**Petra Marcinko (CRO #74) v. [WC] Victoria Jimenez Kasintseva (AND #115)**

**Tied at 1-1**

**Marcinko:**

- Making debut appearance at Madrid
- Is playing her 4th WTA 1000 event, after falling in opening matches at Miami, Indian Wells and Dubai in 2026
- Seeking first career main draw win at a WTA 1000 event
- Best career result on clay is R16 at Rabat 2022 (I. Sharma)
- Best result of 2026 was reaching R16 at Auckland (I. Eala)

**Jimenez Kasintseva:**

- Making 5th appearance at Madrid, where her previous best result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Paolini), the best result by a player from Andorra at Madrid
- Reached 2r at Indian Wells 2026 (I. Osaka), which is her best result across all WTA 1000 events
- Has won two matches on clay - R16 run at Iasi 2025 (Giulia Safina Popa) and Madrid 2024 (d. Lin Zhu)
- Best result of 2026 was QF run at Merida (I. Zhang Shuai)
- Winner of this match will face No.11 Bencic in second round

**Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #69) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #50)**

**Bouzas Maneiro leads 2-0**

**Haddad Maia:**

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Madrid; best previous result was QF in 2024 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Best WTA 1000 result came in 2022 when she reached the final at Toronto (I. Halep)
- Her quarterfinal run here in 2024 is the best result by Brazil at Madrid
- Looking for her first Tour main draw match win of the season and first on clay since Strasbourg 2025 when she reached SF (I. Rybakina)
- Earlier this season, fell to Bouzas Maneiro in 1r at Indian Wells
- She is 0-4 against Top 50 players this year; her most recent victory at 2025 Wimbledon over No.34 Sramkova

**Bouzas Maneiro:**

- Making third main draw appearance at Madrid; made 2r both previous times (I. Ostapenko in 2024; I. Frech in 2025)
- Best WTA 1000 result is reaching quarterfinal at Montreal in 2025 (I. eventual champion Mboko)
- Best career result on clay is quarterfinal which she has reached twice: Rabat, Rouen in 2025
- Competing in her second clay event of the season after Bogota where she reached R16 (I. Lepchenko)
- The only other Tour main draw meeting against a player from Brazil in her career was defeating Haddad Maia this year at Indian Wells in 1r

## [WC] Paula Badosa (ESP #103) vs. Julia Grabher (AUT #107)

**Badosa leads 1-0**

### *Badosa:*

- This is her 7th appearance at Madrid where her best result was reaching semifinal in 2021 (l. Barty)
- Among Spanish players, only Carla Suarez Navarro (9) and Garbine Muguruza (8) have more Madrid appearances than Badosa (7)
- Only Muguruza (100) and Suarez Navarro (92) have claimed more WTA 1000 main draw wins among Spanish players than Badosa (57) since the format's introduction in 2009
- As a wildcard in 2021, advanced to semifinal here – the best result by a player from Spain as well as the best result by a wild card at Madrid
- Playing in third clay event of 2026 and looking for her third match win today after reaching 3r at Charleston

### *Grabher:*

- Making second appearance at Madrid, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 as a lucky loser (l. Swiatek)
- Best WTA 1000 result of career at Rome 2023 with 3r (l. Kasatkina)
- Three of her four WTA 1000 wins have been on clay (two at Rome 2023 and one at Madrid 2023)
- Best career win by ranking in a completed Tour match was achieved on clay over No.28 Zhang Shuai at 2023 Charleston
- Looking for second Tour level main draw match win of 2026 after reaching 2r at Australian Open (l. Cocciaretto)

## [WC] Kaitlin Quevedo (ESP #140) vs. [WC] Venus Williams (USA #479)

**First meeting**

### *Quevedo:*

- Making debut main draw appearance at Madrid after competing in her first Tour qualifying match here last year (l. Blinkova in 2r of qualifying)
- This is the first WTA 1000 main draw of her career
- This is the third Tour level main draw appearance of her career after Auckland where she reached R16 as a qualifier (l. Costoulas) and Cluj-Napoca where she made 1r as a qualifier (l. Wang Xinyu) – both this year
- Her best career win by ranking came over No.64 Peyton Stearns at Auckland this year; this was also her only Tour level main draw match win and only meeting against a player from USA at Tour level
- Owns a total of six ITF titles on clay (most recently W100 Gran Canaria-Maspalomas in June 2025) and this is her first Tour level main draw match on clay

