## MATCH NOTES – DAY 2 – WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22

**Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #67) vs. [WC] Carlota Martinez Cirez (ESP #352)**

**First meeting**

### *Sonmez:*

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she qualified for last year's main draw then fell to Bencic in 1r
- Contesting her 9th career WTA 1000 main draw; her best WTA 1000 finish is R32 at 2025 Beijing (l. Potapova)
- Playing her 2nd clay-court event of the year after R16 finish last week in Stuttgart as a qualifier (d. Paolini for first career Top 10 win; l. Fernandez in 3rd-set TB)
- Has not lost a match to a player ranked outside the Top 100 in 2026 (1-0 in Tour-level main draw matches, and 6-0 in qualifying matches)
- Best result so far this year is QF at Merida (l. eventual champion Bucsa)

### *Martinez Cirez:*

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at this event; she was a main draw wild card last year and fell 1r to Joint
- Her first-ever qualifying match at this tournament was a loss to Aryna Sabalenka in 2018 qualies (Sabalenka was ranked No.46 at the time and was seeded No.2 in that qualifying draw)
- Madrid 2025 and 2026 are her only two career appearances in WTA 1000 main draws
- Seeking her first Tour-level win of career; she is currently 0-2 at Tour-level with opening main draw losses at 2025 Madrid (l. Joint) and 2025 Rabat (l. Pieri), both clay-court events
- Winner of this match to face No.27 seed Cristina Bucsa, the Spanish No.1, in the 2nd round

**Karolina Pliskova (CZE #197) vs. [Q] Sinja Kraus (AUT #104)**

**Pliskova leads 1-0**

### *Pliskova:*

- Making 9th main draw appearance at this event, where her best result was reaching SF in 2018 (l. eventual champion Kvitova)
- First appearance at Madrid since 2022 (l. Bouzkova in 1r)
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles: 2019 Rome (d. Konta in F) and 2016 Cincinnati (d. Kerber in F)
- Three-time clay court champion on the WTA Tour: Rome in 2019 (d. Konta in F); Stuttgart in 2018 (d. Vandeweghe in F); and Prague in 2015 (d. Hradecka in F)
- Her best tournament finish of 2026 so far was reaching QF at Linz on clay (l. Vekic)

### *Kraus:*

- Making her debut appearance at Madrid as a qualifier
- This is her 2nd career WTA 1000 main draw; she also qualified at 2026 Miami (l. Parks in 1r)
- Best career Tour-level result on clay is reaching R16 at 2025 Hamburg (l. Bondar) and 2023 Bogota (l. Brancaccio)
- Recently reached peak rank of No.99 in February 2026; she was the first player this year to post a Top 100 debut in the WTA Rankings
- Winner of this match will face No.33 seed Maria Sakkari of Greece in 2nd round

## [Q] Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#116) vs. Alexandra Eala (PHI #44)

First meeting

### *Pavlyuchenkova:*

- Making 17th appearance at this event, and this is the first time she is playing this event as a qualifier
- Her career-best result at this event is reaching SF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Contesting her 121st WTA 1000 main draw of career, the most of all players since the creation of this tournament tier in 2009
- Her career-best WTA 1000 showings are 4 SF finishes, most recently 2024 Doha (l. eventual R-Up Rybakina)
- Seeking her first Tour-level win of the year (0-5 in Tour-level matches in 2026)

### *Eala:*

- Making 4th main draw appearance at this event; her tournament-best showings are 2r in 2024 (l. Cirstea) and 2025 (l. Swiatek)
- Her career-best WTA 1000 result is SF at 2025 Miami as a No.140-ranked wild card (l. eventual R-Up Pegula)
- She is 1-0 at Tour-level this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (d. Sasnovich in Abu Dhabi R16 in 3rd-set TB)
- Best finish so far this year is Auckland SF (l. eventual R-Up Wang Xinyu); also made Tour-level QFs in 2026 at Abu Dhabi (l. eventual R-Up Alexandrova) and Dubai (l. Gauff)
- Winner of this match to face No.19 seed Elise Mertens of Belgium in 2nd round

## Talia Gibson (AUS #58) vs. [WC] Emiliana Arango (COL #86)

First meeting

### *Gibson:*

- Making her debut appearance at this event
- Contesting her 3rd career WTA 1000 main draw; her previous WTA 1000 main draw showings are 2026 Indian Wells QF (l. Noskova) and 2026 Miami R16 (l. Rybakina), both times as a qualifier
- Made her Top 100 debut in the WTA Rankings on March 16 of this year, following her QF run at Indian Wells – she is one of six players to post Top 100 debuts so far this year
- This is her first WTA Tour-level main draw of a clay-court event
- Winner of this match to face No.13 seed Linda Noskova of Czech Republic in 2nd round

