[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [28] Ann Li (USA #29)

Gauff leads 3-0

Gauff:

- Making 7th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the tournament in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Owns three WTA 1000 titles: 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Reached her 16th career WTA 1000 SF before this event at Toronto (l. Rybakina), and 4th of this year after R-Up finishes at Rome (l. Svitolina in F) and Miami (l. Sabalenka in F), and SF at Dubai (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)
- Since the start of the 2020 season, only Swiatek and Sabalenka have claimed more WTA 1000 main draw match wins than Gauff (117)
- Gauff (20) is one of three players to have claimed 20+ WTA 1000 wins this season, alongside Rybakina (23) and Svitolina (22)
- Faces Li for a fourth time, having won all three of their previous meetings, most recently at Madrid 2025
- Holds a 20-7 record on hard court this season, with her best result on the surface being her Miami R-Up finish

Li:

- Making 4th appearance at Cincinnati, she's through to the 3r here for the first time in her career
- Her best results at WTA 1000 level are R16 finishes at 2026 Doha (l. LL Cocciaretto) and 2026 Madrid (l. Fernandez)
- Top tournament finish so far this year is SF at Strasbourg (l. eventual champion Navarro)
- Owns 2 career wins over Top 10 players, defeating No.4 Swiatek at 2026 Madrid (via ret.) and No.7 Kontaveit at 2022 Miami
- Owns 12-13 career record against fellow Americans, 2-1 in 2026 with wins over Parks at Madrid and Volynets at Hobart and a loss to Navarro at Strasbourg
- Both of her 2 career WTA titles have come on hard court, at 2021 Tenerife (d. Osorio in F) and 2025 Guangzhou (d. Sun in F); has reached 4 additional WTA finals which were all on hard court
- Is currently ranked at her career-high of No.29 (first achieved in May 2026); this time last year was ranked No.64



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[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Wang Xinyu (CHN #36)

Sabalenka leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Making 9th appearance at Cincinnati, where she lifted the title in 2024 without dropping a set (d. Pegula in F)
- Has won 11 WTA 1000 titles in her career, including two this year (the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami); she is the only player to have won two WTA 1000 titles so far this season
- Looking to reach a 45th career WTA 1000 R16 today, surpassing Ka.Pliskova (44) for the most of any currently active player
- Since 2009, Sabalenka (49) could become the third player to claim 50+ career WTA 1000 match wins as World No.1, after Serena Williams (104) and Iga Swiatek (58)
- She has spent 104 weeks at World No.1, including the last 96 weeks consecutively (since October 21, 2024, includes week of August 17)
- 21 of her 24 career WTA titles have come on hard court, including her three titles this year at Brisbane (d. Kostyuk in F), Indian Wells (d. Rybakina in F) and Miami (d. Gauff in F)

Wang:

- Making 3rd appearance at Cincinnati; she is through to the 3r here for the first time in her career
- Her best result at the WTA 1000 level is SF at 2024 Wuhan (l. Q.Zheng)
- Owns 14-10 record so far this season on hard court including reaching her second career Tour-level final at Auckland (l. Svitolina in F); her first final came on grass at 2025 Berlin (l. Vondrousova in F)
- Owns 4-12 career record against Top 10 players and is 0-2 this season with losses to No.3 Rybakina at Doha and No.4 Anisimova at Australian Open; her most recent Top 10 win came over No.10 Badosa at 2025 Berlin
- This is her second career meeting against the World No.1, having previously lost to No.1 Swiatek at 2023 Roland Garros
- Her best win by ranking so far this season came against No.13 Noskova at Australian Open

[33] Katerina Siniakova (CZE #44) vs. [20] Madison Keys (USA #24)

Keys leads 2-0

Siniakova:

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Cincinnati, and she is into R32 at this event for the first time
- She was 0-6 in main draw matches at Cincinnati before her 2r win this year (following 1r bye)
- Best WTA 1000 results are 3 QFs, most recently at 2025 Wuhan (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Pegula)
- Three of her 5 career WTA titles have come on hard court: 2017 Shenzhen (d. Riske-Amritraj in F), 2022 Portoroz (d. Rybakina in F) and 2023 Nanchang (d. Bouzkova in F)
- Currently ranked No.44 in singles, and is also the WTA Doubles World No.1 (has the third-most weeks at WTA Doubles No.1, behind only Martina Navratilova and Liezel Huber)

Keys:

- Making 12th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the title in 2019 (d. Kuznetsova in F), and also reached SF in 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Kvitova)
- She has won one WTA 1000 title in her career - here in Cincinnati in 2019
- Holds a 23-6 record this year at Tour-level vs. players ranked outside the Top 20
- Five of her 11 career Tour-level titles have come on hard court, including her one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Her top performance so far this year is winning the grass-court title at Eastbourne (d. T.Maria in F) - this was the 3rd time in her career that she has won the Eastbourne title (also 2014 and 2023)



