QUICK HITS FOR THE FINAL

- No.3 seed Jessica Pegula will meet No.4 seed Coco Gauff in an all-American Cincinnati Open final on Sunday. This will be the first all-American final at Cincinnati since 1970, when Rosie Casals defeated Nancy Richey.
- Pegula leads Gauff in their head-to-head 5-4 overall, and 4-2 on hard courts. However, Gauff won their only meeting so far this year, defeating Pegula on grass in the Wimbledon quarterfinals.
- This will be their second meeting in a final – Gauff defeated Pegula to win the WTA 1000 Wuhan title last year.
- Having faced each other in the WTA 1000 Wuhan final last year, Pegula and Gauff will become the second pair of Americans to face each other in multiple Tier I/WTA 1000 finals since the format's introduction in 1990, after Serena Williams and Jennifer Capriati (Toronto 2001, Miami 2002 and 2003).
- The age gap between Pegula and Gauff (10 years and 18 days) will be the biggest between the Cincinnati finalists in the Open Era, surpassing the previous biggest between Serena Williams and Simona Halep in 2015.
- Regardless of the final result, Pegula and Gauff are projected to remain at No.3 and No.4 respectively in the PIF WTA Rankings following Cincinnati.
- In the Race to the WTA Finals, Pegula (currently No.5 on the Race Leaderboard) is projected to rise to No.4 with a runner-up finish or No.2 with a title.
- In the Race to the WTA Finals, Gauff (currently No.7 on the Race Leaderboard) is projected to rise to No.6 with a runner-up finish or No.5 with a title.

Pegula leads 5-4

Gauff:

- Making 7th appearance at Cincinnati, where she won the tournament in 2023 (d. Muchova in F)
- Has won three WTA 1000 titles in her career: 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- This is her 8th career WTA 1000 final, and third of this year following R-Up finishes at 2026 Miami (l. Sabalenka in F) and 2026 Rome (l. Svitolina in F)
- She has become the first player to reach three WTA 1000 finals in 2026
- Only Elena Rybakina (25) has won more WTA 1000 main draw matches than Gauff (24) this year
- Seeking her 12th career WTA title, and her first title of this year - her most recent title is 2025 Wuhan, where she defeated today's opponent Pegula in the final
- Holds a 24-7 record on hard court so far this season, with her best results on the surface being her Miami R-Up finish, and her Cincinnati final today
- 9 of her 11 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Owns 36 wins in career over Top 10 players (3-5 vs. Top 10 players this year) – her most recent Top 10 win was over today's opponent, then-No.4 Pegula in 2026 Wimbledon QF
- This year, she has an 8-0 record vs. her fellow American players, including a win over Li this fortnight
- Attempting to become just the 3rd player in the Open Era to claim two Cincinnati Open titles, joining Victoria Azarenka and Serena Williams (who each won their second Cincinnati title after turning 31 years old)

Pegula:

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Cincinnati, and is into the final here for the second time - she was the Cincinnati runner-up in 2024 (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Has won 4 WTA 1000 titles in her career, including one this year at Dubai (d. Svitolina in F)
- This is her 9th career WTA 1000 final, and 8 of those have been on hard court (the exception was her very first WTA 1000 final, where she was R-Up to Jabeur at 2022 Madrid on clay)
- Seeking her 12th career WTA title, and her 3rd title of this year after WTA 1000 Dubai (d. Svitolina in F) and WTA 500 Charleston (d. Starodubtseva in F)
- If she can win her 3rd title of the year today, she would tie Sabalenka and M.Andreeva for the most WTA titles won in 2026
- Her semifinal victory over Swiatek yesterday was her 300th career Tour-level win
- Has won 45 matches in 2026, leading the WTA in Tour-level match-wins so far this year
- Holds a 29-6 record on hard court in 2026, including the title at Dubai, a runner-up finish at Washington DC, semifinal appearances at Brisbane and Australian Open, and now Cincinnati final
- Has claimed the most wins (45), hard court wins (29, level with Elena Rybakina), wins on American soil (19) and wins in three sets (17) at WTA-level events this season
- 7 of her 11 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2026 Dubai
- Owns 7-5 record this year against Top 10 opponents, including two Top 10 wins already this fortnight over No.10 Anisimova (QF) and No.5 Swiatek (SF)
- She is 10-1 this year vs. her fellow American players, including wins over Navarro and Anisimova this fortnight – the one loss was to today's opponent Gauff in the Wimbledon QF

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CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won her second Grand Slam title of career at Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in final) and her third career WTA 1000 title at Wuhan; also made WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome, becoming the first American to reach three WTA 1000 finals in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2014
- Went three for three in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeat the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event. Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top 10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Wang Qiang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon. Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF. At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a Tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F). By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the
- Won three singles titles in 2025 across all three surfaces - Bad Homburg (grass), Charleston (clay) and Austin (hard); also had runner-up finishes at Wuhan, Miami and Adelaide
- Qualified for the 2025 WTA Finals for a fourth consecutive year and reached the semifinals for the second time after 2023
- In 2024, won two singles titles - Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin - en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun
- In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open
- Achieved career-high No.3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