### *Williams:*

- The 2010 Madrid finalist is making her 7th appearance at the tournament
- This is her first clay court match since 2021 Roland Garros and a win today would be her first on clay since defeating Elise Mertens at 2019 Rome
- Among current players, only Sara Errani (198) has claimed more clay court WTA level main draw wins than V. Williams (169)
- Best result by United States of America at Madrid 1000 was by her sister Serena Williams who won the title in 2013 and 2012
- Former World No.1 spent a total of 11 weeks in the top spot, most recently in July 2002
- Owns a total of nine clay court titles, most recently 2010 Acapulco (d. Hercog in F); her Madrid 2010 runner-up result is her most recent final on clay (l. Rezai in F)

## **Peyton Stearns (USA #43) vs. Lois Boisson (FRA #46)**

**First meeting**

### ***Stearns:***

- Making 3rd appearance at Madrid, where previous best result was 4r in 2025 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Achieved her best WTA 1000 result at 2025 Rome with semifinal (l. eventual champion Paolini)
- Owns one career title on clay: Rabat in 2024
- Competing in her second clay event of the season after Charleston where she made 2r (l. Kessler)
- Posted her best result of the 2026 season by winning the title at Austin (l. Townsend)

### ***Boisson:***

- Making Madrid debut appearance
- This is the second WTA 1000 main draw of her career after reaching 3r at Beijing 2025 (retired during match against Navarro); injury has since kept her away from the courts since then and Madrid 2026 is her first tournament back
- Owns five wins in career over Top 50 players, with three of those achieved on her way to 2025 Roland Garros semifinal (No.24 Mertens, No.3 Pegula & No.6 M.Andreeva)
- Her 2024 Roland Garros defeat of Pegula was her only career Tour main draw victory over a player from USA
- In 2025 posted a Tour level main draw match record of 11-2 on clay; she is competing in her first match of the 2026 season today

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 won WTA 125 title at Rome on clay and closed the season with an ITF W100 title at Dubai to climb to a career-high ranking of No.82 in December
- Reached first WTA 125 final at Montreux; played qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon
- In 2023 achieved best Tour-level result with R16 at Monastir (l. eventual R-Up, Paolini). Won her Q1 Grand Slam matches at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open

Won three ITF titles in 2022; two at W25 Antalya and one at W80 Poitiers. Played first WTA Tour matches at Rabat making 2r (l. Sharma) and 1r Potoroz (l. Bucsa). Also represented Croatia in Billie Jean Cup Playoffs defeating Niemeier

Began on ITF circuit in 2021 reaching two 15K semifinals at Sibenik on clay and Monastir on hard

- Reached second career Tour-level QF in 2025 at Guadalajara (after Seoul 2022) and made Grand Slam main draw debut at US Open as a qualifier (l. Maya Joint in 1r). At WTA 125 level, made finals for the first time at Antalya #2 and Makarska. Posted a year-end ranking at a career high No.107
- 2024 season highlight was reaching 2r at WTA 1000 Madrid for the first time in her career (l. Paolini). Also made QF run at WTA 125 Ljubljana
- In 2023 competed in 1r main draw at Miami and Madrid and won fourth ITF career title at W25 Austin
- In 2022 produced a breakthrough performance at Seoul by reaching the semifinal (l. Ostapenko). Also played qualifying at all four Grand Slams and closed the season with a career high ranking of No.121 in November
- Ended 2021 campaign at No.375 after winning 22 of her last 30 matches
- In November 2021, won maiden ITF Circuit title at Aparecida de Goiania, Brazil, followed by SF run at WTA 125K Series event in Montevideo, Uruguay
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2021 Madrid (as WC, l. Bertens)
- Highlight of 2020 was winning girls' singles at Australian Open title (d. Baszak in F), becoming the first player representing Andorra - the 16th smallest country in the world - to win a Grand Slam title. Was the youngest player in the field at 2020 Australian Open (14-years-old)
- Also reached her first SF on the ITF Circuit in 2020 at \$15K ITF/Melilla-ESP
- Played first professional event of career on ITF Circuit in Spain in 2020
- Gained an ITF junior ranking for the first time in 2019, making her way to six titles from April to November
- In 2018, at just 12-years-old, won the Future Tennis Aces tournament held in conjunction with Roland Garros

Is sixth-oldest player to win a WTA singles title, after Billie Jean King (39) at 1983 Birmingham, Kimiko Date (38) at 2009 Seoul, Serena Williams (38) at 2020 Auckland, Martina Navratilova (37) at 1994 Paris [Indoor] and Francesca Schiavone (36) at 2017 Bogotá

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, made first WTA 1000 SF of career at Rome and hit career-high ranking of No.28 on May 19; earned first Top 10 wins of career over No.8 Zheng Qinwen at Dubai and No.6 Keys at Rome