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[32] Janice Tjen (INA #37) vs. [5] Mirra Andreeva (#6)

First meeting

Tjen:

- Making Cincinnati debut
- Could reach a second career R16 at WTA 1000 events, after Dubai earlier this season (l. Anisimova)
- Looking for her first Top 10 win; she is 0-2 against Top 10 players after falling to No.6 at 2026 Dubai and No.2 Swiatek at 2026 Doha
- Since 1990, could become the second player from Indonesia to claim a WTA top 10 win after Yayuk Basuki
- Owns one hard court title at Chennai in 2025
- Has won 10 Tour level matches so far in 2026 with her top result being R16 at Washington DC, Rabat, Dubai and Abu Dhabi

Andreeva:

- Returns to the tournament for the second time after previously reaching QF in 2024 (l. Swiatek)
- First career meeting against a player from Indonesia
- Tied for WTA Tour lead with three singles titles - Adelaide, Linz, Roland Garros
- Tied for fourth most match wins this WTA season with 39 wins trailing only Jessica Pegula (42), Elina Svitolina (41) and Elena Rybakina (41); also tied with Aryna Sabalenka (39)
- Currently sits at No.3 on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard; is one of only three players this season, so far, to earn 5000+ Race points; trails only Elena Rybakina and Aryna Sabalenka who hold No.1 and No.2 spots on the Leaderboard

[22] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #27) vs. [13] Iva Jovic (USA #16)

First meeting

Bouzkova:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Cincinnati, where her best tournament result is QF in 2023 (ret. vs. eventual R-Up Muchova)
- Owns 20 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.20 Beatriz Haddad Maia at 2025 Monterrey (Bouzkova is 0-5 in Tour-level matches vs. Top 20 players in 2026)
- Best career WTA 1000 results are two SFs, at 2019 Toronto (l. eventual R-Up S.Williams) and 2022 Guadalajara (l. eventual R-Up Sakkari)
- Has already won 2 WTA titles this year, at Bogota on clay (d. Udvardy in F) and Nottingham on grass (d. Navarro in F) – the first time she has won multiple WTA titles in one calendar year
- Two of her 4 career WTA titles have come on hard court, both at Prague in 2022 (d. Potapova in F) and 2025 (d. Noskova in F)

Jovic:

- Making 2nd appearance at Cincinnati; she also reached 3r last year (as a lucky loser, l. Krejciikova)
- Contesting her 11th career WTA 1000 main draw, and aiming for her 4th appearance in a WTA 1000 R16
- Her best hard court result is her one career WTA title, at WTA 500 Guadalajara last year (d. Arango in F)
- She is 17-8 on hard court so far this year, including her first career Grand Slam QF at Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka) and a R-Up finish at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto in F)
- She is 2-0 vs. Czech players this year, defeating Knutson and Bejlek back-to-back at Auckland in her first two matches of the 2026 season

