MIRRA ANDREEVA (#33) / DIANA SHNAIDER (#28)

vs.

[2] KATERINA SINIAKOVA (CZE #2) / TAYLOR TOWNSEND (USA #5)

Siniakova/Townsend lead 2-0

These two pairings have met twice before, with Siniakova/Townsend winning on both occasions:

- 6-7(4), 6-4, 6-3 in the 2025 Australian Open semifinals (Siniakova/Townsend went on to win that title)
- 6-2, 6-4 in group-stage play at the 2025 WTA Finals

Siniakova will return to WTA Doubles World No.1 in Monday's updated PIF WTA Rankings. It will be her 181st overall week at World No.1 – the third-most in WTA history, trailing only Martina Navratilova (237 weeks) and Liezel Huber (199 weeks).

Andreeva/Shnaider Quick Hits

Team W-L in doubles: 35-16

- Andreeva and Shnaider are into their second WTA 1000 final; in their previous WTA 1000 final, they won the 2025 Miami title (d. Bucsa/Kato in F)
- They are 2-1 as a team in WTA Tour doubles finals; along with 2025 Miami, they also teamed up to win 2025 Brisbane (d. Hon/Kalinskaya in F)
- Their only team loss in a Tour-level doubles final was to Errani/Paolini in the 2024 Paris Olympics gold-medal final – they finished that event as Olympic silver medalists in women's doubles
- Andreeva and Shnaider paired up for the first time on Tour at 2024 Beijing (reached QF, l. Kenin/Mattek-Sands)
- They reached two Grand Slam doubles SFs in 2025 at Australian Open (l. eventual champions and today's opponents Siniakova/Townsend) and Roland Garros (l. eventual champions Errani/Paolini)
- This is their first doubles event as a duo since they went winless in group-stage play at the 2025 WTA Finals

Andreeva:

- Currently ranked No.33 in doubles; reached career-high doubles ranking of No.12 in September 2025
- This is her 4th career Tour-level doubles final (2-1 record in doubles finals) – all of them have come alongside Shnaider
- Contesting her 4th doubles event of 2026; she also played at Brisbane (QF w/Alexandrova; l. Danilina/Krunic), Indian Wells (QF w/Mboko; l. eventual R-Up Danilina/Krunic) and Miami (R16 w/Mboko; l. Hunter/Pegula)
- Finished as this week's singles runner-up in Madrid (l. Kostyuk in yesterday's singles final)
- Currently ranked No.8 in singles and is projected to move up to No.7 in the singles rankings on Monday (career-high singles ranking of No.5); she has won 5 WTA singles titles including two this year (Adelaide and Linz)

Shnaider:

- Currently ranked No.28 in doubles; reached career-high doubles ranking of No.8 in June 2025
- This is her 5th career Tour-level doubles final (2-2 record in doubles finals); along with her 2 titles and 1 R-Up paired with Andreeva, she was also 2025 London/Queen's Club R-Up w/Danilina (l. Muhammad/Schuurs in F)
- Contesting her 6th doubles event of 2026; prior to this fortnight, her best doubles results this year were R16 at Doha and Dubai (both w/Panova)
- Currently ranked No.19 in singles; she has won 5 career WTA singles titles and reached a career-high singles ranking of No.11 in May 2025

Siniakova/Townsend Quick Hits

Team W-L in doubles: 62-13

- Siniakova and Townsend have reached their fourth WTA 1000 final as a team, and third in a row
- They are 3-0 as a team in WTA 1000 finals, winning their first WTA 1000 title at 2025 Dubai (d. Hsieh/Ostapenko in F)
- They added their next two WTA 1000 titles by completing last month's Sunshine Double, winning 2026 Indian Wells (d. Danilina/Krunic in F) and 2026 Miami (d. Errani/Paolini in F)
- They became the first women's doubles team to successfully complete the Sunshine Double since Elise Mertens and Aryna Sabalenka in 2019
- They are contesting their fourth event as a team this year; along with their Indian Wells and Miami titles, they reached QF at 2026 Australian Open as defending champions (l. eventual runners-up Danilina/Krunic)
- 16-1 win-loss record as a team in 2026
- Seeking their sixth title as a team; along with 2025 Dubai, 2026 Indian Wells and 2026 Miami, they have also won two Grand Slam titles together at 2024 Wimbledon (d. Dabrowski/Routliffe in final) and 2025 Australian Open (d. Hsieh/Ostapenko in final)
- They also reached another Grand Slam final as a pairing at 2025 US Open (l. Dabrowski/Routliffe in final)
- Siniakova and Townsend teamed up for the first time at 2024 Rome (l. Gauff/Routliffe in quarterfinals) – in just their third event together, they won the 2024 Wimbledon title
- Qualified together for the WTA Finals in 2024 (l. Dabrowski/Routliffe in final) and 2025 (l. eventual champions V. Kudermetova/Mertens in semifinals)
- Projected to move from No.3 to No.2 in the Doubles Race to the 2026 WTA Finals

