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## QUARTERFINAL QUICK HITS

- Four Americans (Keys, Gauff, Pegula and Anisimova) have made the QFs at Cincinnati for the first time since 1988 (six - Kathy Rinaldi Stunkel, Susan Sloane Lundy, Barbara Potter, Mareen Louie Harper, Halle Cioffi and Beth Herr)
- This is the third time since 2009 that four Americans have made the QFs at a WTA 1000 event, after 2024 Toronto (5 - Pegula, Stearns, Navarro, Townsend, Anisimova) and 2025 Beijing (4 - Navarro, Pegula, Anisimova, Gauff)
- Gauff is the youngest player to reach back-to-back QFs at Cincinnati (2025-2026) since Svitolina (2014-2015)
- Since 1990, only Hingis (39) has reached more QFs at Tier I / WTA 1000 events than Gauff (26) before turning 23
- Kostyuk has reached Cincinnati QF for the first time in her career; she could equal the best result by a Ukrainian at the event in the Open Era by reaching the SFs, matching Svitolina's 2015 run
- Keys has reached her fourth Cincinnati Open QF (2018, 2019, 2022, 2026); only four players have made more in the Open Era: Jankovic, Halep, Sabalenka and S. Williams
- Bejlek is the youngest of this year's eight quarterfinalists (20 years 194 days); since the event's reinauguration in 2004, she could become the youngest left-handed player to reach the semifinals at Cincinnati
- Bejlek is the only quarterfinalist at this year's Cincinnati Open to have not won a WTA 1000 title

### Sara Bejlek (CZE #35) vs. [20] Madison Keys (USA #24)

**First meeting**

#### ***Bejlek:***

- On her Cincinnati debut, Bejlek is through to her first career WTA 1000 QF, after her previous best result at this level being R16 at 2024 Madrid (l. Rybakina)
- This is her fifth career Tour-level QF (the fourth this season) - all have come on hard court (Prague, Athens, Abu Dhabi in 2026, and Prague in 2025)
- Looking to reach her second career Tour-level SF today, having won her maiden title as a qualifier ranked No.101 at Abu Dhabi earlier this season (d. Alexandrova in F)
- Her win over No.1 Sabalenka in the R16 marked her first career win over a Top 10 player, and was her first time facing the current World No.1
- Made her Top 50 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on February 9 of this year, following her Abu Dhabi title
- Bidding to become just the second player since 2009 to defeat four WTA 1000 champions en route to a WTA 1000 semifinal, after compatriot Karolina Pliskova at 2018 Madrid

#### ***Keys:***

- Making 12th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the title in 2019 (d. Kuznetsova in F), also reached SF in 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Kvitova)
- She has won one WTA 1000 title in her career - here at Cincinnati in 2019
- Contesting her 16th career WTA 1000 QF today, and her first since 2025 Montreal (l. Tauson in QF)
- This is her 6th Tour-level QF of the season after title run at Eastbourne, SF finish at Charleston and QF showings at Brisbane, Adelaide and Berlin
- Looking to reach an 8th career WTA 1000 SF today, and her first since 2025 Indian Wells (l. Sabalenka in SF)
- Keys has won 22 main draw matches at Cincinnati; excluding the four Majors, only Charleston (24) has seen her record more wins at a single event
- Five of her 11 career Tour-level titles have come on hard court, including her one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)



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#### [4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [10] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #11)

**Gauff leads 3-2**

##### ***Gauff:***

- Making 7th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the tournament in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Owns three WTA 1000 titles: 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Contesting her 26th career WTA 1000 QF today, and her fifth this season after runner-up runs at Rome and Miami, and SF finishes at Dubai and Toronto
- Gauff is the third player in the Open Era to reach 3+ QFs at Cincinnati before turning 23 (2023, 2025, 2026) after Linda Tuero (four) and Sania Mirza (three)
- Gauff has won 11 of her last 12 WTA 1000 QFs, only losing to Paolini at Cincinnati last season in that span
- She holds a 22-7 record on hard court so far this season, with her best result on the surface being her Miami R-Up finish (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Seeking her 17th career WTA 1000 SF today (fifth this season)
- Bidding to become the second-youngest player since 2009 to reach 5+ WTA 1000 semifinals in a single season (Dubai, Miami, Rome, Toronto and Cincinnati), older only than Iga Swiatek in 2023
- 9 of her 11 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)

##### ***Kostyuk:***

- Making 5th appearance at Cincinnati, she's made the quarterfinals here for the first time in her career
- She has won one WTA 1000 title in her career, lifting the trophy at Madrid on clay earlier this year (d. M.Andreeva in F)
- Contesting her 6th career WTA 1000 QF today, and her second this season after title run at Madrid
- Kostyuk is undefeated in Tour QFs this season (5-0): only Muchova (six) has played more Tour QFs in 2026 without losing one
- Kostyuk is the player with the joint-most wins against Top 10 opponents this season (8, level with Rybakina and Svitolina)
- Kostyuk is 13-0 this season against opponents from United States of America, including two wins at this year's tournament over Kenin and Stephens
- Since the start of the clay season (Bogota and Charleston), Kostyuk (27) has claimed the most Tour-level main draw wins
- Seeking her 3rd career WTA 1000 SF today after title run at 2026 Madrid (d. M.Andreeva in F) and SF finish at 2024 Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Following back-to-back Grand Slam semifinal runs at Roland Garros and Wimbledon, climbed to a career-high of No.11 for first time on July 13 this year; playing this week ranked No.11

