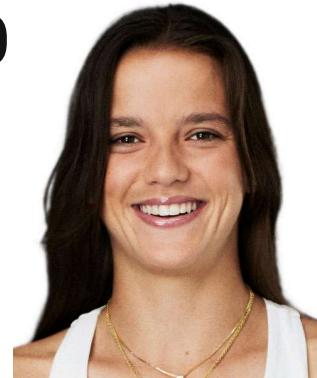

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, best Tour-level result was Jiujiang QF (l. eventual finalist Tagger); also won two ITF Circuit titles (W75 Trnava and W50 Funchal) and made WTA 125 SF at San Sebastian
- At Tour-level in 2024, scored main draw match-wins at Australian Open, Roland Garros, Ningbo and Jiujiang; also made quarterfinals at WTA 125s Hamburg and Bastad
- In 2023, won first WTA Tour singles title at Cluj-Napoca (d. Ruse in F); also reached SF at Prague (l. Noskova) and WTA 125 Valencia (l. Bassols Ribera) and hit a career-high ranking of No.71 on October 23
- Top results in 2022 include first WTA 125 title at Budapest (made Top 100 debut afterwards on September 26), WTA 125 R-Up at Marbella, and ITF/W25 title at Le Havre-FRA; best Tour-level results were 2r at Lyon and Stuttgart
- Singles highlight in 2021 was SF run at Gdynia (l. Kucova) and also reached 2r at Bad Homburg and Hamburg; in doubles that year, advanced to first WTA final at Budapest (w/Bolsova, l. Buzarnescu/Stollar)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 US Open and played another Grand Slam main draw at 2020 Roland Garros (in autumn), falling 1r on both occasions
- Reached maiden WTA SF at 2019 Lausanne (l. Cornet)
- Reached QF at 2018 Lugano (l. Voegele)
- In 2017, made 2r in Tour-level debut at Budapest (as qualifier, l. Dodin); later in year, reached first career WTA Tour QF at Gstaad (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Gstaad
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2015 at Brno-CZE
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Braunschweig, Germany in 2011
- In 2025 reached maiden Tour finals at WTA 500s Merida (as a qualifier) and Guadalajara; earned her first career WTA 125 title at Cancun and after beginning the year ranked No.169, she broke into the Top 50 for the first time and reached a career-high ranking of No.46 in October
- In 2024 won main draw matches at WTA 1000 events Miami and Madrid as a qualifier; also made the final at WTA 125 Santa Cruz and semifinal at WTA 125 Guadalajara
- Moved into Top 150 for first time in 2023 with breakthrough QF performances at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Sakkari) and Cluj Napoca (l. Ruse)
- Missed first half of 2022 campaign. Best result on return was SF showing at W60 ITF Circuit event at Caldas da Rainha
- Posted 38-20 win-loss record in 2021, lifting two ITF Circuit titles
- Won maiden ITF Circuit title at W15 Antalya in 2017
- Fell in 1r on WTA debut at 2016 Bogota
- On the ITF Junior Circuit, posted career-high ranking of No.8 in January 2018, having reached SF at previous year's US Open (l. eventual champion Anisimova)

