### PLAYER NOTES

- Making tournament debut; this is her 2nd appearance at a WTA 250 event in 2026 (Auckland R16, l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- Defeated Lucie Havlickova, Viktorija Golubic, Linda Fruhvirtova and Katie Volynets to move into her 5th career WTA singles final
- Seeking her 4th career WTA singles title and first since she defended her Nottingham title in June of 2024 (holds 3-1 record in WTA singles finals)
- Her most recent WTA singles final came at Hong Kong in November of 2024 (l. Shnaider, Boulter's only loss in a WTA singles final)
- Faces No.124 Tamara Korpatsch in today's final; Boulter is 3-0 this year vs. players ranked outside Top 100
- Seeking to become the first British singles titlist on Tour since Sonay Kartal at Monastir in September 2024 (her countrywoman Emma Raducanu is also in a final today, in Cluj-Napoca)
- Owns 2-1 career Tour-level record against players from Germany; her most recent Tour-level match vs. a German was a loss to Lys at 2025 Tokyo
- 1 of her 3 career WTA singles titles has come on hard court: 2024 San Diego (her other 2 titles came back-to-back on the grass of Nottingham)
- Is currently ranked No.120; this time last year was ranked No.24. Reached career-high ranking of No.23 in November of 2024

### PLAYER NOTES

- This is her first appearance at this tournament; this is also her first Tour-level main draw appearance of 2026
- Defeated Anna Siskova, Emiliana Arango, Caty McNally and Diane Parry so far this week to reach her 2nd career WTA singles final
- She won her previous WTA singles final, taking the title at 2023 Cluj-Napoca (d. Ruse in F), which is also her career-best hard court result
- Faces No.120 Katie Boulter in today's final; she is 2-0 this year at Tour-level vs. players ranked outside Top 100 (both wins this week)
- Owns 3-4 career Tour-level record against players from United Kingdom; her most recent Tour-level match vs. a player from United Kingdom was a loss to Miyazaki at 2024 Wimbledon
- Seeking to become the first German to win a singles title on Tour since Tatjana Maria at Queen's Club in June of last year
- Is currently ranked No.124; this time last year was ranked No.192. Reached career-high ranking of No.71 in October of 2023
- This is the first WTA singles final between 2 players ranked outside Top 100 since Sao Paulo last September (No.214 Rakotomanga Rajaonah d. No.130 Tjen)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights of 2025 were reaching QF on home grass at Nottingham (l. Kessler) and making QF with the Great Britain team at the United Cup (won two round robin matches and lost to Swiatek in QF). Also won a WTA 125 title at Paris
- 2024 season saw Boulter rise to a career high ranking of No.23, achieved on Nov 4, 2024. Successfully defended title at Nottingham (d. Ka. Pliskova in F) and won San Diego (d. Kostyuk in F). Made SF at Tokyo (l. Kenin) and wrapped up the year with a final run at Hong Kong (l. champion Shnaider)
- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career on home soil at Nottingham; made Top 50 debut at No.50 the week of September 11; advanced to 3r at Wimbledon for second year in a row (l. Rybakina), and at US Open for first time (l. Stearns)
- Also in 2023, reached 2r as qualifier at both Montreal and Beijing; on ITF Circuit won one singles title at Canberra and reached two finals in Japan; went 2-0 in singles in November's Billie Jean King Cup play-offs against Sweden
- During the 2022 grass court season, advanced to QF at Nottingham (ret. vs. Davis w/right elbow injury) and 2r at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Opened 2021 season by reaching 3r at the Gippsland Trophy in Melbourne (l. Osaka); upset No.14 seed Gauff in 2r
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$15k ITF/Sharm El-Sheikh-EGY. Earlier in the year, made 2r at Acapulco (l. Zhu) and fell 1r at Australian Open (l. Svitolina) in only Tour-level outings
- Suffered a stress fracture in her back which forced her out for much of 2019. Best results prior to injury were 2r showing at Australian Open and SF run at \$25K ITF/Solapur-IND (l. Raina)
- Won the WTA's first-ever 10-point match tie-break at a Slam to see off Makarova in 1r at 2019 Australian Open
- Reached career-high No.82 on February 18, 2019
- Broke into the Top 100 the week of October 15, 2018
- Made significant strides in 2018, reaching first WTA QF of career at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Barty) - defeated Stosur en route for her first win over a Grand Slam winner. Also enjoyed QF run at Tianjin (d. No.432 Sakkari, l. Ka.Pliskova) and R-Up finish at \$100K ITF/Southsea-GBR (l. Flipkens)
- Also in 2018, reached 2r for the first time at a major, at Wimbledon (d. Cepede Royg, l. Osaka)
- In 2025, best Tour-level result was Jiujiang QF (l. eventual finalist Tagger); also won two ITF Circuit titles (W75 Trnava and W50 Funchal) and made WTA 125 SF at San Sebastian
- At Tour-level in 2024, scored main draw match-wins at Australian Open, Roland Garros, Ningbo and Jiujiang; also made quarterfinals at WTA 125s Hamburg and Bastad
- In 2023, won first WTA Tour singles title at Cluj-Napoca (d. Ruse in F); also reached SF at Prague (l. Noskova) and WTA 125 Valencia (l. Bassols Ribera) and hit a career-high ranking of No.71 on October 23
- Top results in 2022 include first WTA 125 title at Budapest (made Top 100 debut afterwards on September 26), WTA 125 R-Up at Marbella, and ITF/W25 title at Le Havre-FRA; best Tour-level results were 2r at Lyon and Stuttgart
- Singles highlight in 2021 was SF run at Gdynia (l. Kucova) and also reached 2r at Bad Homburg and Hamburg; in doubles that year, advanced to first WTA final at Budapest (w/Bolsova, l. Buzarnescu/Stollar)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 US Open and played another Grand Slam main draw at 2020 Roland Garros (in autumn), falling 1r on both occasions
- Reached maiden WTA SF at 2019 Lausanne (l. Cornet)
- Reached QF at 2018 Lugano (l. Voegelé)
- In 2017, made 2r in Tour-level debut at Budapest (as qualifier, l. Dodin); later in year, reached first career WTA Tour QF at Gstaad (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Gstaad
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2015 at Brno-CZE
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Braunschweig, Germany in 2011

- Fell in 1r on Tour-level main draw singles debut at 2017 Wimbledon (as WC, l. McHale)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of seven singles titles and four doubles titles
- Played first professional events of career on ITF Circuit in Great Britain in 2011
- Appeared in girls' singles at all four Slams, reaching 3r at Australian Open, Wimbledon and US Open, and was R-Up in doubles at 2014 Australian Open (w/Jorovic, l. Kalinina/Kulichkova). Other junior highlights include winning Lemon Bowl in Rome at age of 11, and reaching final at Junior Orange Bowl in Florida at age 14
