finished runner-up to Cirstea)
- Closing in on surpassing her career-high ranking of No.44; with a R16 win would climb into WTA Top 40
- Has served 22 aces through three matches – second most in the tournament (averaging 7.33 aces per match); entering the tournament had served 153 aces in 40 main draw matches (3.83 per match)

Barbora Krejčíková (CZE #62) vs. Taylor Townsend (USA #139)

Krejčíková leads 1-0

Krejčíková:

- Making 5th main-draw appearance at US Open; her tournament-best result is QF in 2021 (l. Sabalenka)
- This is her 22nd Grand Slam main draw appearance
- She is a 2-time Grand Slam singles champion, winning titles at 2021 Roland Garros (d. Pavlyuchenkova in final) and 2024 Wimbledon (d. Paolini in final)
- Owns a 5-3 record in R16 matches at the Grand Slams (including 1-0 at the US Open)
- Win over No.11 Emma Navarro in R32 was her second Top 20 win in 2025, also defeating No.13 Elina Svitolina at 2025 Cincinnati
- Teamed with Katerina Siniakova to win the 2022 US Open women's doubles title; that title gave them the Career Grand Slam in women's doubles

Townsend:

- Making 10th main-draw appearance at US Open; achieved her career best Grand Slam result by reaching 4r in 2019 (l. eventual champion Bianca Andreescu)
- In her 31st Grand Slam appearance, bidding to reach her first Slam QF
- With a win, would be the fourth player ranked outside the Top 100 to reach the US Open QF since 2000, joining Emma Raducanu (No.150 in 2021, Won), Kaia Kanepi (No.418 in 2017, QF) and Kim Clijsters (NR in 2009, Won)
- Win over No.5 Mirra Andrejeva in R32 was third career win over a Top 5 player, having also defeated No.3 Jessica Pegula at Rome 2023 and No.4 Simona Halep at US Open 2019
- During this year's North American summer hard-court swing, reached Washington QF as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Fernandez), then made Cincinnati 3r (l. Bouzas Maneiro)
- Currently holds World No.1 doubles ranking; she reached the top spot in doubles for the first time on July 28

- Making her eighth main draw appearance at the US Open, returning this year as defending champion (d. Pegula in last year's final)
- Was also R-Up here in 2023 (l. Gauff) and made the SF in 2021 and 2022
- Has successfully defended titles twice in her career, at Wuhan in 2018-19 and Australian Open from 2023-24
- Serena Williams from 2012-14 was the last player to defend the US Open title
- Won the doubles title here at Flushing Meadows in 2019 (w/Mertens)
- Overall this is her 30th Grand Slam main draw appearance and has won the Australian Open twice (2023-24), finished R-Up at Roland Garros (2025, l. Gauff) and has made the Wimbledon SFs three times
- Has reached at least the QF stage of last 11 Grand Slams she has contested
- Has reached a 17th career 4r at a Grand Slam event, with six of those now coming at the US Open (2018, 2021-25)
- Since 2000, Sabalenka is the fifth WTA #1 to reach 4r at all four Grand Slams in a season after Hingis (2000), Davenport (2005), S. Williams (2015-16) and Swiatek (2023)
- Is closing in on 100 Grand Slam main draw wins, currently owning a 97-26 record across the Slams and is 31-6 here at US Open
- Faces No.95 Cristina Bucsa in 4r today, owns 17-1 record in 2025 vs. players outside the Top 50
- Owns a 13-3 record in Grand Slam 4r matches, 4-1 here at US Open
- 17 of her 20 career titles came on hard court, including 2 this year: Miami (d. Pegula in F) & Brisbane (d. P. Kudermetova in F)
- Is currently ranked world No.1; this time last year was ranked No.2
- Last time the No.1 seed lost in the 4r at US Open was 2023 (Swiatek falling to Ostapenko)
- Claims the most match wins (20) at Grand Slam events in 2025, along with the most tour-level match wins overall (53) this season

