[30] Hailey Baptiste (USA #32) vs. [9] Mirra Andreeva (#8)

Andreeva leads 1-0

Baptiste:

In the quarterfinals, Baptiste has become the fourth player since the WTA Rankings were published in 1975 to defeat the World No. 1 on clay in a third set tie break after Chris Evert (vs Martina Navratilova in Houston 1987), Arantxa Sanchez Vicario (vs Steffi Graf in Hamburg 1994) and Jelena Jankovic (vs Serena Williams in Rome 2010).

Baptiste has defeated two Top 10 this week (Paolini, R32 and Sabalenka, QF), as many as in her entire career prior to this tournament. She could become the fifth player to defeat three top-10 in Madrid after Petra Kvitova (2011), Serena Williams (2012), Maria Sharapova (2014) and Kiki Bertens (2019).

Baptiste has equaled her best career result in a WTA level event by reaching the semifinals (also SF in Abu Dhabi 2026)

Baptiste could become the first player to reach her maiden career WTA level final at the Madrid Open

Baptiste has claimed nine WTA 1000 main draw wins in 2026, already her highest career tally in a single entire calendar year (previously eight in 2025)

Baptiste (14) and Andreeva (13, level w/Gauff) are the players with the most three-setters played in 2026 at WTA level

Projected to make Top 30 debut after tournament moving to No.25 with SF, No.18 or No.19 as R-Up or to No.15 with title

Andreeva:

Andreeva has won the only previous career meeting against Baptiste (Wimbledon 2025, R32)

Andreeva (celebrated 19th birthday on April 29) is the second-youngest semi-finalist in Madrid since the tournament's inception in 2009, older only than Caroline Wozniacki in 2009 (finalist, lost to Safina).

Andreeva is the youngest to reach her third WTA-1000 SF since the format's introduction in 2009 (Dubai, Indian Wells 2025, Madrid 2026) - she always won the title when made this stage in such events.

Andreeva could become the first teenager to reach three WTA 1000 finals since the format's introduction in 2009

Andreeva is the youngest player to reach the SFs in three consecutive WTA level clay court event's she appeared in (Linz, Stuttgart, Madrid) since Alize Cornet in 2008 (Acapulco, Amelia Island, Charleston).

Andreeva has the most clay court wins in 2026 (11). Since her debut on the surface at WTA level in 2023, only Iga Swiatek and Sabalenka have more

Kostyuk:

Kostyuk and Potapova have split their four head-to-head meetings at WTA level, with Kostyuk winning their only previous meeting on clay in Madrid (R16) last season.

Two players will meet to reach a maiden WTA 1000 final for the first time since Wuhan in 2024 (Qinwen Zheng-Xinyu Wang), and for the first time at the Madrid Open since 2022 (Ons Jabeur-Ekaterina Alexandrova).

Including the Men's Singles draw, Marta Kostyuk is currently the only player to reach the semi-final at the Madrid Open this year without conceding a set or claiming a comeback win en route.

Kostyuk (2) is one of two players to reach multiple WTA level semifinals on clay in 2026, along with Mirra Andreeva (3)

Including the BJK Cup, Marta Kostyuk can claim an 11th consecutive match win at WTA level, extending what is currently the longest winning streak of her career

Only Mirra Andreeva (11) has claimed more WTA main draw wins on clay than Kostyuk (9) and Potapova (8) in 2026

Projected to move to No.20 or No.21 with SF, could move as high as No.17 to R-Up and could move to No.15 with title

Potapova:

As WTA World No. 56, is the fourth-lowest ranked semifinalist at the Madrid Open since the tournament's inception in 2009, behind only than Louisa Chirico (#130 in 2016), Lucie Hradecka (#105 in 2012) and Paula Badosa (#62 in 2021). The lowest ranked finalist at the event currently is No.38 Dominika Cibulkova in 2016

Potapova is the first lucky loser to reach a WTA 1000 semifinal and first to do so at a Tier I/WTA 1000 level since the Tier format was introduced in 1990.

Potapova is the first WTA level semifinalist as a lucky loser since Aliaksandra Sasnovich in Cluj-Napoca 2025 (defeated by Potapova in SF) and could be the first such finalist since Sara Sorribes Tormo in Cleveland 2023 - the first on clay since Maria Timofeeva in Budapest 2023.