- Contesting her 6th career WTA 1000 main draw, she is through to her first QF at this level after her previous best being R16 at 2024 Madrid (l. Rybakina)
- This is her fifth career WTA level QF (the fourth this season) - all have come on hard court
- Career record in WTA QF matches stands at 1-3; she's fallen in the QF stage at 2026 Prague (l. eventual champion Tagger), 2026 Athens (l. Tauson) and 2025 Prague (l. Wang Xinyu)
- Looking to reach her second career Tour-level SF today, having won her maiden title as a qualifier at Abu Dhabi earlier this season
- Has beaten Karolina Pliskova, Barbora Krejcikova, Ekaterina Alexandrova and Aryna Sabalenka so far this week to reach her first WTA 1000 QF
- Her win over No.1 Sabalenka in the R16 marked her first career win over a Top 10 player, and was her first time facing the current World No.1
- Faces No.24 Madison Keys in QF today; she's 17-9 this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 20, most recent was her win over No.26 Krejcikova in the 2r here
- Owns 5-4 career record against players from United States of America, 3-3 this season - most recent was her win over Stephens at Roland Garros
- Best career hard court result is winning her first WTA title earlier this year at Abu Dhabi, as a qualifier ranked No.101 (d. Alexandrova in F)
- Only player from Czech Republic to reach QF
- Best result by Czech Republic at Cincinnati is by Karolina Pliskova who won the title in 2016
- Is currently ranked No.35 (career high of No.34 in April 2026); this time last year was ranked No.109. Made her Top 50 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on February 9 of this year, following her Abu Dhabi title

- Contesting her 16th career WTA 1000 QF today; and her first since 2025 Montreal (l. Tauson in QF)
- This is her 6th Tour-level QF of the season after title run at Eastbourne, SF finish at Charleston and QF showings at Brisbane, Adelaide and Berlin
- Looking to reach an 8th career WTA 1000 SF today, and her first since 2025 Indian Wells
- After 1r bye, has beaten Snigur, Siniakova and Wang Xiyu so far this week to reach her first WTA 1000 QF of the season
- Faces No.35 Sara Bejlek in QF today; she's 25-6 so far this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 20, most recent was her win over No.108 Wang Xiyu in the R16 here
- Owns 4-2 record in 2026 against players from Czech Republic, most recent was her win over Siniakova in the 3r here
- 5 of her 11 career Tour-level titles have come on hard court, including her one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Her top performance so far this year is winning the grass-court title at Eastbourne (d. T.Maria in F) - this was the 3rd time in her career that she has won the Eastbourne title (also 2014 and 2023)
- Most recent American to win this title is Coco Gauff in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Is currently ranked No.24; this time last year was ranked No.6. Reached career-high ranking of No.5 in February 2025

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## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 reached QF at Tour level for the first time at Prague (l. Wang Xinyu) and registered her first Grand Slam main draw match win by reaching 2r at Roland Garros as a qualifier (defeated No.25 Marta Kostyuk in 1r)
- Also in 2025 won three WTA 125 titles at Makarska, Rende and Queretaro, and broke into the Top 100 for the first time reaching a career-high of No.75 in November
- 2024 breakthrough performance saw her reach R16 at WTA 1000 Madrid as a qualifier. Also reached main draw as a qualifying at Australian Open and made two WTA 125 SFs at Colina and Buenos Aires and achieve a career high ranking of No.114 in May
- In 2023, played main draw at Australian Open (l. Krejčíková) and Roland Garros (l. Rakhimova) both as a qualifier; also played qualifying at Austin, Rome, Wimbledon and US Open
- Also in 2023, won title at WTA 125K event at Colina, Chile and two titles on ITF circuit at W25 Santa Margherita di Pula, ITA and W25 Parnu, EST
- Made Tour-level qualifying debut at 2022 Wimbledon and made WTA main draw debut at 2022 US Open coming through qualifying where she fell to No.35 Liudmila Samsonova in 1r
- Also in 2022, won three ITF titles at W60 Olomouc, CZE; W60 Ceska Lipa, CZE; and W25 Santa Margherita di Pula, ITA
- Standout junior results came at 2022 Roland Garros (l. Havlickova), when she reached SF in singles and won girls' doubles title w/Havlickova
- Made professional debut in 2021 on ITF circuit winning first title at W60 Olomouc, CZE
- Won two singles titles in 2025, including maiden Grand Slam title at Australian Open becoming the oldest first-time Australian Open champion at 29 years old, and the player with the longest gap between their first two major finals in the Open Era (US Open 2017). Returned to a career-high ranking of No.7, then broke into the Top 5 for the first time in February
- In 2025 also qualified for the WTA Finals for the second time in her career after 2016
- In 2024, won eighth career title at Strasbourg (d. Collins in F dropping only three games). Reached SF at Madrid (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Eastbourne (l. Fernandez), and another QF at Rome (l. eventual champion Swiatek). At Grand Slams, reached 4r at Wimbledon (l. Paolini, retired in 3r set due to left thigh injury), made 3r at Roland Garros (l. Navarro) and US Open (l. Mertens)
