[32] Zheng Qinwen (CHN #36) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #68)

Zheng leads 2-0

Zheng:

- Making 5th appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2023 (l. Alexandrova)
- Contesting her 31st career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 result is R-Up at 2024 Wuhan (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Competing in her 4th event of the year after Doha (l. Rybakina in R16), Indian Wells (after 1r bye, l. Ruzic in 2r) and Miami (l. Sabalenka in R16) – she has only played WTA 1000 events so far this year
- Holds 4-0 record vs. American players in 2026 - all 4 of her wins this year have been over Americans, defeating Parks and Kenin in Doha, and Stephens and Keys in Miami
- Three-time clay court champion at WTA Tour-level: 2024 Paris Olympics (d. Vekic in F), and Palermo in 2023 (d. Paolini in F) and 2024 (d. Muchova in F)

Kenin:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Madrid, where her previous and tournament-best result was reaching 3r in 2025 (l. Potapova)
- Best results at WTA 1000 events are SF runs at Toronto 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu), Cincinnati 2019 (l. eventual champion Keys) and Guadalajara 2023 (l. eventual R-Up Dolehide)
- Owns 76 Tour-level wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.10 Ekaterina Alexandrova at Tokyo 2025
- Best career results on clay are R-Up finishes at Charleston 2025 (l. Pegula) and Roland Garros 2020 (l. Swiatek)
- Her top result so far this year is R16 run at Charleston (l. fellow American Jovic)

Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #71) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

Rybakina leads 2-0

Ruse:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Madrid, where her previous main draw result was contesting 1r in 2023 as a qualifier (l. Cornet)
- Owns 2 wins in career over Top 10 players, defeating No.5 Badosa at 2022 Dubai and No.8 Krejčíková at 2024 US Open (0-5 vs. Top 10 players since 2024 US Open)
- Her one career WTA singles title came on clay at 2021 Hamburg (d. Petkovic in F)
- Her best result of 2026 so far also came on clay, reaching SF at Linz (l. eventual champion Mirra Andreeva)
- Best results by a Romanian player at Madrid were the title runs by Simona Halep in 2016 (d. Cibulková in F) and 2017 (d. Mladenovic in F)

Rybakina:

- Making 6th appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching SF in 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka)
- Contesting her 46th career WTA 1000 main draw; she is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion at 2023 Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in F) and 2023 Rome (d. Kalinina in F via ret.)
- 5 of her 13 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2026 Stuttgart (claiming that title last week, d. Muchova in F); Strasbourg in 2025; Stuttgart in 2024; Rome in 2023; Bucharest in 2019
- Has won 25 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.1 on Tour for match-wins so far this year
- With a victory today, Rybakina would become the 10th active player to claim 100+ main draw match-wins at WTA 1000 events

[5] Jessica Pegula (USA #5) vs. Katie Boulter (GBR #61)

Tied 1-1

Pegula:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at this event, where she was runner-up in 2022 - that was her first career WTA 1000 final (l. Jabeur in F)
- Pegula has gone on to win four WTA 1000 titles (all on hard court), most recently this year at Dubai (d. Svitolina in F)
- Has won her last 16 WTA Tour-level matches vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50 (her most recent loss to a player ranked outside the Top 50 was to No.386 Sevastova at 2025 Montreal)
- Holds a 5-0 record on clay so far this year - she successfully defended her Charleston title earlier this month (d. Starodubtseva in F)
- Has won 24 matches so far in 2026; she is No.2 on Tour for match-wins this year, behind only Elena Rybakina (25)

Boulter:

- Making 3rd appearance at this event and is contesting the 2r for the 3rd straight year - she is now seeking her first 3r appearance at Madrid
- Career-best WTA 1000 results are R16 at 2024 Miami (l. Azarenka) and 2024 Toronto (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Paula Badosa in the 2025 Wimbledon 1r
- This is her 3rd clay-court event of the season after Linz (l. Ruse in 1r) and Rouen (l. eventual R-Up Podrez in QF) - her 2026 Rouen QF run is her career-best clay-court result at WTA Tour-level
- Her top result of 2026 is winning her 4th career WTA singles title at Ostrava (d. Korpatsch in F)