Potapova is the first player competing for Austria to reach a Tier I / WTA-1000 semi-final since Sybille Bammer in Indian Wells 2007 and the second overall on clay court after Barbara Paulus (Hilton Head 1996 and Rome 1997)

In the last five years (since 2022), only Iga Swiatek (13) and Aryna Sabalenka (10) have made more WTA level clay court semi-finals than Potapova (6, equaling Jasmine Paolini and Coco Gauff)

Projected to move to No.38 with SF, could move to Top 30 as R-Up and Top 20 with title

- Contesting her 22nd career WTA 1000 main draw, and has reached a WTA 1000 SF for the first time
- Previously, her career-best WTA 1000 finish was reaching QF at 2026 Miami (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Has claimed 9 WTA 1000 main draw wins in 2026, already surpassing her highest career tally in a single entire calendar year (8 in 2025)
- After 1r bye, defeated Kaitlin Quevedo, No.8 seed Jasmine Paolini, No.11 seed Belinda Bencic and No.1 seed Aryna Sabalenka this week, reaching her 2nd SF of the year (2026 Abu Dhabi was her first WTA SF of career)
- Seeking a spot in a WTA Tour singles final for the first time in her career
- Faces No.8 Mirra Andreeva in SF today; Baptiste owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, including two this fortnight over Paolini and Sabalenka (win over World No.1 Sabalenka was also her first Top 5 win)
- Attempting to become the 5th player to defeat three Top 10 players at a single edition of WTA 1000 Madrid, joining Petra Kvitova (2011), Serena Williams (2012), Maria Sharapova (2014) and Kiki Bertens (2019) - all of those other players won the title in those respective years
- This has become her best career Tour-level result on clay after reaching R16 4 times before: Rouen in 2026; Roland Garros and Rabat in 2025; Bogota in 2024
- Most recent American to win this title is Serena Williams, who went back-to-back in 2012 (d. Azarenka in F) and 2013 (d. Sharapova in F)
- This week, reached a new career-high ranking of No.32; this time last year was ranked No.88
- Has hit the most aces this fortnight in Madrid with 38

- Has become the second youngest semifinalist at Madrid since the tournament's inception in 2009, older only than eventual R-Up Caroline Wozniacki in 2009
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles which she won back-to-back in 2025 at Dubai (d. Tauson in F) and Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Attempting to become the first teenager to reach three WTA 1000 finals since the format's introduction in 2009
- After 1r bye, defeated Panna Udvardy, Dalma Galfi, Anna Bondar and No.24 seed Leylah Fernandez this fortnight, making her 4th SF of the year
- Faces No.32 Hailey Baptiste in SF today; Andreeva is 22-2 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 20
- Owns 16-13 career Tour-level record against players from United States of America (3-1 in 2026)
- Seeking her 7th career WTA singles final, and 3rd of this year - won 2026 titles at Adelaide (d. Mboko in F) and Linz (d. Potapova in F)
- Has an 11-1 match record on clay this season, claiming the Linz title and reaching SF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Rybakina) - she has the most clay-court Tour-level wins in 2026
- Two of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2024 Iasi (d. Avanesyan in F via ret.) and 2026 Linz
- Is currently ranked No.8; this time last year was ranked No.7. Reached career-high ranking of No.5 in July 2025

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, reached first WTA Tour QF of career at Auckland (l. Osaka) and first Grand Slam R16 of career at Roland Garros (l. Keys); made Top 50 debut, peaking at a career-high ranking of No.47 on August 25
- During 2024, made Tour-level R16 at Bogota, Seoul and Wuhan as well as reaching 2r at Roland Garros. Also made semifinal at WTA 125 Puerto Vallarta and broke into the Top 100 for the first time, achieving a career high ranking of No.80 in October
- Won back-to-back Tour main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia)
- During 2022 season, reached 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara 250 (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet)
- In 2021, made 2r at Roland Garros as qualifier (l. Kenin), and also reached 2r at Chicago 500 (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur); won first WTA Tour doubles title at Charleston 250 w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- In 2020, made Grand Slam main draw debut as wild card at US Open (l. Mladenovic in 1r); also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as wild card, d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic); also contested qualifying at US Open, and on ITF Circuit won \$25K titles at Tucson, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017
- In 2025 won two WTA 1000 titles back-to-back at Dubai and Indian Wells - becoming the youngest WTA 1000 champion since the tournament tier began in 2009 at 17-years-old. Made her Top 10 debut in February before breaking into the Top 5 for the first time in July
- Won maiden WTA doubles title in 2025 with Diana Shnaider at Brisbane, followed by a second title at Miami and finished the 2025 season making her WTA Finals debut in doubles with Shnaider
- Reached first two WTA finals of career in 2024 winning the title at Iasi and finishing runner-up at Ningbo
- Made first Grand Slam semifinal at 2024 Roland Garros beating World No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals
- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16; also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneevea)

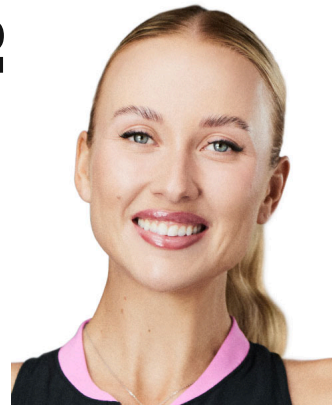
