CAREER MILESTONES

- 2025 highlights include Nottingham SF (l. eventual champion Kessler) and QFs at Merida, Monterrey and Osaka; notched first Grand Slam main draw win of career at Australian Open (d. Volynets, l. No.2 seed Swiatek in 2r); reached career-high ranking of No.33 on July 14
- Reached first three WTA finals of career in 2024, at Monastir (R-Up, l. Kartal), Hua Hin #2 (d. Siegemund for maiden title) and Jiujiang (R-Up, l. Golubic); ended year in Top 50 for first time
- Standout performance of 2023 was reaching QF at Warsaw (l. Maria). Also achieved R-Up at WTA 125 Bari on clay (l. Zidansek)
- In 2022, made Roland Garros main draw as lucky loser (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Continued on ITF Circuit from 2019 through 2021, also making 2r at Tour level at 2020 Prague (l. Jones) and again at 2021 Prague (as qualifier, l. Kuzmova)
- In 2017, made Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Duan) and won first WTA main draw match at Gstaad (d. Stojanovic)
- During 2016, broke into Top 200 for first time following title run at ITF Rome \$25K; also played Grand Slam qualifying for first time at US Open (l. Karatantcheva in Q1)
- Played first WTA qualifying match at 2015 Nottingham (l. Zhu)
- Won first ITF title in 2013 on clay at Vrnjacka Banja \$10K
- Began on professional circuit in 2012 at Velenje \$10K at the age of 15

- In 2025 made QF at WTA 125 Canberra and played qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon
- Breakthrough performances in 2024 included reaching her first WTA 125 final at Puerto Vallarta (l. Kessler), winning her first Tour level main draw match at San Diego over No.42 Magdalena Frech (her first Top 50 career win) and making her Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open and US Open. Her career-high ranking of No.134 was achieved in March 2024
- Won a further three ITF titles in 2023 at Perth \$25K, Cairns \$25K and Brisbane \$60K, to close out the year with a total of four
- Reached first ITF final at Nottingham \$25K in 2023 and claimed her first ITF title in the same month at Monastir \$25K
- Made first main draw in 2022 at Sint Maarten Hertogenbosch (as qualifier, l. Hartono)
- Entered Australian Open qualifying as a wild card in 2022, reaching 2r of qualifying
- In only her third professional tournament, played qualifying at WTA 250 Melbourne as a wild card in 2022, winning her first qualifying match over Sara Errani
- Made ITF debut at Perth \$25K in 2020 at the age of 14

CAREER MILESTONES

- Had breakthrough week at WTA 500 Guadalajara in 2025, making her first Tour-level QF (saved MP vs. Jimenez Kasintseva) and going on to win her first Tour title at age 17 (d. Arango in final); rose from No.73 to No.36 following her triumph in Mexico
- Also in 2025, won WTA 125 title at Ilkley (d. Marino in final) and played all four Grand Slam main draws; made Top 100 and Top 50 debuts and peaked at No.33 on October 20
- In 2024, made US Open 2r in her first Grand Slam and Tour-level appearance (as wild card); reached final at ITF W100 Tyler and ended the year with a career-high ranking of No.194
- Claimed her first ITF title in 2023 at 25K Reading
- Played her first ITF tournament in 2022 reaching the final at 15K Los Angeles; also reached 3r at 2022 Junior US Open

- In 2025 made semifinal at Sao Paulo (the second SF of her career after 2020 Acapulco), earned her first Top 10 win over No.6 Madison Keys at US Open and earned a WTA 125 title at Austin
- A strong 2024 season saw her play main draw at all four Grand Slams for the first time, contest QF at Merida and reach a career high ranking of No.51 in November after claiming her maiden WTA 125 title at Charleston
- Played mainly ITF in 2023, lifting titles at Boca Raton \$25K and \$60K Lexington. Ended the season with strong WTA 125 results at Florianopolis with SF, Buenos Aires with SF and lifting the title at Montevideo, climbing back up the ranking to No.105

Ranking dipped in 2022, winning only one Tour level match in first round of qualifying at Guadalajara (WTA 500) and ended the season at No.350

- In 2021 achieved R-Up at WTA 125 Concord and 2r at Guadalajara (l. Schmiedlova) and Miami (l. Kerber)
- Breakthrough performances in 2020 reaching SF at Acapulco (l. Fernandez) and 2r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Svitolina) and breaking into Top 150
- Won first WTA main draw match in 2018 over Kristyna Pliskova. Also made Grand Slam qualifying debut at Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open
- Played first WTA main draw match at Florianopolis 2016 (as qualifier, l. Pella in 1r)
- Entered first WTA tournaments in 2016 with qualifying at Acapulco and Monterrey. Earned first ITF titles that season at Leon \$10K and La Bisbal \$10K
- Represented Mexico in 2016, 2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023 Fed Cup/BJKC

Made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2013 at Austin \$10K
