- Krejckikova is the only Grand Slam singles champion contesting in this year's Athens draw; she made R16 at Wimbledon last week, where she was stopped in three sets by her countrywoman and eventual runner-up Karolina Muchova
- She is through to a second QF this season after runner-up finish at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Montgomery via w/o in final)
- Also through to a 19th career Tour-level QF on hard court, and her first since 2025 Seoul (l. eventual champion Swiatek in QF)
- Looking to reach a 17th career Tour-level SF today; and a 10th on hard court
- Her last Tour-level SF on hard court came at the 2024 WTA Finals where she lost to today's opponent Zheng Qinwen
- Has beaten Viktoriya Tomova and Carole Monnet so far this week to register her 12th and 13th match wins of the season
- Owns 10-4 career record against players from China, most recent was her loss to Zheng Qinwen in the semifinals at the 2024 WTA Finals
- Faces No.135 Qinwen Zheng in QF today; her record this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 100 stands at 5-0, most recent win was over No.205 Monnet in the 2r here
- Five of her 8 career WTA titles have come on hard court at 2023 San Diego, 2023 Dubai, 2022 Ostrava, 2022 Tallinn and 2021 Prague
- One of 3 players from Czech Republic to reach QF alongside Bejlek and Valentova
- Is currently ranked No.32; this time last year was ranked No.78. Reached a career-high of World No.2 in February 2022
- Best win by ranking this season came over No.5 Andreeva at Wimbledon

- Looking to reach a 16th career Tour-level SF today, and an 11th SF on hard court. Her most recent hard court SF came during her R-Up finish at the 2024 WTA Finals (d. today's opponent Krejckikova in SF, l. Gauff in F)
- Has beaten Jessica Bouzas Maneiro and qualifier Elena Micic so far this week to reach her first QF of the 2026 season
- Faces No.32 Barbora Krejckikova in QF today; owns 4-7 record so far this season against Top 50 opponents, most recent was a loss to No.36 Siniakova at Wimbledon. Most recent win was over No.41 Sakkari at Nottingham
- Owns 6-9 career record against players from Czech Republic, 0-1 in 2026 with a loss to Siniakova at Wimbledon. Her most recent win over a Czech player came against today's opponent Krejckikova at 2024 WTA Finals

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CAREER MILESTONES

- Missed first 5 months of 2025 due to back injury and made season debut at Strasbourg in May; in singles, posted three QF finishes at Eastbourne, US Open and Seoul. In doubles, won 20th Tour-level title of career at Seoul (w/Siniakova)
- Finished 2024 at No.10 in the year-end rankings (2nd consecutive year-end Top 10 finish) after winning 2nd Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon (d. Paolini in F); also made Australian Open QF; qualified for the WTA Finals as a Grand Slam champion and advanced to SF (l. Zheng)
- Reached four singles finals across 2023, winning first WTA 1000 title at Dubai (d. No.1 Swiatek in F) in addition to WTA 500 San Diego title (d. Kenin in F), and finishing R-Up at Birmingham (l. Ostapenko) and Zhengzhou (l. Zheng Qinwen). Ended season inside the Top 10 at No.10
- In 2022, started with R-Up at Sydney (l. Badosa) and QF at Australian Open (l. Keys) before missing several months w/arm injury. Ended 2022 in fine form, winning back-to-back titles at Tallinn (d. Kontaveit) and Ostrava (d. Swiatek). Also completed Career Doubles Grand Slam by winning US Open w/Siniakova
- Won first WTA Tour singles title at 2021 Strasbourg, then swept singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros (her first Grand Slam singles title and 3rd Grand Slam doubles title). Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name
- Also in 2021, won Prague title (d. Martincova in F), reached final at Dubai (l. Muguruza), made Wimbledon R16 and US Open QF, and qualified for WTA Finals in singles for the first time
- Posted another excellent doubles campaign across 2021; along with aforementioned Roland Garros, added titles at Madrid, Gippsland Trophy, WTA Finals and the gold medal at Tokyo Olympic Games (all w/Siniakova). Additionally, won 3rd straight Australian Open mixed doubles title (w/2019 partner Ram)
- Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz; in doubles, won Shenzhen title (w/Siniakova), finished R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng Saisai) and defended Australian Open mixed doubles title (w/new partner Pavic)
- Best results in an injury-affected 2025 season include semifinals at Rome and London and a run to the Roland Garros QF; underwent elbow surgery in July and played only one event after Wimbledon (ret. in Beijing 3r)
- Enjoyed best season of career in 2024, reaching her first Grand Slam final at the Australian Open, winning titles at Tokyo and Palermo, contesting the title match at her home tournament in Wuhan and closing out the season at her first WTA Finals, losing to Gauff in the final
- An outstanding 2024 also saw her make her Top 10 and Top 5 debuts in the PIF WTA Rankings and the gold medal placed around her neck at the 2024 Paris Olympics
- Won first two WTA titles in 2023 at Palermo (d. Paolini in F) and Zhengzhou (d. Krejciakova in F); also reached final at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (l. Haddad Maia), SF at Abu Dhabi and first career Grand Slam QF at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Earned 2023 WTA Most Improved Player of Year, ending the season at No.15 and inside the Top 20 for the first time; she made her Top 20 debut on May 22, 2023
- In 2022, won WTA Newcomer of the Year, reached first WTA final at Tokyo (l. Samsonova) and also made SF at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (as qualifier), QF at Toronto and R16 at Roland Garros. Broke into Top 100 on January 31, and cracked Top 50 after her Roland Garros run
- Scored first Top 20 win over No.19 Simona Halep at 2022 Roland Garros, then earned two Top 10 wins over No.5 Ons Jabeur at Toronto and No.4 Paula Badosa at Tokyo. Also won title at WTA 125 event in Valencia in June 2022
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made WTA qualifying debut in 2019, appearing in qualifying at Miami, Tianjin and Wuhan
- Made ITF debut in 2018; has gone on to amass eight ITF singles titles with 8-0 record in finals

- In 2019, advanced to QF at Bucharest in addition to winning four ITF Circuit singles titles on clay in North America and Europe, winning 20 of her 21 matches during this stretch
- Also in 2019, posted second Top 20 doubles season highlighted by titles at Toronto and Linz, and R-Up finish at Indian Wells (all w/Siniakova). Won Australian Open mixed doubles title w/Ram
- In 2018, won first two Grand Slam doubles trophies at Roland Garros (d. Hozumi/Ninomiya in F) and Wimbledon (d. Melichar/Peschke in F), both w/Siniakova; they became the first pairing to complete the Roland Garros-Wimbledon double since Kim Clijsters and Ai Sugiyama in 2003, and also became the first team ever to win the girls' doubles (2013) and ladies' doubles title at SW19
- Rose to WTA Doubles World No.1 for the first time on October 22, 2018
- Highlight of 2017 was R-Up finish in first WTA singles final at Nurnberg (L. Bertens in F). Also made QF as qualifier at Bastad (L. Garcia). Only other tour-level appearances were 1r exits at Bucharest and Quebec City
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Quebec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, L. Bacsinszky/Barrois)
- Reached 2r on WTA singles debut as qualifier at 2014 Quebec City (L. Hradecka)
- On ITF Circuit, owns 14 singles and 19 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Piestany-SVK in 2010

- Started playing tennis aged 6 and was later coached and mentored by WTA legend Jana Novotna
- Highly ranked junior; won the Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open girls' doubles titles with Katerina Siniakova
