Ashlyn Krueger (USA #58) vs. [WC] Lois Boisson (FRA #229)

First meeting

Krueger:

- Making 3rd appearance at Cincinnati, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2025 (l. Paolini)
- Best result at WTA 1000 events is R16 at Miami 2025 (l. Zheng) and Toronto 2024 (l. Pegula)
- In Tour level main draw matches, has only fallen to an opponent ranked outside the Top 200 once before at Nottingham 2024 to No.249 Jones (on grass)
- Is undefeated against players from France in Tour level main draw matches with a record of 2-0 (d. Ponchet at 2023 Osaka, d. Garcia at 2024 Dubai)
- Her sole singles title came on hard court at Osaka 2023 (d. Zhu Lin in F); also reached another final at Abu Dhabi 2025 (l. Bencic in F)
- Best result of this season is SF at Austin (l. eventual R-Up Townsend); also won WTA 125 title at Ilkley on grass

Boisson:

- Making debut appearance at Cincinnati
- Best result at WTA 1000 events is R32 at Beijing 2025 (l. Navarro)
- Record against Top 100 opponents stands at 1-7 this season with her only win over No.32 Wang Xinyu at Strasbourg
- Has defeated a player from USA in a Tour level main draw match once before at 2025 Roland Garros over No.3 Pegula; the victory remains her best career win by ranking
- Best career result on hard court is R16 run at Seoul 2025
- Looking for her first hard court match win of the season; she has won one match so far this year at Strasbourg on clay

Diane Parry (FRA #64) vs. [WC] Caroline Dolehide (USA #256)

First meeting

Parry:

- Making tournament main draw debut appearance, having played qualifying in 2022 and 2023
- Her best result at WTA 1000 events is R16 at Indian Wells 2024 (l. Sakkari)
- Is 3-2 against players from USA in main draw Tour level matches this season including defeating No.6 Anisimova at Roland Garros
- Second meeting against a wild card this season after defeating Venus Williams at Indian Wells
- Best career results on hard court are semifinals at Ostrava 2026, Osaka 2024 and Granby 2022
- Is currently ranked No.64, having reached a career high of No.47 earlier in June

Dolehide:

- Making 3rd appearance at Cincinnati and looking to pass 1r for the first time after 2025 (l. Sramkova) and 2024 (l. Townsend)
- Best WTA 1000 result is R32 which she made four times, at Indian Wells (2018, 2024-25) and Madrid 2024
- Has one Tour level win over a Top 100 player this season defeating No.98 Lulu Sun at Austin 2026
- Also defeated No.85 Zarazua last month on the way to claiming World Tennis title at W100 Evansville
- Best career result on hard court is runner-up at Guangzhou 2024 (Danilovic) and Guadalajara 2023 (l. Sakkari)
- Looking for her second Tour level main draw match win of the season after Austin



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Caty McNally (USA #70) vs. McCartney Kessler (USA #48)

Kessler leads 1-0

McNally:

- Making 6th appearance at Cincinnati, where her best result was reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Kessler) and 2022 (l. Jabeur)
- Strongest WTA 1000 result was R16 at Madrid 2026 (l. eventual champion Kostyuk)
- Has a record of 6-8 against Top 50 players this season, including two Top 10 wins over No.7 Noskova at Toronto and No.10 Mboko at Madrid
- Best career result on hard court is semifinals at Merida 2023 and Washington DC 2019
- Has reached four quarterfinals so far in 2026 at Memphis, Eastbourne, 's-Hertogenbosch and Ostrava

Kessler:

- Making 2nd appearance at Cincinnati, previously reaching 3r last season (l. Seidal)
- Defeated McNally in their only previous meeting here at Cincinnati last year in 2r
- Best result at WTA 1000 events is R16 at Montreal 2025 (l. Kostyuk) and Beijing 2025 (l. Lys)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 stands at 9-6 this season, with the most recent a win over No.258 Brace at Toronto
- Two out of her 3 singles titles have come on hard court at Hobart 2025 (d. Mertens) and Cleveland 2024(d. Haddad Maia); also reached a third final on hard court at Austin 2025 (l. Pegula in F)
- The most recent win by United States of America at Cincinnati was by Coco Gauff in 2023
- Is currently ranked No.48 (peak rank at No. 30 in 2025); this time last year was ranked No.32
- Best results of the season are quarterfinals at Eastbourne, Charleston, and Abu Dhabi

