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DEFENDING RANKING POINTS

Current singles PIF WTA World No.1 Aryna Sabalenka will spend her **53rd and 54th weeks** at the summit of the PIF WTA Rankings over the US Open fortnight. Currently, Sabalenka holds a 3,292-point advantage over Swiatek at No.2. At the start of August, Sabalenka held a 4,751-point lead atop the Rankings.

As the defending US Open champion, Sabalenka is defending 2,000 points in New York, while Iga Swiatek is defending 430 points and Coco Gauff 240 points. With those points dropping off, Sabalenka's total at the start of the tournament is 9,225, compared with 7,503 for Swiatek and 7,634 for Coco Gauff – putting both within striking distance of the World No.1 Ranking.

Sabalenka could secure the No.1 ranking outright by reaching the quarterfinals in New York. If she fails to reach the quarterfinals, Swiatek or Gauff could move to No.1 by winning the title.

The doubles No.1 Ranking will be on the line in New York as well. Taylor Townsend currently holds the top spot by a narrow margin (140 points) over her anticipated doubles partner at the US Open, Katerina Siniakova. Others with a chance to move to No.1 after the US Open: Sara Errani & Jasmine Paolini – would be co-No.1, will need to at least reach the semifinals; or title runs by Jelena Ostapenko, Veronika Kudermetova or Erin Routliffe

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STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (25-1 in 1r, 96.0%):** Swiatek has been defeated in the 1r only once in 26 Grand Slam main draw appearances, here at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). She is 6-0 in R128 at the US Open
- **Mirra Andrejeva (9-1 in 1r, 90.0%):** Only loss in opening round at a Slam came at 2024 Wimbledon
- **Madison Keys (43-5 in 1r, 89.6 %):** Has won 13-straight Slam opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). She owns an 11-2 record here in opening matches
- **Elena Rybakina (21-3 in 1r, 87.5%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel). The US Open is the only Slam Rybakina has lost in the opening round twice.
- **Elina Svitolina (40-6 in 1r, 87.0%):** Svitolina has won 36 of her last 37 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria)
- **Coco Gauff (20-4 in 1r, 83.3%):** Looks to rebound after dropping the opening match at Wimbledon. Has won 12 of last 14 opening round matches at the Slams with both losses coming at Wimbledon (2023 and 2025). Owns a 5-1 record in R128 at the US Open with only loss coming in 2020 (I. Sevastova)
- **Elise Mertens (29-5 in 1r, 85.3%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu). Also fell 1r at 2025 Roland-Garros (I. Boisson)
- **Emma Raducanu (11-2, 84.6%):** Both of Raducanu's first round losses came at the US Open; in the opening round she is 1-2 at the US Open.
- **Aryna Sabalenka (24-5, 82.8%) :** Has not lost in 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open; since then has won 19-straight first round matchups

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Eight players received main draw wildcards. These include six players from the USA – **Venus Williams, Julieta Pareja, Valerie Glozman, Clervie Ngounoue, Caty McNally** and **Alyssa Ahn** - along with **Caroline Garcia** from France and Australia's **Talia Gibson**. A wildcard has won a Grand Slam title once in the Open Era – this was achieved by Kim Clijsters, at the 2009 US Open.

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QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & US OPEN

At the 2021 US Open, **Emma Raducanu** became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

In the Open Era, the singles title has been successfully defended 14 times, most recently by **Serena Williams** (2012-14). In 2014 Serena became the first woman to win the US Open three times in a row since Chris Evert won four consecutive titles in 1975-78. Serena's 2014 success was also the first three-peat at any Slam since Justine Henin at Roland Garros 2005-07.

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STORYLINES

Serena Williams and Chris Evert have won the Women's Singles title at the US Open on the equal-most occasions in the Open Era, winning the event six times each.

Chris Evert has won the Women's Singles title at the US Open the most times consecutively of any player in the Open Era, winning four of her total six titles in succession between 1975-1978.

Serena Williams has appeared in the most Women's Singles finals at the US Open in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 6-4 from her 10 appearances. Serena Williams is the only player in the Open Era to reach 10+ Women's Singles finals at multiple Grand Slam events: 11 in Wimbledon and 10 at the US Open.

Evonne Goolagong has appeared in the Women's Singles final at the US Open on four occasions – the most of any player in the Open Era to not win the event.

Serena Williams has appeared in (123) and won (108) the most Women's Singles matches at the US Open in the Open Era. Serena Williams is one of two players with 100+ wins at the event over that span along with Chris Evert (101).

Among players with 10+ matches at the event in the Open Era, Margaret Court (90.6%, 29-3) holds the best winning percentage in the Women's Singles at the US Open.

Aryna Sabalenka is the current player with the highest winning percentage at the US Open (82.4%, 28-6) - min. two tournament's appearances. Sabalenka holds the 12th highest such percentage in the Open Era.

Venus Williams (2000 and 2001) and Naomi Osaka (2018 and 2020) are the only two current players with multiple Women's Singles titles won at the US Open.

In the Open Era, Serena Williams (2002, 2008 and 2014) and Chris Evert (1976, 1977 and 1978) have won the Women's Singles title the most times at the US Open without dropping a set. The last player to achieve the feat was Emma Raducanu (2021).

Winning the US Open in 2021, Emma Raducanu is the only qualifier in the Open Era to appear in and win a Women's or Men's Singles final at a Grand Slam event.

