CAREER MILESTONES

- Posted a breakthrough performance in 2025 by reaching SF at WTA 500 Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Jovic) which saw her break into the Top 200 for the first time. Made a WTA 125 final for the first time at Samsun and rose to a career-high ranking of No.129 in December
- Played all matches on the ITF circuit in 2024; up to end of 2025 won six ITF singles titles
- Earned first career tour-level match-win at 2023 Cluj-Napoca as a wild card (d. Yastremska, l. Bogdan)
- Made WTA main-draw debut as wild card at 2022 Istanbul (l. Potapova)

- Broke through at Tour-level in 2025, reaching first WTA QF and SF at Chennai (l. eventual champion Tjen); also made first WTA 125 final at Porto (l. Valentova in F) and cracked Top 150 by year end
- In 2024, played qualifying at all four Grand Slams and won her first Tour-level main draw match at Hua Hin 2. Broke into the Top 200, with a career-high ranking of No.171 in October

- In 2025, made World Tennis/ITF finals at W75-Trnava (l. Korpatsch in F) and W50-Austin (l. Stoiana in F); also made WTA 125 QFs at Mumbai, Porto and Huzhou
- Highlight of 2024 season was making main draw debut at Australian Open (R64, 2022 Wimbledon) and reaching 2r at Indian Wells, as a qualifier. Also made QF run at Hua Hin #2. Posted new career high ranking of No.105 in August
- 2023 saw her reach her debut WTA SF, making last four at Osaka (l. Krueger). Other key results were QF at Monastir (l. Mertens) and R16 at Tokyo (l. Swiatek)
- In 2022, reached 2r at first career Grand Slam main draw at Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Parry)
- Also played main draw at Melbourne 1, Lyon and Tokyo and contested qualifying at Australian Open, Indian Wells, Miami, Roland Garros and US Open
- On ITF circuit, won title at W60 Sydney, AUS and reached SFs at W25 Cairns, AUS and W25 Santarem, POR
- Highlight in 2021 was run through qualifying to QF on WTA main-draw debut at Chicago [500] (l. eventual champion Muguruza)
- Also in 2021, played main draw of Indian Wells and contested qualifying at US Open
- On ITF Circuit, won two titles at W25 Salinas, ECU and W25 Porto, POR; also reached final at W15 Antalya 11 & 12, TUR
- Played only five tournaments in 2020, with best result a R-Up finish at \$25k ITF/Yokahama-JPN, ended the year at No.330
- In 2018, rose over 500 places in the rankings, finishing at No.402
- Reached maiden ITF Circuit final at \$25k Nanao-JPN in September 2018
- Fell at final hurdle of qualifying on professional debut, at \$10k ITF/Tokyo-JPN in 2015
- Made Tour-level debut at 2025 Jiujiang, where she reached her first career WTA final (youngest WTA Tour finalist of the season; finished R-Up to Blinkova). Reached Top 200 for the first time and peaked at a career high of No.152 in November. Also won her first two ITF titles during the 2025 season
- In 2024, played her first WTA 125 event at Limoges (d. Jimenez Kasintseva in 1r, l. Parrizas Diaz in 2r)
- Began competing on the ITF circuit in 2022 at the age of 14
- Won the 2025 Junior Roland Garros singles title

- Away from tennis enjoys skiing and playing ice hockey whenever she's at home during the winter

CAREER MILESTONES

- At Tour level in 2025 reached R16 at Singapore as a qualifier (l. eventual R-Up Li); also reached final at WTA 125 Changsha (l. Erjavec) and QF at Samsun (l. Juvan)
- In 2024, made R16 in her Australian Open debut (as a qualifier, l. Kostyuk); also reached 2r at Miami (as a qualifier, l. Noskova) and Budapest (l. Sasnovich); broke into Top 100 for the first time with a ranking of No.93 on April 1, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, making her Grand Slam debut reaching third round of qualifying (l. Townsend) before winning Budapest as lucky loser (d. Baindl) for her first singles title. Her ranking jumped from No.246 to No.129 following Budapest title run.
- After winning her first WTA title at Budapest in July, took three months out due to left foot stress injury
- In 2022 played first WTA125 at Karlsruhe on clay and first WTA 250 at Chennai qualifying.
- Claimed first ITF title in 2019 at \$15K Antalya as a junior and a second in 2020 at \$15K Monastir.