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CAREER MILESTONES

- Top result of 2025 was R-Up at WTA 500 Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic in final); also made Australian swing QFs at Brisbane and Adelaide, and hit new career-high ranking of No.29 on July 14
- In 2024, made main draw at all four majors for the first time, posting her best career Slam result at US Open with 3r (l. Samsonova); also claimed first career doubles title at WTA 500 Charleston (w/Stephens)
- In 2023, captured first career singles title in Osaka; did not drop a set en route to the title, defeating World No.35 and top seed Zhu Lin in the final. As a result of the title run, made Top 100 debut (September 18, 2023)
- Highlights of 2022 season were playing main draw at Indian Wells, Miami, San Jose and US Open; on ITF Circuit, won title at W60 Evansville, IN, USA and reached final at W25 Sarasota, FL, USA
- Fell 1r on Tour-level debut at 2021 US Open (as WC, l. Schmiedlova in 3s); also received WC to Indian Wells (l. 1r to Martincova)
- Made 2r as wild card in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery, l. Fernandez/Routliffe); she earned wild cards into the singles and doubles draws at 2021 US Open after sweeping the USTA 18s National Championships
- At her professional debut in 2019, came through qualifying to reach SF at ITF/W15 event in Carson, CA, USA
- As a junior, won 2020 Orange Bowl tournament as a wild card; also won junior doubles title at 2021 US Open (w/Montgomery)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut on home clay at 2025 Roland Garros as a wild card and reached the semifinals, defeating two Top 10 players en route (No.6 Andreeva in QF and No.3 Pegula in 4r). Also won maiden WTA title at Hamburg (d. Bondar in F) and finished the season at a career-high ranking of No.36
- Produced a breakthrough performance in 2024 to win WTA 125 Saint Malo and won 18 consecutive ITF series matches to take her ranking to a career high of No.152 in May; season ended prematurely in May after suffering ACL injury at WTA 125 Paris
- Earned first ITF title in 2022 at W15 Dijon
- In 2021 played first Tour level qualifying matches at Lyon and Roland Garros
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2019 at the age of 16

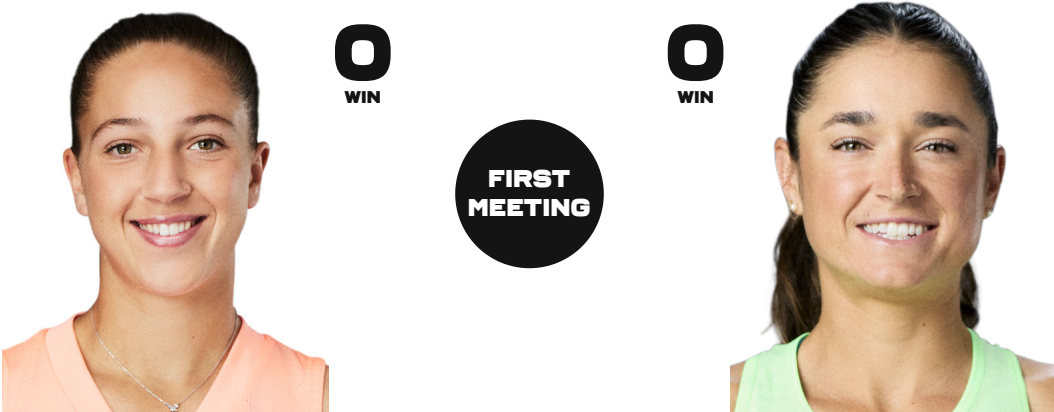

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights in 2025 included 3r runs at Wimbledon (as a qualifier) and US Open, also reached R16 at Strasbourg, Hamburg and Chennai
- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)
- Broke into Top 100 on February 28, 2022 and continued steady progress for remainder of season
- First notable 2022 performance was 3r run at Roland Garros (l. Stephens) beating defending champion Krejčíková in 1r
- In the 2022 grass season, made SF at Gaiba 125 and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur)
- Series of impressive performances in 2022 started from QF at Palermo (l. Camelia Begu) followed by SF at Granby (l. Kasatkina), QF at Portoroz (l. Lena Friedsam), and QF at Monastir before 1r exits at Cluj Napoca, Rouen 125, and W80 Poitiers
- Finished 2021 in fine form, winning 18 of last 20 matches, highlighted by two WTA 125K Series finals, winning title in Montevideo, Uruguay and finishing R-Up at Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Overall, compiled 50-23 win-loss record last year, lifting three ITF Circuit titles and rising nearly 200 places in the rankings during second half of campaign. Also fell 1r at Roland Garros (as WC, l. Sasnovich) and Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Niemeier)
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2020, at W15 tournament in Antalya, Turkey
- Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Lapko, l. Mertens)
- First contested WTA qualifying at 2018 Roland Garros
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
