Alexandra Eala (PHI #40) vs. [Q] Tereza Valentova (CZE #48)

Valentova leads 1-0

Eala:

- Making her tournament debut
- Contesting her 10th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best result at a WTA 1000 event is semifinals at 2025 Miami as a wild card ranked No.140 (l. Pegula)
- Owns 7 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently over No.14 Clara Tauson at 2025 US Open
- Top WTA Tour results so far this season are Auckland semifinals (l. eventual runner-up Wang Xinyu) and Abu Dhabi quarterfinals (l. eventual runner-up Alexandrova)
- Currently ranked at a career-high No.40; first player from Philippines to crack the Top 50 of the WTA Rankings

Valentova:

- Making her tournament debut after successfully coming through qualifying (d. Ar. Rodionova and Seidel)
- This is also the first WTA 1000 main draw appearance of her career
- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.31 Maya Joint at 2026 Australian Open
- Career-best Tour-level result on hard court is runner-up at 2025 Osaka (l. Fernandez in final)
- In her previous event, made her first Grand Slam 3r at 2026 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Winner of this match to face No.14 seed Karolina Muchova in 2r

Maria Sakkari (GRE #52) vs. [WC] Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #85)

Tied 1-1

Sakkari:

- Making her 8th main draw appearance at this tournament
- Her best results at this event are semifinals in both 2022 (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and 2023 (l. eventual runner-up Pegula) – those are also the best results by a Greek woman at this event
- Contesting her 59th career WTA 1000 main draw; she has won one WTA 1000 title at 2023 Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in final)
- Holds a 1-0 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 75 (d. Jeanjean at Australian Open)
- The winner of this match will face No.6 seed Jasmine Paolini in 2r

Sonmez:

- Making her 3rd appearance at this tournament; lost 1r in 2024 and 2025 as a wild card on both occasions
- Contesting her 5th career WTA 1000 main draw; her best WTA 1000 result is 3r at 2025 Beijing (l. Potapova)
- Career-best result on hard court is her one WTA Tour singles title at 2024 Merida (d. Li in final)
- Made 3r run as a qualifier at 2026 Australian Open; that was the second time she reached a Grand Slam 3r in her career (she is the first Turkish woman in the Open Era to go that far at a Grand Slam event)
- Best result by a wild card at Doha was runner-up finish by Victoria Azarenka in 2015 (l. Safarova in final)

[3] Amanda Anisimova (USA #4) vs. Karolina Pliskova (CZE #418)

Pliskova leads 5-1

Anisimova:

- Making 4th appearance at Doha, where she is the defending champion (d. Ostapenko in last year's final)
- Owns another WTA 1000 singles title at Beijing 2025 (d. Noskova in final)
- This is her 44th career WTA 1000 main draw; along with her two WTA 1000 titles, she was also a WTA 1000 runner-up at Toronto 2024 (l. defending champion Pegula in final)
- In addition to winning Beijing and Doha on hard court in 2025, she won a third hard-court WTA singles title at Melbourne 250 #2 in 2022
- Currently ranked World No.4 (reached career-high ranking of No.3 on January 5, 2026)
- Is playing her 3rd tournament of 2026, having made quarterfinals at Australian Open (l. Pegula) and R16 at Brisbane (l. eventual runner-up Kostyuk)

Pliskova:

- Making 10th appearance at Doha, where she won the WTA 500 edition in 2017 (d. Wozniacki in final); also reached semifinals in 2024 (walkover vs. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Owns two singles titles at WTA 1000 events, at Cincinnati 2016 (d. Kerber) and Rome 2019 (d. Konta)
- Looking for her first Top 10 win since defeating No.10 Ons Jabeur at Nottingham 2024
- 11 out of her 17 WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently Cluj-Napoca in 2024
- The former World No.1 is currently ranked No.418 (she took the majority of the 2025 season off to recover from ankle surgery); this time last year was ranked No.69
- Reached No.1 ranking for the first time on July 17, 2017 and held that spot for a total of 8 weeks in her career

[5] Mirra Andreeva (#7) vs. Magda Linette (POL #47)

Andreeva leads 2-1

Andreeva:

- Making her 2nd appearance at this tournament; she reached 2nd round in her debut last year (l. Sramkova)
- Following her Doha loss last year, Andreeva won her next 13 matches, all at WTA 1000 events, including consecutive WTA 1000 titles at Dubai (d. Tauson in final) and Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in final)
- With her WTA 1000 titles last year, Andreeva became the youngest WTA 1000 finalist and champion since the WTA 1000 format began in 2009
- Has a 5-2 record this year vs. players ranked inside the Top 50
- Holds a 9-2 overall record so far this year, winning Adelaide title (d. Mboko in final), and reaching Brisbane quarterfinals (l. Kostyuk) and Australian Open R16 (l. Svitolina)

Linette:

- Making her 5th main draw appearance at this event; her best tournament result is R16 last year (l. Kostyuk)
- Contesting her 52nd career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 results are quarterfinals at 2024 Wuhan (l. Gauff) and 2025 Miami (l. Paolini)
- Owns 7 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula at 2025 Cincinnati
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, at 2019 Bronx and 2020 Hua Hin
- Her top 2026 results so far are quarterfinals at Auckland (l. Eala) and Hobart (l. eventual runner-up Jovic)

Noskova:

- Making her third appearance at this tournament, where she reached the Round of 16 in both 2024 (l. Ka. Pliskova) and 2025 (l. Swiatek)
- Contesting her 22nd career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 result is runner-up at 2025 Beijing (l. Anisimova in final)
- Holds 0-2 record vs. Top 50 players in 2026 (l. M.Andreeva at Brisbane; l. Wang Xinyu at Australian Open)
- Best results by Czech Republic at Doha are title runs by Petra Kvitova in 2018 and 2021, Karolina Pliskova in 2017, and Lucie Safarova in 2015
- Winner of this match to face qualifier Varvara Gracheva in 2r

Joint:

- Making her tournament debut
- Owns 3 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.19 Diana Shnaider at 2025 Beijing
- Career-best Tour-level results on hard court are three semifinals at Hobart, Seoul and Hong Kong, all in 2025
- Top result this year is making the Adelaide quarterfinals (l. eventual champion M. Andreeva), where she claimed her only two match-wins of the season so far
- Best results by Australia at Doha were runner-up finishes by Alicia Molik in 2005 and Samantha Stosur in 2012

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakout 2025 season saw her break into the Top 100 after SF run at WTA 1000 Miami; as a wild card she registered back-to-back Top 10 wins over No.5 Keys and No.2 Swiatek. Went on to reach maiden Tour final at Eastbourne and then won her first WTA 125 title Guadalajara. Her year-end ranking was a career high No.50
- Following her Miami 2025 result, she made history by becoming the first player from the Philippines to reach a WTA 1000 semifinal and the first to enter the WTA World Top 100 ranking
- In 2024 made 2r at WTA 1000 Madrid (l. Cirstea) as well as playing main draw at Abu Dhabi, Guadalajara, Wuhan, Guangzhou and Jiujiang. Earned fourth ITF career title at W100 Vitoria-Gasteiz and reached a career high ranking of No.143 in July
- Entered first Grand Slam in 2023 at Australian Open qualifying (l. Doi in Q1). As a qualifier reached main draw at Hua Hin (l. Maria), Osaka (l. Sakatsume), Guangzhou (l. Maria) and Monastir (l. Mertens) taking her ranking into Top 200 for first time
- Claimed first ITF title in 2022 at Chiang Rai \$25K and also played WTA Miami opening main draw match (l. Brengle) and qualifying at Madrid (l. Bondar).
- In 2021 played first Tour level match at Miami qualifying (l. Kuzmova) and reached 2r at Cluj Napoca on clay (l. Sherif).
- Best result of 2021 was reaching QF at Grenoble \$25K
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2020 at the age of 14

- Breakout 2025 season saw her reach her maiden Tour-level final at Osaka as a qualifier (l. Fernandez in F), as well as SF on home soil at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova). Also made her Grand Slam main draw debuts reaching 2r at both Roland Garros (l. Gauff) and US Open (l. Rybakina). Claimed WTA 125 titles at Grado and Porto, made her Top 100 debut and posted a year-end ranking of No.56

In 2024 won the French Open junior title in both singles and doubles w/Renata Jamrichova

- Played a handful of tournaments from 2021 to 2023 before a breakout year on the circuit in 2024 winning five ITF titles
- In 2023 reached the final at the US Open girl's singles (l. Katherine Hui)