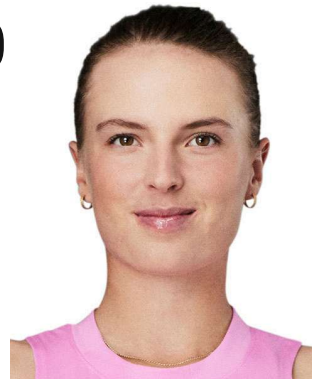

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2025 highlights include Nottingham SF (l. eventual champion Kessler) and QFs at Merida, Monterrey and Osaka; notched first Grand Slam main draw win of career at Australian Open (d. Volynets, l. No.2 seed Swiatek in 2r); reached career-high ranking of No.33 on July 14
 - Reached first three WTA finals of career in 2024, at Monastir (R-Up, l. Kartal), Hua Hin #2 (d. Siegemund for maiden title) and Jiujiang (R-Up, l. Golubic); ended year in Top 50 for first time
 - Standout performance of 2023 was reaching QF at Warsaw (l. Maria). Also achieved R-Up at WTA 125 Bari on clay (l. Zidansek)
 - In 2022, made Roland Garros main draw as lucky loser (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
 - Continued on ITF Circuit from 2019 through 2021, also making 2r at Tour level at 2020 Prague (l. Jones) and again at 2021 Prague (as qualifier, l. Kuzmova)
 - In 2017, made Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Duan) and won first WTA main draw match at Gstaad (d. Stojanovic)
 - During 2016, broke into Top 200 for first time following title run at ITF Rome \$25K; also played Grand Slam qualifying for first time at US Open (l. Karatantcheva in Q1)
 - Played first WTA qualifying match at 2015 Nottingham (l. Zhu)
 - Won first ITF title in 2013 on clay at Vrnjacka Banja \$10K
 - Began on professional circuit in 2012 at Velenje \$10K at the age of 15
 - Best Tour results in 2025 were reaching 3r at WTA 1000 Miami as a qualifier, making R16 at Rouen (l. eventual finalist Danilovic) and Chennai (l. eventual champion Tjen) and qualifying for main draw at Wimbledon (l. Mertens in 1r). Also reached two WTA 125 finals at Birmingham and Puerto Vallarta
- In 2024 won main draw matches at Hua Hin, Nottingham and Jiujiang
- In June 2023, with a ranking of No.49, entered the Top 50 for the first time in her career
 - In her 2023 debut Australian Open appearance she reached the 4r (l. Vekic); fell in 1r at all the other Grand Slams of the season
 - WTA Tour 2023 highlights include a SF run at Ningbo (l. Shnaider) and a QF run at Birmingham (l. Krejcikova) and Hong Kong (l. Fernandez)
 - Highlight of 2022 was maiden WTA title run at Chennai (d. Linette in F), helping her rise from No.305 to No.77 in the rankings
 - First title win of the 2022 season came early at W25 Cancun followed by R16 run at Miami Open (l. Badosa)
 - In 2022 had early exits on clay and grass swing, notably 2r at Charleston (l. Bencic), 1r at Madrid (l. Kanepi), and qualifying rounds at Roland Garros and Wimbledon; Came back strongly with a 2r run at US Open (as qualifier, l. Muguruza) followed by first singles title at Chennai (d. Linette)
 - In 2021, reached QF at Charleston [250] (as WC, l. eventual champion Sharma) and made 2r at Cleveland (as LL, l. Linette); also lifted first ITF Circuit titles of her career at W15 events in Monastir, Tunisia
 - Fell 1r on WTA debut at 2020 Prague (as WC, l. Kr.Pliskova)
 - Before the tour stopped in March 2020, she competed in her first ITF \$100K event, beating a former WTA top-100 player in the first round
 - Best junior Slam singles result was SF run at 2021 Wimbledon
 - In May 2019, she was directly accepted in the main draw for Roland Garros girls' singles - the youngest player in the draw and first 2005 born player to play in a junior Grand Slam
 - In February 2019, as a 13-year-old, she won the prestigious Les Petits As title in France, losing only 15 games the entire tournament - something that had never been done in the history of the event
 - In the past, she has won the Junior Orange Bowl (2017) and a long list of Tennis Europe and ITF

- Currently working with Hynek Fruhvirt
- Born, lives and trains in Prague, Czech Republic but also spends time in Nice, France at the Mouratoglou Academy
- Her sister Brenda followed in her footsteps by winning the Les Petits As girls singles title in 2020 (she was only 12 years old at the time), becoming the youngest winner in the tournament's 38-year history, and completing the first-ever sister-combination to win the event in back-to-back years (Linda in 2019, Brenda in 2020). On the heels of that win, Roland Garros had already awarded her a WC for the girls' singles before the event was moved to September

- Hobbies include singing, family time, and travel

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights of 2025 were reaching QF on home grass at Nottingham (l. Kessler) and making QF with the Great Britain team at the United Cup (won two round robin matches and lost to Swiatek in QF). Also won a WTA 125 title at Paris
- 2024 season saw Boulter rise to a career high ranking of No.23, achieved on Nov 4, 2024. Successfully defended title at Nottingham (d. Ka. Pliskova in F) and won San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F). Made SF at Tokyo (l. Kenin) and wrapped up the year with a final run at Hong Kong (l. champion Shnaider)
- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career on home soil at Nottingham; made Top 50 debut at No.50 the week of September 11; advanced to 3r at Wimbledon for second year in a row (l. Rybakina), and at US Open for first time (l. Stearns)
- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November's Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tie-break at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
- Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- In 2025 posted best result of the season at Jiujiang with SF (l. Tagger); also made QFs at Cleveland and Osaka. Earned a WTA 125 title at Suzhou
- Began 2024 with her best Grand Slam performance since Wimbledon 2021 (quarterfinal), with R32 at Australian Open (l. Svitolina). Her only other consecutive main draw wins came in October at Jiujiang where she claimed her second career title, eight years after earning her maiden title at 2016 Gstaad. Continued her winning streak at Limoges, ending the season with the WTA 125 title (d. Naef in F)
- Reached QF at 2023 Nottingham (l. Watson). Advanced to second round at 2023 Wimbledon, as a qualifier (l. Keys). Also qualified at 2023 Miami and fell in second round (l. Samsonova)
- Had a mixed 2022 falling out of Top 100 after 2r exit at Wimbledon and entering back in with QF run at Warsaw
- Made QF at the first tournament of 2022, Melbourne 1 (l. Halep), and later on clay at Strasbourg (l. Dodin) and Warsaw (l. Paolini)
- In addition to F run at Rouen 125 (l. Zanevska), highlight of the year include SF campaign at Nottingham (l. Amritraj)
- Produced impressive campaign in 2021, culminating in first Top 50 year-end finish and a career-high ranking of No.43 on November 8
- On clay, won WTA 125K Series title at Saint-Malo and then performed impressively on grass with back-to-back QF runs at Eastbourne and Wimbledon
- After a strong start to last season on ITF Circuit, continued her resurgence by coming through qualifying to reach the final at Lyon (l. Tauson) and Monterrey (l. Fernandez)
