[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [22] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #27)

Bouzkova leads 2-1

Gauff:

- Making 7th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the tournament in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Owns three WTA 1000 titles: 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Holds a 21-7 record on hard court so far this season, with her best result on the surface being her Miami R-Up finish (l. Sabalenka in F)
- She is 28-5 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 20
- Since the format's introduction in 1990, only Martina Hingis (44) has reached more R16s at Tier I/WTA 1000 events than Gauff (36) before the age of 23
- Seeking her 26th career WTA 1000 QF, and 5th of this year after R-Up finishes at Miami and Rome, and semifinals at Dubai and Toronto

Bouzkova:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Cincinnati, where her best tournament result is QF in 2023 (ret. vs. eventual R-Up Muchova)
- Has defeated Gauff once before at Cincinnati when they met in the first round here in 2022, also their only meeting on hard court (on clay, Gauff defeated Bouzkova at 2025 Roland Garros and Bouzkova defeated Gauff at 2023 Rome)
- Seeking her 4th career WTA 1000 QF, and first since her 2023 QF here in Cincinnati
- Best career WTA 1000 results are two SFs, at 2019 Toronto (l. eventual R-Up S.Williams) and 2022 Guadalajara (l. eventual R-Up Sakkari)
- Has already won 2 WTA titles this year, at Bogota on clay (d. Udvardy in F) and Nottingham on grass (d. Navarro in F) – the first time she has won multiple WTA titles in one calendar year
- Two of her 4 career WTA titles have come on hard court, both at Prague in 2022 (d. Potapova in F) and 2025 (d. Noskova in F)
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.3 Aryna Sabalenka at 2024 Washington DC; she is 0-4 vs. Top 10 players in 2026



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[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Sara Bejlek (CZE #35)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- 2024 Cincinnati champion (d. Pegula in F) has won 11 WTA 1000 titles in her career, including two this year (the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami), the only player to have won two WTA 1000 titles this season
- Looking to a sixth quarterfinal at Cincinnati, equalling Simona Halep (6) for the most of any player since the format introduction in 2009
- Since 2009, Sabalenka (33) trails just five players for WTA 1000 quarterfinals reached – Agnieszka Radwanska, Simona Halep, Victoria Azarenka, Caroline Wozniacki and Petra Kvitova
- Since 2009, Sabalenka (50) is one of three players to claim 50+ career WTA 1000 match wins as World No.1, along with Serena Williams (104) and Swiatek (58)
- Undefeated against players from Czech Republic this season with wins over Muchova, Noskova, Krejckova and Bartunkova
- 21 of her 24 career WTA titles have come on hard court, including her three titles this year at Brisbane (d. Kostyuk in F), Indian Wells (d. Rybakina in F) and Miami (d. Gauff in F)

Bejlek:

- In her Cincinnati debut, she has equalled her best WTA 1000 career result with R16 at 2024 Madrid (l. Rybakina)
- Best career hard court result is winning her first WTA title earlier this year at Abu Dhabi, as a qualifier ranked No.101 (d. Alexandrova in F)
- This is her first meeting against the current World No.1; she is 0-3 against Top 10 players with her best win by ranking of No.11 Alexandrova in the Abu Dhabi final this year
- Made her Top 50 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on February 9 of this year, following her Abu Dhabi title
- Looking to make her fifth career QF (the fourth this season) - all the previous four have been on hard court

[7] Iga Swiatek (POL #5) vs. Diane Parry (FRA #66)

Swiatek leads 1-0

Swiatek:

- Defending Cincinnati champion (d. Paolini in F) is competing in her 8th main draw here
- Has made at least the semifinals in each of her last three appearances here, reaching the SF in 2024 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and 2023 (l. eventual champion Gauff)
- Has won 12 WTA 1000 titles in her career, most recently last week at Toronto (d. Rybakina in F)
- Could reach her 30th WTA 1000 QF from 48 appearances, only Serena Williams (45) and Agnieszka Radwanska (46) have reached as many QFs from fewer appearances since the format's introduction in 2009
- Along with Sabalenka could become the only players to reach QFs at Cincinnati in each of the last four editions of the tournament (since 2023)
- Has now claimed 100 wins from 127 WTA 1000 matches on hard court - since 2009, only S.Williams (118) has claimed 100 wins from fewer matches on the surface

Parry:

- Making tournament main draw debut appearance, having played qualifying in 2022 and 2023
- Has equalled her best WTA 1000 result with R16 at Indian Wells 2024 (l. Sakkari)
- Owns two wins in her career over Top 10 players - No.6 Amanda Anisimova at Roland Garros 2026 and No.2 Krejckova at 2022 Roland Garros
- The last player from France to defeat a Top 5 player at Cincinnati was Caroline Garcia who defeated No.3 Maria Sakkari in 2022
- Best career results on hard court are semifinals at Ostrava 2026, Osaka 2024 and Granby 2022
- Is currently ranked No.66, having reached a career high of No.47 earlier in June



