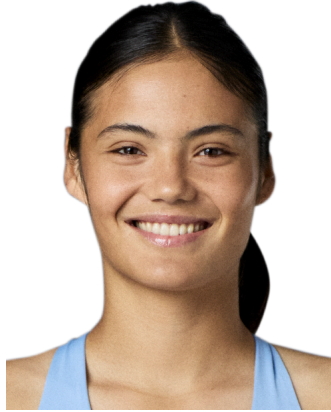

- One of 5 players from United Kingdom to feature in the main draw along with Boulter, F.Jones, Dart and Stojsavljevic
- Best result by United Kingdom at Queen's, London was her own QF run last year
- Is currently ranked No.42; this time last year was ranked No.37. Reached a career high ranking of No.10 in July 2022
- During last year's European grass swing reached 3r at Wimbledon (l.Sabalenka), 2r at Eastbourne (l. Joint), QF at Queen's (l.Q.Zheng)
- Has won 7 matches so far in 2026 (all on hard court) with her best result a run to the final at Cluj-Napoca (. Cirstea in F)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Best result in 2025 was reaching SF Washington DC (l. Kalinskaya). Reached QF at a WTA 1000 event for the first time at Miami; also made QF on home soil at London, Queen's Club. Ended the season ranked inside the Top 30 (No.29) for a second year after 2021. In doubles, reached first Tour-level SF at Washington DC with Elena Rybakina
- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made 4r of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best win-by-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the 2021 US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell in 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top 50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Closed out 2025 by winning second title of career at Jiujiang without losing a set (d. Tagger in final); also reached three additional QFs during the year, and won third career doubles title at Austin (w/Yuan)
- Began 2024 with her strongest Australian Open result, making 3r in 7th appearance at the event; also reached quarterfinals at San Diego and Bad Homburg, as well as claiming her second career WTA Tour doubles title at Monastir (w/Sherif)
- In 2023, advanced to final in Strasbourg in May (l. Svitolina). Reached back-to-back third rounds at Roland Garros (l. Svitolina) and Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka). Posted a career-high ranking of No.34 in August
- Returned to Top 100 on October 17, 2022 after lifting first WTA Tour singles title at Cluj-Napoca (as qualifier, d. Paolini in F); earlier in the season finished R-Up at WTA 125 event in Saint Malo and also at ITF Circuit events at W60 Andrezieux-Bouthéon, W60 Grenoble and W25 Le Havre
- In opening match of 2020 season, scored first Top 10 win of her career, over No.8 Bencic at Shenzhen. Also in 2020, reached first Grand Slam doubles SF at US Open (w/V. Kudermetova)
- Enjoyed breakthroughs in 2019, reaching first career WTA Tour QF at the Bronx (as LL, l. Q.Wang), then followed up with first WTA Tour SFs of career at Guangzhou (l. eventual champion Kenin) and Luxembourg (l. eventual champion Ostapenko); also made 3r at Roland Garros (d. Garcia in 2r, l. Keys)
- At WTA 125 event at 2019 New Haven, swept titles in both singles (d. Arconada in F) and doubles (w/Kalashnikova)
- Upset No.13 Mladenovic during run from qualifying to 3r at 2018 Doha to register first Top 20 win of her career; went on to make Top 100 debut on August 20, 2018, and also won first WTA Tour doubles title at 2018 Rabat (w/Olaru)
- Advanced to 2r on first appearance at a Grand Slam (main draw or qualifying), at 2017 Australian Open (as qualifier, d. Niculescu, l. No.5 seed Ka.Pliskova)
- Won 41 matches, first two ITF Circuit titles and rose over 600 places in the rankings during the 2016 campaign
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2016 Rabat (as wildcard, l. Bacsinszky). Posted first main draw win during 2r showing at 2016 Moscow (as qualifier, d. Sevastova - saved 5mp)

- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarterfinals at Wimbledon and US Open in 2018

- WTA qualifying debut came at Moscow in 2015; made professional debut at \$10K ITF/El Kantaoui-TUN in 2015
- Reached as high as No.3 in junior singles rankings, finishing singles R-Up at 2015 Wimbledon (L. Zhuk) and winning the ITF Junior Masters in Chengdu in April 2016

- Favorite shot is forehand and favorite surface is hard
- Started playing tennis aged five

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 made her Grand Slam main draw debut with a wild card at Wimbledon (l. Krueger in 1r); also competed in qualifying at London (Queen's), Nottingham and Eastbourne
- Made her Tour debut at 2024 Tokyo (l. Uchijima in 1r)
- In 2024 played qualifying with a wild card at Birmingham and Wimbledon
- Claimed her first IT title at W35 Nottingham in 2024
- Won the junior title at 2024 US Open and reached QF as a junior at 2023 Wimbledon
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2023 at the age of 14 with a best result of QF at W25 Sunderland
- Best results in 2025 were three QF finishes all at WTA 1000 events: Doha (l. eventual champion Anisimova), Madrid (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and Montreal. Made 4r at a Grand Slam for the second time in her career (after QF at 2024 Australian Open) at US Open (l. Muchova)
- Reached two WTA 500 finals in 2024 at San Diego and Stuttgart finishing runner-up at both. Also made first Grand Slam quarterfinal at Australian Open and first WTA 1000 semifinal at Indian Wells
- Earned five Top 10 wins in 2024, entered the year with only three in career and made Top 20 debut on May 6, 2024 finishing the year at No.18
- In 2023, won maiden singles title at Austin (d. Gracheva) and doubles title at Birmingham (w/Krejcikova)
- Reached QF at two WTA 500 events; Adelaide 1 (l. Jabeur) and Washington (l. Samsonova). Achieved a peak singles ranking of No. 32 on August 7, 2023 and No. 27 in doubles on May 8, 2023
- Best result of 2022 was SF showing at Granby (l. Saville). Also made 3r at Australian Open and Eastbourne
