- She is 5-1 so far this season on grass, made 2r at London last week where she fell to eventual champion Vekic
- Has beaten Tereza Valentova, Hannah Klugman, Tatjana Maria and Karolina Pliskova so far this week to reach her 10th career Tour-level final (first Tour-level final on grass)
- Record in Tour-level finals stands at 3-6
- Seeking her 4th career Tour-level title after 2026 Bogota, 2025 Prague and 2022 Prague
- Faces No.25 Emma Navarro in the final; owns 3-8 record this season vs. Top 50 opponents, most recent was a loss to eventual champion No.8 M. Andrejeva at Roland Garros. Her last win over a Top 50 player came against No.36 Siniakova at Strasbourg
- She is 0-3 in 2026 vs. USA players, losing to Li at Strasbourg, and Townsend at Rome and Indian Wells
- Prior to 2026 Nottingham, her best career results on grass were QF runs at Wimbledon in 2022 and Birmingham in 2021
- Her QF run at 2022 Wimbledon is her career-best run at a Grand Slam to date
- Looking to become the second player from Czech Republic to win the title here at Nottingham after Karolina Pliskova in 2016
- Is currently ranked No.27; this time last year was ranked No.45. Reached a career-high ranking of No.24 in December 2022
- Went 1-2 on the grass in 2025, falling in the 1r at Eastbourne (l. Blinkova) and the 2r at Wimbledon (d. Sun in the 1r, l. Sabalenka in 2r)

- Faces No.27 Marie Bouzkova in the final; owns 5-6 record this season vs. Top 50 opponents, most recent was a loss to No.17 Jovic at Roland Garros. Most recent win was over No.40 Tjen at Roland Garros
- Owns 8-5 career record against players from Czech Republic, 1-0 in 2026 with a win over Bejlek during title run at Strasbourg
- Prior to 2026 Nottingham, her best career results on grass were SF runs at Bad Homburg in 2024 and 2023
- Looking to become the second player from United States of America to win the title here at Nottingham after McCartney Kessler in 2025
- Is currently ranked No.25; this time last year was ranked No.9. Reached a career-high ranking of No.8 in September 2024
- Went 7-4 during last year's grass court swing, reaching 4r at Wimbledon, QF at Bad Homburg, 2r at Berlin and QF at London

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won second WTA Tour singles title of career at Prague (d. fellow Czech Noskova in final); also made SF at Monterrey and QF at Brisbane and Bogota, finishing inside the Top 50 for the fourth straight season. In doubles, won Eastbourne title w/Danilina
- Reached two WTA singles finals in 2024, at Bogota (l. Osorio) and Washington, DC (l. Badosa); finished season with SF run at Jiujiang (l. Golubic). In Grand Slam play, achieved best result at Roland Garros to date, advancing to 3r (l. Swiatek)
- Enjoyed success in second half of 2023 season with 4r at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova), 3r at US Open (l. Jabeur) and R-Up at Nanchang (l. Siniakova). Lifted two more doubles trophies in 2023 at Beijing (w/Sorribes Tormo) and Seoul (w/Mattek Sands)
- In 2022, won first WTA Tour singles title at Prague (d. Potapova in F) and made first Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur); finished R-Up at WTA 250 event in Guadalajara (l. Stephens in F), then had a SF run later in the year at the WTA 1000 event in the same city (l. Sakkari)
- Finished 2022 season ranked No.25 in singles, having started it only just inside Top 100. Also won her third career doubles title at 2022 Istanbul (w/Sorribes Tormo)
- Advanced to second career WTA singles final at 2021 Phillip Island Trophy in Melbourne, defeating No.8 Andreescu in SF (l. Kasatkina in F); followed up with SF at Guadalajara (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- In doubles in 2021, won first WTA titles of career, both w/Hradecka at Birmingham (d. Jabeur/Perez in F) and Prague (d. Stojanovic/Kuzmova in F); reached an additional final at Charleston (w/Hradecka, l. Melichar/Schuurs) and also made QF at Wimbledon and US Open
- Before tour's hiatus in March 2020, advanced to first career WTA singles final at Monterrey where she finished R-Up to Svitolina; broke into Top 50 at No.47 following the tournament
- Other highlights of 2020 came at Lexington, where she made the fourth Tour-level QF of her career (l. eventual champion Brady) and reached maiden WTA doubles final (w/Teichmann, l. Carter/Stefani)
- Standout performance of 2019 season was a SF run in her first Premier 5 appearance at Toronto (as qualifier, l. S. Williams in 3s); upset No.4 Halep and No.8 Stephens en route, her first career Top 20 wins
- In 2025, won second Tour singles title of her career at Merida (d. Arango in final); made 7 additional Tour QFs, including her 3rd straight Grand Slam QF at Australian Open (l. Swiatek)
- Voted 2024 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year Award, finished the year ranked No.8 with a singles record of 54-24, winning her first career title at 2024 Hobart; climbed to a year-end ranking at No.8 after finishing 2023 at No.38 (and No.143 in 2022)
- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay, Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng), and one semifinal on grass, Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova)
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA Division I women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter Bowl

- Also in 2019, made QF at Guangzhou and was R-Up at WTA 125 Guadalajara. Lifted 12th and biggest title of career on ITF Circuit at \$80K Nur-Sultan-KAZ (d. Kostic in F), broke into the Top 100 for the first time at No.92 following the tournament (on July 22)
- Won first Grand Slam main draw match during 2r showing at 2019 Wimbledon (as LL, d. Barthel, l. Sakkari)
- Highlights of 2018 season were winning maiden Tour-level match during 2r showing at Quebec City (as qualifier, l. Lepchenko) and qualifying for first Grand Slam at US Open, where she fell in 1r (l. Bogdan)
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 Acapulco (as wild card, l. Karatantcheva)
- Professional debut was opening round loss in qualifying at 2013 Katowice
- Girls' singles champion at 2014 US Open (d. Kalinina in F)

  - Has memorably played with the same type of giant water bottle courtside for more than 10 years
  - Speaks Czech, English, Spanish and some German

  - Currently pursuing a degree in business administration through Indiana University East
- Currently coached by Peter Ayers
  - Born in New York City and raised in Charleston, SC
