- Making 2nd appearance at this event; she previously fell 1r in 2022 (l. Tomova)
- Defeated Ella Seidel, Ayla Aksu, Lanlana Tararudee and No.5 seed Tereza Valentova this week, reaching her first career WTA final
- Prior to this week, her career-best Tour-level result was SF at 2026 Cluj-Napoca this February (l. eventual champion Cirstea)
- Faces No.74 Lilli Tagger in today's final; Snigur is 10-4 in Tour-level matches this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- First Tour-level meeting vs. a player from Austria
- Has posted a new career-best Tour-level result on hard court; previously it was her 2026 Cluj-Napoca SF run
- 1 of 2 players from Ukraine in this week's main draw (qualifier Podrez lost 1r)
- Has become the first player from Ukraine to reach the SF or better at this event
- Before this week, the previous best results by Ukraine at this event were QF runs by Anhelina Kalinina in 2024 and Kateryna Baindl in 2023
- Contesting her first event since 3r run at 2026 Wimbledon, her career-best Grand Slam finish (d. No.8 Svitolina in 1r; l. Krueger in 3r)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high No.54, achieved for the first time this week; this time last year was ranked No.192
- Made her Top 100 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on March 30 of this year

- Making tournament debut at this event
- Defeated Gao Xinyu, Mai Hontama, No.3 seed Sara Bejlek and No.2 seed Barbora Krejcikova this week, making her 2nd career WTA final
- Seeking her first career WTA title; Tagger's prior WTA final was a R-Up finish at 2025 Jiujiang (l. Blinkova in F)
- Faces No.54 Daria Snigur in today's final; Tagger is 6-3 at Tour-level this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- Owns 0-1 career Tour-level record against players from Ukraine (l. Oliynykova in 2026 Rouen 1r)
- Has equaled her career-best Tour-level result on hard court, which was her 2025 Jiujiang R-Up finish
- Only player from Austria in this week's main draw
- Aiming to become the first Austrian to win this title
- Prior to this week, Tagger's best Tour-level result of the year was QF at Linz (l. eventual R-Up Potapova)
- Bidding to become the second teenager to win a WTA title this year (Mirra Andreeva has won 3 titles as a teenager so far in 2026)
- Is currently ranked a career-high No.74, achieved for the first time this week; this time last year was ranked No.513
- Made her Top 100 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on April 13 of this year

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CAREER MILESTONES

- 2025 highlights include qualifying for Australian Open main draw (l. Collins in 1r) and Cluj-Napoca main draw (l. Dolehide in 1r). Also reached QF at WTA 125 Warsaw and Caldas Da Rainha and won 11th career ITF title at W75 Glasgow
- In 2024 achieved her best Tour results on her favorite surface of grass at Wimbledon and Nottingham with 2r; also made Australian Open main draw for the first time reaching 1r as a qualifier
- On the ITF circuit in 2024 won W50 Lopota title and was runner-up at W75 Ricany and W75 Ismaning
- 2023 season highlighted by QF appearance at Cluj Napoca in October (l. eventual champion Korpatsch). Also qualified at Nottingham and defeated No.2 seed Haddad Maia in opening round.
- Fell on WTA main-draw debut at 1r at Nottingham 2022 (as qualifier, l. Riske-Armitraj)
- Finished 2022 with 32-18 record and won two ITF Circuit titles, including at W100 tournament in Dubai at the end of the year
- In 2021, also contested qualifying at all four Grand Slams
- Made Tour-level qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- Won Wimbledon girls' singles title in 2019 (d. Noel in F); rose to No.2 on the ITF Junior Circuit at the end of that year
- Made Tour-level debut at 2025 Jiujiang, where she reached her first career WTA final (youngest WTA Tour finalist of the season; finished R-Up to Blinkova). Reached Top 200 for the first time and peaked at a career high of No.152 in November. Also won her first two ITF titles during the 2025 season
- In 2024, played her first WTA 125 event at Limoges (d. Jimenez Kasintseva in 1r, l. Parrizas Diaz in 2r)
- Began competing on the ITF circuit in 2022 at the age of 14
- Won the 2025 Junior Roland Garros singles title

OTHER INFORMATION

- Current coach is her father, Sergiy; Previous coach is former World No.13 Larisa Savchenko
- Born in Kyiv but currently living in Warsaw, Poland
- Father, Sergiy, used to play football. Mother Viktoria works in science
- Favorite surface is grass and tournament is Wimbledon
- Enjoyed watching Novak Djokovic matches when she was younger
- In 2025, won French Open girls' singles title, becoming the first Austrian to win a Roland Garros junior singles title defeating Great Britain's Hannah Klugman in the final, 6-2, 6-0
- Coached by former Grand Slam Champion Francesca Schiavone
- Switched to one-handed backhand at age 12
- Away from tennis enjoys skiing and playing ice hockey whenever she's at home during the winter
- Credits the development of her mental aspect of her game as the biggest area of improvement, transitioning from Juniors to Pros