- Making 5th main draw appearance at US Open; her previous tournament-best result was making 2r in 2022 (l. Collins)
- Contesting her 16th Grand Slam main draw appearance, this is the first time she has reached the 4r of a major
- In the previous round, she won her first career Grand Slam 3r match on her third attempt, after previously falling in the 3r at Wimbledon 2025 (l. Sierra) and Australian Open 2023 (l. Swiatek)
- Has defeated qualifier Claire Liu, Alexandra Eala and Elise Mertens so far this week to register her first trip to a Grand Slam 4r
- Rallied after dropping 1st set to defeat No.21 Elise Mertens in 3r to register her third Top 50 win of 2025, after defeating Vekic at Wimbledon and Kalinskaya in Doha
- Faces PIF WTA World No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in 4r today; owns 0-8 career record against Top 10 players, she has only appeared against one Top 10 player in 2025 (l. No.6 Mirra Andreeva in Roland Garros 1r)
- Career-best win rankings-wise came when she defeated No.14 Belinda Bencic in 2r at Cincinnati 2023 as a qualifier
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is QF run at Abu Dhabi 2024
- Only player from Spain remaining in the draw after Parrizas Diaz and Bouzas Maneiro both fell in the 1r
- Best result by a Spanish woman at US Open was the title run by Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario in 1994
- Is currently ranked No.95 (peak rank No. 56 in Jan 2024); this time last year was ranked No.77
- Coming into the US Open, Bucsa hadn't won a main draw match during this year's North American summer hard court swing, after falling in the 1r at Montreal (l. V. Kudermetova), Cincinnati (l. lucky loser Yuan) and Monterrey (l. Parks)
- Bidding for her 13th career Grand Slam match win

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career
- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejčíková/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitová in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season

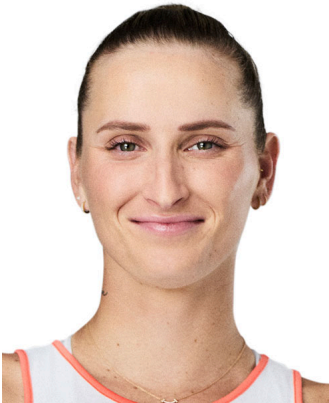

CAREER MILESTONES

- Finished the 2024 season at No.10 in the year-end rankings, her second consecutive year-end Top 10 finish; lone singles title in 2024 came at Wimbledon; over the first six months of the season, won just 7 matches, including 4 at the Australian Open; qualified for the WTA Finals as a Grand Slam champion, securing the final qualifying spot where she advanced to SF (L. Zheng)
- Reached four finals across 2023, winning first WTA 1000 title at Dubai (d. No.1 Swiatek in F) in addition to San Diego (d. Kenin in F), and finishing R-Up at Birmingham (L. Ostapenko) and Zhengzhou (L. Zheng Qinwen).
- Ended 2022 season in fine form, lifting back-to-back titles at Tallinn (d. Kontaveit) and Ostrava (d. Swiatek). Also completed career doubles Slam by winning US Open w/Siniakova.
- Made strong start to 2022, finishing R-Up at Sydney (L. Badosa) and reaching QF at Australian Open (L. Keys) before missing several months w/arm injury.
- Lifted maiden WTA title at 2021 Strasbourg, followed by sweep of singles and doubles titles at Roland-Garros. Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name.
- Also won Prague title (d. Martincova in F), reached final at Dubai (L. Muguruza) and qualified for WTA Finals in singles for the first time. Recorded best results at US Open (QF) and Wimbledon (R16) last year
- Posted another record-breaking year in doubles across 2021 - in addition to singles title at Roland Garros, won doubles title too in Paris, along with Madrid, Gippsland Trophy, WTA Finals and the gold medal at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (all w/Siniakova)
- Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz
- Also reached two doubles finals last year, finishing R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng) and winning Shenzhen (w/Siniakova)

- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2022 US Open (w/McNally, L. Krejckova/Siniakova)
- Last season in singles, made 2r at San Jose (as qualifier, L. eventual champion Kasatkina) and fell 1r at Roland Garros, Cincinnati and US Open. Won 11th and 12th ITF Circuit titles of her career in 2022, at W100 Charleston and W80 Tyler
- Returned from maternity leave in April 2022 with QF runs at ITF Circuit clay-court tournaments in Palm Harbor and Charlottesville
- Enjoyed doubles success in 2020, advancing to SF at US Open and winning titles at both Auckland and WTA 125K Series event in Indian Wells (all w/Muhammad)
- In 2019, produced best singles performance at a major by reaching R16 at US Open (as qualifier, L. Andreescu); in 2r saved 1MP to upset No.4 seed Halep

- Rose to WTA doubles World No.1 on October 22, 2018
- Highlight of 2017 was R-Up finish in first WTA singles final at Nürnberg (L. Bertens in F). Also made QF as qualifier at Bastad (L. Garcia). Only other tour-level appearances were 1r exits at Bucharest and Québec City
- Contested five WTA main draws in 2016, progressing to 2r at two events: Kuala Lumpur and Prague