[Q] Leolia Jeanjean (FRA #126) vs. [3] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Gauff leads 1-0

Jeanjean:

- Making her main-draw debut at this tournament after successfully qualifying (she previously fell in qualifying here in 2023, l. Ruse)
- In this week's main draw, she defeated Oksana Selekhmeteva in 1r for her first Tour-level win of the year
- Contesting the 3rd WTA 1000 main draw of her career; her 2025 Cincinnati 1r win over Starodubtseva was her only previous WTA 1000 main draw match-win
- Holds a 1-3 career record vs. Top 10 players, with her one Top 10 win coming over No.8 Ka. Pliskova at 2022 Roland Garros
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is QF at 2025 Bogota (l. Pareja), which was also her first career WTA Tour QF

Gauff:

- Making 6th appearance at this event; she finished as runner-up here last year (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Has won 3 WTA 1000 titles in her career, at 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- Contesting her 2nd clay-court event of the season; she made Stuttgart QF last week (l. eventual R-Up Muchova)
- Has won her last 21 matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 - her most recent loss to a player ranked outside the Top 100 was to No.128 Kenin in the 2023 Wimbledon 1r
- 2 of her 11 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, at 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in F) and 2021 Parma (d. Wang Qiang in F)

Caty McNally (USA #76) vs. [10] Victoria Mboko (CAN #10)

Tied 1-1

McNally:

- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she also reached 2r in 2023 (d. Galfi, l. Zheng Qinwen)
- Defeated fellow American Katie Volynets in 1r for her 2nd clay-court match-win of the year – both of her clay wins in 2026 have been over Volynets (also in Rouen 1r)
- Seeking her first career Top 10 win (currently 0-8 vs. Top 10 opponents)
- Best tournament finish so far this year is QF at Ostrava (l. eventual R-Up Korpatsch)
- Most recent American to win this title is Serena Williams, who claimed back-to-back titles in 2012 (d. Azarenka in F) and 2013 (d. Sharapova in F)

Mboko:

- This is her Madrid tournament debut, as well as her first clay-court match of the 2026 season
- Contesting her 9th career WTA 1000 main draw; she has already won one WTA 1000 title at 2025 Montreal (d. Osaka in F), and finished R-Up at WTA 1000 Doha earlier this year (l. Muchova in F)
- Has won her last 13 matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 50 (her most recent loss to a player ranked outside the Top 50 was to No.59 Potapova at 2025 Beijing)
- Contesting just her 3rd career WTA Tour main draw on clay; her previous Tour-level main draws on clay were at 2025 Rome (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 2r) and 2025 Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Zheng Qinwen in 3r)
- Currently ranked No.10; this time last year was ranked No.156. Made her Top 10 debut on February 16 of this year, and reached career-high ranking of No.9 on March 16

