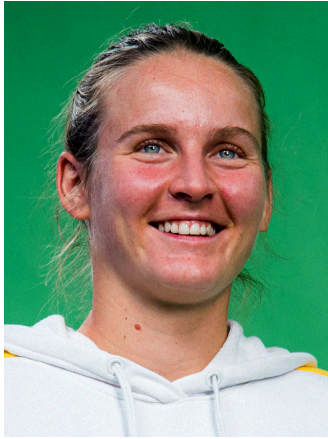

- Owns 1-5 career record against players from Spain, most recent was a loss to Badosa at 2022 Roland Garros. Sole win came over Sorribes Tormo at 2019 Palermo
- Both her career titles have come on clay court at 2019 Lausanne (d. Cornet in F) and 2020 Palermo (d. Kontaveit in F)
- Only player from France competing in this year's main draw
- Best result by France at Rabat was Champion run by Emilie Loit in 2004
- Only qualifier to win their first round match here this week
- Best result by a qualifier at Rabat was Champion run by Kiki Bertens in 2012
- Is currently ranked No.200; this time last year was ranked No.344. Reached a career-high ranking of No.39 in March 2021

CAREER MILESTONES

- Qualified for 2023 Roland Garros before falling first round (l. Peterson). Finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Barranquilla, Columbia (l. Maria). Won two ITF events in 2023 including W60 in Biarritz.
- Highlights of 2021 season was SF at Lyon (l. Golubic) and QF runs at Istanbul (ret. w/abdominal injury vs. eventual champion Cirstea) and Lausanne (l. Burel)
- Grand Slam breakthrough came with R16 showing at 2020 Roland Garros (l. Kenin)
- Finished 2020 season at No.42 for highest year-end ranking and first inside Top 50. Broke into Top 50 at No.44 after winning second career title at 2020 Palermo (d. Kontaveit in F)
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2019, lifting maiden WTA title in her career first tour-level final at Lausanne (d. Cornet in F); posted first Top 100 year-end finish (No.63)
- Reached one additional SF in 2019 at Lugano and the QF on two other occasions at Strasbourg and Palermo
- Contested the main draw at all four Grand Slams for the first time in 2019, achieving her best result at the majors by reaching the 3r at the US Open (l. No.18 seed Q.Wang)
- Member of the French Fed Cup squad that were crowned 2019 Fed Cup champions, beating Australia away from home in November
- Finished 2018 ranked No.102 highlighted by maiden WTA QF at Guangzhou (l. eventual champion Q.Wang). Also made 2r at Roland Garros, Tashkent and Luxembourg and won first four titles on ITF Circuit
- Prior to 2018 Roland Garros had lost 1r on eight previous tour-level main draw appearances
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2014 Strasbourg
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in 2012
- Highlights of 2025 include first Grand Slam R16 of career at Wimbledon (l. Samsonova), first WTA 1000 QF of career at Montreal (l. eventual champion Mboko) and additional Tour QFs at Rabat and Rouen. Hit career-high ranking of No.40 on August 18 and finished season at No.42
- In 2024, posted career-best Grand Slam results with R32 at Wimbledon and US Open (at Wimbledon, beat defending champion Vondrousova in 1r on Centre Court for first career Top 10 win, before retiring to eventual champion Krejčíková in 3r); also claimed first WTA 125 title at Antalya (d. Begu in final)
- In 2023, won ITF W60 title at Rome and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2023 Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. 1r to Kalinina)
- Earned first ITF title at Madrid \$15K in 2020 on clay
- On ITF Circuit, owns 11 singles titles and four doubles titles
- Made professional debut in January 2018 at \$15K ITF/Hammamet 2, Tunisia

- Picked up her first tennis racquet at age 7 after seeing her two older brothers playing
- Describes herself as a complete, fast and creative player, determined to fight for each point until the end. Favorite shot is her forehand
- Currently working with coach Cesar Fabregas

- Favorite surface is clay, but also loves grass because of Wimbledon; favorite shot is backhand

- and favorite tournament is Roland Garros, although enjoys playing on every surface
- Best tennis memory so far is winning the 2019 Fed Cup with France
 - Does not have specific tennis idols, but has found players to be inspiring in different ways
 - Long-term career goals are winning big titles and Grand Slams

- Played only one ITF tournament between 2018 and 2022, returning to the courts for the 2023 season.
- Made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2016 at 16 years of age.
- 2025 highlights included reaching semifinal at Brisbane (l. P.Kudermetova) and quarterfinal at Cluj-Napoca (l. Sasnovich). Took six months away from the Tour following injury before returning to claim the WTA 125 Limoges title in December
- In 2024, reached the semifinal stage on three occasions; Austin (l. Wang Xiyu), Rouen (l. Linette) and Strasbourg (l. Collins)
- In 2023, made 3r at Australian Open, achieving best Grand Slam result (l. Krejckikova). Finished runner-up at Rome (l. Rybakina via ret. w/left leg injury), equalling her best Tour result (also runner-up at Budapest in 2021). 2023 ranking peaked at No. 25 on May 22 and closed out the season with QF at Zhengzhou (l. eventual champion Zheng).
- In 2022, reached four QF, at Charleston (l. Jabeur), Madrid (l. Teichmann), Eastbourne (l. Ostapenko) and Cluj-Napoca (l. eventual champion Blinkova). Also won WTA 125 tournament at Limoges in December
- Posted first Top 100 season in 2021, finishing on a career-high ranking of No.52
- Reached first WTA singles final at 2021 Budapest (l. Putintseva) and was a quarterfinalist at the Transylvania Open (l. eventual champion Kontaveit)
- Ranking was further boosted in 2021 by five ITF Circuit titles, taking career haul to 15 at that level
- Upset Kerber in 1r at 2021 Roland Garros to advance to 2r (l. Collins); also reached 2r at the US Open, where she was defeated by Kerber
- Broke into Top 100 on July 12, 2021, following title run at \$100k ITF/Contrexeville-FRA
- Best result of 2020 was R-Up finish at \$100k ITF/Midland-MI, USA. At WTA level, fell 1r twice (including US Open) and in qualifying three times (including the year's other two majors)
- Highlight of 2019 was reaching 2r at Jurmala (d. Siniakova, l. Tig) and winning ITF Circuit title at \$25k Perov-CZE
- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 US Open - came through qualifying to make 2r (l. Stephens)
- Also in 2018 made second tour-level appearance of her career, falling 1r at Washington DC (as qualifier, l. Bonaventure)
- Sidelined for 10 months at the end of 2015 w/shoulder injury, playing only 12 matches in 2016 season

- As a junior was runner-up in girls' singles at 2014 US Open (l. Bouzkova) and doubles champion at 2014 Australian Open (w/Kulichkova)