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[15] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #19) vs. [3] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

Pegula leads 2-1

Cirstea:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at Cincinnati
- She has made R16 here for a third time, after 2009 (l. Dementieva) and last year (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- She has reached one WTA 1000 final in her career, at 2013 Toronto (l. S. Williams in F)
- Seeking her 10th career WTA 1000 QF, and second of the year after 2026 Rome SF (l. eventual R-Up Gauff)
- Owns 24 Tour-level wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.1 Sabalenka at 2026 Rome
- Three of her 4 career WTA titles have come on hard court, including one this year at Cluj-Napoca (d. Raducanu in F)

Pegula:

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Cincinnati with her best result in 2024 with R-Up (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Owns 4 WTA 1000 titles, capturing her fourth this year at Dubai (d. Svitolina in F)
- Has won 42 matches in 2026, leading the WTA in Tour-level match wins so far this year
- Holds a 26-6 record on hard court in 2026, highlighted by the title at Dubai, a runner-up finish at Washington DC, and semifinal appearances at Brisbane and Australian Open
- Seeking her 26th career WTA 1000 QF, and 5th of this year
- Has won 2 titles this year, one on clay at WTA 500 Charleston (d. Starodubtseva in F) and one on hard court at WTA 1000 Dubai (d. Svitolina in F)

[20] Madison Keys (USA #24) vs. [Q] Wang Xiyu (CHN #108)

Keys leads 1-0

Keys:

- Making 12th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the title in 2019 (d. Kuznetsova in F), and also reached SF in 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Kvitova)
- She has won one WTA 1000 title in her career - here in Cincinnati in 2019
- Seeking her 16th career WTA 1000 QF, and her first of the 2026 season
- Looking to reach her fourth QF at Cincinnati (2018, 2019 and 2022): in the Open Era, only four players would have more (Jelena Jankovic (7), Simona Halep (6), Sabalenka and S. Williams with five each)
- Holds a 6-0 record this year in Tour-level matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 100
- Has won nine of her last 10 WTA level main draw meetings against player from China, only losing to Zheng at Miami this season in that span
- Five of her 11 career Tour-level titles have come on hard court, including her one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)

Wang:

- Has reached R16 at Cincinnati for the first time in her second main draw appearance here after falling in 1r in 2023 (as qualifier, l. Sherif)
- Seeking her first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal - this is her second R16 at WTA 1000 level after career after 2023 Rome (l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Looking to reach the 11th QF of her career and the first since Guangzhou in 2024; nine of her previous 10 QFs were on hard court (Budapest 2022 the only exception, on clay)
- Her sole career title was earned on hard court at 2023 Guangzhou (d. Linette in F)
- Reached her first career Grand Slam R16 earlier this year at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Cirstea)
- Holds career-high ranking of No.49, reached in January 2023

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won her second Grand Slam title of career at Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in final) and her third career WTA 1000 title at Wuhan; also made WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome, becoming the first American to reach three WTA 1000 finals in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2014
- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top 10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Wang Qiang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon. Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF. At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a Tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F). By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the
- In 2025, won second WTA Tour singles title of career at Prague (d. fellow Czech Noskova in final); also made SF at Monterrey and QF at Brisbane and Bogota, finishing inside the Top 50 for the fourth straight season. In doubles, won Eastbourne title w/Danilina

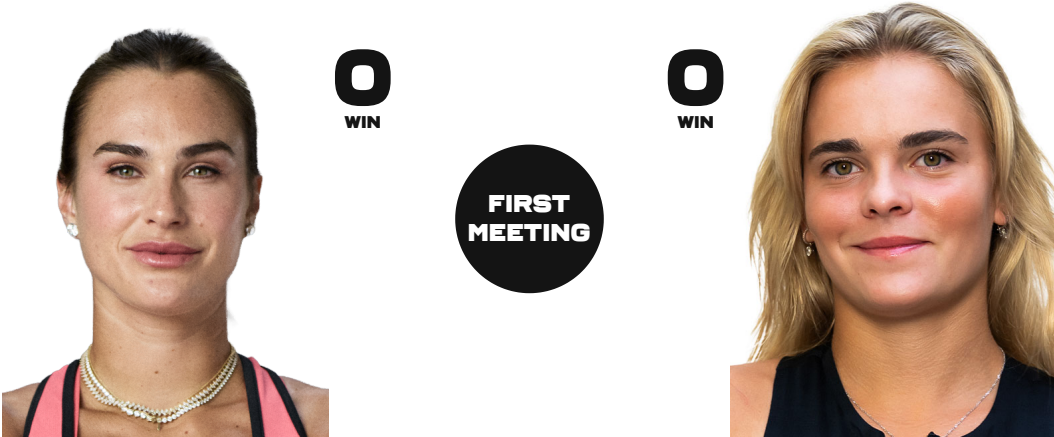

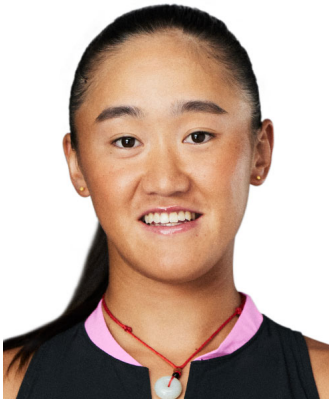

- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014
- Ended 2020 ranked No.16, with best result being R-Up finish at Brisbane (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Lifted biggest title of career during 2019 season at WTA 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kuznetsova in F); afterwards returned to Top 10 for first time since week of June 25, 2018