Siniakova:

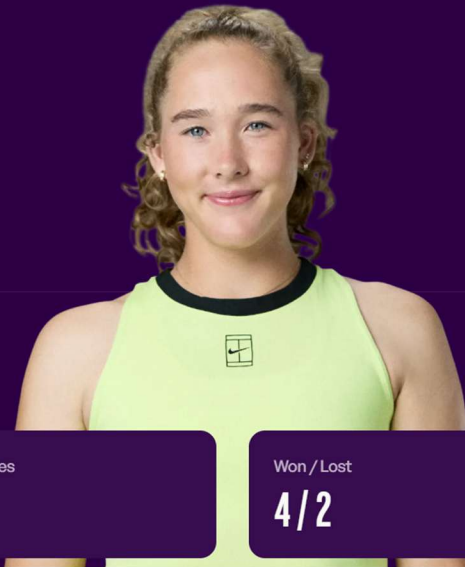
- Currently ranked World No.2 in doubles
- She will reclaim the WTA Doubles World No.1 ranking on Monday
- Reached World No.1 in doubles for the first time on October 22, 2018; Monday will mark her 181st week holding the top doubles ranking (third-most, trailing only Martina Navratilova with 237 weeks and Liezel Huber with 199)
- This is her 13th career WTA 1000 final and she is seeking her 9th career WTA 1000 title; she has won three WTA 1000 titles with Krejčíková, two with Hunter and three with Townsend
- Is a 10-time Grand Slam champion in women's doubles (7 titles with Krejčíková, 2 with Townsend and 1 with Gauff) and she won the 2021 Olympic gold medal in women's doubles (w/Krejčíková)
- She and Krejčíková completed the Career Golden Slam at the 2022 US Open
- In mixed doubles, she won the 2024 Olympic gold medal (w/Machac) and the 2025 Wimbledon title (w/Verbeek)
- Has won 35 Tour-level women's doubles titles in her career overall, including 3 this year (Indian Wells and Miami w/Townsend; Adelaide with Zhang Shuai)
- She has also won 5 WTA singles titles in her career and holds a career-high singles ranking of No.27 (June 2024)

Townsend:

- Currently ranked World No.5 in doubles
- Reached World No.1 in doubles for the first time on July 28, 2025; she held the top ranking for a total of eight weeks last summer
- This is her 7th career WTA 1000 final; she has won four career WTA 1000 titles at 2023 Cincinnati (w/Parks), 2025 Dubai (w/Siniakova), 2026 Indian Wells (w/Siniakova) and 2026 Miami (w/Siniakova)
- Her 2 Grand Slam titles have come in women's doubles alongside Siniakova (2024 Wimbledon and 2025 Australian Open), and she has reached 3 additional women's doubles Grand Slam finals
- 2-time mixed doubles Grand Slam runner-up at 2024 US Open (w/Young) and 2025 Roland Garros (w/King)
- Has won 14 WTA Tour doubles titles in her career overall, including 3 this year (Indian Wells and Miami w/Siniakova; Austin w/Hunter)
- Townsend reached her first WTA Tour singles final at Austin last month (l. Stearns in final); she also won the doubles title that week (w/Hunter)

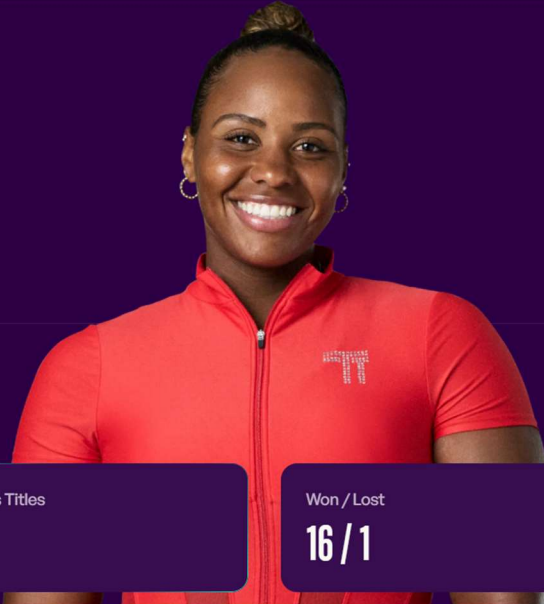