### *Arango:*

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at this event; her best Madrid finish is 2r in 2024 as a qualifier (d. wild card Anisimova in 1r in 3rd-set TB; l. Yastremska)
- Contesting her 13th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 showing is QF at 2023 Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Sakkari)
- Seeking her second Top 100 win of the year (d. Potapova at 2026 Merida)
- Her best result so far this year is SF run at Bogota (l. eventual R-Up Udvardy) – that is also her career-best Tour-level result on clay
- One of 2 players from Colombia in the main draw, along with Osorio (last year at Madrid, Osorio defeated Arango in an all-Colombian 1r)

***Townsend:***

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at this event; her previous Madrid main draw showing was 1r in 2024 (l. M. Andrejeva)
- Her career-best result at a WTA 1000 event is QF at 2024 Toronto (l. Navarro)
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are R16 finishes at Charleston in 2019 (l. Bencic) and 2024 (l. Azarenka)
- Best singles result so far in 2026 is making her first career WTA singles final at Austin (l. fellow American Stearns in F)
- Winner of this match to face No.5 seed Jessica Pegula of the United States in 2nd round

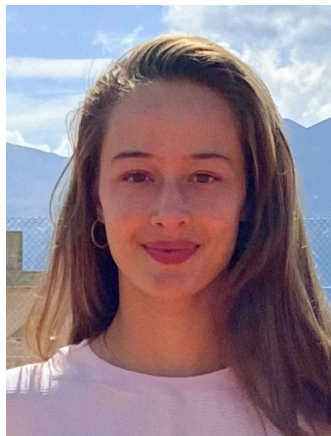
***Boulter:***

- Holds a 9-2 record in Tour-level matches this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, made history for her country at Wimbledon, becoming first Turkish player to reach a Grand Slam 3r in Open Era; also made Merida QF, and notched first WTA 1000 main draw wins of career in Beijing 3r run; reached career-high No.69 on October 20
- During 2024, won first WTA Tour title at Merida, becoming first Turkish player to win WTA Tour singles title since Buyukakcay at 2016 Istanbul. Also made QF at Monastir and entered the Top 100 for the first time, ending the year at a career-high of No.89
- Made her WTA Tour main draw debut in 2023 at 's-Hertogenbosch with a 1r (l. Andreescu) and followed up with a 1r at Hamburg (l. Pera). Contested Grand Slam qualifying for the first time in 2023 at Wimbledon and US Open
- In 2023, reached her first WTA 125 final at Ljubljana (l. Bassols Ribera) and further reached a WTA 125 SF at Kozerki (l. Yastremska)
- In 2022, lifted two ITF titles at 15K Monastir and 25K Sozopol
- In 2020, lifted one ITF title at 15K Antalya
- Competed in her first Tour level main draw in 2025 at Madrid (l. Joint in 1r); also played Rabat that year (l. Pieri in 1r)
- Played qualifying at 2023 & 2025 US Open, 2024 Australian Open and 2025 Wimbledon
- Claimed a further five ITF titles between 2023 and 2024, all on clay
- Won her first ITF title in 2022 at W15 Marrakech followed by a second that year at W25 Santa Margherita di Pula
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2016, and played her first Tour qualifying match at Madrid 2018 where she faced No.2 qualifying seed Aryna Sabalenka in her opening qualifying match

- Coached by Issam Jellali
- Fitness and mental coach is Mehmet Bayraktar
- Following her breakthrough in 2025, received the Athlete of the Year award at the Harper's Bazaar Türkiye Women of the Year ceremony in Istanbul
- Inspired as a child by attending the WTA Finals Istanbul and watching stars like Victoria Azarenka, Li Na, Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova; also served as a ballgirl at the Istanbul event where Buyukakcay made history
- A key to her 2024 rise was adding a more aggressive, net-rushing style to complement her strong movement, along with improved mental resilience following a heartbreaking Wimbledon qualifying loss to Daria Snigur
- She emphasizes hope, focus and sportsmanship, highlighted by a notable fair-play moment with Eva Lys in Monastir where both players corrected calls in each other's favor
- Currently coached by Josep Maria Arenas Grau

- 2024 season saw Boulter rise to a career high ranking of No.23, achieved on Nov 4, 2024. Successfully defended title at Nottingham (d. Ka. Pliskova in F) and won San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F). Made SF at Tokyo (l. Kenin) and wrapped up the year with a final run at Hong Kong (l. champion Shnaider)

Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)

- Made WTA main draw debut as wildcard at 2013 Indian Wells; in first match posted career first Top-100 win over No.57 Hradecka
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2013 Washington DC (w/Bouchard)
- Won the junior singles and doubles titles at 2012 Australian Open; became first American to hold year-end No.1 junior world ranking since Gretchen Rush in 1982
- Turned professional at end of 2012 season

- Fell in 1r on Tour-level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles titles and four doubles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Great Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of 11, and reaching final at Junior Orange Bowl in Florida at age 14