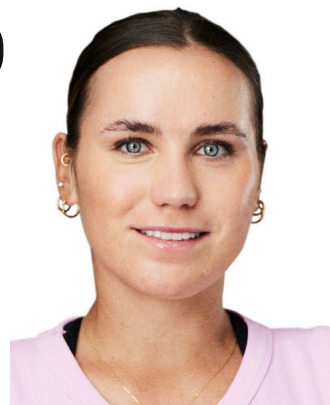

CAREER MILESTONES

- Best results in an injury-affected 2025 season include semifinals at Rome and London and a run to the Roland Garros QF; underwent elbow surgery in July and played only one event after Wimbledon (ret. in Beijing 3r)
- Enjoyed best season of career in 2024, reaching her first Grand Slam final at the Australian Open, winning titles at Tokyo and Palermo, contesting the title match at her home tournament in Wuhan and closing out the season at her first WTA Finals, losing to Gauff in the final
- An outstanding 2024 also saw her make her Top 10 and Top 5 debuts in the PIF WTA Rankings and the gold medal placed around her neck at the 2024 Paris Olympics
- Won first two WTA titles in 2023 at Palermo (d. Paolini in F) and Zhengzhou (d. Krejčíková in F); also reached final at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (l. Haddad Maia), SF at Abu Dhabi and first career Grand Slam QF at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Earned 2023 WTA Most Improved Player of Year, ending the season at No.15 and inside the Top 20 for the first time; she made her Top 20 debut on May 22, 2023
- In 2022, won WTA Newcomer of the Year, reached first WTA final at Tokyo (l. Samsonova) and also made SF at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (as qualifier), QF at Toronto and R16 at Roland Garros. Broke into Top 100 on January 31, and cracked Top 50 after her Roland Garros run
- Scored first Top 20 win over No.19 Simona Halep at 2022 Roland Garros, then earned two Top 10 wins over No.5 Ons Jabeur at Toronto and No.4 Paula Badosa at Tokyo. Also won title at WTA 125 event in Valencia in June 2022
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made WTA qualifying debut in 2019, appearing in qualifying at Miami, Tianjin and Wuhan
- Made ITF debut in 2018; has gone on to amass eight ITF singles titles with 8-0 record in finals
- Best result of 2025 was reaching the final at Charleston (l. Pegula). Also made SF at Tokyo (l. eventual champion Bencic) and QFs at Dubai and Hobart. In doubles reached a fifth Tour final at Washington DC (w/Dolehide)
- Achieved best result of 2024 at Tokyo with runner-up run (l. Zheng in final). In doubles claimed her third and fourth career titles at Abu Dhabi and Miami w/Bethanie Mattek-Sands
- Strongest result of 2023 was runner-up run at San Diego (l. Krejčíková). Also reached SF at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto) and Guadalajara (l. Dolehide). As a qualifier, posted her best Wimbledon result with 3r (l. Svitolina). Moved 202 positions up the ranking from her 2022 year-end position (from No. 235 to No.33)
- Best results of 2022 were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
- Reached R16 at US Open and was one of only two players (also Kvitová) to reach second week of all three Slams in 2020
- Lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F) becoming the first player in 2020 to win a second title
- Won maiden major at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008. Defeated home favorite and World No.1 Barty in SF for third career win over a reigning World No.1
- Australian Open run helped her break into the Top 10 for the first time at No.7 on February 3, 2020
- Won 2019 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year award after winning three WTA titles at Hobart (d. Schmiedlova in F), Mallorca (d. Bencic in F) and Guangzhou (d. Stosur in F)
- Finished 2019 at No.14 as US No.2 (behind No.9 S. Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38-tied w/Barty)

- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Toronto (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys), subsequently leading to Top 20 debut at No.20 on August 19, 2019
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati) to become first player since October 2001 to defeat World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (after McHale)
- Advanced to R16 at 2019 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams, l. eventual champion Barty) - became first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF
- Also won maiden doubles titles in 2019 at Auckland (w/Bouchard) and Beijing (w/Mattek-Sands)
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Made Billie Jean King Cup debut for the US in 2018
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Marino in 1r)
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China

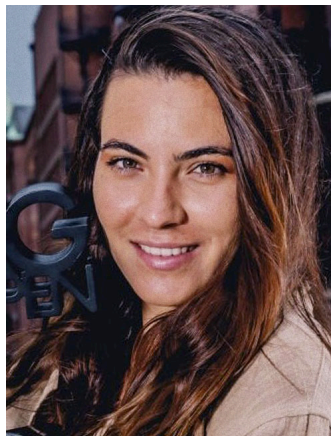

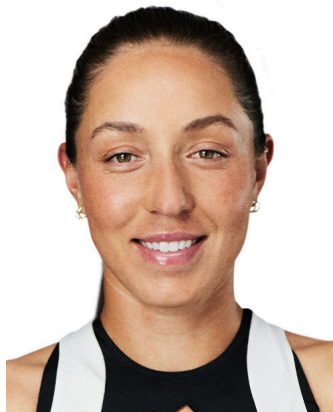

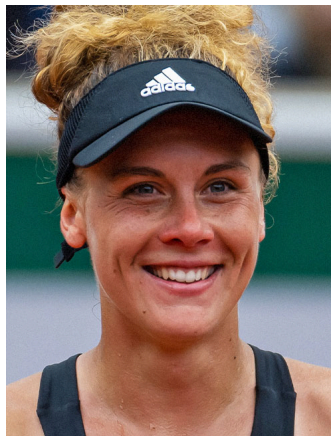