Taking out the US Open in 2009, Kim Clijsters is the only wildcard in the Open Era to win a Women's Singles title at a Grand Slam event. Clijsters is also one of only two in that span to appear in a Women's Singles final along with Justine Henin at the Australian Open 2010.

Chris Evert (31) has recorded the most consecutive Women's Singles match wins at the US Open in the Open Era. Only two players in that span have recorded more consecutive Women's Singles match wins at a single Grand Slam: Martina Navratilova in Wimbledon (47) and Monica Seles at the Australian Open (33).

Venus Williams (24) has appeared in the most Women's Singles main draws at the US Open in the Open Era. Williams is one of four players to appear in 20+ main draws at the event along with her sister Serena, Martina Navratilova (21 each) and Amy Frazier (20) - Victoria Azarenka is the current player with the most appearances at the event (17 before this 2025 edition).

In 1985, Hana Mandlikova conceded 68 games to win the Women's Singles at the US Open - the most games conceded en route to the title at the event in the Open Era.



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In 1976, Chris Evert conceded just 12 games to win the Women's Singles at the US Open - the fewest games conceded en route to the title at the event in the Open Era.

Aryna Sabalenka is looking to become the first player to win consecutive Women's Singles titles at the US Open since Serena Williams (2013-2014).

Aryna Sabalenka could become the third player in the Open Era to reach 6+ consecutive Women's Singles Grand Slam finals on hard court after Steffi Graf and Martina Hingis (seven each).

Currently holding a record of 100-20, Iga Swiatek (83.3%) holds the best winning percentage at Grand Slam events of any currently active player - min. two events played - Swiatek is currently ranked #10 in the Open Era and will surpass Justine Henin at the ninth place if she wins her First Round.

Two players (Aryna Sabalenka and Iga Swiatek) can reach the semi-finals at each of the four Women's Singles Grand Slam events of the season for the fifth time in the Open Era after Goolagong-Court (1973), Navratilova-Evert (1984), Navratilova-Evert (1985) and Clijsters-Henin (2003).

Daria Kasatkina (98), Yulia Putintseva (97) and Jelena Ostapenko (95) are close to reaching the milestone of 100 matches played in Women's Singles Major events.

Aryna Sabalenka (571) and Iga Swiatek (440) are the players with the most winners made in Women's Singles Grand Slam events this season.

Elena Rybakina holds the highest percentage of first serve points in Women's Singles Grand Slam events this year (73.4%) - min. 5 matches.

WTA FINALS

The WTA Finals will return to Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, for the second of three editions of the WTA Finals from 2024-2026. The 2025 season-ending Finals will take place between November 1-8, featuring the Top 8 singles players and doubles teams in the Race to the WTA Finals.

Players earn race points at WTA 250 level, WTA 500 level, WTA 1000 level and Grand Slams. The Top 7 players/teams on Leaderboard qualify with the 8th spot being rewarded to either the highest ranked Grand Slam champion No.8-20 on Leaderboard OR the next highest point total.

NEXT POSSIBLE QUALIFICATION

Coco Gauff and Madison Keys currently sit at No.3 and No.4, respectively, on the Leaderboard and are next in line to qualify. Both Gauff and Keys have captured Grand Slam titles this year.

A TEENAGER EYES WTA FINALS QUALIFICATION

Etching her name in the record books as the youngest player to capture a WTA 1000 title – Mirra Andreeva sits at No.5 on the Leaderboard. Andreeva has reached the R16 at each of the Slams this year, including back-to-back quarterfinal runs at Roland Garros and Wimbledon. In the last 20 years, only two other players 18 or younger have qualified for the WTA Finals – Coco Gauff in 2022 and Maria Sharapova in 2005.

Following strong results in the grass-court swing, Amanda Anisimova sits at No.6 on the Leaderboard. Since reaching finals at Queens (WTA 500) and Wimbledon, Anisimova did not advance past the R16 in either of the WTA 1000s during the North American summer hardcourt swing. In her five previous US Open appearances, Anisimova is yet to reach the R16 and has lost in the opening round in her last two appearances (2022, 2024).

COULD THIS BE THE BREAKTHROUGH YEAR FOR RYBAKINA AT THE US OPEN?

With three-straight semifinal finishes at Washington DC, Montreal and Cincinnati, Elena Rybakina sits at No.7 on the Leaderboard. As of May 19, Rybakina sat at No.13 on the Leaderboard. With a title run at WTA 500 Strasbourg, Rybakina moved to No.8 but slid to No.9 at the end of the grass-court swing. With the success on the summer hardcourt swing, Rybakina is eyeing a breakthrough performance in New York. To date, her best result at the US Open has been a R32 finish (2021, 2023) – the only Slam she is yet to reach the quarterfinal stage.

OUTSIDE LOOKING IN

No.8 Jessica Pegula and No.9 Jasmine Paolini are separated by only 34 points on the Leaderboard. Next in line at No.10 is Elina Svitolina, but she trails by 800 points.

No.12 Ekaterina Alexandrova will look to close ground this week as she is competing in Monterrey.

DOUBLES WATCH

Katerina Siniakova & Taylor Townsend and the Italian duo of Sara Errani & Jasmine Paolini hold the top two spots and are closing in on qualification but would need a deep run in New York.