- In 2025, won ITF W75 Lexington title (d. Tjen in F), and posted 2r results on Tour at Australian Open, WTA 1000 Beijing (l. eventual finalist Noskova) and Guangzhou
- Kicked off 2024 with SF at Auckland (l. Svitolina) before reaching her second career Tour-level final at Austin (l. Yuan)
- In 2023, won first WTA Tour title at Guangzhou (d. Linette in F) and posted new career-high ranking of No.49 on January 9; also reached R16 at Eastbourne, Rome, Prague, and Merida
- Recorded first Top 100 season finish in 2022, ending the year ranked No.50; season highlighted by reaching the semifinals at WTA 250 events in Cluj-Napoca and Washington DC; also reached the quarterfinals at Granby and Budapest
- During 2021, made 2r at Abu Dhabi (l. Rybakina) and Nottingham (l. Riske). Also finished R-Up at ITF/W25 event in Florence, SC, USA
- In 2020, reached her first career WTA Tour SF at Acapulco as qualifier, where she defeated No.2 seed Y.Wang and two-time champion Errani (l. eventual champion Watson); following that event, posted new career-high ranking of No.106 on March 2
- Earlier in 2020, reached her first career WTA Tour QF at Hua Hin (l. eventual champion Linette), upsetting No.15 Martic in 1r for first victory over a Top 20 player
- In 2019, best Tour-level result was Miami 2r (as WC, l. Bertens); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at US Open (as LL, l. Flipkens), and won third ITF Circuit singles title at \$60K Internacional de Solgirones
- Season highlights in 2018 were maiden ITF singles titles at \$25K Nonthaburi and \$25K Tsukuba, and also won three ITF doubles titles that year; at Tour-level, contested Wuhan, falling 2r to Kasatkina in her first match vs. a Top 20 opponent
- Made WTA singles main draw debut at 2017 Tianjin Open as wildcard, defeating Kovinic in 1r
- Made professional debut at 2016 \$10K ITF/Anning, CHN
- In Juniors, became first Chinese girl to win a Grand Slam Junior singles title at 2018 US Open; also teamed up with Wang Xinyu to claim Junior doubles title at 2018 Wimbledon
- As a junior, achieved career-high ranking of No.1 in both singles and doubles; also took bronze in the girls' doubles (w/Wang Xinyu) at 2018 Summer Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires

- Enjoyed first Top 10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), was youngest player in Top 20; won second title at Birmingham (d. Strycova) and reached final at Rome (l. S.Williams) and Montreal (l. Halep)
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20 as first American to make Top 10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (l. Bronze medal match to Petra Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
- Advanced to maiden major SF at 2015 Australian Open (l. eventual champion S.Williams); broke into Top 20 following conclusion of tournament, on February 2
- Also in 2015, won second career title at Charleston and reached QF at Wimbledon
- Won first career title at 2014 Eastbourne (d. No.9 Kerber in F); was second-youngest player to win a WTA title in 2014, (after Vekic at Kuala Lumpur); also, youngest American to win a title since Vania King in October 2006 (17y 254d at Bangkok)
- Made Billie Jean King Cup debut for USA in 2014
- Broke into Top 100 at beginning of 2013 season and finished the year No.39; highlights were SF at Osaka, QFs at Sydney, Charleston and Birmingham and 3r at Australian Open and Wimbledon
- Earned first Top 20 win over No.17 Lucie Safarova while ranked No.135 at 2013 Sydney; then earned first Top 10 win over No.5 Na Li as LL at Madrid
- In 2012, reached 2r at Miami and played main draw at Australian Open, Memphis and Cincinnati; also won two titles on ITF circuit
- Earned first Grand Slam win at 2011 US Open (d. Craybas, l. Safarova in 2r), also played main draw at Miami and contested qualifying at Indian Wells
- Won first title on ITF circuit at 2010 \$10k/ITF Cleveland, OH, USA; also contested qualifying at US Open in 2010
- Made professional debut in 2009 and Tour-level debut at 2009 Ponte Vedra Beach (as WC, d. Kudryavtseva, l. No.10 Nadia Petrova); was seventh youngest player to win a WTA main draw match at 14y 48d and youngest since Hingis in 1994