PLAYER NOTES

- Making 7th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the tournament in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Owns three WTA 1000 titles, winning 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Reached her 16th career WTA 1000 SF before this event at Toronto (l. Rybakina), and 4th of this year after R-Up finishes at Rome (l. Svitolina in F) and Miami (l. Sabalenka in F), and SF run at Dubai (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)
- Holds a 20-7 record on hard court so far this season, with her best result on the surface being her Miami R-Up finish
- After a 1r bye, defeated Samsonova in the 2r from a set down, marking her 11th comeback win of the season - the most on Tour ahead of Pegula (10)
- Faces No.29 Ann Li in 3r today; record against opponents ranked outside the Top 20 stands at 27-5 in 2026. Has won her last 7 consecutive matches against such opponents with the most recent loss coming against No.142 Badosa at Berlin
- She is undefeated this season against fellow Americans (7-0 record), most recently defeated Day at Toronto
- 9 of her 11 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Gauff (2023) is one of four women from the USA to win the Cincinnati Open title, alongside Madison Keys (2019), Serena Williams (2015, 2014) and Lindsay Davenport (2004)
- Is currently ranked No.4; this time last year was ranked at her career-high of No.2 (first reached in June 2024)
- Since the start of the 2020 season, only Sabalenka and Swiatek have claimed more WTA 1000 wins than Coco Gauff (117)
- Since the format's introduction in 1990, only Martina Hingis (44) has reached more R16s at TierI/WTA 1000 events than Coco Gauff (35) before the age of 23
- Gauff (20) is one of three players to have claimed 20+ WTA 1000 wins this season, alongside Rybakina (23) and Svitolina (22)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won her second Grand Slam title of career at Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in final) and her third career WTA 1000 title at Wuhan; also made WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome, becoming the first American to reach three WTA 1000 finals in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2014
- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top 10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Wang Qiang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon. Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF. At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a Tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F). By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the
- Won second career title in 2025 at Guangzhou (after Tenerife 2021) and reached further finals at Singapore (l. Mertens in F) and Cleveland (l. Cirstea in F). Made 4r at a Grand Slam for the first time at US Open (l. Pegula) and reached a peak ranking of No.33 in October before finishing the 2025 season ranked inside the Top 40 for the first time (No.38)
- Ended 2024 with her strongest result of the year at Merida with R-Up run taking her ranking back into the Top 100 for the first time since 2022. Through the season also made QF at Palermo and at WTA 125s, lifted the title at Valencia and reached the final at Bastad
- Reached four Tour-level main draws in 2023; 1r at Austin (as qualifier, l. Blinkova), 1r at Indian Wells (l. Blinkova), Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Guadalajara (as qualifier, l. Stephens). Also reached QF at WTA 125 Valencia on clay (l. Sherif) and R-Up at ITF \$100K Bonita Springs
- Her second semifinal appearance of 2022 came at Midland WTA 125 (l. Friedsam)
- Advanced to second round at Doha WTA 500 (l. Sakkari) and reached WTA 1000 Miami 3r (l. Riske-Amritraj)
- In 2022 reached Melbourne 2 (WTA 250) semifinal (l. Sasnovich)
- Ended 2021 season in fine form, winning first WTA title at Tenerife (d. Osorio in F) and making QF at Courmayeur (l. Tauson)
- Opened 2021 campaign by reaching maiden WTA final, at Grampians Trophy (final vs. Kontaveit was not played)
- Ended 2020 season with career-high ranking of No.97 (November 9, 2020) and first-ever Top 100 finish
- Best result in 2020 was 3r run at US Open (d. No.20 Riske in 2r, l. Kerber)
- Advanced to 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2020 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kenin)
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2020 Auckland (as qualifier, l. McHale)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In doubles in 2025 won a 10th Grand Slam trophy at Australian Open (w/Townsend), followed by a maiden Grand Slam mixed doubles title at Wimbledon (w/Verbeek). Finished the 2025 season ranked PIF Doubles World No.1 for a fifth time (2018, 2021, 2022, 2024), now equal Martina Navratilova for the most year-end No.1 finishes in WTA history
- Reached two WTA singles finals in 2024, at Cleveland and Guangzhou; additionally, champion at WTA 125 event at Lleida (d. Sherif in F). In doubles, finished year-end No.1 for fourth time after winning five titles: Dubai (w/Hunter); an eighth Grand Slam at Roland Garros (w/Gauff) and ninth at Wimbledon (w/Townsend); Prague (w/Krejčíková); and Guangzhou (w/Zhang). Additionally, R-Up at WTA Finals (w/Townsend). Also won gold medal in mixed doubles at Paris Olympics (w/Machac)
- In 2023, won fourth and fifth WTA career singles titles at Bad Homburg (d. Bronzetti in F) and Nanchang (d. Bouzková in F). Also reached final at Hong Kong (l. Fernandez) and advanced to SF at Merida (l. eventual champion Giorgi)
- In doubles in 2023 won titles at Australian Open, Indian Wells and San Diego (all w/Krejčíková). Also achieved R-Up at Adelaide 1 (w/Hunter) and Berlin (w/Vondroušová)
- At 2022 Portoroz, lifted first WTA singles title in over five years (d. Rybakina in F). Also made QF at Hamburg (l. eventual champion Pera)
- Finished her second consecutive season as WTA Doubles World No.1 after winning six titles in 2022 (Melbourne Summer Set #2, Australian Open, Berlin, Wimbledon, US Open, Monastir); with her title at the US Open with partner Krejčíková, completed the career Golden Slam (winning all four Grand Slams and the Olympics) in Doubles
- Singles highlight in 2021 was R-Up finish at Bad Homburg (l. Kerber) - her first singles final since the start of 2018. Also made SF at Parma and reached three further QFs
- Finished 2021 as WTA Doubles World No.1 after winning a Tour-leading five titles, including Roland Garros and Olympics (both w/Krejčíková)
- Reached two doubles finals in 2020, winning her first event of the season (Shenzhen)
- Won two singles titles in 2025, including maiden Grand Slam title at Australian Open becoming the oldest first-time Australian Open champion at 29 years old, and the player with the longest gap between their first two major finals in the Open Era (US Open 2017). Fernandez), and another QF at Rome (l. eventual champion Świątek). At Grand Slams, reached 4r at Wimbledon (l. Paolini, retired in 3r set due to left thigh injury), made 3r at Roland Garros (l. Navarro) and US Open (l. Mertens)
- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014

- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in 2012
- Ranked world No.2 in ITF junior rankings in December 2012; won the girls' doubles titles at Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open in 2013

- Enjoyed first Top 10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), was youngest player in Top 20; won second title at Birmingham (d. Strycova) and reached final at Rome (l. S.Williams) and Montreal (l. Halep)
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20 as first American to make Top 10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (l. Bronze medal match to Petra Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
